No. 18 West Virginia and No. 2/1 Kansas Square Off on ESPN

- With 806 wins, Bob Huggins is tied with Eddie Sutton for ninth place all-time in NCAA victories.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 806-325 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino by three wins and Jim Phelan by 24 wins.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 113-31 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 57-27 mark in league games.
- WVU is 522-151 (.781) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 154-37 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins at the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 80.9 ppg while holding its opponents to 62.0 ppg.
- The Mountaineers have won 71 of their last 101 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 36 ranked teams at WVU, including 13 wins over Top 10 teams and two over No. 1.
- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the eighth-largest margin victory ever against a No. 1-ranked AP team.
- WVU is 5-1 in its last six games against AP Top 25 teams, including two wins over No. 1 and two wins over No. 6.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 28-15 in the Big 12 in the last two plus seasons.
- West Virginia is 97-72 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 53-42 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 43-36 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- WVU leads the country in scoring margin (23.6), turnover margin (11.5), turnovers forced (23.2) and steals (12.0). WVU ranks third in offensive rebounds (15.6), eighth in assists (17.8) and sixth in scoring offense (88.3).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 in steals (fourth nationally), while Nathan Adrian ranks third in offensive rebounds.
- WVU's plus/minus leaders are Tarik Phillip (+318), Jevon Carter (+299) and Nathan Adrian (+296).
- WVU is averaging 46.3 deflections per game 49.4 deflections in its wins and 33.9 deflections in its losses.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but four Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU
 has had 15 or more steals eight times in 2016-17.
- Baylor's 29 turnovers were the most forced by WVU in a league game in 24 years (30 vs. St. Bonaventure in 1992).
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 30.3 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.84 points per possession, tops in the country.
- WVU has forced more turnovers (441) than its opponents have made field goals (423).
- WVU has attempted 242 more shots than its opponents this season -- 1,246 to 1,004.
- . WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 35 of the last 46 games. This year's team is averaging 38.5 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- West virginia frace its 27th appealance in the NCAA championship last season, dating both to 1999.
 WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 72 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 28 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 28 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 45 of the last 48 weeks in
 the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 48 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 53 of their last 54 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 174-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 63 of its last 65 and 119 of
 its last 130 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 577 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 56 times under Bob Huggins (330 games).
- West Virginia is 59-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 169-29 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 176-18 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 149-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 160-30 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 158-39 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 19-3 all-time on Jan. 24 and 501-322 all-time in the month of January.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 806 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 10th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.

Scouting Kansas

- Kansas is 18-1 overall and 7-0 in the Big 12 following a 79-67 win over Texas on Saturday.
- The Jayhawks have won 18 in a row after losing the season opener to Indiana, 103-99, in overtime.
- Kansas is 4-0 on the road this season, including a 3-0 road record in Big 12 games.
- Bill Self is 403-83 in his 14th year at Kansas. He holds a 610-189 overall record in 24 years.

Series Record Against Kansas

- This will be the 10th meeting between West Virginia and Kansas.
- Kansas leads the series, 6-3. All nine of those meetings have been since the Mountaineers joined the Big 12 in 2012.
- West Virginia has won three of the last six meetings in the series.
- The Mountaineers have won three in a row against KU in Morgantown and have a 3-1 record against Kansas at home.
- Last season, each team won on its home court, and KU defeated WVU in the Big 12 Championship game.
- Bob Huggins has faced Kansas 13 different times during his coaching career. He is 3-6 at West Virginia. Huggins was 0-1 against Kansas while he was at Cincinnati and 0-3 while he was the head coach at Kansas State.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,717-1,063 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- · Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

Recap

Devonte' Graham tied a career high with 27 points to lift topranked Kansas to an 81-71 victory over West Virginia in the final of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship at the Sprint Center in Kansas City.

The sophomore made six of 10 shots from the floor, including five of six from three, and he hit all 10 free throws to lead the Jayhawks.

"We shot 13 percent from three and they shoot 60," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "We just didn't make shots when we needed to and they did. Kansas is the No. 1 team in the country and when they shoot 60 percent (from three) and we commit 20 turnovers and only take nine more shots than they do, beating them is an impossibility."

