West Virginia Mountaineers (28-8)

2017 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship Regional Semifinals

- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in seven of its last 11 NCAA appearances (2017, 2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005 and 1998).
- This is WVU's eighth NCAA appearance in the last 10 years and 10th appearance in the last 13 seasons.
- WVU is 9-9 all-time in California with four wins in a row. WVU has played one NCAA Tournament game in California a 65-62 loss to Utah in the 1998 NCAA Sweet 16 in Anaheim.
- The Mountaineers have scored a school-record 2,956 points this season, besting the previous mark of 2,884 in 1959.
- West Virginia's 28 victories are the third most in school history behind WVU's two Final Four teams (31 in 2010 and 29 in 1959). This is the third straight year the Mountaineers have won at least 25 games in a season.
- For the second year in a row, WVU finished second in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tourney.
- West Virginia is 23-11 in postseason games (10 NCAA and 3 NIT) in its last 13 appearances.
- WVU has made 13 postseason appearances in the last 14 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- Jevon Carter was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, while Tarik Phillip was named the Big 12 Sixth Man of the Year. Carter was named to the All-Big 12 Second team, while Nathan Adrian was named to the All-Big 12 Third Team. Carter and Adrian were named to the All-Big 12 Defensive Team. Carter is just the third player in Big 12 history to earn three selections on the All-Big 12 Defensive Team.
- WVU is 37-23 in March under Bob Huggins, and WVU is 52-30 in its last 82 games in the month of March.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in eighth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 819-329. Huggins trails Jim Phelan by 11 wins for seventh place all-time.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- WVU did not lose a regular season game this season by double digits for the first time since the 1961 season.
- WVU has had back-to-back seasons of single-digit season losses. The last time that happened was in 1982-83.
- WVU is 36-18 in the Big 12 regular season in the last three seasons. WVU is 79-27 overall since the beginning of 2014-15.
- West Virginia is 159-36 in its last 195 games against unranked teams, including 82 of its last 93 at the WVU Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 39 ranked teams at WVU, including 14 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by least 15 points each in a single season.
- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the eighth-largest margin victory ever against a No. 1-ranked AP team.
- WVU is 8-4 in its last 12 games vs. AP Top 25 teams, with two wins over No. 1, one vs. No. 2 and two wins over No. 6.
- Jevon Carter became West Virginia's 51st 1,000-point scorer on Feb. 27. He now ranks 41st all-time with 1,097 points.
- WVU leads the country in turnover margin (7.8), turnovers forced (20.1) and steals (10.2). WVU ranks third in scoring margin (15.3), fifth in offensive rebounds (14.3), 16th in assists (16.7) and 18th in scoring offense (82.1).
- Baylor's 29 turnovers were the most forced by WVU in a league game in 24 years (30 vs. St. Bonaventure in 1992).
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 27.0 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU has nearly forced more turnovers (724) than its opponents have made field goals (808).
- WVU has attempted 369 more shots than its opponents this season -- 2,273 to 1,904.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 79 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 31 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 35 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 52 of the last 55 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 55 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- This is WVU's second longest streak of ranked weeks in the AP poll, behind 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.
- The Mountaineers have won 60 of their last 61 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 181-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 70 of its last 72 and 126 of its last 137 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 58 times under Bob Huggins (347 games).
- West Virginia is 61-4 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 178-32 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 186-19 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 157-11 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 169-33 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 168-40 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 819 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks eighth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 31 of 35 seasons, including 23 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 35 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.5 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 66 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.

Scouting Gonzaga

- No. 2 Gonzaga is 34-1 overall and finished 17-1 in the West Coast Conference.
- The Bulldogs were 9-0 on the road and 10-0 on neutral courts this season.
- Gonzaga's only loss was a 79-71 defeat at home to BYU on Feb. 25.
- Mark Few, a 1987 graduate of Oregon, is 500-112 in his 18th season at Gonzaga.

Series Record Against Gonzaga

- West Virginia and Gonzaga will meet for the fourth time in all-time series play that began in 2012.
- The first meeting took place in the first round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament in Pittsburgh with the Zags winning 77-54.
- The two teams then opened the 2013 season in Spokane with Gonzaga winning 84-50.
- The last meeting took place on Dec. 10, 2013 in Morgantown, an 80-76 Gonzaga victory.
- Bob Huggins was 1-1 against Gonzaga while at Cincinnati. His top-ranked Bearcats defeated Gonzaga, 75-68, in the 1999
 Gatorade Rock-N-Roll Shootout. Gonzaga defeated UC, 74-69, in the first round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament.
- WVU is 3-6 against current members of the West Coast Conference: BYU (I-1), Gonzaga (0-3), Pacific (I-0), Pepperdine (0-1), Portland (I-0) and Santa Clara (0-1).

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,730-1,067 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 28 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 20 times, including an
 amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 13 years, WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in 2017 & 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012,
 NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had II first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America
 first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in
 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former
 Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former
 Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15). The Ark (1916-27). Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was dosed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

NCAA Tournament Notebook

- West Virginia is making its 28th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, dating back to 1955.
- The Mountaineers are 29-27 all-time in NCAA Tournament play.
- The Mountaineers made their second Final Four appearance in 2010. The other was in 1959, led by the great Jerry West. WVU advanced to the national championship game, falling to California, 71-70.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in seven of its last 11 NCAA Tournament appearances (2017, 2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005 and 1998)
- West Virginia is 23-11 in postseason games (10 NCAA and 3 NIT) in its last 13 appearances.
- In 2010, WVU defeated No. 15 Morgan State, No. 10 Missouri, No. 11 Washington and No. 1 Kentucky to win the East Region. The Mountaineers fell to Duke in the Final Four.
- In 2015, WVU defeated No. 12 Buffalo and No. 4 Maryland before falling to No. 1 Kentucky in the NCAA Sweet 16.
- Combining the NCAA Tournament and the NIT, WVU is 50-43 all-time in 44 postseason appearances.

Huggins in Division I Postseason Tournaments

- Bob Huggins is coaching in his 28th Division I postseason appearance and his 31st appearance overall in his 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins is making his 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance (one at Akron, 14 at Cincinnati and eight at WVU).
- He made 14 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances at Cincinnati from 1992-2005.
- Huggins led his 1992 Cincinnati team and 2010 West Virginia team to the Final Four. He has appeared in the NCAA Elite Eight four times (1992, 1993, 1996 and 2010) and NCAA Sweet 16 eight times (four at West Virginia).
- Huggins is 31-22 in NCAA Division I tournament games and 34-28 in Division I postseason games.

Recap

West Virginia likes these trips to Buffalo, New York. In 2010, its journey to the Final Four began in Buffalo, and in 2017, the Mountaineers deposited fifth-seeded Notre Dame, 83-71, in an NCAA Tournament second round game.

West Virginia rode the hot outside shooting of guard Jevon Carter, who scored 24 on eight of 15 shooting, and Daxter Miles Jr., whose 18 came on five of eight shooting.

West Virginia (28-8) led from wire to wire, the Mountaineers' fullcourt pressure defense forcing Notre Dame to turn the ball over 14 times and never really allowing the Irish to get into an offensive rhythm.

Bonzie Colson led all scorers with 27 points. Colson hit 10 of 15 from the field, including four of five from 3, but he wasn't much of a factor on the defensive end of the floor once he picked up his fourth foul with 9:47 remaining and Notre Dame trailing by nine.

After an early flurry from Notre Dame to begin the second half, West Virginia kept its margin in a comfortable eight-to-nine-point range.

Two Steve Vasturia free throws pulled the Irish to within seven before Esa Ahmad answered with a big 3 from the corner to push the advantage back to 10 with 5:43 left.

Colson banged another 3 with 4:32 remaining to make it 68-61, but again the Mountaineers answered when Elijah Macon followed up Carter's miss with 3:58 to go.

Notre Dame (26-10) then got it to six on a Matt Ryan 3 before Carter responded with the biggest basket of the game with 2:35 to go, a pretty step-back 3 from the left wing.

The Mountaineers also took care of business at the free throw line, making all 11 of its attempts in the first half and converting 21 of 26 for the game.

Notre Dame was deadly from the free throw line hitting all 17 of its

Tarik Phillip scored 12 while Ahmad and Macon contributed 11 each. West Virginia set the tone by scoring the first 10 points of the

game and led by 11 twice in the first half, at 15-4 and then later at 26-15. Notre Dame missed its first five shots, made nine of its next 15 but finished the first half hitting one basket over its remaining 4:31 - that coming when Carter goal-tended Rex Pflueger's driving layup attempt.

Tarik Phillip scored 16 points, including six straight from the free throw line inside of a minute to play, to help fourth-seeded West Virginia hold off 13th-seed Bucknell, 86-80, in an NCAA Tournament first-round game at KeyBank Center in Buffalo.

West Virginia (27-8) jumped out to an early 15-point lead, 27-12, when Lamont West's drive to the basket capped a 13-0 run.

But Bucknell (26-9) was able to hang around because of the inside scoring of 6-foot-9-inch, 230-pound, junior center Nana Foulland and the outside shooting of sophomore guard Kimbel Mackenzie.

Two Mackenzie free throws reduced Bucknell's deficit to eight, 29-21, and the Bison eventually got it down to three, 36-33, on an Avi Toomer layup with 3:24 remaining.

For the remainder of the first half West Virginia held the Bison scoreless.

A Brandon Watkins follow-up basket gave the Mountaineers a 39-33 lead, and West completed the half with a driving layup off a steal from Jevon Carter.

