\section*{Meet Minutes}
- The No. 23-ranked West Virginia University gymnastics team competes for one of two bids to the 2017 NCAA National Championships at the NCAA Morgantown Regional

~ Nсан Championships on Saturday, April 1, at 4 p.m. EST, inside the WVU Coliseum. State are the No. 4 and No. 6 seeds, respectively.
- WVU will open the meet on balance beam. The team's complete rotation order is: BB-Bye-FX-V-Bye-UB.
- The Mountaineers have scored 195.7 or better in five of their last six meets, including a season-best road score of 196.1 at No. 3 Florida on March 10.
- Following two weeks at No. 26, the Mountaineers reentered the Road to Nationals Rankings on March 6 at No. 22. WVU sits at No. 23 this week and boasts an RQS of 195.92.
- WVU enters the regional championships ranked for the first time since the 2009 season, when the squad was ranked No. 21 - WVU has been nationally ranked eight weeks this season, the team's best single-season total under Butts.
- Kirah Koshinski was named to the NACGC/W All-America Vault Second Team for the second straight season. She is the first WVU gymnast to score an All-America honor in multiple years since Kristin Quackenbush won six awards from 1994-96. - Two Mountaineer gymnasts own three national rankings. Kirah Koshinski ranks No. 14 on vault (9.905 RQS) and No. 23 on floor exercise (9.905 RQS). Zaakira Muhammad ranks No. 32 on vault (9.86 RQS).
- Currently, a freshman or sophomore is featured in 10 of the Mountaineers' 24 lineup spots.
- Twelve of the 13 gymnasts who have seen competitive time this season have reached the podium. Kirah Koshinski paces the team with 12 event victories.
-WVU has hit 24-for-24 twice this season, most recently at No. 3 Florida on March 10.
- Kirah Koshinski is the only Mountaineer gymnast in 2017 to score 9.95 or better on any event. She earned the career-high marks on floor on Jan. 21 and March 5, and on vault on March 3. Koshinski has not scored below 9.85 on floor this season. - Six different gymnasts have scored 9.9 or better on at least one event this season.

\section*{WVU vs. the Field}
- The Mountaineers are 1-1 against the field this season. WVU earned a 195.95-194.875 win at Kent State on Feb. 4 before falling, 196.375-195.8, to then-No. 16 George Washington, on March 5, at the WVU Coliseum.
- NCAA Regional Championships results will not count toward the Mountaineers' final 2017 record.

\section*{What's at Stake?}
- The top two teams and the top two all-around competitors (who are not on an advancing team) from each regional receive an automatic berth to the NCAA National Championships in St. Louis, Missouri, April 14-15, hosted by the University of Missouri, Columbia, and the St. Louis Sports Commission.
- The top two teams from the Champaign, Fayetteville and Seattle regionals will compete in one of the semifinals, and the top two teams from the Gainesville, Lincoln and Morgantown regionals will compete in the other semifinal.
- The event winners at each regional site will advance to the national championships (in that event only) if they are not part of a qualifying team or an all-around qualifier.

\section*{NCAA Morgantown Regional Championships History}
- WVU hosts a regional championships for the 10th time in program history.
- Most recently, the Mountaineers finished fifth at the 2015 NCAA Morgantown Regional Championships on April 4 with a 195.65 score, the team's second-best showing at an NCAA Regional Championships.

The Mountaineers are 6-3 at the WVU Coliseum this season ... WVU is 2-7 against ranked teams ... Alexa Goldberg paces the team with \(1,379.925\) points ... she needs 16.375 points to break onto the WVU Career Points Top 20 List ... Kirah Koshinski rank No. 1 on the team, No. 7 in program history, with 19 career scores of 9.9 or better ... 11 of Koshinski's 9.9+ scores have been earned on vault, the fifth-best mark in program history ... she needs four more \(9.9+\) vault scores to move into fourth place ... the eight additional 9.9+ career scores have been earned on floor, and she sits at No. 10 in program history ... she needs one more \(9.9+\) floor score to move into ninth place ... Goldberg ranks No. 15 in program history with 12 career scores of \(9.9+\ldots\) nine of her marks have been earned on bars, the second-best total in WVU history ... she needs five more bars score of 9.9 or better to match the program record ... Goldberg owns a team-best 27 career wins, with 21 victories on bars, and Koshinski ranks second on the team with 21 career event wins ... Koshinski has scored 9.8 or better in all but 17 of her 71 collegiate routines ... Zaakira Muhammad ranks No. 22 in program history with eight career scores of 9.9 or better ... Muhammad ranks No. 1 on the team with 57 career podium finishes, and Goldberg follows in second place with 51 ... Tiara Wright (444.925) needs 55.075 points to reach the 500 career-point mark.

