No. 13 West Virginia Looks For Season Win No. 20 Against K-State

- With WVU's next win, it will mark the 31st 20-win season in school history. It would be Bob Huggins' 28th 20-win season in 35 years as a head coach.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 810-326 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino by three wins and Jim Phelan by 20 wins.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 152-36 in its last 188 games against unranked teams, including 79 of its last 90 at the WVU Coliseum.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 31-16 in the Big 12 in the last two-plus seasons.
- West Virginia is 100-73 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).
- Bob Huggins is 56-43 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 46-37 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 37 ranked teams at WVU, including 14 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by least 15 points each in a single season.
- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the eighth-largest margin victory ever against a No. 1-ranked AP team.
- WVU is 6-1 in its last seven games vs. AP Top 25 teams, with two wins over No. 1, one vs. No. 2 and two wins over No. 6.
- With James Bolden's 17 points at OU, he became the seventh different WVU player to lead in scoring in a league game this year. He is the first player in school history to score 17 points while playing a maximum of 10 minutes in a game.
- The Mountaineers have won 72 of their last 103 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 115-32 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 58-28 mark in league games.
- WVU is 524-152 (.781) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 156-38 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- WVU leads the country in turnover margin (10.5), turnovers forced (22.3) and steals (11.3). WVU ranks second in scoring margin (20.2), fourth in offensive rebounds (14.8), ninth in assists (17.5) and 11th in scoring offense (86.0).
- WVU's plus/minus leaders are Tarik Phillip (+327), Jevon Carter (+317) and Nathan Adrian (+314).
- WVU is averaging 43.5 deflections per game, while averaging 35.6 deflections in Big 12 Conference games.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but six Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals eight times in 2016-17.
- Baylor's 29 turnovers were the most forced by WVU in a league game in 24 years (30 vs. St. Bonaventure in 1992).
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 29.7 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU has nearly forced more turnovers (535) than its opponents have made field goals (539).
- WVU has attempted 273 more shots than its opponents this season -- 1,539 to 1,266.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 37 of the last 51 games. This year's team is averaging 37.0 points from the bench.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in all but one game this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament last season.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 74 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 29 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 30 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 47 of the last 50 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 50 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 55 of their last 56 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 176-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 65 of its last 67 and 121 of its last 132 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 582 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 57 times under Bob Huggins (335 games).
- West Virginia is 59-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 173-30 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 180-18 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 152-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 163-31 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 160-39 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 20-19 all-time on Feb. 11 and 515-396 all-time in the month of February.

- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.

- Kansas State is 16-8 overall and 5-6 in the Big 12 following a 74-71 loss at home to Kansas on Monday.
- The Wildcats have lost four of their last five games after defeating West Virginia on Jan. 21.
- Kansas State is 4-4 on the road this season with a 2-3 mark in league road games.
- Bruce Weber is 95-62 in his fifth season at K-State. He is 408-217 in his 19th year overall.

Series Record Against Kansas State

- West Virginia and Kansas State will be meeting for the 12th time in series play that began in 1949.
- The first meeting took place in Morgantown on Dec. 12, 1949, with the Wildcats coming away with a 49-44 victory.
- West Virginia has won five of the last six meetings. K-State defeated WVU, 79-75, in Manhattan on Jan. 21 this season.
- West Virginia is 3-1 against Kansas State in the WVU Coliseum and 3-2 all-time in Morgantown.
- West Virginia is 5-4 against the Wildcats since the Mountaineers joined the Big 12 in 2012.
- Bob Huggins is 6-5 against his former team (5-4 at WVU). His Akron team fell to the Wildcats, 70-68, on Dec. 10, 1988.
- Bob Huggins led K-State to a 21-12 record in 2006-07, the Wildcats' most wins in 19 years. K-State broke an eight-season postseason drought when Huggins led the Wildcats to the NIT Second Round. The Wildcats also collected 10 Big 12 wins for the first time since the league's inception in 1997.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,721-1,064 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

Jonathan Holton scored 14 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to lead ninth-ranked West Virginia to a 70-55 victory over Kansas State at the WVU Coliseum in Morgantown.

Neither team shot particularly well, the winning Mountaineers hit 42.6 percent of their field goal attempts while K-State connected on just 35.1 percent from the floor, including one-of-18 from three.

The poor shooting also carried over to the free throw line where West Virginia missed 13 and Kansas State failed to convert on nine of its 23 attempts.

West Virginia (17-3, 6-2) was sleep walking through the first half until being whistled for back-to-back technical fouls, one going against guard Tarik Phillip after he made a driving layup and another on West Virginia's bench for protesting the call.

Kansas State was only able to make one of four free throws to take an 8-7 lead, but the two technicals finally stirred up a lethargic WVU student section.

Over the next seven minutes West Virginia built its lead to nine, 19-10, getting baskets from Jaysean Paige, Devin Williams, Holton, a three from Paige and another close one from Holton.

K-State eventually whittled West Virginia's lead to three, 21-18, on a pair of Justin Edwards free throws, but the Mountaineers used a 13-7 run over the remaining 4:48 to take a 34-25 advantage into the locker room at halftime.

WVU pushed the lead to double digits in the second half, getting to as high as 17, 57-40, with 5:51 to go.

Jaysean Paige came off the bench to score 12, while Nathan Adrian, getting his first start of the year in place of freshman Esa Ahmad, scored 10 points on four of five shooting. Ahmad sat out the game with a sprained right knee.

In getting his sixth double-double of the season, Holton made six of eight from the floor and also pulled down seven defensive rebounds.

Kansas State (12-8, 2-6) got 11 points from Edwards.

An announced crowd of 9,936 watched the game.

Recap

With all eyes on the Big 12 this season it seemed only fitting that the first conference game of the season went to double overtime as the No. 19 Mountaineers survived for an 87-83 victory at Kansas State.