The Mountaineers began the second half going inside to Elijah Macon, who scored close to the goal while being fouled by Foulland. His three-point play pushed WVU's advantage to 12, 45-33, but immediately Bucknell scored seven straight to make it a five-point game.

An Esa Ahmad tip-in basket, a Macon jumper and then a West 3 pushed the margin back to 11, 52-41, with 16:40 remaining.

Again, Bucknell battled back to outscore the Mountaineers 16-8 over the next five minutes to make it a three-point game, 58-55, and requiring Huggins to call timeout.

An important moment in the game came with 9:37 left when Foulland was called for his fourth foul as Carter was making a move to the basket. Foulland sat the next five minutes on the bench as West Virginia was able to build its lead to eight, 76-68, on Carter's 3 - West Virginia's final field goal of the game.

Following Carter's 3, Phillip took over at the line by getting free throws to go down at 1:00, at :41 and :26 to keep the margin a reasonably comfortable three-possession game.

Thomas Walkup scored 33 points to lead 14th-seeded Stephen F. Austin to a 70-56 victory over No. 3-seed West Virginia in a NCAA First Round game at Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

"If you wrote down how to lose a game, you could probably check off just about everything that you wrote down, and that's not taking anything away from Stephen F. Austin," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "I love (Stephen F. Austin coach) Brad (Underwood) to death, and Brad's done a great job with that bunch - and they played their butts off - but you could probably make a list and check it off and say, yeah, (West Virginia) did all those things."

After trailing by nine, 20-11, early in the first half, Stephen F. Austin took control of the game just minutes later by running as many as three defenders at WVU forward Devin Williams when he got the ball in the paint, and then overplaying the passing lanes which led to several Mountaineer turnovers and transition basket opportunities.

Back-to-back threes by Demetrious Floyd and Clide Geffrard reduced West Virginia's lead to three, and the Lumberjacks eventually took the lead, 27-26, on two Walkup free throws, the result of a technical foul called on Nathan Adrian when he got tangled up with C.J. Williams under the basket after Floyd made a baseline jumper.

Later, Floyd also got a transition three to go down to cap a first half that saw the Lumberjacks outscore the Mountaineers 21-8 over the remaining 11:28 to take a 31-28 advantage into the locker room.

West Virginia fought back to make it a three-point game with 10 minutes remaining on a Williams basket, but the Lumberjacks answered with free throws from Cameron, and then a big three from Lansani Johnson with 8:31 remaining.

Another three from Johnson a minute later extended SFA's lead to nine, and Walkup got the SFA advantage to double digits once again with more free throws at 6:40

The Lumberjacks' biggest lead was 16 with 1:08 to go on a Geffrard

The Mountaineers shot just 30.8 percent from the floor, were unable to convert the numerous transition basket chances they had, turned the basketball over 22 times and were whistled for 27 fouls. including two technicals

West Virginia experienced across-the-board shooting woes with the exception of freshman forward Esa Ahmad, who made three of four from the floor for 10 points - all of his scoring coming in the first half. Ahmad played 18 minutes, but only saw abbreviated action in the second half.

WVU concludes its season with a 26-9 record, tying for the fifthmost victories in a season in school history.

West Virginia's NCAA Tournament run ended in Cleveland, Ohio.

Kentucky showed why it is the top-seeded team in the tournament
with a convincing 78-39 victory over the Mountaineers at Quicken Loans
Arena.

West Virginia, making its first Sweet 16 appearance since beating Kentucky to reach the Final Four in 2010, saw first hand why the Wildrats are the best defensive team in the country.

The Wildcats came into tonight's game allowing opposing teams to shoot just 35.1 percent from the floor. The Mountaineers shot 24.1 percent.

West Virginia scored 39 points – tying the 39 it scored against Cincinnati in 2008 as the second fewest points scored in a game in the last 54 years.

Trey Lyles led five double-figure scorers with 14 points, Andrew Harrison scored 13, brother Aaron Harrison, Devin Booker and Dakari Johnson had 12 each.

Kentucky (37-0) began the game on an 18-2 run before a second Juwan Staten jumper ended West Virginia's scoreless drought with 11:18 remaining in the half. It was originally called a 3 but was later changed to a 2 when officials reviewed a replay of the shot when there was a stoppage of play.

Forward Jonathan Holton followed with a lay up to give West Virginia its only consecutive baskets of the first half.

After a Holton free throw reduced Kentucky's lead to 20-7, the Wildcats went on another 14-4 flurry to push its lead to 23, 34-11, with 5:21 to go.

Dakari Johnson's jumper with 1:52 left gave Kentucky its biggest lead of the first half at 27.

In the second half, it was more of the same – West Virginia finding it difficult to get anything close to the rim and settling for hurried shots late in the shot clock. It wasn't until II:42 left that Jevon Carter finally ended the Mountaineers' second-half field goal drought with a driving layup.

Staten led West Virginia with 14 points. The Mountaineers' other senior in the game, Gary Browne, scored one point and pulled down four rebounds.

Williams scored 16 points and grabbed 10 rebounds and West Virginia's press produced 15 steals and 23 Maryland turnovers in a 69-59 victory at Nationwide Arena in the NCAA Championship Third Round.

After leading by one at halftime, West Virginia began to take control of the game midway through the second half when senior guard Gary Browne hit back-to-back 3s, and then Williams followed with a monster dunk.

Maryland guard Melo Trimble answered with a 3 to reduce West Virginia's lead to three, 45-42, and Dez Wells added another basket inside to make it a one-point game, 45-44.

But shortly after that, Trimble, who finished with a team-high 15 points, got kicked in the back of the head by one of his own players while leaping to try and intercept a pass and he spent the remainder of the game with his hands on his head sitting on Maryland's bench.

Tarik Phillip and Wells exchanged baskets and then the Mountaineers began to methodically build their lead, first to three when Williams got one to go down in the paint, then to five when Phillip followed up his own miss and then to nine with 7:15 remaining on a pair of Daxter Miles Jr. driving layups.

Maryland went more than six minutes without a field goal before Evan Smotrycz made a 3 with 4:51 left to end the drought.

That was the dosest Maryland (28-7) could get for the remainder of the game.

In the first half, West Virginia was able to get off 11 more shots, grab nine offensive rebounds and turn Maryland over nine times. However, the Terps were able to stick around because of transition baskets, either by hitting open 3s from the wing or by going to the rim.

Five different Terrapin players made 3s in the first half and Maryland shot 6 of 9 from behind the arc for 66.7 percent while West Virginia was just 4 of 13 from 3 and 12 of 33 overall from the field.

The Mountaineers' biggest lead of the first half was six, 16-10, after Staten made one of two from the line while Maryland's biggest lead of the first half was four, 31-27, when Trimble could only get one of his two free throws to go down. WVU used a 7-3 run over the remaining 3:22 of the half to take a 35-34 lead into the locker room at intermission.

Notebook

 The Mountaineers, who have won 24 out of 38 all-time against Maryland, will be making their sixth Sweet 16 appearance since 1998 and the third under Huggins.

West Virginia was able to hold off pesky Buffalo, 68·62, in an NCAA Tournament Second Round game at Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio.

The Mountaineers (24-9) got 17 points and nine rebounds from forward Devin Williams and 15 points from guard Juwan Staten to win their first NCAA Tournament game since 2011.

Staten, who missed the last four games with knee and groin injuries, looked like the Juwan Staten of old, particularly in the first half when he scored 10 points to help West Virginia build a double-digit halftime lead.

West Virginia jumped on Buffalo from the opening tip and never trailed the MAC champions, leading by as many as 13 points midway through the first half.

But Buffalo (23-10) was able to stay in the game by getting transition baskets once the Bulls were able to break West Virginia's full-court pressure defense. An Xavier Ford 3 from the wing in transition reduced the Mountaineers' lead to five, 29-24, and then a pair of Justin Moss free throws made it a three-point game with 4:25 left in the half.

From there, West Virginia scored seven straight points - three of those coming from Jaysean Paige on a 3 and then four straight from Staten to conclude the half.

Buffalo scored the first seven points of the second half to reduce West Virginia's lead to three, 36-33, before Williams ended West Virginia's scoring drought with a conventional three-point play near the basket.

Buckets by Williams, Miles and Williams once again built the lead back to 10.

A Ford 3 from the wing with 5:40 left made it a five-point game, 59-54, and then a layup by Lamonte Bearden and a three-point play from Ford pulled the Bulls to within one, 60-59.

After Staten's driving basket made it 62-59 with 2:57 to go, Buffalo tied it 15 seconds later when Ford got his third triple to go down.

Williams responded with two free throws for West Virginia, and then Moss' shot attempt close to the basket was unsuccessful and Williams rebounded his miss with 1:40 to go.

West Virginia, choosing to spread the floor and run dock, held the ball until Gary Browne was forced to take a contested 3 from the wing with 1:06 remaining. Buffalo couldn't secure Browne's miss and Williams was able to get his hand on the ball long enough for Browne to call timeout with 1:02 to go.

Staten pitched to Tarik Phillip and he arched a shot high enough to get over the defender and accurate enough to sail through the hoop with 28 seconds remaining, giving the Mountaineers a five-point lead.

A Browne free throw in the final seconds secured the victory.







Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on fourof-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Knonate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead 19th-ranked West Virginia to a 107-66 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the WVU Coliseum.

The Delta Devils led briefly, 3·2, on an Isaac Williams 3, but the Mountaineers had this one in hand by the 15-minute mark of the first half, leading 21-7.