- Meet 1: WVU at Maryland (1/8) College Park, Md.
The Mountaineers opened the 2017 season with a come-from-behind, 194.4-193.95 win at Maryland, inside the XFINITY Center. Down 146.025-145.725 after three events, the team strung together four scores of 9.75 or better to close its beam rotation with a 48.675 total, good enough to edge the Terrapins' 47.925 showing on floor.
Kirah Koshinski paced the Mountaineers on three events, earned two wins and matched two career highs in a strong showing. Koshinski finished first on vault (9.925) and floor (9.85) and tied for second place on beam (9.8); the vault and beam marks were career highs. Jordan Gillette won beam with a career-high 9.9.
- Meet 2: No. 19 WVU at Pitt (1/13) | Pittsburgh, Pa.

Despite defeating the Panthers on three of the four events, WVU suffered a 194.025-193.875 loss at Pitt, inside Fitzgerald Field House. WVU won vault (48.8), beam (48.425) and floor (48.85) but could not overcome a 47.8 showing on bars.

Kirah Koshinski earned two event titles, tying Zaakira Muhammad for the vault win with a 9.85 mark and scoring 9.875 for the floor victory. Carly Galpin made her season debut on beam and tied for first place with a 9.825 score, while Tiara Wright paced the team on bars and finished third overall with a 9.8.
- Meet 3: WVU vs. No. 1 Oklahoma (1/21) | Morgantown

The Mountaineers opened their home season at the WVU Coliseum with a 197.925-195.55 loss to No. 1 Oklahoma. WVU was powered by a season-high mark of 49.2 on floor

Kirah Koshinski matched her career-best floor score of 9.95 and tied for second place, the highest individual finish for WVU. She also paced on vault and tied Zaakira Muhammad for fifth place with a 9.85 .
Tiara Wright paced on bars for the second straight week with a 9.825, and Brooklyn Doggette led the team on beam with a 9.825 mark, matching a career high first set in 2015.
- Meet 4: No. 25 WVU vs. No. 7 Denver, Temple and Towson (1/29) | Morgantown

The Mountaineers tallied the 18th-best score in program history in a first place, 196.3 showing at the WVU Coliseum in their first quad meet of the season. No. 7 Denver (195.9) finished in second place, while Towson (194.775) placed third and Temple (193.625) finished in fourth place. The victory over the Pioneers was WVU's first against a top-10 team since 2012.

WVU set or matched season highs on all four events: vault (49.25), bars (49.175), beam (48.675) and floor (49.2). Kirah Koshinski tied for the floor win with a 9.9 and also tied Zaakira Muhammad for second place on vault (9.9). Alexa Goldberg and Tiara Wright tied for first place on bars with season-high scores 9.875 , and Jordan Gillette finished a team-best fourth on beam (9.85).
- Meet 5: No. 25 WVU at Kent State (214) | Kent, Ohio

Coming off a season-best performance, the Mountaineers achieved their top road score, earning a 195.95-194.875 win at Kent State, inside the M.A.C. Center. WVU swept the team and individual competitions.

Alexa Goldberg earned her first all-around victory of the season, tallying 39.15. She also won bars and matched her season-best mark of 9.875. Kirah Koshinski scored 9.9 on vault and floor for the wins, and Brooklyn Doggette earned her first career victory with a 9.825 showing on balance beam
- Meet 6: No. 24 WVU at Towson with Temple and North Carolina (2/12) | Towson, Md.

A slow start on balance beam was too much for the Mountaineers to overcome, as they finished in third place at Towson with a 194.575 mark inside the SECU Arena. WVU finished first on bars with a season-best road score of 49.075 and also won vault with a 48.975 total. The Mountaineers finished third on floor (48.85) and fourth on beam (47.675).