West Virginia led for just 9:31 during the contest that featured 29 lead changes and 19 ties, but it did not matter as the grit and depth of the Mountaineers proved to be too much for the Wildcats.

K-State turned the tables on the Mountaineers in the first half, forcing WVU into 10 turnovers while committing just five.

Despite nine different players on the score sheet in the opening half, Devin Williams, Jevon Carter, Daxter Miles Jr. and Jaysean Paige combined for just nine points and the Mountaineers were O-for-8 from beyond the arc.

West Virginia headed into the locker room trailing 34-33.

Paige came out in the second half and took over, giving the Mountaineers a 69-67 lead with 1:07 remaining in the contest on a tip-in and free throw. Paige finished the second half with 18 of WVU's 36 points.

The teams then traded possessions before an Elijah Macon foul on DJ Johnson sent Johnson to the line with 22 seconds remaining. Johnson proceeded to make both free throws and following a missed layup by Carter, the game went to overtime.

K-State once again trailed with time dwindling in the first overtime session, but a made layup by Barry Brown with 1:31 remaining tied the game at 75-75.

After K-State took a 77-75 with 4:40 remaining in the second overtime, West Virginia took control and never allowed the Wildcats another lead as Miles Jr. was fouled on a 3-pointer and sunk all three free throws

Key jump shots by Williams and Tarik Phillip helped to break two more ties with Phillip's serving as the eventual game-winning shot.

Prior to the overtime sessions the Mountaineers were just 10-of-18 from the free-throw line, but went 10-for-13 in overtime to help seal the

Paige scored a career high 25 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lead the Mountaineers in both categories. Phillip contributed 14 points, Miles Jr. added 10 and 10 different players scored for the Mountaineers.

Brown led K-State with 20 points and Wesley Iwundu (16), Kamau Stokes (15) and Dean Wade (13) were all in double-figures.

There were 53 fouls called in the game and the two teams went to the free throw line a combined 63 times - 43 of those free throws coming from K-State.

WVU played its first double-overtime game since 2011, also a win against K-State in Wichita, Kan.

No. 21 West Virginia made its free throws down the stretch to hold off pesky Kansas State 76-72 at the WVU Coliseum.

After Jaysean Paige's 3 from the wing with 5:27 remaining gave West Virginia a 67-57 lead, it took only two minutes for the Mountaineers to see a 10-point lead totally disappear. Free throws by Nino Williams and Justin Edwards and a Nigel Johnson layup made it a five-point game, two more charities from Johnson got it to three and a Johnson steal and layup made it a one-point game with 3:06 still showing on the clock.

Following another empty offensive possession for West Virginia, K-State took the lead when Williams got a basket in transition off a Juwan Staten missed free throw. Williams was fouled by Nathan Adrian on the play and converted the conventional three-point play to give the Wildcats a 69-67 lead.

Adrian finally stopped the bleeding with a pair of free throws to tie the game with 1:57 left and West Virginia got the ball right back when Williams was whistled for traveling on the ensuing in-bounds play.

West Virginia coach Bob Huggins called a 30-second timeout to draw up a play close to the basket for sophomore Devin Williams. It worked, Williams pushing in a contested shot from the baseline to give WVU a 71-69 advantage with 1:51 left.

Williams' basket was the only successful field goal attempt for the Mountaineers after the Paige 3 with nearly 5 ½ minutes left in the

The game's two biggest free throws came from freshman Jevon Carter with 20 seconds left to give WVU a four-point lead. Staten missed two right after that, and he also missed a pair with 2:39 to go and the Mountaineers dinging to a one-point advantage.

West Virginia (19-5, 7-4) did shoot a respectable 46.3 percent from the floor, but that masked some poor shooting in the second half that saw the Mountaineers hit only 7-of-25, including 2 of 9 from 3.

Williams led everyone with 22 points on 7 of 11 shooting for Kansas State, while Johnson and Edwards contributed 14 points each.

Forward Brandon Watkins came off the bench to give his best performance of the season for WVU, the sophomore scoring a careerhigh 14 points and nearly getting a double-double with nine rebounds.

Staten scored 11 while Jaysean Paige and Jevon Carter contributed 10 each.

West Virginia's bench outscored Kansas State's 47-19.

- The Mountaineers began the season No. 20 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- West Virginia has been ranked as high as No. 7 (three times in the AP poll) in both polls this season.
- The Mountaineers were ranked as high as No. 6 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today poll on Jan. 18 last season and finished No. 8 in the Associated Press poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 74 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 29 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- West Virginia has been ranked 94 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 208 weeks total in school history.
- WVU has been ranked in 50 consecutive USA Today polls and for 30 straight weeks in the AP poll.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

- The Kansas game marked the 294th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.

- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the largest loss in AP poll history by a team in its first-ever game as No. 1.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia this season was its first non-conference road win over a Top 10 team since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU became the fourth team in the AP poll to beat an AP No. 1 and No. 2 team by at least 15 points each in a season.
- This season, West Virginia becamse the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- This season marks the first time WVU has defeated three AP Top 10 teams in the same season, and the first time WVU has ever beaten three AP Top 6 teams in the same year.
- WVU owns 93 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 181 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 294 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 61 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 23 seasons.
- WVU has played 132 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 51 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 85 ranked teams during the regular season in 10 years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.

- Bob Huggins has won 104 out of his 220 games at WVU away from home.
- Under Bob Huggins at the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 80.9 ppg while holding its opponents to 62.9 ppg.
- West Virginia is 102-26 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 57-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 91-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 14 years, including 72 of its last 76.
- West Virginia is 133-32 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 14 seasons.
- WVU has won 118 of its last 147 non-conference games and 123 of its last 153 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- Bob Huggins has made 22 Division I NCAA Tournament appearances.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship in 2015-16.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA apperance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 years.
- WVU has made 12 postseason appearances in the last 13 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in six of its last 11 NCAA appearances: (2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005 and 1998).
- West Virginia's basketball staff has 65 years of Division I head coaching experience.