"I thought we came out and played with a lot of energy and played pretty well early and in the second half we decided we were done for the day," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

At halftime, the margin swelled to 64:28 and for a while it looked like West Virginia might challenge the Coliseum record for points scored, that coming against Alaska-Fairbanks on November 25, 1994 when the Mountaineers put 132 on the Nanocks, but WVU hit a lull at the six-minute mark and remained stuck on 96 points for more than three

"I understand it's hard to play when you're up by 40 at halftime or whatever it was, but all we talked about at halftime was get better," said Huggins. "And we talked about was where they were entering the ball, how they were entering the ball, how we can do a better job, can we work on this in the second half? But we didn't."

Teyvon Myers eventually scored the team's 100th point with 2:22 left.

Huggins once again substituted liberally, particularly in the second half and usually following mistakes, with all 13 players dressed getting significant minutes

In the season-opening blowout win against Mount St. Mary's, 11 different players got into the scoring column. This time, it was 12, with WVU also getting double-digit efforts from Myers and Lamont West (12 each) and 10 from Esa Ahmad and Jevon Carter.

"I know I'm playing a lot of people and I'm playing a lot of combinations and our deal was we are going to play more people than anybody else and be fresher than everybody else and we gave up nine layups and a tip-in in the second half," noted Huggins. 'That's uncalled for and it didn't happen in the first half when we were chasing them

Mississippi Valley State committed 26 turnovers which translated into 34 points for the Mountaineers.

An announced crowd of 7,807 attended the game.

Bob Huggins said after the first two games that he wanted a full 40 minutes from his 19th-ranked WVU men's basketball team.

He got it against New Hampshire.

West Virginia smothered the Wildcats with a suffocating full-court press and some accurate 3-point shooting to roll to a 100-41 victory at the WVU Coliseum in the opening game of the NIT Season Tip-Off in front of 8.842.

"I thought our rotations were really good, it's a hard matchup for them - they're a half-court team that likes to run a lot of sets and Bill (Herrion) does a great job of coaching them," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, now six wins shy of becoming just the ninth coach in NCAA Division I history to achieve 800 career victories. "That pressure keeps mounting and mounting and mounting and I like what we did today."

West Virginia (3-0) used a 24-4 run early in the first half to build an insurmountable 46-20 halftime lead. In the second half, the Mountaineers kept their foot on the pedal as Huggins used every player he had available.

Six different players reached double figures, led by sophomore forward Esa Ahmad's career-high-tying 14 points.

"We've been on him pretty good kind of revving the motor up a little more and I thought he played a lot harder today," said Huggins. "When he's running the floor and getting a full head of steam he's probably going to finish it over most people."

Freshman forward Lamont West contributed 13, Jevon Carter and Nathan Adrian 12 each, 11 by Teyvon Myers and 10 from Tarik Phillip.

The backups even got into the act, freshman guard Chase Harler scoring nine, backup guards James Long and Beetle Bolden contributing six each and freshman center Logan Routt recording a late tip-in basket for his first career points as a Mountaineer.

Overall, WVU's bench outscored UNH's 50-10.

The only unresolved matter was if West Virginia was going to set a school record for forced turnovers established in 2014 with 36 against VMI.

New Hampshire finished two shy of that with 34. West Virginia shot 54.4 percent overall, and 46.8 percent from 3, making 15 of 32.

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

"It feels good to win any time," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Bardays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Maverick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists.

West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down.

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers.

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory.

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa Ahmad 3.

Another 3, this one by Daxter Miles Jr. from NBA range, pulled WVU to within two, 62-60, and Teyvon Myers tied the game at 62 on a driving lavup.

Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in dose.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enenchionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up short.

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 14.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Enenchionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining.

Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3-point arc (10 of 19).

Recap

Esa Ahmad made all seven of his field goal attempts to lead 25th-ranked West Virginia with 19 points as the Mountaineers cruised to a 108-61 victory over Manhattan at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 8,190 got to see coach Bob Huggins' entire roster for a good portion of the second half after West Virginia built a $60\cdot27$ halftime lead.

"I thought we played pretty hard and we took better care of the ball for the most part," said Huggins.

The Mountaineer defense forced Manhattan into committing a record 40 turnovers, the Jaspers spreading their miscues across the hoard

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points, Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 11 and James Long came off the bench to score 10 in just eight minutes of action.

"James Long he's given so much to our program," said Huggins. "He gets other guys in the gym and he's got such a great work ethic so it was great to be able to get him in a little bit in the first half and play as much as he did in the second half."

All 15 players who got into the game scored and 62 of the team's 108 points came from the bench.

Ahmad, coming off a 19-point performance to Temple, continued his strong play. He has made 15 of his last 20 field goal attempts in career-high-duplicating performances.

"He gets better all the time, we've just got pushing up those expectations and try to keep that motor running that way all the time," said Huggins. "We all know he's a talented guy and I really think he's got a great advantage in this league being a 6-foot-7 three-man because there aren't very many of them."

WVU shot 47.3 percent for the game and also hit 30 of 43 from the free throw line for 69.8 percent, an improvement over the 60.5 percent the team was shooting coming into tonight's game.

Manhattan got 11 points from Xavier Peart.

- WVU's 40 forced turnovers were the most by any Division I team since 2007.

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14.

WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Notebook

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesvile for the first time since 1975.

Recap

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Daxter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Knonate) gets 13. We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready.

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins. "We make people play. (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when you're constantly throwing the ball backwards."

Recap

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense eventually wore down VMI and the 15th-ranked Mountaineers cruised to their eighth victory of the season, 90-55, at the WVU Coliseum.

The win against 1-7 VMI was never in doubt, but the Keydets did hang around longer than most people expected.

VMI trailed by just five, 22-17 with 7:36 remaining in the first half and then by six with 4:34 left. Then, early in the second half the Keydets got a conventional three-point play from Will Miller to pull within 12.

The Mountaineers (8-1) were slow dosing out on defense, allowing VMI to convert eight 3s, permitted the much smaller Keydets to grab 13 offensive rebounds, missed several layups and was just 26 of 42 from the free throw line.

But eventually, the constant pressure got to VMI as West Virginia's lead swelled to 20 at the 10-minute mark, and then to 30 with 6:34 to

WVU's biggest lead was 38 with 3:16 remaining.

Guard Daxter Miles Jr. made 5 of 6 from 3 and finished with a game-high 20 points. The junior became the first Mountaineer player to edipse the 20-point barrier in 2016-17.

Esa Ahmad recovered from a poor first half to finish with12, and senior forward Brandon Watkins came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 17 minutes of action. That was his second career double-double.

Those three players combined to score 21 points, grab 18 rebounds and block four shots.

Freshman guard James "Beetle" Bolden finished with 9 points on three 3s, getting some extended work with the ones, including a second

West Virginia once again dominated all of the specialty statistics, including a 27-3 advantage in points off of turnovers, a 34-9 edge in second-chance points and a 44-28 advantage in points off the bench.

Twelve different Mountaineer players got into the scoring column. Q.J. Peterson led VMI with 17 points.

The Keydets turned the ball over 22 times.

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67.

Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino,

Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball.

Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players

Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches. rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony.

As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor.

The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame.

With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction.

Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakaway dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic hustle play.

Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points.

The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers.

UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

Esa Ahmad scored 17 points in 24 minutes of action to power 11th-ranked West Virginia to an 84-57 victory over Radford at the WVU

West Virginia (10-1) used a 23-0 run to build a 32 point first-half lead the Highlanders nearly having more turnovers than points scored (22 points to 21 turnovers) at the break.

WVU shot 58.8 percent from the floor, including 60 percent from 3 in the first half, but those numbers fell off considerably in the second half as Huggins continued to use different players.

"The guys that we started, I thought they went out and were walking around so I took them out and put some other guys in and they weren't a whole lot better," said Huggins. "The game has a way of getting even with you when you approach it the wrong way. We went on that big run and we thought the game was over and kind of quit playing.

Radford (4-7) actually outscored West Virginia in the second half, 35-31, grabbed two more rebounds than the much taller Mountaineers, led by Sterling Christy's game-high 10 boards, and overall the Highlanders had a 40-37 edge on the glass for the game.

"I don't know if it was effort or a lack of focus," said Huggins. "We boxed out and stood and then went and got it. We made an effort to block out sometimes."

West Virginia's big advantages were in points in the paint (46-8) and points off of turnovers (41-10). Bench scoring, which has been a staple all season for the Mountaineers, was just plus-eight (33-25).

Jevon Carter contributed 15 and Tarik Phillip led the reserves with

Overall, West Virginia shot 49.2 percent from the floor but just 48.4 percent from the free throw line.

"When you miss free throws, when you fumble the ball - which we fumbled countless balls, when you miss layups you're not ready to play,'

Radford was worse, hitting just 42.1 percent of its free throw tries. Justin Cousin scored 12 and Caleb Tanner scored 10 for Radford, which is coached by Mike Jones, who spent one year on John Beilein's WVU coaching staff in 2003.

An announced crowd of 8,311 watched the game.

West Virginia improved to 6-0 all-time against Radford. Five of those meetings have come in Morgantown.

West Virginia trailed by eight early in the game but was able to flip that around by halftime, leading by seven at the break.

"They did a good job of throwing the ball out of traps," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "They probably did a best job distributing the ball out of traps than anybody's done all year. When you've got two against one you're supposed to really bother that guy but we didn't bother him much."