Kansas (30-4) used a 7-0 run to start the second half to take control of the game. Graham keyed the run from behind the arc, two of his threes coming in succession as Kansas built its lead to 12.

KU had a 14-point advantage with 9:26 remaining on layup by Perry Ellis, but West Virginia, behind Devin Williams' career-high 31 points, began chipping away at Kansas' lead.

A Williams jumper, two Williams free throws, and a layup by Nathan Adrian got the run started, and later, five straight points from the Mountaineers made it a four-point game, 67-63, with 4:09 left.

Then, West Virginia got the ball back on a Frank Mason III turnover and Mason fouled Tarik Phillip as Phillip attempted to score. Unfortunately, Phillip missed both free throws, and following a Kansas timeout, Landon Lucas scored close to the basket and was fouled by Jonathan Holton. Lucas made the free throw for a five-point swing.

After a Daxter Miles Jr. layup, Wayne Selden Jr. made a three with one second left on the shot clock, and then Graham added a pair of free throws with 1:33 remaining and that was it.

Graham got great support from Selden Jr., who scored 21 points on eight of 13 shooting, while Ellis contributed 17.

Williams made nine of 12 from the floor, hit 13 of 15 from the free line and pulled down 10 rebounds for his 32nd career double-double to earn a spot on the all-tournament team.

No other West Virginia player scored in double figures, the other eight guys who played shooting a combined 17-of-43.

Kansas shot 52.1 percent for the game, including hitting nine of 15

West Virginia shot a respectable 45.6 percent, but hit only two of 15 from behind the arc and also turned the ball over 20 times - the same number as Kansas - but the Javhawks were able to outscore WVU 26-15 in points off those miscues.

Perry Ellis scored 21 points and Frank Mason III added 14 to lead sixth-ranked Kansas to a 75-65 victory over 10th-ranked West Virginia in Big 12 Conference men's basketball action at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas.

The Jayhawks shot 56.1 percent from the floor against the Mountaineers to pull into a three way tie atop the conference standings with West Virginia and Oklahoma at 8-3.

"We didn't score in transition and we had opportunities," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "We must have missed six or seven layups; we didn't score it close. We had a couple of tip ins that didn't go in and we had open shots."

With the exception of two early ties, Kansas (20-4) led throughout the game, building its lead to nine early on baskets by Landen Lucas, Mason III and Lucas again. Two Ellis free throws with 2:05 left built Kansas' lead to 10, 34-24, and after exchanging baskets, Jaysean Paige finished the first half by knocking down a three - West Virginia's first of the game.

The Mountaineers scored nine of the first 13 points of the second half to pull to within two, 40-38, with 16:12 remaining, but Kansas scored the next eight points to get its lead back to 10.

Again, West Virginia battled back to get within four on a Paige layup with 7:26 remaining, but Seldon Jr. responded with a three to key a 14-6 Jayhawk run to push the lead back out to double digits with 2:37

West Virginia, playing without forward Jonathan Holton for a fourth consecutive game, had trouble handling Ellis and Lucas near the basket. The two combined to shoot 11 of 14 from the floor, scored 30 points and grabbed 17 rebounds.

Devonte' Graham and Brannen Greene added 10 each to give Kansas 20 wins for the 27th straight year.

West Virginia (19-5 overall) got 14 points and nine rebounds from Devin Williams. Paige added 14, but shot just five of 16 from the floor.

Starting guards Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. combined to make just three of 14 as West Virginia shot just 37.3 percent for the

"We needed to keep the ball out of Frank Mason's hands on the press and we didn't," said Huggins. "He's the one guy that can break pressure."

Recap

West Virginia got 26 points from super-sub Jaysean Paige and a workman-like 17 points and 12 rebounds from junior forward Devin Williams to knock off top-ranked Kansas, 74-63, in snowy Morgantown.

West Virginia's offense was certainly on point whenever Paige had the ball, the senior guard hitting 6-of-13 from the floor - mostly on drives to the basket - and knocking down a career-high 14 free throws. Paige had 17 of his game-high scoring total in the first half when the Mountaineers began to take control of the game.

Paige was most effective during a three-minute stretch late in the first half when he scored eight straight points to help the Mountaineers build their halftime lead to eight.

Twice, the guard was able to get second-chance baskets off of Jonathan Holton offensive rebounds; he made two more from the line and then added a drive to the basket to give the Mountaineers a 29-23 advantage with 3:56 remaining.