Carter, Miles Jr. Earn All-Big 12 Honors

- Junior guards Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention team. The two Mountaineers were two of the 10 Big 12 Conference players earning preseason recognition.
- Carter started all 35 games a year ago and finished fourth in the Big 12 in steals and 11th in assists.
- Carter earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Defensive Team as a freshman and as a sophomore.
- Miles Jr. averaged 9.4 points per game, with 40 made 3-point field goals.
- He finished 11th in the Big 12 in steals per game a year ago.

Press Virginia

- Press Virginia is back in full swing for the Mountaineers for the third season in a row.
- West Virginia forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan.
- All but six Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30.
- WVU has 15 or more steals eight times this season.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 29.7 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- In 2014-15, the Mountaineers led the country in forced turnovers, steals and offensive rebounds. Last season, West Virginia led the country in forced turnovers.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 in 2014-15 and 558 to 306 last season.
- WVU forced 30 or more turnovers in three games last season. WVU had at least seven steals in all but six games and forced 14 or more turnovers in all but five games.

WVU To Open 2017-18 Season in Germany

- West Virginia will open its 2017-18 basketball season in Germany against Texas A&M at Ramstein Air Base.
- The event is part of the Armed Forces Classic a series of Division I men's basketball college games that are televised from United States military bases around Veteran's Day as a morale event for service members.
- WVU and Texas A&M will meet on Nov. 10, 2017, and it will be televised by ESPN.

WVU Coliseum Renovations

- The 46-year-old WVU Coliseum received a \$23-million facelift in 2016.
- The concession stands doubled from 21 points of sale in the past to 40 points of sale.
- The concourse level is adorned with new graphics, more color and easily recognizable signage to help fans to get to their seating locations more rapidly.
- Twelve new Daktronics LED boards have been added inside the inner bowl to add more color to the arena.
- Forty-three high definition television monitors have been added throughout the concourse.
- There have been 140 more toilets and three restrooms added in the concouse.
- As part of a private gift of \$1.3 million, WVU's locker room and hallway received a signifant makover.
- Phase two of the Coliseum project will involve seating improvements to the arena's interior and will start at the conclusion of the 2016-17 basketball season.

Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on fourof-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Knonate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or more.

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots \cdot three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon \cdot and made six steals.

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins.
"That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead 19th-ranked West Virginia to a 107-66 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the WVU Coliseum.

The Delta Devils led briefly, 3·2, on an Isaac Williams 3, but the Mountaineers had this one in hand by the 15-minute mark of the first half, leading 2l·7.

"I thought we came out and played with a lot of energy and played pretty well early and in the second half we decided we were done for the day," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

At halftime, the margin swelled to 64:28 and for a while it looked like West Virginia might challenge the Coliseum record for points scored, that coming against Alaska-Fairbanks on November 25, 1994 when the Mountaineers put 132 on the Nanocks, but WVU hit a lull at the six-minute mark and remained stuck on 96 points for more than three

"I understand it's hard to play when you're up by 40 at halftime or whatever it was, but all we talked about at halftime was get better," said Huggins. "And we talked about was where they were entering the ball, how they were entering the ball, how we can do a better job, can we work on this in the second half? But we didn't."

Teyvon Myers eventually scored the team's 100th point with 2:22 left.

Huggins once again substituted liberally, particularly in the second half and usually following mistakes, with all 13 players dressed getting significant minutes

In the season-opening blowout win against Mount St. Mary's, 11 different players got into the scoring column. This time, it was 12, with WVU also getting double-digit efforts from Myers and Lamont West (12 each) and 10 from Esa Ahmad and Jevon Carter.

"I know I'm playing a lot of people and I'm playing a lot of combinations and our deal was we are going to play more people than anybody else and be fresher than everybody else and we gave up nine layups and a tip-in in the second half," noted Huggins. 'That's uncalled for and it didn't happen in the first half when we were chasing them down."

Mississippi Valley State committed 26 turnovers which translated into 34 points for the Mountaineers.

An announced crowd of 7,807 attended the game.

Bob Huggins said after the first two games that he wanted a full 40 minutes from his 19th-ranked WVU men's basketball team.

He got it against New Hampshire.

West Virginia smothered the Wildcats with a suffocating full-court press and some accurate 3-point shooting to roll to a 100-41 victory at the WVU Coliseum in the opening game of the NIT Season Tip-Off in front of 8.842.

"I thought our rotations were really good, it's a hard matchup for them - they're a half-court team that likes to run a lot of sets and Bill (Herrion) does a great job of coaching them." said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, now six wins shy of becoming just the ninth coach in NCAA Division I history to achieve 800 career victories. "That pressure keeps mounting and mounting and mounting and I like what we did today."

West Virginia (3-0) used a 24-4 run early in the first half to build an insurmountable 46-20 halftime lead. In the second half, the Mountaineers kept their foot on the pedal as Huggins used every player had available.

Six different players reached double figures, led by sophomore forward Esa Ahmad's career-high-tying 14 points.

"We've been on him pretty good kind of revving the motor up a little more and I thought he played a lot harder today," said Huggins. "When he's running the floor and getting a full head of steam he's probably going to finish it over most people."

Freshman forward Lamont West contributed 13, Jevon Carter and Nathan Adrian 12 each, 11 by Teyvon Myers and 10 from Tarik Phillip.

The backups even got into the act, freshman guard Chase Harler scoring nine, backup guards James Long and Beetle Bolden contributing six each and freshman center Logan Routt recording a late tip-in basket for his first career points as a Mountaineer.

Overall, WVU's bench outscored UNH's 50-10.

The only unresolved matter was if West Virginia was going to set a school record for forced turnovers established in 2014 with 36 against VMI.

New Hampshire finished two shy of that with 34. West Virginia shot 54.4 percent overall, and 46.8 percent from 3, making 15 of 32.

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

"It feels good to win any time," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Mayerick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists.