WVU used a 14-4 run to begin the second half to build its lead to 17, 48-31, at the first media stoppage and then got its margin to 20 points at the 10-minute mark.

Northern Kentucky (9-4) made a mini run to reduce West Virginia's lead to 15, 67-52, but senior Brandon Watkins answered with a pair of free throws to begin another 9-1 spurt to make it a 23-point contest.

Teyvon Myers added 13 off the bench and WVU got 12 from starting forward Esa Ahmad and 11 from starting guard Jevon Carter to improve

West Virginia shot 51.6 percent from the field for the game and forced 25 turnovers.

Northern Kentucky got 12 points from Carson Williams and 10 each from Layone Holland II and Brennan Gillis.

Center Drew McDonald, the team's leading scorer averaging better than 17 points per game, failed to score.

"A hard-earned win," said Huggins. "They do a good job. They've

done a great job going into places and winning. They've got nine wins." An announced crowd of 10,197 watched the game.

Eleventh-ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams.

With the exception Lucas N'Guessan's dunk to begin the game. Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor.

Forte led Oklahoma State with 18

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation. Macon was a late scratch after suffering a knee injury in the win against Northern Kentucky.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players - Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West - added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better-than-usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe.

Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7. Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7.

The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61. West Virginia.

Some late 3s from Forte kept the margin under 20.

Anthony Livingston's 3-point field goal with six seconds left lifted Texas Tech to a 77-76 overtime victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

West Virginia (12-2, 1-1) had trouble stopping Tech's dribble penetration and was also victimized by fouls, the Mountaineers sending the Red Raiders to the free throw line 30 times where they made 20.

Meanwhile, WVU didn't help itself when it got to the foul line, West Virginia converting just 13 out of 24 for 54.2 percent.

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense turned Tech over just 13 times - one fewer than the Mountaineers' 14 for the game.

The Red Raiders shot 51 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 3-point distance.

There were 21 lead changes with the game's biggest lead being seven points - that by West Virginia with 17:13 to go when Daxter Miles Jr. converted a driving layup off a feed from Nathan Adrian. But Texas Tech erased that within a span of five minutes when the Mountaineers went ice cold from the floor.

Texas Tech's scoreless spell came near the end of regulation after Justin Gray's layup with 2:20 left put the Red Raiders ahead by five.

Lamont West's two free throws reduced Tech's lead to three, and then Adrian banged in a 3 with seven seconds left to tie the game at

Shadell Millinghaus tried to win it for Tech in regulation but his 3 was off the mark just ahead of the horn.

In overtime, missed free throws by Tarik Phillip, Miles Jr., Esa Ahmad and Adrian - six in all - kept Tech in position to get the upset.

Two Jevon Carter free throws pushed West Virginia's lead to three, 70-67, but two at the other end by Aaron Ross and then a turnaround jumper by Smith gave the lead back to Texas Tech, 71-70.

Ahmad followed with his two misses at the line before Phillip was able to get two to go down with 2:15 left, putting WVU back ahead, 72-71.

Stevenson answered with a 3 - his second - to make it 74-72. Then, Adrian could only get one of two to go down from the line before Phillip followed a Devon Thomas miss with a 3 to put West Virginia ahead, 76-74, with 33 seconds remaining

The Red Raiders came down and worked to get into position for a late shot, with Livingston taking it off a feed from Stevenson.

Carter had a chance to win the game for West Virginia at the other end but he couldn't get his 3 to go down with one second left.

Notebook

It is the first regular season win for the Red Raiders over the Mountaineers since they joined the Big 12 in 2012. Tech's only victory against West Virginia since then came in the first round of the 2013 Big 12 tournament when WVU finished 13-19.

Recap

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 22 points and Jevon Carter banged in three critical 3s during a key stretch late in the second half to lead seventhranked West Virginia to an 82-70 victory over TCU inside the WVU

In a battle of two 12-2 teams both looking to go 2-1 in Big 12 play. the game boiled down to the final 9:47 when West Virginia outscored the Horned Frogs 25-13.

TCU, which trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, and then again by 11 with 13:12 remaining, used a 15-4 run to tie the game at 57 following a Desmond Bane layup with 9:47 to go.

But Miles answered with a layup and Sagaba Konate followed with a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Vlad Brodziansky while scoring near the basket. Konate's free throw pushed West Virginia's advantage to 62-57.

Then three minutes later Carter took control of the game with the Mountaineers leading by just four.

Following a missed jumper by TCU's Alex Robinson, Carter came down on the other end and drilled a 3 from the top of the key. The next time down the floor, following a basket by Bane, Carter drained another. This one put WVU ahead by eight, 71-63.

His third came with 2:52 left to put the Mountaineers ahead by nine, 74-65. Konate followed with another lay in and then a steal by Nathan Adrian led to Miles' 3 from the corner to make it a 15-point game with two minutes to go.

West Virginia (13-2, 2-1) used an 18-9 run over the remaining six minutes by holding the Horned Frogs to just three field goals during that stretch of time.

Overall, TCU committed 18 miscues leading to 28 West Virginia points - a deciding factor in the game.

Esa Ahmad added 16 points on seven-of-11 shooting, while Carter and Konate contributed 13 points each. For Konate, who also grabbed eight rebounds coming off the bench, it was a season high in scoring for him.

Adrian, despite scoring just four points, was also a big contributor in the victory by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds, handing out five assists and making two steals. He played a team-high 34 minutes.

Robinson led TCU with 17 points on three-of-nine shooting. Brodziansky added 14 on five-of-six shooting.

Overall, the Horned Frogs made 46.2 percent from the floor and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line - attempting seven more free throws and making eight more than the Mountaineers (nine-of-14).

An announced crowd of 12,568 watched the game.

Baylor, which reached No. 1 in both major polls a day earlier for the first time in school history, ran into "Press" Virginia in Morgantown and the 10th-ranked Mountaineers ran away with a surprisingly easy 89-68 victory over the Bears.

It was the second consecutive year West Virginia has knocked off No. 1 at home in January. In 2015-16, it was top-ranked Kansas which succumbed to the Mountaineers, 74-63.

Nathan Adrian scored a career-high 22 points, grabbed six rebounds, made three steals and handed out two assists in a terrific allaround performance. The Morgantown High graduate made seven-of-10 from the field, knocked down a pair of 3s and also hit six-of-nine from the free throw line in one of the best all-around efforts.

Carter, too, stepped up and played wonderfully by scoring 17, handing out seven assists and producing a game-high five steals. Carter hounded Baylor's guards the entire night and was a major reason why the Bears turned the ball over a staggering 29 times.

Eight of the 11 players who got into the game for Baylor had multiple turnovers, including six by forward Ishmail Wainright.

West Virginia (14-2, 3-1) led Baylor (15-1, 3-1) throughout, and the Mountaineers had plenty of chances to extend their lead in the first half. but the Bears stuck around by beating West Virginia on the glass. The rebounding disparity was 12 in the Baylor's favor, and that minimized to some extent the 16 turnovers they committed in the first 20 minutes of

The Mountaineers began the game strong and took an early 11-point lead before Baylor began chipping away, gradually reducing its deficit to four with 2:31 remaining.

In the second half, Baylor scored first on a Wainright layup but Watkins answered with a jumper. Another Watkins jumper pushed the lead to nine and soon it was 13 on a quick 7-0 spurt, capped by a pair of Esa Ahmad layups.

A Watkins dunk made it 57-43, and then a Tarik Phillip jumper with 9:36 remaining gave West Virginia a 15 point advantage. A Miles Jr. follow-up dunk pushed the margin to 21, but he was called for a technical foul for hanging on the rim, giving Baylor free throws at the other end.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 26 points, twice, before Huggins began emptying his bench.

A sellout crowd of 14,632 watched the game.

Recap

Jordan Woodard's driving layup with 2.5 seconds left in overtime gave Oklahoma an 89-87 come-from-behind victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum.

Woodard, who led the Sooners with 20 points, missed a free throw with three seconds left that could have won it in regulation. But he sure made up for it in overtime.

With nine minutes remaining it looked like WVU was well on its way to a double-digit victory when Jevon Carter's driving layup gave it a

But then Oklahoma scored nine straight before Carter's basket ended the dry spell with seven minutes to go. A Woodard traditional three-point play a minute later got the OU deficit to three, and eventually Rashard Odomes tied it at 69 with 4:25 left.

But West Virginia rebuilt it to four twice, 73-69 and 75-71, before Woodard took over the game by going right at and then past the Mountaineer defense. His driving basket with 2:10 to go pulled the Sooners to within two, and he tied it with 45 seconds remaining on another dribble-drive to the hoop.

Carter answered at the other end with 21 seconds left to give WVU a 77-75 lead, but once more, Oklahoma got the ball into Woodard's hands and he got close enough to the rim to get his short baseline jumper to go down. He was fouled by Esa Ahmad while doing so.

Woodard's free throw to win the game bounced off the rim and Adrian's desperation heave sailed out of bounds at the end regulation after Huggins had called timeout to draw up a play in case Woodard made his foul shot.

In overtime, West Virginia got the lead to four, 85-81, but couldn't hold onto it at the free throw line and also couldn't stop Woodard whenever had the hall

West Virginia simply couldn't convert free throws at crunch time, missing five of seven at one point and finished the overtime period just four out of nine. Overall, West Virginia missed 11 out of 29 for 62.1 percent.