Later, more Paige free throws built West Virginia's lead to 10, 36-26, with 50 seconds remaining before Devonte' Graham got a triple to go down right after Daxter Miles Jr.'s foul shot to make it an eight-point game at the break.

In the second half, Kansas (14-2, 3-1) made a run to get the deficit to four, 43-39, on a pair of Perry Ellis free throws.

But then it was Paige who once again answered, scoring a driving layup ahead of Tarik Phillip's basket to push WVU's lead back to eight, 47-39.

The closest KU could get over the remaining five minutes was seven 70-63 with 49 seconds on the clock

After Lagerald Vick's three with 49 seconds to go, Phillip made a pair of free throws at the other end of the floor and then Paige punctuated things with a slam dunk to close the lid on the game.

Ellis led Kansas with 21, while Frank Mason III scored 12 and Wayne Seldon Jr. contributed 11. The Javhawks have lost the last three times they have played in Morgantown.

Jevon Carter also reached double figures with 10 for West Virginia, now 15-1 for the first time since the 1981-82 team started 24-1.







Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on fourof-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Knonate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead 19th-ranked West Virginia to a 107-66 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the WVU Coliseum.

The Delta Devils led briefly, 3·2, on an Isaac Williams 3, but the Mountaineers had this one in hand by the 15-minute mark of the first half, leading 21·7.

"I thought we came out and played with a lot of energy and played pretty well early and in the second half we decided we were done for the day," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

At halftime, the margin swelled to 64-28 and for a while it looked like West Virginia might challenge the Coliseum record for points scored, that coming against Alaska-Fairbanks on November 25, 1994 when the Mountaineers put 132 on the Nanocks, but WVU hit a lull at the six-minute mark and remained stuck on 96 points for more than three

"I understand it's hard to play when you're up by 40 at halftime or whatever it was, but all we talked about at halftime was get better," said Huggins. "And we talked about was where they were entering the ball, how they were entering the ball, how we can do a better job, can we work on this in the second half? But we didn't."

Teyvon Myers eventually scored the team's 100th point with 2:22

Huggins once again substituted liberally, particularly in the second half and usually following mistakes, with all 13 players dressed getting significant minutes

In the season-opening blowout win against Mount St. Mary's, 11 different players got into the scoring column. This time, it was 12, with WVU also getting double-digit efforts from Myers and Lamont West (12 each) and 10 from Esa Ahmad and Jevon Carter.

"I know I'm playing a lot of people and I'm playing a lot of combinations and our deal was we are going to play more people than anybody else and be fresher than everybody else and we gave up nine layups and a tip-in in the second half," noted Huggins. That's uncalled for and it didn't happen in the first half when we were chasing them

Mississippi Valley State committed 26 turnovers which translated into 34 points for the Mountaineers.

An announced crowd of 7,807 attended the game.

Bob Huggins said after the first two games that he wanted a full 40 minutes from his 19th-ranked WVU men's basketball team.

He got it against New Hampshire.

West Virginia smothered the Wildcats with a suffocating full-court press and some accurate 3-point shooting to roll to a 100-41 victory at the WVU Coliseum in the opening game of the NIT Season Tip-Off in front of 8.842.

"I thought our rotations were really good, it's a hard matchup for them - they're a half-court team that likes to run a lot of sets and Bill (Herrion) does a great job of coaching them," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, now six wins shy of becoming just the ninth coach in NCAA Division I history to achieve 800 career victories. "That pressure keeps mounting and mounting and mounting and I like what we did today."

West Virginia (3-0) used a 24-4 run early in the first half to build an insurmountable 46-20 halftime lead. In the second half, the Mountaineers kept their foot on the pedal as Huggins used every player he had available.

Six different players reached double figures, led by sophomore forward Esa Ahmad's career-high-tying 14 points.

"We've been on him pretty good kind of revving the motor up a little more and I thought he played a lot harder today," said Huggins. "When he's running the floor and getting a full head of steam he's probably going to finish it over most people."

Freshman forward Lamont West contributed 13, Jevon Carter and Nathan Adrian 12 each, 11 by Teyvon Myers and 10 from Tarik Phillip.