West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in close.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enenchionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 14.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Enenchionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining.

Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3-point arc (10 of 19).

"James Long he's given so much to our program," said Huggins. "He gets other guys in the gym and he's got such a great work ethic so it was great to be able to get him in a little bit in the first half and play as much as he did in the second half"

All 15 players who got into the game scored and 62 of the team's 108 points came from the bench.

Ahmad, coming off a 19-point performance to Temple, continued his strong play. He has made 15 of his last 20 field goal attempts in career-high-duplicating performances.

"He gets better all the time, we've just got pushing up those expectations and try to keep that motor running that way all the time," said Huggins. "We all know he's a talented guy and I really think he's got a great advantage in this league being a 6-foot-7 three-man because there aren't very many of them."

WVU shot 47.3 percent for the game and also hit 30 of 43 from the free throw line for 69.8 percent, an improvement over the 60.5 percent the team was shooting coming into tonight's game.

Manhattan got 11 points from Xavier Peart.

- WVU's 40 forced turnovers were the most by any Division I team since 2007.
- The previous school record for turnovers in a game was set by VMI with 36 in 2014.
- WVU had 60 or more points in the first half for the 12th time in school history. It is the first time WVU has scored 60 or more points in the first half in two games in the same season.

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14.

WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesvile for the first time since 1975.

Recap

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Daxter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Knonate) gets 13. We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready.

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins. "We make people play. (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when you're constantly throwing the ball backwards."

Recap

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense eventually wore down VMI and the 15th-ranked Mountaineers cruised to their eighth victory of the season, 90-55, at the WVU Coliseum.

The win against 1-7 VMI was never in doubt, but the Keydets did hang around longer than most people expected.

VMI trailed by just five, 22-17 with 7:36 remaining in the first half and then by six with 4:34 left. Then, early in the second half the Keydets got a conventional three-point play from Will Miller to pull within 12.

The Mountaineers (8-1) were slow dosing out on defense, allowing VMI to convert eight 3s, permitted the much smaller Keydets to grab 13 offensive rebounds, missed several layups and was just 26 of 42 from the free throw line.

But eventually, the constant pressure got to VMI as West Virginia's lead swelled to 20 at the 10-minute mark, and then to 30 with 6:34 to

WVU's biggest lead was 38 with 3:16 remaining.

Guard Daxter Miles Jr. made 5 of 6 from 3 and finished with a game-high 20 points. The junior became the first Mountaineer player to edipse the 20-point barrier in 2016-17.

Esa Ahmad recovered from a poor first half to finish with12, and senior forward Brandon Watkins came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 17 minutes of action. That was his second career double-double.

Those three players combined to score 21 points, grab 18 rebounds and block four shots.

Freshman guard James "Beetle" Bolden finished with 9 points on three 3s, getting some extended work with the ones, including a second

West Virginia once again dominated all of the specialty statistics, including a 27-3 advantage in points off of turnovers, a 34-9 edge in second-chance points and a 44-28 advantage in points off the bench.

Twelve different Mountaineer players got into the scoring column. Q.J. Peterson led VMI with 17 points.

The Keydets turned the ball over 22 times.

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67.

Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino,

Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball.

Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players

Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches. rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony.

As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor.

The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame.

With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction.

Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakaway dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic hustle play.

Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points.

The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers.

UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

Esa Ahmad scored 17 points in 24 minutes of action to power 11th-ranked West Virginia to an 84-57 victory over Radford at the WVU

West Virginia (10-1) used a 23-0 run to build a 32 point first-half lead the Highlanders nearly having more turnovers than points scored (22 points to 21 turnovers) at the break.

WVU shot 58.8 percent from the floor, including 60 percent from 3 in the first half, but those numbers fell off considerably in the second half as Huggins continued to use different players.

"The guys that we started, I thought they went out and were walking around so I took them out and put some other guys in and they weren't a whole lot better," said Huggins. "The game has a way of getting even with you when you approach it the wrong way. We went on that big run and we thought the game was over and kind of quit playing.

Radford (4-7) actually outscored West Virginia in the second half, 35-31, grabbed two more rebounds than the much taller Mountaineers, led by Sterling Christy's game-high 10 boards, and overall the Highlanders had a 40-37 edge on the glass for the game.

"I don't know if it was effort or a lack of focus," said Huggins. "We boxed out and stood and then went and got it. We made an effort to block out sometimes."

West Virginia's big advantages were in points in the paint (46-8) and points off of turnovers (41-10). Bench scoring, which has been a staple all season for the Mountaineers, was just plus-eight (33-25).

Jevon Carter contributed 15 and Tarik Phillip led the reserves with

Overall, West Virginia shot 49.2 percent from the floor but just 48.4 percent from the free throw line.

"When you miss free throws, when you fumble the ball - which we fumbled countless balls, when you miss layups you're not ready to play,'

Radford was worse, hitting just 42.1 percent of its free throw tries. Justin Cousin scored 12 and Caleb Tanner scored 10 for Radford, which is coached by Mike Jones, who spent one year on John Beilein's WVU coaching staff in 2003.

An announced crowd of 8,311 watched the game.

West Virginia improved to 6-0 all-time against Radford. Five of those meetings have come in Morgantown.

Teyvon Myers added 13 off the bench and WVU got 12 from starting forward Esa Ahmad and 11 from starting guard Jevon Carter to improve

West Virginia shot 51.6 percent from the field for the game and forced 25 turnovers.

Northern Kentucky got 12 points from Carson Williams and 10 each from Layone Holland II and Brennan Gillis.

Center Drew McDonald, the team's leading scorer averaging better than 17 points per game, failed to score.

"A hard-earned win," said Huggins. "They do a good job. They've

done a great job going into places and winning. They've got nine wins." An announced crowd of 10,197 watched the game.

Eleventh-ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams.

With the exception Lucas N'Guessan's dunk to begin the game. Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor.