With 2:02 left, Daxter Miles Jr. missed one of two; with 1:14 on the clock and West Virginia leading 86-85, Ahmad missed both attempts and then trailing 87-86. Carter rimmed out the first of two. His second one tied the game eight seconds left, but Woodard easily got to the basket to score the game's deciding bucket.

Oklahoma had little difficulty handling West Virginia's pressure, OU turning the ball over just 12 times - one less than WVU's 13.

Notebook

The loss spoiled an outstanding offensive night for Carter, who led West Virginia with a season-high 23 points. Adrian contributed 14 and Elijah Macon came off the bench to score a season-high 13.

All five Kansas State starters scored double figures and the Wildcats overcame a 12-point first half deficit to defeat seventh-ranked West Virginia 79-75 at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan, Kansas.

Sophomore point guard Jamau Stokes matched Barry Brown for team scoring honors with 15 points.

D.J. Johnson added 14 while Wesley Iwandu and Dean Wade contributed 13 apiece.

West Virginia, now 15-4, 4-3, was unable to hold on to a doubledigit lead for the second straight game; WVU led Oklahoma by 15 points in the second half before falling, 89-87, in overtime.

"We haven't had that edge and we need to get that edge back," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

The defense once again struggled to get stops in the second half and West Virginia also turned the ball over a season-high 23 times.

Three different players had four turnovers and six had at least two bobbles

After missing its first six shots of the game, West Virginia made seven of its next nine and eventually took a 12-point lead, which it enjoyed on three different occasions in the first half, before K-State scored 10 straight over the remaining 1:13 to reduce the Mountaineers' lead to two at halftime, 38-36.

The Wildcats took control of the game midway through the second half when they led by 11. But West Virginia responded by scoring 12 of the next 13 points over a three-minute span to retake the lead on Tarik Phillip's traditional three-point play with 5:07 left.

The two teams exchanged points before layups by Wesley Iwundu, Jamau Stokes and Iwandu put the Wildcats ahead, 73-68, with 2:18 to go.

Brown managed to take the ball away from Jevon Carter and was fouled by Carter, which led to a free throw to give K-State a six-point margin with 1:49 remaining.

Nathan Adrian's 3 seven seconds later cut it to three, 74-71, but two Brown free throws and a layup gave Kansas State enough room to collect its 15th victory of the year.

Kansas State shot a sizzling 54 percent in the second half, had a 25-15 advantage in points off turnovers and outscored the Mountaineers, 40-28, in the paint.

Phillip came off the bench to lead West Virginia with 20 points. West Virginia shot 41.8 percent for the game, but converted just 44 percent of its field goal attempts inside the 3-point line.

West Virginia had its five-game winning streak against the Wildcats snapped, including its two-game winning streak at Bramlage Coliseum.

Recap

Esa Ahmad started the night off with an emphatic baseline tomahawk dunk and then continued to throw down dunks in leading the 18th-ranked Mountaineers to a resounding 85-69 victory over Kansas, ranked No. 1 in the Coaches' poll and No. 2 in the .AP poll.

From the outset, Ahmad and his teammates brought the crowd to their feet, particularly the final nine minutes of the game after Kansas briefly retook the lead, 59-58, on a Svi Mykhailiuk 3.

Ahmad came right back with that little curl play around the basket that was so successful all night, scoring once again against Jackson.

Following Ahmad's basket to put West Virginia back ahead, 60-59, Macon contributed one of two from the free throw line and then another freshman, West Virginia's Lamont West, banged in a big 3 from the corner to make it a five-point game with 7:56 remaining.

A Josh Jackson flying tomahawk reduced the lead to three, 64-61, with 7:11 to go before Ahmad answered once more with a pair of free

Two more Macon free throws extended West Virginia's lead to seven, 68-61, and yet another Ahmad close one pushed the lead to

A Landen Lucus dunk - his only two points of the game - stopped the West Virginia spurt momentarily.

But Daxter Miles Jr., with the shot dock winding down to three, got a nifty shot from the baseline to go down, freshman Sagaba Konate followed with a thunderous dunk in transition and then Miles hit the dagger from the corner with 1:57 left.

That put WVU ahead by 12, and everyone in the building could sense the Kansas players waiving the white flag. Free throws by Tarik Phillip and Miles preceded a Jevon Carter 3 with 28 seconds remaining to give West Virginia its biggest lead of the game at 19, 85-66.

Nathan Adrian contributed 11 points, five rebounds, two assists. a block and a steal in 29 minutes of action, while Miles Jr. and Phillip

Devonte' Graham, who burned West Virginia for 27 points in the 2016 Big 12 Championship game, scored 17 on six of 10 shooting.

Frank Mason III, averaging 20.1 points per game heading into the game, scored 15 but managed just six of 16 shooting.

Overall, Kansas shot 42.4 percent from the floor and just 40 percent from the free throw line (6 of 15).

Notebook

- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by least 15 points each in a single season.
- It is also the first time Kansas has lost four consecutive games in the same arena since it joined the Big 12 in 1996.

Recap

The issues West Virginia had in recent losses against Oklahoma and Kansas State showed up once again against Texas A&M, but the 18th-ranked Mountaineers were able to overcome them to defeat the Aggies, 81-77, in the opening game of the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

Poor decision making, defensive lapses and an inability to throw the basketball into the ocean from the free throw line in the second half almost caused a 13-point meltdown in the game's remaining 2:36, but Esa Ahmad finally managed to make two free throws with five seconds left and the Mountaineers leading by just two.

There were many moments when the 12.836 who showed to watch this one thought win No. 17 was in the bag:

- * When the lead was 20 with 19:32 to go in the second half
- * When Jevon Carter's 3 ended the team's long scoreless drought with 8:04 left to put the Mountaineers back up by 11
- * When Carter hit another 3 with 2:36 remaining to make it a
- * When Ahmad got his free throw to go in with 1:09 left to once again get the lead to double digits
- * And, finally, when Elijah Macon dunked the ball with 23 seconds left to make it a two-possession game.

But after Macon's breakaway dunk, Hampton's 3 nine seconds later reduced West Virginia's lead to 79-77 with 14 seconds left.

Ahmad was fouled by Tonny Morelos-Trocha with five seconds showing on the clock and he was able to get both free throws to go in avoiding West Virginia's sixth and seventh misses from the line in the

Overall, the Mountaineers hit 12 of their 23 free throw attempts, but missed seven after the break

WVU's poor free throw shooting almost canceled out the 23 turnovers it caused - most of those coming in the first half, including five from sophomore guard Chris Collins.

Gilder led everyone with 24, Davis finished with 19 points and 18 rebounds while Hampton came off the bench to score 21 - 16 of those coming in the second half.

Carter hit two critical second-half 3s for West Virginia and finished with 19. He also grabbed a team-best nine boards.

Ahmad contributed 14 points - 10 of those coming in the first half while Daxter Miles Jr. added 10.

West Virginia (17-4) tried 26 3-point field goal attempts, hitting 11, while Texas A&M finished the afternoon 10 of 21 from behind the arc.

The win gives West Virginia a 12-1 record outside of Big 12 play, and snaps the Mountaineers' six-game losing streak to SEC teams dating back to a victory over Vanderbilt in Puerto Rico in 2011.

Recap

Nathan Adrian was West Virginia's perfect antidote for "Hilton Magic." The senior scored a career-high 23 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to lead the seventh-ranked Mountaineers to an 85-72 victory over Iowa State at Hilton Coliseum.

Adrian made seven of his 10 field goal attempts, including two of three from 3, knocked down seven of eight from the free throw line and his basket right before the first-half buzzer really gave the team a big boost going into the locker room leading by four, 44-40.

In the second half, West Virginia (18-4, 6-3) never trailed as the Mountaineers began taking control of the game at the halfway point.

Adrian grabbed Esa Ahmad's miss and was fouled by Nazareth Mitrou-Long while trying to follow. He made two free throws to put the Mountaineers up six, 56-50, and then his 3-pointer from the corner off a pretty feed from Ahmad got the lead to seven with 10:26 remaining.

Daxter Miles Jr. answered a Morris jumper with a 3 from the corner to expand the lead to nine, 64-55, and a Teyvon Myers steal led to two free throws and an 11-point advantage.

A Sagaba Konate put-back basket and Jevon Carter's driving layup pushed the lead to 15 with 5:42 to go. The widest margin was 16 points with 49 seconds remaining.

West Virginia knocked down its free throws, hitting 17 of 20, including 15 of 17 in the second half.

Tarik Phillip came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 15, Ahmad contributed 14 and seldom-used freshman guard Beetle Bolden, who has scored just six points in eight prior Big 12 games, came off the bench and scored eight, including a pair of bank shot 3s. He also made a pretty drive to the basket for two.

Preseason Big 12 player of the year Monte Morris had a tough night with Carter mostly guarding him. Morris made just four of 14 from the floor, missing both 3-point attempts, never got to the free throw line and finished with just eight - eight below his season average.

Matt Thomas led Iowa State (13-8, 5-4) with 19, but 13 of those came in the first half. The Cyclones shot just 29 percent from the field in the second half

The loss was lowa State's second-worst loss of the season. lowa beat the Cyclones by 14 back on December 8.

A crowd of 14,384 watched the game.

Recap

Oklahoma State shot a torrid 62.5 percent from the floor to knock off seventh-ranked West Virginia 82-75 at the WVU Coliseum.

After leading by four at halftime, 44-40, the tide began to turn for the Mountaineers midway through the second half when they settled for 3s against Oklahoma State's pack-line defense and the Cowboys were making them pay on the other end.

Then, Davon Dillard's soaring dunk gave the Cowboys a 61-57 lead with 8:44 remaining.