The backups even got into the act, freshman guard Chase Harler scoring nine, backup guards James Long and Beetle Bolden contributing six each and freshman center Logan Routt recording a late tip-in basket for his first career points as a Mountaineer.

Overall, WVU's bench outscored UNH's 50-10.

The only unresolved matter was if West Virginia was going to set a school record for forced turnovers established in 2014 with 36 against VMI.

New Hampshire finished two shy of that with 34. West Virginia shot 54.4 percent overall, and 46.8 percent from 3, making 15 of 32.

Recap

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

"It feels good to win any time," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Mayerick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists.

West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory.

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa

Another 3, this one by Daxter Miles Jr. from NBA range, pulled WVU to within two, 62-60, and Teyvon Myers tied the game at 62 on a driving layup

Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in close.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enenchionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 14.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Enenchionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining.

Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3-point arc (10 of 19).

Esa Ahmad made all seven of his field goal attempts to lead 25th-ranked West Virginia with 19 points as the Mountaineers cruised to a 108-61 victory over Manhattan at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 8,190 got to see coach Bob Huggins' entire roster for a good portion of the second half after West Virginia built a 60-27 halftime lead.

"I thought we played pretty hard and we took better care of the ball for the most part," said Huggins.

The Mountaineer defense forced Manhattan into committing a record 40 turnovers, the Jaspers spreading their miscues across the

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points, Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 11 and James Long came off the bench to score 10 in just eight minutes of

"James Long he's given so much to our program," said Huggins. "He gets other guys in the gym and he's got such a great work ethic so it was great to be able to get him in a little bit in the first half and play as much as he did in the second half"

All 15 players who got into the game scored and 62 of the team's 108 points came from the bench.

Ahmad, coming off a 19-point performance to Temple, continued his strong play. He has made 15 of his last 20 field goal attempts in career-high-duplicating performances.

"He gets better all the time, we've just got pushing up those expectations and try to keep that motor running that way all the time," said Huggins. "We all know he's a talented guy and I really think he's got a great advantage in this league being a 6-foot-7 three-man because there aren't very many of them."

WVU shot 47.3 percent for the game and also hit 30 of 43 from the free throw line for 69.8 percent, an improvement over the 60.5 percent the team was shooting coming into tonight's game.

Manhattan got 11 points from Xavier Peart.

- WVU's 40 forced turnovers were the most by any Division I team since 2007.
- The previous school record for turnovers in a game was set by VMI with 36 in 2014.
- WVU had 60 or more points in the first half for the 12th time in school history. It is the first time WVU has scored 60 or more points in the first half in two games in the same season.
- Manhattan is now 0-3 in the WVU Coliseum.

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14.

WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Recap

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Daxter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Knonate) gets 13. We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready.

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins, "We make people play, (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when you're constantly throwing the ball backwards."

Recap

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense eventually wore down VMI and the 15th-ranked Mountaineers cruised to their eighth victory of the season, 90-55, at the WVU Coliseum.

The win against 1-7 VMI was never in doubt, but the Keydets did hang around longer than most people expected.

VMI trailed by just five, 22-17 with 7:36 remaining in the first half and then by six with 4:34 left. Then, early in the second half the Keydets got a conventional three-point play from Will Miller to pull within 12.

The Mountaineers (8-1) were slow dosing out on defense, allowing VMI to convert eight 3s, permitted the much smaller Keydets to grab 13 offensive rebounds, missed several layups and was just 26 of 42 from the free throw line.

But eventually, the constant pressure got to VMI as West Virginia's lead swelled to 20 at the 10-minute mark, and then to 30 with 6:34 to

WVU's biggest lead was 38 with 3:16 remaining.

Guard Daxter Miles Jr. made 5 of 6 from 3 and finished with a game-high 20 points. The junior became the first Mountaineer player to eclipse the 20-point barrier in 2016-17.

Esa Ahmad recovered from a poor first half to finish with12, and senior forward Brandon Watkins came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 17 minutes of action. That was his second career double-double.

Those three players combined to score 21 points, grab 18 rebounds and block four shots.

Freshman guard James "Beetle" Bolden finished with 9 points on three 3s, getting some extended work with the ones, including a second

West Virginia once again dominated all of the specialty statistics, including a 27-3 advantage in points off of turnovers, a 34-9 edge in second-chance points and a 44-28 advantage in points off the bench.