Forte led Oklahoma State with 18

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation. Macon was a late scratch after suffering a knee injury in the win against Northern Kentucky.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players - Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West - added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better-than-usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe.

Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7. Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7.

The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61. West Virginia.

Some late 3s from Forte kept the margin under 20.

Anthony Livingston's 3-point field goal with six seconds left lifted Texas Tech to a 77-76 overtime victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

West Virginia (12-2, 1-1) had trouble stopping Tech's dribble penetration and was also victimized by fouls, the Mountaineers sending the Red Raiders to the free throw line 30 times where they made 20.

Meanwhile, WVU didn't help itself when it got to the foul line, West Virginia converting just 13 out of 24 for 54.2 percent. West Virginia's full-court pressure defense turned Tech over just 13

times - one fewer than the Mountaineers' 14 for the game.

The Red Raiders shot 51 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 3-point distance.

There were 21 lead changes with the game's biggest lead being seven points - that by West Virginia with 17:13 to go when Daxter Miles Jr. converted a driving layup off a feed from Nathan Adrian. But Texas Tech erased that within a span of five minutes when the Mountaineers went ice cold from the floor.

Texas Tech's scoreless spell came near the end of regulation after Justin Gray's layup with 2:20 left put the Red Raiders ahead by five.

Lamont West's two free throws reduced Tech's lead to three, and then Adrian banged in a 3 with seven seconds left to tie the game at 67.

Shadell Millinghaus tried to win it for Tech in regulation but his 3 was off the mark just ahead of the horn.

In overtime, missed free throws by Tarik Phillip, Miles Jr., Esa Ahmad and Adrian - six in all - kept Tech in position to get the upset.

Two Jevon Carter free throws pushed West Virginia's lead to three, 70-67, but two at the other end by Aaron Ross and then a turnaround jumper by Smith gave the lead back to Texas Tech, 71-70.

Ahmad followed with his two misses at the line before Phillip was able to get two to go down with 2:15 left, putting WVU back ahead, 72-71.

Stevenson answered with a 3 - his second - to make it 74-72. Then, Adrian could only get one of two to go down from the line before Phillip followed a Devon Thomas miss with a 3 to put West Virginia ahead, 76-74, with 33 seconds remaining

The Red Raiders came down and worked to get into position for a late shot, with Livingston taking it off a feed from Stevenson.

Carter had a chance to win the game for West Virginia at the other end but he couldn't get his 3 to go down with one second left.

Notebook

It is the first regular season win for the Red Raiders over the Mountaineers since they joined the Big 12 in 2012. Tech's only victory against West Virginia since then came in the first round of the 2013 Big 12 tournament when WVU finished 13-19.

Recap

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 22 points and Jevon Carter banged in three critical 3s during a key stretch late in the second half to lead seventhranked West Virginia to an 82-70 victory over TCU inside the WVU

In a battle of two 12-2 teams both looking to go 2-1 in Big 12 play. the game boiled down to the final 9:47 when West Virginia outscored the Horned Frogs 25-13.

TCU, which trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, and then again by 11 with 13:12 remaining, used a 15-4 run to tie the game at 57 following a Desmond Bane layup with 9:47 to go.

But Miles answered with a layup and Sagaba Konate followed with a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Vlad Brodziansky while scoring near the basket. Konate's free throw pushed West Virginia's advantage to 62-57.

Then three minutes later Carter took control of the game with the Mountaineers leading by just four.

Following a missed jumper by TCU's Alex Robinson, Carter came down on the other end and drilled a 3 from the top of the key. The next time down the floor, following a basket by Bane, Carter drained another. This one put WVU ahead by eight, 71-63.

His third came with 2:52 left to put the Mountaineers ahead by nine, 74-65. Konate followed with another lay in and then a steal by Nathan Adrian led to Miles' 3 from the corner to make it a 15-point game with two minutes to go.

West Virginia (13-2, 2-1) used an 18-9 run over the remaining six minutes by holding the Horned Frogs to just three field goals during that stretch of time.

Overall, TCU committed 18 miscues leading to 28 West Virginia points - a deciding factor in the game.

Esa Ahmad added 16 points on seven-of-11 shooting, while Carter and Konate contributed 13 points each. For Konate, who also grabbed eight rebounds coming off the bench, it was a season high in scoring for him.

Adrian, despite scoring just four points, was also a big contributor in the victory by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds, handing out five assists and making two steals. He played a team-high 34 minutes.

Robinson led TCU with 17 points on three-of-nine shooting. Brodziansky added 14 on five-of-six shooting.

Overall, the Horned Frogs made 46.2 percent from the floor and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line - attempting seven more free throws and making eight more than the Mountaineers (nine-of-14). An announced crowd of 12,568 watched the game.

WVU improved to 10-0 all-time against TCU, including a 5-0 record against the Horned Frogs in Morgantown.

Baylor, which reached No. 1 in both major polls a day earlier for the first time in school history, ran into "Press" Virginia in Morgantown and the 10th-ranked Mountaineers ran away with a surprisingly easy 89-68 victory over the Bears.

It was the second consecutive year West Virginia has knocked off No. 1 at home in January. In 2015-16, it was top-ranked Kansas which succumbed to the Mountaineers, 74-63.

Nathan Adrian scored a career-high 22 points, grabbed six rebounds, made three steals and handed out two assists in a terrific allaround performance. The Morgantown High graduate made seven-of-10 from the field, knocked down a pair of 3s and also hit six-of-nine from the free throw line in one of the best all-around efforts.

Carter, too, stepped up and played wonderfully by scoring 17, handing out seven assists and producing a game-high five steals. Carter hounded Baylor's guards the entire night and was a major reason why the Bears turned the ball over a staggering 29 times.

Eight of the 11 players who got into the game for Baylor had multiple turnovers, including six by forward Ishmail Wainright.