A key sequence came with 5:30 left and the game tied at 64. Jevon Carter stole the basketball underneath Oklahoma State's basket and fed it to freshman forward Lamont West, who took off from the foul line toward the basket.

West was called for an offensive foul and Bob Huggins, reacting to the play, slipped and fell in front of the bench. A technical foul was issued on the West Virginia coach, sending Phil Forte to the line where he made both free throws

The four-point swing in momentum was accentuated four minutes later when Lindy Waters got a 3 to go down from the wing to make it, 74-69, Oklahoma State.

Two Juwan Evans free throws pushed the Cowboy margin to seven with 2:31 left

Two quick scoring bursts, a Tarik Phillip 3 and then a Brandon Watkins dunk, made it a two-point game when Carter was called for a foul on Evans near the sideline. Evans made it a two-possession game when he hit two more free throws with 1:14 showing on the clock.

Despite its torrid shooting, Oklahoma State (15-8, 4-6) won this game from the free throw line, hitting 24 of 27, and on the defensive end of the floor by forcing the Mountaineers to shoot mostly 3s - 20 out of the 28 second-half shots they took came from behind the arc.

WVU made 12 of them for the game (out of 33) - a dramatic departure from the first game back on December 30 when it scored a 17-point victory over the Cowboys in Stillwater.

Jeffrey Carroll led Oklahoma State with 20 points, including 13 of the team's first 15 points to start the game.

Evans finished with 18 and Forte contributed 13

Lamont West scored a career-high 21, 15 of those coming in the first half on five 3s, while Phillip added 15.

West Virginia did not have a starter reach double figures. A sell-out crowd of 14,225 watched the home team get beat on the glass, 30-16.

Notebook

West Virginia's 16 rebounds marked the second-lowest rebounding total in a game in school history.

Recap

Freshman James "Beetle" Bolden scored a career-high 17 points - 15 of those coming in the first half - to lead 13th-ranked West Virginia to a 61-50 victory over struggling Oklahoma at the Lloyd Noble Center in Norman, Oklahoma,

Bolden scored more than half of West Virginia's first half points, including seven in a row at one point when Oklahoma jumped out to an early 11-2 lead.

A Nathan Adrian 3 briefly gave the Mountaineers their first lead of the game, 20-19, a Lamont West 3 gave West Virginia its second lead at 25-23 and then Bolden finished the half with a driving layup ahead of the horn to give WVU a 27-25 advantage.

The second half began like a siege with neither team able to get any points until Tarik Phillip finally ended the drought with a short jumper in the lane after nearly four minutes came off the clock.

West Virginia began to take control of the game at the midway point of the second half. Bolden hit two free throws - his only two points of the second half, Adrian followed with a drive to the basket and Esa Ahmad added a jumper to give the Mountaineers an eight-point

The lead swelled to 10 after another Adrian layup and grew to 13 when Jevon Carter got a 3 to go down with 6:40 remaining.

OU answered with a five-point play. Jordan Shephard made a 3 and West Virginia's Sagaba Konate was called for a foul away from the ball, sending Khadeem Lattin to the line, where he made both free

But from there, Oklahoma could only manage to reduce its deficit to six twice for the remainder of the game.

While Bolden gave West Virginia a big offensive lift in the first half, Konate was the difference in the second half on the defensive end.

The freshman swatted away a season-high five shots and also grabbed four rebounds and scored two points on a pair of late free

Oklahoma, which scored 48 points in the paint in the overtime victory in Morgantown back on January 18, only scored 18 close to the basket, mainly because of Konate's presence.

The only Sooner player to reach double figures was guard Kameron McGusty with 11. Oklahoma turned the ball over 23 times and shot just 33 percent for the game.

The Mountaineers didn't shoot it well either, hitting 20 of 54 for 37 percent. At the end of the first half, Bolden made six of 10 while the rest of the team was only four of 19.

Notehook

The victory, before a crowd estimated at less than 5,000, was West Virginia's first-ever in Norman.

Jevon Carter scored 19 points to lead 13th-ranked West Virginia to an 85-66, foul-marred Big 12 victory over Kansas State.

The 14,074 saw a combined 54 fouls called on both teams, including two technicals issued to West Virginia.

K-State attempted 40 free throws but converted just 27 - several misses coming in one-and-one situations.

West Virginia was able to make up some of that by hitting 17 out of the 21 free throws it attempted.

K-State missed them from the floor, too, shooting 34.8 percent overall and enduring a five-minute field goal drought midway through the second half when West Virginia was finally able to take control of the game.

Leading by seven, 51-44, the Mountaineers got three consecutive layups from Lamont West, Elijah Macon and Teyvon Myers to build their lead to 13.

Another drive to the basket, this one by Tarik Phillip, gave West Virginia a 16-point advantage with 4:48 remaining.

The lead swelled to 19, and then finally to 22 when both benches emptied.

Kansas State, playing without starting center D.J. Johnson, who sprained his ankle, jumped out to an early eight-point lead, and then overcame West Virginia's eight-point advantage to tie the game at halftime 34-34

Neither team shot the ball particularly well in the first half, but the Wildcats did get four 3s to go down and converted four more free throws than the Mountaineers did

However, K-State continued to shoot poorly in the second half while West Virginia found its shooting touch by spreading the floor and taking the basketball to the rim. The Mountaineers made 20 of 34 in the second half for 58.8 percent, mostly on drives to the basket or follow-up makes

WVU had a 21-rebound advantage on the glass, including 13 offensive boards, with Johnson sitting on the bench watching the game in street clothes. Freshman Lamont West and Carter led the way with nine rebounds each for West Virginia.

Esa Ahmad was the only other WVU player to reach double figures in points with 11.

Wesley Iwundu led Kansas State with 14. He also turned the ball over six times.

West Virginia #23 E. Ahmad fouled out with 15 seconds remaining in overtime
West Virginia #12 T. Phillip fouled out with 7.5 seconds left in overtime.

No. 3 Kansas used a 21-7 run over the remaining 2:20 to send the game to overtime, and then outscored ninth-ranked West Virginia 13-9 in the extra session to pull out a near-miraculous 84-80 victory at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas.

Frank Mason III scored 24 points - 16 coming from the free throw line, and Devonte' Graham contributed 18 to help Kansas avoid back-toback losses at home for the first time since 1989.

The Mountaineers, looking to win for the first time ever in Lawrence, was in control of the game leading by 14 points, 64-50, with three minutes remaining.

Then, they self-destructed when Kansas went to a full-court press after Mason's 3 pulled the Jayhawks to within nine, 64-55.

Two Daxter Miles Jr. missed free throws with 2:06 left opened the door for Graham to make it a six-point game, 64-58. However, WVU still appeared to be in good shape with 1:07 to go

when Tarik Phillip got two free throws to go down to make it 69-62.

But Graham's two free throws with 52 seconds left reduced West Virginia's lead to five. Here, Landon Lucas stole the inbound pass and followed Frank Mason's miss to make it a three-point game with 47

Esa Ahmad's two free throws briefly put West Virginia ahead, 71-66, but Graham came down and drilled another 3 with 36 seconds left to make it a two-point game, 71-69.

Another West Virginia turnover, this one by Phillip, led to two Mason free throws with 21 seconds to go.

He made both, knotting the score at 71.

Immediately in overtime, Graham nailed the fourth of his five 3s and another Phillip turnover led to Josh Jackson's driving layup and a five-point lead. That put West Virginia in chase-mode for the remainder

Graham hit his fifth triple to give Kansas an eight-point lead, 79-71, its biggest of the game.

A Teyvon Myers 3 and an Adrian layup got the deficit to two, 82-80, with seven seconds left, but Mason made two more free throws to

West Virginia (20-6, 8-5) began the game on a 10-0 run, led by seven at halftime, and seemingly had things well under control as the clock hit the three-minute mark when Phillip's driving layup made it 64-50.

Notehook

It was also the second time in three years that West Virginia has lost in overtime in Lawrence. In 2015, WVU led by as many as 18 points in the first half before falling, 76-69.

Recap

West Virginia got season-high scoring performances from Jevon Carter and Elijah Macon to outlast game Texas Tech 83-74 in double overtime at the WVU Coliseum.

Texas Tech got a difficult, contested 3-point shot from Keenan Evans with five seconds left to tie the game at 64 in regulation.

Following a West Virginia timeout, Carter's running jumper near the elbow drew the back of the iron to send the game into overtime.

The Mountaineers, which didn't convert a field goal during the final 5:42 of regulation, needed all six free throws they made in the first overtime to extend the game to a second extra session.

In the second overtime, Carter snapped West Virginia's 10-minute field goal drought with a driving layup off the opening tip. Macon, who scored 17 points and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds, got a nifty baseline basket off the glass.

Then, Daxter Miles Jr. made the play of the game when he jumped above everyone to tip in Carter's miss with his left hand.

Miles got another massive put-back with 1:42 to go when he dunked Adrian's close one that wouldn't go down.

This time, West Virginia made its free throws down the stretch - all four coming from Tarik Phillip - to salt away its first overtime victory of the season.

West Virginia wasn't able to close this one out in regulation despite leading by six with 2:44 to go.

Two big missed free throws by Miles Jr. with 2:10 left opened the door for Tech to score a couple of quick baskets and put the pressure back on the Mountaineers. Another miss at the line, this one by Carter with 27 seconds left and West Virginia leading by three, opened the door for Tech to tie it.