Twelve different Mountaineer players got into the scoring column. Q.J. Peterson led VMI with 17 points.

The Keydets turned the ball over 22 times.

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67.

Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino,

Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball.

Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players

Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches. rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony.

As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor.

The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame.

With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction.

Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakaway dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic hustle play.

Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points.

The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers.

UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

Esa Ahmad scored 17 points in 24 minutes of action to power 11th-ranked West Virginia to an 84-57 victory over Radford at the WVU

West Virginia (10-1) used a 23-0 run to build a 32 point first-half lead the Highlanders nearly having more turnovers than points scored (22 points to 21 turnovers) at the break.

WVU shot 58.8 percent from the floor, including 60 percent from 3 in the first half, but those numbers fell off considerably in the second half as Huggins continued to use different players.

"The guys that we started, I thought they went out and were walking around so I took them out and put some other guys in and they weren't a whole lot better," said Huggins. "The game has a way of getting even with you when you approach it the wrong way. We went on that big run and we thought the game was over and kind of quit playing.

Radford (4-7) actually outscored West Virginia in the second half, 35-31, grabbed two more rebounds than the much taller Mountaineers, led by Sterling Christy's game-high 10 boards, and overall the Highlanders had a 40-37 edge on the glass for the game.

"I don't know if it was effort or a lack of focus," said Huggins. "We boxed out and stood and then went and got it. We made an effort to block out sometimes."

West Virginia's big advantages were in points in the paint (46-8) and points off of turnovers (41-10). Bench scoring, which has been a staple all season for the Mountaineers, was just plus-eight (33-25).

Jevon Carter contributed 15 and Tarik Phillip led the reserves with

Overall, West Virginia shot 49.2 percent from the floor but just 48.4 percent from the free throw line.

"When you miss free throws, when you fumble the ball - which we fumbled countless balls, when you miss layups you're not ready to play,'

Radford was worse, hitting just 42.1 percent of its free throw tries. Justin Cousin scored 12 and Caleb Tanner scored 10 for Radford, which is coached by Mike Jones, who spent one year on John Beilein's WVU coaching staff in 2003.

An announced crowd of 8,311 watched the game.

West Virginia improved to 6-0 all-time against Radford. Five of those meetings have come in Morgantown.

Eleventh-ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-lba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams.

With the exception Lucas NGuessan's dunk to begin the game, Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil Forte

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor.

Forte led Oklahoma State with 18.

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation. Macon was a late scratch after suffering a knee injury in the win against Northern Kentucky.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players · Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West · added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better-than-usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe.

Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7. Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7.

The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61. West Virginia.

Anthony Livingston's 3-point field goal with six seconds left lifted Texas Tech to a 77-76 overtime victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

West Virginia (12-2, 1-1) had trouble stopping Tech's dribble penetration and was also victimized by fouls, the Mountaineers sending the Red Raiders to the free throw line 30 times where they made 20.

Meanwhile, WVU didn't help itself when it got to the foul line, West Virginia converting just 13 out of 24 for 54.2 percent. West Virginia's full-court pressure defense turned Tech over just 13

times - one fewer than the Mountaineers' 14 for the game.

The Red Raiders shot 51 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 3-point distance.

There were 21 lead changes with the game's biggest lead being seven points - that by West Virginia with 17:13 to go when Daxter Miles Jr. converted a driving layup off a feed from Nathan Adrian. But Texas Tech erased that within a span of five minutes when the Mountaineers went ice cold from the floor.

Texas Tech's scoreless spell came near the end of regulation after Justin Gray's layup with 2:20 left put the Red Raiders ahead by five.

Lamont West's two free throws reduced Tech's lead to three, and then Adrian banged in a 3 with seven seconds left to tie the game at 67.

Shadell Millinghaus tried to win it for Tech in regulation but his 3 was off the mark just ahead of the horn.

In overtime, missed free throws by Tarik Phillip, Miles Jr., Esa Ahmad and Adrian - six in all - kept Tech in position to get the upset.

Two Jevon Carter free throws pushed West Virginia's lead to three, 70-67, but two at the other end by Aaron Ross and then a turnaround jumper by Smith gave the lead back to Texas Tech, 71-70.