West Virginia (14-2, 3-1) led Baylor (15-1, 3-1) throughout, and the Mountaineers had plenty of chances to extend their lead in the first half. but the Bears stuck around by beating West Virginia on the glass. The rebounding disparity was 12 in the Baylor's favor, and that minimized to some extent the 16 turnovers they committed in the first 20 minutes of

The Mountaineers began the game strong and took an early 11-point lead before Baylor began chipping away, gradually reducing its deficit to four with 2:31 remaining.

In the second half, Baylor scored first on a Wainright layup but Watkins answered with a jumper. Another Watkins jumper pushed the lead to nine and soon it was 13 on a quick 7-0 spurt, capped by a pair of Esa Ahmad layups.

A Watkins dunk made it 57-43, and then a Tarik Phillip jumper with 9:36 remaining gave West Virginia a 15 point advantage. A Miles Jr. follow-up dunk pushed the margin to 21, but he was called for a technical foul for hanging on the rim, giving Baylor free throws at the other end.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 26 points, twice, before Huggins began emptying his bench.

A sellout crowd of 14,632 watched the game.

The victory over Baylor is the fifth time in school history West Virginia has defeated No. 1. The other instances were against North Carolina (1957), Duke (1966), UNLV (1983) and Kansas (2016).

Teyvon Myers scored a career-high 16 points and Jevon Carter added 17 to lead 10th-ranked West Virginia to a 74-72 victory at the Erwin Center in Austin. Texas.

Texas, with leading scorer Tevin Mack, had a six-point lead with 10:40 remaining in the game when Andrew Jones made one of his four 3-point baskets.

Two Myers free throws, and a Tarik Phillip traditional three-point play sliced the Texas lead to one in a matter 35 seconds. Another Phillip basket after he stole the ball from Kerwin Roach Jr. gave West Virginia a 54-53 lead.

Another Jones 3 tied the game at 60 with 6:55 to go but that's when Carter took over. A Carter free throw and then a steal in the open court led to a short jumper and a three-point lead.

Two Carter free throws with 22 seconds left gave West Virginia enough room to hold on for a two-point road win.

After trailing for most of the first half, WVU used a 22-13 run over the remaining 7:09 of the half to take a five-point lead at halftime. Phillip contributed 14, giving West Virginia 30 points from its two

guards coming off the bench. That made up for Daxter Miles Jr.'s struggles from the floor. The junior missed all six of his 3-point field goal tries and finished with

Adrian finished with eight points and six rebounds, but spent a

good portion of the first half on the bench with foul trouble Allen led everyone with 19 points on six of seven shooting. Jones

finished with 17 before fouling out with 3:23 remaining.

Texas (7-10, 1-4) made eight 3s and shot 47.9 percent from the floor. The Longhorns committed 19 turnovers, but West Virginia was only able to score 21 points off those turnovers.

The Mountaineers were a frigid four of 18 from 3 against primarily a zone defense.

West Virginia won for the second time in five tries in Austin. The first victory came in 2013, an overtime victory in WVU's first season in the Big 12.

Recap

Jordan Woodard's driving layup with 2.5 seconds left in overtime gave Oklahoma an 89-87 come-from-behind victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum.

Woodard, who led the Sooners with 20 points, missed a free throw with three seconds left that could have won it in regulation. But he sure made up for it in overtime.

With nine minutes remaining it looked like WVU was well on its way to a double-digit victory when Jevon Carter's driving layup gave it a

But then Oklahoma scored nine straight before Carter's basket ended the dry spell with seven minutes to go. A Woodard traditional three-point play a minute later got the OU deficit to three, and eventually Rashard Odomes tied it at 69 with 4:25 left.

But West Virginia rebuilt it to four twice, 73-69 and 75-71, before Woodard took over the game by going right at and then past the Mountaineer defense. His driving basket with 2:10 to go pulled the Sooners to within two, and he tied it with 45 seconds remaining on another dribble-drive to the hoop.

Carter answered at the other end with 21 seconds left to give WVU a 77-75 lead, but once more, Oklahoma got the ball into Woodard's hands and he got close enough to the rim to get his short baseline jumper to go down. He was fouled by Esa Ahmad while doing so.

Woodard's free throw to win the game bounced off the rim and Adrian's desperation heave sailed out of bounds at the end regulation after Huggins had called timeout to draw up a play in case Woodard made his foul shot.

In overtime, West Virginia got the lead to four, 85-81, but couldn't hold onto it at the free throw line and also couldn't stop Woodard whenever had the hall

West Virginia simply couldn't convert free throws at crunch time, missing five of seven at one point and finished the overtime period just four out of nine. Overall, West Virginia missed 11 out of 29 for 62.1 percent.

With 2:02 left, Daxter Miles Jr. missed one of two; with 1:14 on the clock and West Virginia leading 86-85, Ahmad missed both attempts and then trailing 87-86. Carter rimmed out the first of two. His second one tied the game eight seconds left, but Woodard easily got to the basket to score the game's deciding bucket.

Oklahoma had little difficulty handling West Virginia's pressure, OU turning the ball over just 12 times - one less than WVU's 13.

Notebook

The loss spoiled an outstanding offensive night for Carter, who led West Virginia with a season-high 23 points. Adrian contributed 14 and Elijah Macon came off the bench to score a season-high 13.

All five Kansas State starters scored double figures and the Wildcats overcame a 12-point first half deficit to defeat seventh-ranked West Virginia 79-75 at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan, Kansas.

Sophomore point guard Jamau Stokes matched Barry Brown for team scoring honors with 15 points.

D.J. Johnson added 14 while Wesley Iwandu and Dean Wade contributed 13 apiece.

West Virginia, now 15-4, 4-3, was unable to hold on to a doubledigit lead for the second straight game; WVU led Oklahoma by 15 points in the second half before falling, 89-87, in overtime.

"We haven't had that edge and we need to get that edge back," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

The defense once again struggled to get stops in the second half and West Virginia also turned the ball over a season-high 23 times.