The Red Raiders couldn't miss in regulation, shooting 54.5 percent in the first half and then 64.5 percent in the second. But in the two overtime periods Tech hit just two of 15 and missed all four of its 3-point field goal tries.

Carter led everyone with 24 points, hitting eight of 16 from the floor and adding five of eight from the line. His impressive stat line also included seven rebounds, a couple of assists and two steals.

Macon easily played his best game of the year, scoring 17 (one shy of his career high 18 scored against Stetson in 2015) while grabbing a game-high 12 rebounds, a couple key ones coming at the defensive end in overtime.

Recap

Jevon Carter matched his season-high with 24 points and Lamont West came off the bench to score 23 to lead 12th-ranked West Virginia to a 77-62 victory over Texas at the WVU Coliseum in Morgantown on ESPN's Big Monday..

The Mountaineers improved to 22-6 overall, but that was secondary to what happened near the end of the first half when West Virginia coach Bob Huggins went to his knees and grabbed his chest following a timeout.

A hushed silence fell over the 10.460 inside the arena as it took a moment for Huggins to be helped to his feet. He said afterward that he felt light headed and his heart defibrillator went off and it gave him a shock. After communicating with his personal doctor, who was at the game, he continued to coach without any issues.

"I was a little light headed and when the defibrillator goes off it feels like a horse kicks you," Huggins said on his postgame radio show. He said it happened to him once before, "And I didn't like it either time."

After a slow start, Huggins' team used a 21-3 run to turn an early 12-2 deficit into a 16-point advantage with 1:43 remaining in the first half. West was the catalyst, draining five of his seven 3-point attempts to score 20 by halftime.

At the game was Lamont's mother, Tonya, a former star player at Purdue in the mid-1990s. His mother was also here for the Oklahoma State game on February 4 when he scored a then-season-high 21 points.

"We ran a bunch of things for him," Huggins said. "When he made his first couple it was against the zone and they just didn't pay attention to him and then we tried to run some stuff to iso him on the side that Lamont was on and that worked. And then we ran some John Beilein 'football' for him and we ran some stuff we used to run for KJ (Kevin Jones) for him and he just kept making shots."

In the second half, Jevon Carter took over and scored II of his game-high 24, matching the season-high 24 he scored two nights prior against Texas Tech.

The junior guard also grabbed 10 rebounds, handed out four assists and made a steal in 38 minutes of work.

Junior forward Elijah Macon continued his outstanding work with 10 points and a pair of rebounds.

The Longhorns got 17 points and seven rebounds from freshman Jarrett Allen.

Recap

Sometimes you lose pretty and sometimes you lose ugly. West Virginia got one of those never-ugly road wins over desperate TCU at Schollmaier Arena. 61-60.

The game came down to the final possession after Daxter Miles Jr. made one of two free throws with 4.8 seconds left to give the Mountaineers a one-point advantage.

Following a TCU timeout, the Horned Frogs got the ball up the floor to Desmond Bane on the right wing, but his game-winning, 3-point try was wide left as time expired.

WVU shot a depressing 37 percent from the floor, including 21.4 percent from 3, made 10 of 15 from the free throw line and it got hammered on the glass in the first half.

But where the Mountaineers made up the difference was off turnovers (19-10 scoring advantage), bench scoring (plus-11) and shot attempts (65-46) while grabbing 14 offensive rebounds in the second half when WVU was better off kicking it into the basket instead of shooting it.

West Virginia led by nine, 18-9, with 8:27 left in the first half after a Jevon Carter jumper, but poor shooting and turnovers enabled TCU to dose out the first half on an 8-0 run and take a 30-27 halftime lead when Bane got his 3-pointer from the wing to go down ahead of the hop.

The second half was basically a back-and-forth affair with a total of 12 lead changes and eight ties.

TCU's biggest second-half lead was three, 40-37 with 15 minutes remaining before West Virginia edged back out in front, 45-43, on an Elijah Macon basket. The two teams exchanged baskets until the Mountaineers began to open some room with four minutes to go.

Nathan Adrian's layup put West Virginia ahead 58:55 with 3:45 to go. After TCU's Vladimir Brodziansky was unable to convert a one-and-one, Tarik Phillip added two free throws at the other end to push the Mountaineers' lead to five, 60:55.

But Brodziansky answered with a 3 with 2:13 remaining and Jaylen Fisher's two free throws made it a one-point game with 50 seconds to go.

Alex Robinson could have given TCU the lead with 10 seconds left, but he only got one of his two free throws to go down to tie the game at 60.

For the third straight game, Carter led West Virginia with 15 points, despite shooting just six of 16 from the floor. Adrian contributed 13 points and a team-best eight rebounds, while Macon had a solid eight points and five rebounds - all five boards coming on the offensive glass.

Recap

Eleventh-ranked Baylor used a 30-13 run over the remaining 8:33 to defeat 10th-ranked West Virginia, 71-62, before 8,203 fans at the Ferrell Center in Waco, Texas.

The Bears (24·6, 11·6), trailing 30·28 at halftime, overcame a halftime deficit to win on Senior Night for guard Ishmail Wainright.

West Virginia (23-7, 11-6) overcame an early nine-point deficit and led 49-41 with nine minutes remaining after Jevon Carter got a short jumper to go down.

But after Carter's basket, the Mountaineers hit a brick wall and looked more like a team that was playing the second-leg of a long Texas road trip.

The next two minutes saw the Bears wipe out West Virginia's lead on a couple of Johnathan Motley dunks and put-back basket by Jo Lual-Acuil Jr.

Motley's layup with 7:26 remaining made it a one-point game, 49-48, and the next time down the floor Baylor got three cracks at scoring before Motley was fouled by Nathan Adrian after grabbing Wendell Mitchell's missed 3.

Motley made both free throws to give the Bears their first lead of the second half, 50·49 - an advantage they would never relinquish.

For the next $5 \frac{1}{2}$ minutes, West Virginia's only field goals were made by Carter at 6:03 on a short jumper, at 2:27 from 3 (his 1,000th career point) and with 31 seconds remaining on a driving layup.

By then, Baylor's lead swelled to double digits.

West Virginia finished the game shooting just 37.3 percent the second straight sub-40-percent shooting performance for the Mountaineers.

Carter led West Virginia with 18 points, Tarik Phillip scored 12 and Elijah Macon added 11.

Baylor, which turned the ball over 29 times in the loss to West Virginia in Morgantown earlier in the year, turned it over 18 times but made up for it by destroying the Mountaineers on the glass, 43:23.

Carter, the team's point guard, grabbed nine rebounds while the rest of the team managed to pull down only 14 boards.

Motley led all scorers with 23 points while also grabbing eight boards. He was a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line.

Acuil Jr. scored 11 points and led the Bears with 10 rebounds.

Recap

West Virginia got a season-high 23 points from Daxter Miles Jr. on Senior Night to power the 10th-ranked Mountaineers to an 87-76 victory over No. 24 Iowa State in the regular season finale for both teams.

In addition to scoring 23 points, Miles grabbed seven rebounds and made five of six from the free throw line in clearly his best performance

A sell-out crowd of 14,528 helped recognize West Virginia's five seniors - Nathan Adrian, James Long, Teyvon Myers, Tarik Phillip and Brandon Watkins - which made up the starting lineup.

Long, a walk on from Charleston, set the tone by hitting a 3 on West Virginia's opening possession of the game.

There were seven ties and 10 lead changes in the first half, WVU leading by as many as six, 9-3, and lowa State holding a four-point advantage, 39-35, with 1:39 remaining.

Miles Jr. reduced that to one on a 3 and two Elijah Macon free throws the next time down the floor gave West Virginia back the lead, 40-39. A Macon block led to another Miles 3, with 49 seconds left before Monte Morris ended the first half with lowa State's ninth triple.

The Mountaineers (24-7) used a 7-0 run at the beginning of the second half to build an eight-point lead, 50-42, and the 3-point shots the Cyclones were making in the first half were not falling in the second.

lowa State (20-10) was just two of eight from behind the arc in the second half, and during a six-minute stretch late in the game when the Mountaineers built their lead to as many as 17, all of the Cyclones' points came at the free throw line off of drives to the rim.

Naz Mitrou-Long led the Cyclones with 22, but 15 of those came in the first half.

Deonte Burton, who sat a good portion of the first half after picking up two quick fouls, scored 17 to match Morris' 17.

Matt Thomas contributed 16.

Adrian, playing in front of the hometown crowd for the last time, scored 16 points, grabbed seven rebounds and handed out three assists

Jevon Carter scored 13, Macon had 10 off the bench and Phillip was close to a triple-double with seven points, eight rebounds and 10 assists.

WVU was 21 of 26 from the free throw line and had a sizable 48-29 advantage on the glass.

The victory assured West Virginia of its second straight single-digit loss season. The last time that happened was in 1982-83 when college basketball played a 26-game regular season schedule and the Mountaineers were competing in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

Recap

Jevon Carter scored 21 points to power 11th-ranked West Virginia to a 63-53 victory over 10th-seeded Texas in the quarterfinals of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship at the Sprint Center in Kansas City.

Except for a few brief moments in the first half, the Mountaineers led for almost the entire game behind the stellar outside shooting of Carter, who made seven of 12 overall and five of eight from 3.

Carter scored 16 of his game-high 21 in the first half as West Virginia built its lead to nine at intermission. With the score tied at 29, freshman forward Sagaba Konate gave the Mountaineers the lead for good on a baby hook shot in the lane, keying a 10-1 run.