Ahmad followed with his two misses at the line before Phillip was able to get two to go down with 2:15 left, putting WVU back ahead, 72-71.

Stevenson answered with a 3 · his second · to make it 74·72. Then, Adrian could only get one of two to go down from the line before Phillip followed a Devon Thomas miss with a 3 to put West Virginia ahead, 76·74, with 33 seconds remaining.

The Red Raiders came down and worked to get into position for a late shot, with Livingston taking it off a feed from Stevenson.

Carter had a chance to win the game for West Virginia at the other end but he couldn't get his 3 to go down with one second left.

Recap

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 22 points and Jevon Carter banged in three critical 3s during a key stretch late in the second half to lead seventh-ranked West Virginia to an 82-70 victory over TCU inside the WVU Coliseum.

In a battle of two 12-2 teams both looking to go 2-1 in Big 12 play, the game boiled down to the final 9:47 when West Virginia outscored the Horned Frogs 25-13.

TCU, which trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, and then again by 11 with 13:12 remaining, used a 15-4 run to tie the game at 57 following a Desmond Bane layup with 9:47 to go.

But Miles answered with a layup and Sagaba Konate followed with a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Vlad Brodziansky while scoring near the basket. Konate's free throw pushed West Virginia's advantage to 62-57.

Then three minutes later, Carter took control of the game with the Mountaineers leading by just four.

Following a missed jumper by TCU's Alex Robinson, Carter came down on the other end and drilled a 3 from the top of the key. The next time down the floor, following a basket by Bane, Carter drained another. This one put WVU ahead by eight, 71-63.

His third came with 2:52 left to put the Mountaineers ahead by nine, 74·65. Konate followed with another lay in and then a steal by Nathan Adrian led to Miles' 3 from the corner to make it a 15-point game with two minutes to go.

West Virginia (13⁻², 2·1) used an 18·9 run over the remaining six minutes by holding the Horned Frogs to just three field goals during that stretch of time.

Overall, TCU committed 18 miscues leading to 28 West Virginia points - a deciding factor in the game.

Esa Ahmad added 16 points on seven-of-11 shooting, while Carter and Konate contributed 13 points each. For Konate, who also grabbed eight rebounds coming off the bench, it was a season high in scoring for him.

Adrian, despite scoring just four points, was also a big contributor in the victory by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds, handing out five assists and making two steals. He played a team-high 34 minutes.

Robinson led TCU with 17 points on three-of-nine shooting. Brodziansky added 14 on five-of-six shooting.

Overall, the Horned Frogs made 46.2 percent from the floor and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line - attempting seven more free throws and making eight more than the Mountaineers (nine-of-14).

An announced crowd of 12,568 watched the game.

Baylor, which reached No. 1 in both major polls a day earlier for the first time in school history, ran into "Press" Virginia in Morgantown and the 10th-ranked Mountaineers ran away with a surprisingly easy 89-68 victory over the Bears.

It was the second consecutive year West Virginia has knocked off No. 1 at home in January. In 2015-16, it was top-ranked Kansas which succumbed to the Mountaineers, 74-63.

Nathan Adrian scored a career-high 22 points, grabbed six rebounds, made three steals and handed out two assists in a terrific allaround performance. The Morgantown High graduate made seven-of-10 from the field, knocked down a pair of 3s and also hit six-of-nine from the free throw line in one of the best all-around efforts.

Carter, too, stepped up and played wonderfully by scoring 17, handing out seven assists and producing a game-high five steals. Carter hounded Baylor's guards the entire night and was a major reason why the Bears turned the ball over a staggering 29 times.

Eight of the 11 players who got into the game for Baylor had multiple turnovers, including six by forward Ishmail Wainright.

West Virginia (14-2, 3-1) led Baylor (15-1, 3-1) throughout, and the Mountaineers had plenty of chances to extend their lead in the first half. but the Bears stuck around by beating West Virginia on the glass. The rebounding disparity was 12 in the Baylor's favor, and that minimized to some extent the 16 turnovers they committed in the first 20 minutes of

The Mountaineers began the game strong and took an early 11-point lead before Baylor began chipping away, gradually reducing its deficit to four with 2:31 remaining.