Zaakira Muhammad won her second vault title of the season with a 9.85 mark. Alexa Goldberg and Tiara Wright tied for first on bars with season-best marks of 9.875. Kirah Koshinski paced on floor (9.85) and beam (9.75).

\section*{- Meet 7: No. 24} Columbus, Ohio
Duntainers had the Buckeyes in the third rotation, the Mountaineers had to settle for a narrow 196.075-195.8 loss at Ohio State's St. John Arena. WVU hit 24-for-24 for the first time this year and scored a season-high road score of 48.825 on balance beam, as well as a winning 49.05 mark on vault.
Kirah Koshinski scored 9.9 on vault and earned her fourth win of the season. Chloe Cluchey returned to the floor lineup for the first time since Jan. 8 and won the event with a 9.925 mark. Alexa Goldberg and Tiara Wright tied for third on bars with 9.825 s, and Carly Galpin finished second on beam with a 9.85.

\section*{Meet 8: WVU vs. No. 24 Iowa State and Maryland (2/26) |} Morgantown
A season-high 49.1 on balance beam helped push the Mountaineers to a 195.95 showing and wins over the Cyclones (195.725) and Terrapins (195.45) at the WVU Coliseum. WVU finished the day with team wins on beam, bars \((48.825)\) and floor (49.125).

Zaakira Muhammad was the talk of the meet, tallying a winning, career-high 39.4 in her first all-around appearance of the season. She also won beam with a career-best 9.875 and finished second on vault (9.875) and bars (9.825). Alexa Goldberg won bars with a 9.85 , while Kirah Koshinski finished first on floor with a 9.9.
- Meet 9: WVU at Pitt with Michigan State and Towson (3/3) | Pittsburgh, Pa.

The Mountaineers swept the field in their return trip to Pitt, scoring 195.7 and defeating the Panthers (195.375), the Spartans (194.6) and the Tigers (194.4) at Fitzgerald Field House. WVU earned team wins on every event but floor, including an impressive 49.15 on vault.

Kirah Koshinski won vault outright with a career-best 9.95 and tied for the win on floor with a 9.85. Zaakira Muhammad earned the victory on bars with a career-best matching score of 9.9. Brooklyn Doggette and Abby Kaufman tied for third on beam with career-high 9.85 s . Muhammad finished first overall with a 39.375 total.
- Meet 10: WVU vs. No. 16 George Washington, No. 24 Eastern Michigan and Pitt (3/5) | Morgantown

The Mountaineers rallied on floor in the fourth rotation following two falls on beam and finished third with a 195.8 mark in their home regular-season finale in the WVU Coliseum. GW placed first (196.375), EMU took second (196.225) and Pitt finished fourth (194.2). Despite counting the fall, WVU's team mark matches the 47th-best score in program history.

WVU scored a season-best 49.375 on floor, its top mark on any event this year. Kirah Koshinski won the event with her second career-high 9.95 of the year. Zaakira Muhammad finished third on bars (9.85) and fourth on vault (9.85). Abby Kaufman tallied a career-best 9.9 and finished second on beam.
- Meet 11: No. 22 WVU at No. 3 Florida (3/10) | Gainesville, Fla.

The Mountaineers tallied their best road score of the season in a 197.6-196.1 loss to the Gators inside the Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

WVU earned its best road beam (49.075) and floor (49.175) scores, as well as its third-best bars total (48.95) of the season.
Kirah Koshinski tied for second on floor (9.9) and third on vault (9.875). Alexa Goldberg hit a season-high 9.9 on bars and tied for third place. She also matched her career-high beam score of 9.85 and tied Abby Kaufman for fifth place Zaakira Muhammad finished second overall with a 39.2.
- Meet 12: No. 22 WVU at the Big 12 Championship (3/18)| Frisco, Texas
WVU scored 195.575 and finished in third place at the 2017 Big 12 Championship, inside the Dr. Pepper Arena. No. 1 Oklahoma finished first (197.85), No. 7 Denver placed second (196.475) and lowa State finished fourth (195.5). It was the team's second straight third-place finish and second-best mark earned at a Big 12 Championship away from Morgantown.
WVU finished second on floor (49.15), third on vault (49.05) and beam (48.825) and fourth on bars (48.55). Kirah Koshinski and Zaakira Muhammad finished second on vault (9.9) and floor (9.9) and earned All-Big 12 Championship Team honors.