Esa Ahmad added two more on a curl play, then Carter nailed a 3 from the wing and ended the first half scoring for the Mountaineers with a pair of free throws.

WVU built its lead to 13 - its biggest of the game - with a quick flurry to begin the second half. Tarik Phillip got a step-back shot to go down in the lane, Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. followed with breakaway baskets and then Konate nearly pulled down the basket with a baseline two-handed stuff to give the Mountaineers a 47-34 advantage.

From here, baskets were few and far between for WVU. The Mountaineers were stuck on 47 for nearly five minutes, allowing Texas to creep to within four with 8:30 remaining.

Teyvon Myers converted two free throws to make the margin six, 52-46, and then Adrian made two exceptional plays to get the lead back to 11. His pretty feed down in the blocks to Elijah Macon led to a basket and then he came up with the basketball along the sideline near the WVU bench and he fed Carter for a straightaway 3 at the top of the key.

That quick, 12-second spurt effectively put the game away for West Virginia.

Texas (10-22) missed all eight of its field goal attempts over the remaining 5:34 and finished the game converting just two of its last 12.

The Mountaineers were not much better, however, converting one one of their last nine and going the final 4:20 without making a field goal.

For the game, West Virginia shot 42.6 percent from the field and just 50 percent (10 of 20) from the free throw line.

The Mountaineers were seven of 13 from behind the arc, five of those coming from Carter.

Macon scored eight points and grabbed 10 rebounds, while Adrian contributed six points, nine rebounds, four assists and three blocks.

West Virginia has made a name for itself with its tenacious, full court pressing style known as "Press Virginia."

The Mountaineers reached back to their past by using a 1-3-1 defense to pull out a hard-fought, 51-50 victory over Kansas State in the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship semifinals in Kansas City.

The way West Virginia (26-7) was shooting the basketball, it had to do something different to change things up.

The Mountaineers shot an abysmal 18.7 percent in the first half (six of 32) by settling for jump shots - mostly from 3, they didn't force K-State to turn the basketball over, they didn't attempt a single foul shot and consequently was trailing the Wildcats by nine, 25-16 at the break.

The first-half hole West Virginia dug itself in became even deeper when a Wesley Iwundu 3 gave the Wildcats a 39-27 lead with 13:26 remaining.

Then finally Elijah Macon got a jumper to go down, Tarik Phillip hit a 3 and the Mountaineers made consecutive trips to the free throw line where Phillip and Carter were able to reduce K-State's lead to four.

The deficit was trimmed to two 39-37 when Esa Ahmad hit a

The K-State lead swelled back to five, 42-37, and then 44-39, before Ahmad's 3 with 6:24 left made it a two-point game, 44-42.

A D.J. Johnson free throw and then a Barry Brown 3 pushed K-State's lead back to six, but Carter answered with a 3 at the other end and then two Ahmad free throws with 2:18 remaining made it a onepoint game, 48-47.

Johnson's tip-in off a feed from Wesley Iwundu gave the Wildcats a 50-47 lead with 2:07 to go, but that was the final field goal K-State

Phillip answered with his third 3 with 1:45 to go to tie the game, and after three cracks at the basket. Ahmad was finally fouled by Johnson while rebounding Nathan Adrian's missed 3 with 19 seconds

Ahmad made one of two to give the Mountaineers the lead, forcing Kansas State coach Bruce Weber to call timeout with 10 seconds remaining.

Following the timeout, the best look K-State could get at the basket was a desperation, one-handed throw by Kamau Stokes from well beyond the 3-point arc with too little time left on the clock for Dean Wade to try to tip it in.

For the second straight year, West Virginia advanced to the finals of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship, and for the second time the Mountaineers came up short, this time losing to lowa State 80-74.

In 2016, West Virginia reached the finals before falling to Kansas 81-71.

Playing before an overwhelmingly pro-lowa State crowd that cheered every good play made by the Cyclones, West Virginia (26·8) was unable to slow down lowa State's Monte Morris, who scored 17, and Deonte Burton, who contributed 16.

lowa State won the game, in part, because it got nearly every loose ball near its basket. The Cyclones also out-rebounded the much bigger and more physical Mountaineers, 33-29, and they got just enough 3-point shooting to hold off another second-half WVU surge.

After leading 35-29 at intermission, lowa State came out firing with back-to-back triples by Burton and Matt Thomas to open up a 10-point lead.

The Cydone advantage swelled to 12 three different times, the latest coming with 13:14 remaining before the Mountaineers began chipping away.

An Esa Ahmad layup with nine minutes to go reduced lowa State's lead to seven, 60-53, and a Teyvon Myers driving layup made it a five-point game with 5:48 left.

But lowa State (23-10) answered with layups by Morris and Solomon Young to push the advantage back to nine, 69-60.

The Cyclones managed to keep it an eight-to-10-point game until Carter's 3 ahead of the horn made the final margin six.

WVU also hurt itself at the free throw line when it was chasing lowa State. During one stretch, the Mountaineers missed six consecutive free throws and finished the game converting only eight of 17 for 47.1 percent.

West Virginia got off to a strong start, building an early 12-4 lead on baskets by Elijah Macon, Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter - two of those 3s coming from Miles and Carter - and the Mountaineers led by eight, 16-8, following an Nathan Adrian steal and dunk.

lowa State took its first lead of the game with 5:12 remaining in the half when Darrell Bowie was fouled by Adrian while scoring dose to the basket. He converted the free throw to give Cyclones a 23-22 advantage.

Recap

Tarik Phillip scored 16 points, including six straight from the free throw line inside of a minute to play, to help fourth-seeded West Virginia hold off 13th-seed Bucknell, 86-80, in an NCAA Tournament first-round game at KeyBank Center in Buffalo.

West Virginia (27-8) jumped out to an early 15-point lead, 27-12, when Lamont West's drive to the basket capped a 13-0 run.

But Bucknell (26-9) was able to hang around because of the inside scoring of 6-foot-9-inch, 230-pound, junior center Nana Foulland and the outside shooting of sophomore guard Kimbel Mackenzie.

Two Mackenzie free throws reduced Bucknell's deficit to eight, 29-21, and the Bison eventually got it down to three, 36-33, on an Avi Toomer layup with 3:24 remaining.

For the remainder of the first half West Virginia held the Bison scoreless.

A Brandon Watkins follow-up basket gave the Mountaineers a 39-33 lead, and West completed the half with a driving layup off a steal from Jevon Carter.

The Mountaineers began the second half going inside to Elijah Macon, who scored close to the goal while being fouled by Foulland. His three-point play pushed WVU's advantage to 12, 45-33, but immediately Bucknell scored seven straight to make it a five-point game.

An Esa Ahmad tip-in basket, a Macon jumper and then a West 3 pushed the margin back to 11, 52-41, with 16:40 remaining.

Again, Bucknell battled back to outscore the Mountaineers 16-8 over the next five minutes to make it a three-point game, 58-55, and requiring Huggins to call timeout.

An important moment in the game came with 9:37 left when Foulland was called for his fourth foul as Carter was making a move to the basket. Foulland sat the next five minutes on the bench as West Virginia was able to build its lead to eight, 76:68, on Carter's 3 - West Virginia's final field goal of the game.

Following Carter's 3, Phillip took over at the line by getting free throws to go down at 1:00, at :41 and :26 to keep the margin a reasonably comfortable three-possession game.

Recap

West Virginia likes these trips to Buffalo, New York. In 2010, its journey to the Final Four began in Buffalo, and in 2017, the Mountaineers deposited fifth-seeded Notre Dame, 83-71, in an NCAA Tournament second round game.

West Virginia rode the hot outside shooting of guard Jevon Carter, who scored 24 on eight of 15 shooting, and Daxter Miles Jr., whose 18 came on five of eight shooting.

West Virginia (28-8) led from wire to wire, the Mountaineers' fullcourt pressure defense forcing Notre Dame to turn the ball over 14 times and never really allowing the Irish to get into an offensive rhythm.

Bonzie Colson led all scorers with 27 points. Colson hit 10 of 15 from the field, including four of five from 3, but he wasn't much of a factor on the defensive end of the floor once he picked up his fourth foul with 9:47 remaining and Notre Dame trailing by nine.

After an early flurry from Notre Dame to begin the second half, West Virginia kept its margin in a comfortable eight-to-nine-point range.

Two Steve Vasturia free throws pulled the Irish to within seven before Esa Ahmad answered with a big 3 from the corner to push the advantage back to 10 with 5:43 left.

Colson banged another 3 with 4:32 remaining to make it 68:61, but again the Mountaineers answered when Elijah Macon followed up Carter's miss with 3:58 to go.

Notre Dame (26-10) then got it to six on a Matt Ryan 3 before Carter responded with the biggest basket of the game with 2:35 to go, a pretty step-back 3 from the left wing.

The Mountaineers also took care of business at the free throw line, making all 11 of its attempts in the first half and converting 21 of 26 for the game.

Notre Dame was deadly from the free throw line hitting all 17 of its attempts.

Tarik Phillip scored 12 while Ahmad and Macon contributed 11 each.

West Virginia set the tone by scoring the first 10 points of the
game and led by 11 twice in the first half, at 15-4 and then later at 26-15.

Notre Dame missed its first five shots, made nine of its next 15 but
finished the first half hitting one basket over its remaining 4:31 - that

West Virginia answered with a pretty Phillip feed to Sagaba Konate for a dunk, Jevon Carter followed with a pull-up jumper just inside of the arc and then Macon added two free throws to build the lead back to nine. 38-29.