Three different players had four turnovers and six had at least two bobbles

After missing its first six shots of the game, West Virginia made seven of its next nine and eventually took a 12-point lead, which it enjoyed on three different occasions in the first half, before K-State scored 10 straight over the remaining 1:13 to reduce the Mountaineers' lead to two at halftime, 38-36.

The Wildcats took control of the game midway through the second half when they led by 11. But West Virginia responded by scoring 12 of the next 13 points over a three-minute span to retake the lead on Tarik Phillip's traditional three-point play with 5:07 left.

The two teams exchanged points before layups by Wesley Iwundu, Jamau Stokes and Iwandu put the Wildcats ahead, 73-68, with 2:18 to go.

Brown managed to take the ball away from Jevon Carter and was fouled by Carter, which led to a free throw to give K-State a six-point margin with 1:49 remaining.

Nathan Adrian's 3 seven seconds later cut it to three, 74-71, but two Brown free throws and a layup gave Kansas State enough room to collect its 15th victory of the year.

Kansas State shot a sizzling 54 percent in the second half, had a 25-15 advantage in points off turnovers and outscored the Mountaineers, 40-28, in the paint.

Phillip came off the bench to lead West Virginia with 20 points. West Virginia shot 41.8 percent for the game, but converted just 44 percent of its field goal attempts inside the 3-point line.

West Virginia had its five-game winning streak against the Wildcats snapped, including its two-game winning streak at Bramlage Coliseum.

Recap

Esa Ahmad started the night off with an emphatic baseline tomahawk dunk and then continued to throw down dunks in leading the 18th-ranked Mountaineers to a resounding 85-69 victory over Kansas, ranked No. 1 in the Coaches' poll and No. 2 in the .AP poll.

From the outset, Ahmad and his teammates brought the crowd to their feet, particularly the final nine minutes of the game after Kansas briefly retook the lead, 59-58, on a Svi Mykhailiuk 3.

Ahmad came right back with that little curl play around the basket that was so successful all night, scoring once again against Jackson.

Following Ahmad's basket to put West Virginia back ahead, 60-59, Macon contributed one of two from the free throw line and then another freshman, West Virginia's Lamont West, banged in a big 3 from the corner to make it a five-point game with 7:56 remaining.

A Josh Jackson flying tomahawk reduced the lead to three, 64-61, with 7:11 to go before Ahmad answered once more with a pair of free

Two more Macon free throws extended West Virginia's lead to seven, 68-61, and yet another Ahmad close one pushed the lead to

A Landen Lucus dunk - his only two points of the game - stopped the West Virginia spurt momentarily.

But Daxter Miles Jr., with the shot dock winding down to three, got a nifty shot from the baseline to go down, freshman Sagaba Konate followed with a thunderous dunk in transition and then Miles hit the dagger from the corner with 1:57 left.

That put WVU ahead by 12, and everyone in the building could sense the Kansas players waiving the white flag. Free throws by Tarik Phillip and Miles preceded a Jevon Carter 3 with 28 seconds remaining to give West Virginia its biggest lead of the game at 19, 85-66.

Nathan Adrian contributed 11 points, five rebounds, two assists. a block and a steal in 29 minutes of action, while Miles Jr. and Phillip added 10 each

Devonte' Graham, who burned West Virginia for 27 points in the 2016 Big 12 Championship game, scored 17 on six of 10 shooting.

Frank Mason III, averaging 20.1 points per game heading into the game, scored 15 but managed just six of 16 shooting.

Overall, Kansas shot 42.4 percent from the floor and just 40 percent from the free throw line (6 of 15).

Notebook

- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by least 15 points each in a single season.
- It is also the first time Kansas has lost four consecutive games in the same arena since it joined the Big 12 in 1996.

The issues West Virginia had in recent losses against Oklahoma and Kansas State showed up once again against Texas A&M, but the 18th-ranked Mountaineers were able to overcome them to defeat the Aggies, 81-77, in the opening game of the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

Poor decision making, defensive lapses and an inability to throw the basketball into the ocean from the free throw line in the second half almost caused a 13-point meltdown in the game's remaining 2:36, but Esa Ahmad finally managed to make two free throws with five seconds left and the Mountaineers leading by just two.

There were many moments when the 12.836 who showed to watch this one thought win No. 17 was in the bag:

- * When the lead was 20 with 19:32 to go in the second half
- * When Jevon Carter's 3 ended the team's long scoreless drought with 8:04 left to put the Mountaineers back up by 11
- * When Carter hit another 3 with 2:36 remaining to make it a
- * When Ahmad got his free throw to go in with 1:09 left to once again get the lead to double digits
- * And, finally, when Elijah Macon dunked the ball with 23 seconds left to make it a two-possession game.

But after Macon's breakaway dunk, Hampton's 3 nine seconds later reduced West Virginia's lead to 79-77 with 14 seconds left.

Overall, the Mountaineers hit 12 of their 23 free throw attempts, but missed seven after the break

WVU's poor free throw shooting almost canceled out the 23 turnovers it caused - most of those coming in the first half, including five from sophomore guard Chris Collins.

Gilder led everyone with 24. Dayis finished with 19 points and 18 rebounds while Hampton came off the bench to score 21 - 16 of those coming in the second half.

Carter hit two critical second-half 3s for West Virginia and finished with 19. He also grabbed a team-best nine boards.

Ahmad contributed 14 points - 10 of those coming in the first half while Daxter Miles Jr. added 10.

Recap

Nathan Adrian was West Virginia's perfect antidote for "Hilton Magic." The senior scored a career-high 23 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to lead the seventh-ranked Mountaineers to an 85-72 victory over Iowa State at Hilton Coliseum.

Adrian made seven of his 10 field goal attempts, including two of three from 3, knocked down seven of eight from the free throw line and his basket right before the first-half buzzer really gave the team a big boost going into the locker room leading by four, 44-40.

In the second half, West Virginia (18-4, 6-3) never trailed as the Mountaineers began taking control of the game at the halfway point.

Adrian grabbed Esa Ahmad's miss and was fouled by Nazareth Mitrou-Long while trying to follow. He made two free throws to put the Mountaineers up six, 56-50, and then his 3-pointer from the corner off a pretty feed from Ahmad got the lead to seven with 10:26 remaining.

Daxter Miles Jr. answered a Morris jumper with a 3 from the corner to expand the lead to nine, 64-55, and a Teyvon Myers steal led to two free throws and an 11-point advantage.

A Sagaba Konate put-back basket and Jevon Carter's driving layup pushed the lead to 15 with 5:42 to go. The widest margin was 16 points with 49 seconds remaining.

West Virginia knocked down its free throws, hitting 17 of 20, including 15 of 17 in the second half.

Tarik Phillip came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 15, Ahmad contributed 14 and seldom-used freshman guard Beetle Bolden, who has scored just six points in eight prior Big 12 games, came off the bench and scored eight, including a pair of bankshot 3s. He also made a pretty drive to the basket for two.

Preseason Big 12 player of the year Monte Morris had a tough night with Carter mostly guarding him. Morris made just four of 14 from the floor, missing both 3-point attempts, never got to the free throw line and finished with just eight - eight below his season average.

Matt Thomas led Iowa State (13-8, 5-4) with 19, but 13 of those came in the first half. The Cyclones shot just 29 percent from the field in the second half

The loss was lowa State's second-worst loss of the season. lowa beat the Cyclones by 14 back on December 8.

A crowd of 14,384 watched the game.

Recap

Oklahoma State shot a torrid 62.5 percent from the floor to knock off seventh-ranked West Virginia 82-75 at the WVU Coliseum.

After leading by four at halftime, 44-40, the tide began to turn for the Mountaineers midway through the second half when they settled for 3s against Oklahoma State's pack-line defense and the Cowboys were making them pay on the other end.

Then, Davon Dillard's soaring dunk gave the Cowboys a 61-57 lead with 8:44 remaining.

A key sequence came with 5:30 left and the game tied at 64. Jevon Carter stole the basketball underneath Oklahoma State's basket and fed it to freshman forward Lamont West, who took off from the foul line toward the basket.

West was called for an offensive foul and Bob Huggins, reacting to the play, slipped and fell in front of the bench. A technical foul was issued on the West Virginia coach, sending Phil Forte to the line where he made both free throws

The four-point swing in momentum was accentuated four minutes later when Lindy Waters got a 3 to go down from the wing to make it, 74-69. Oklahoma State.

Two Juwan Evans free throws pushed the Cowboy margin to seven with 2:31 left

Two quick scoring bursts, a Tarik Phillip 3 and then a Brandon Watkins dunk, made it a two-point game when Carter was called for a foul on Evans near the sideline. Evans made it a two-possession game when he hit two more free throws with 1:14 showing on the clock.

Despite its torrid shooting, Oklahoma State (15-8, 4-6) won this game from the free throw line, hitting 24 of 27, and on the defensive end of the floor by forcing the Mountaineers to shoot mostly 3s - 20 out of the 28 second-half shots they took came from behind the arc.

WVU made 12 of them for the game (out of 33) - a dramatic departure from the first game back on December 30 when it scored a 17-point victory over the Cowboys in Stillwater.

Jeffrey Carroll led Oklahoma State with 20 points, including 13 of the team's first 15 points to start the game.

Evans finished with 18 and Forte contributed 13

Lamont West scored a career-high 21, 15 of those coming in the first half on five 3s, while Phillip added 15.

West Virginia did not have a starter reach double figures. A sell-out crowd of 14,225 watched the home team get beat on the glass, 30-16.

Notebook

West Virginia's 16 rebounds marked the second-lowest rebounding total in a game in school history.

Recap

Freshman James "Beetle" Bolden scored a career-high 17 points - 15 of those coming in the first half - to lead 13th-ranked West Virginia to a 61-50 victory over struggling Oklahoma at the Lloyd Noble Center in Norman, Oklahoma,

Bolden scored more than half of West Virginia's first half points, including seven in a row at one point when Oklahoma jumped out to an early 11-2 lead.

A Nathan Adrian 3 briefly gave the Mountaineers their first lead of the game, 20-19, a Lamont West 3 gave West Virginia its second lead at 25-23 and then Bolden finished the half with a driving layup ahead of the horn to give WVU a 27-25 advantage.

The second half began like a siege with neither team able to get any points until Tarik Phillip finally ended the drought with a short jumper in the lane after nearly four minutes came off the clock.

West Virginia began to take control of the game at the midway point of the second half. Bolden hit two free throws - his only two points of the second half, Adrian followed with a drive to the basket and Esa Ahmad added a jumper to give the Mountaineers an eight-point

The lead swelled to 10 after another Adrian layup and grew to 13 when Jevon Carter got a 3 to go down with 6:40 remaining.

OU answered with a five-point play. Jordan Shephard made a 3 and West Virginia's Sagaba Konate was called for a foul away from the ball, sending Khadeem Lattin to the line, where he made both free

But from there, Oklahoma could only manage to reduce its deficit to six twice for the remainder of the game.

While Bolden gave West Virginia a big offensive lift in the first half, Konate was the difference in the second half on the defensive end.

The freshman swatted away a season-high five shots and also grabbed four rebounds and scored two points on a pair of late free

Oklahoma, which scored 48 points in the paint in the overtime victory in Morgantown back on January 18, only scored 18 close to the basket, mainly because of Konate's presence.

The only Sooner player to reach double figures was guard Kameron McGusty with 11. Oklahoma turned the ball over 23 times and shot just 33 percent for the game.

The Mountaineers didn't shoot it well either, hitting 20 of 54 for 37 percent. At the end of the first half, Bolden made six of 10 while the rest of the team was only four of 19.

Notehook

The victory, before a crowd estimated at less than 5,000, was West Virginia's first-ever in Norman.