In the second half, Baylor scored first on a Wainright layup but Watkins answered with a jumper. Another Watkins jumper pushed the lead to nine and soon it was 13 on a quick 7-0 spurt, capped by a pair of Esa Ahmad layups.

A Watkins dunk made it 57-43, and then a Tarik Phillip jumper with 9:36 remaining gave West Virginia a 15 point advantage. A Miles Jr. follow-up dunk pushed the margin to 21, but he was called for a technical foul for hanging on the rim, giving Baylor free throws at the other end.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 26 points, twice, before Huggins began emptying his bench.

A sellout crowd of 14,632 watched the game.

Notebook

The victory over Baylor is the fifth time in school history West Virginia has defeated No. 1. The other instances were against North Carolina (1957), Duke (1966), UNLV (1983) and Kansas (2016).

Teyvon Myers scored a career-high 16 points and Jevon Carter added 17 to lead 10th-ranked West Virginia to a 74-72 victory at the Erwin Center in Austin. Texas.

Texas, with leading scorer Tevin Mack, had a six-point lead with 10:40 remaining in the game when Andrew Jones made one of his four 3-point baskets.

Two Myers free throws, and a Tarik Phillip traditional three-point play sliced the Texas lead to one in a matter 35 seconds. Another Phillip basket after he stole the ball from Kerwin Roach Jr. gave West Virginia a 54-53 lead.

Another Jones 3 tied the game at 60 with 6:55 to go but that's when Carter took over. A Carter free throw and then a steal in the open court led to a short jumper and a three-point lead.

Two more Carter free throws, coming after a terrific Sagaba Konate block on Shaquille Cleare's turnaround jumper put West Virginia up by five, 65-60, with 3:52 left.

A key play came with 43 seconds left when Nathan Adrian, battling a virus, managed to grab Phillip's missed 3 and was fouled by Allen. Adrian hit both free throws to put West Virginia ahead by four.

Two Carter free throws with 22 seconds left gave West Virginia enough room to hold on for a two-point road win.

After trailing for most of the first half, WVU used a 22-13 run over the remaining 7:09 of the half to take a five-point lead at halftime. Phillip contributed 14, giving West Virginia 30 points from its two

guards coming off the bench. That made up for Daxter Miles Jr.'s struggles from the floor. The

junior missed all six of his 3-point field goal tries and finished with

Adrian finished with eight points and six rebounds, but spent a good portion of the first half on the bench with foul trouble Allen led everyone with 19 points on six of seven shooting. Jones

finished with 17 before fouling out with 3:23 remaining. Texas (7-10, 1-4) made eight 3s and shot 47.9 percent from the floor. The Longhorns committed 19 turnovers, but West Virginia was only

able to score 21 points off those turnovers. The Mountaineers were a frigid four of 18 from 3 against primarily

a zone defense.

West Virginia won for the second time in five tries in Austin. The first victory came in 2013, an overtime victory in WVU's first season in the Big 12.

Jordan Woodard's driving layup with 2.5 seconds left in overtime gave Oklahoma an 89-87 come-from-behind victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum.

Woodard, who led the Sooners with 20 points, missed a free throw with three seconds left that could have won it in regulation. But he sure made up for it in overtime.

With nine minutes remaining it looked like WVU was well on its way to a double-digit victory when Jevon Carter's driving layup gave it a

But then Oklahoma scored nine straight before Carter's basket ended the dry spell with seven minutes to go. A Woodard traditional three-point play a minute later got the OU deficit to three, and eventually Rashard Odomes tied it at 69 with 4:25 left.

But West Virginia rebuilt it to four twice, 73-69 and 75-71, before Woodard took over the game by going right at and then past the Mountaineer defense. His driving basket with 2:10 to go pulled the Sooners to within two, and he tied it with 45 seconds remaining on another dribble-drive to the hoop.

Carter answered at the other end with 21 seconds left to give WVU a 77-75 lead, but once more, Oklahoma got the ball into Woodard's hands and he got close enough to the rim to get his short baseline jumper to go down. He was fouled by Esa Ahmad while doing so.

Woodard's free throw to win the game bounced off the rim and Adrian's desperation heave sailed out of bounds at the end regulation after Huggins had called timeout to draw up a play in case Woodard made his foul shot.

In overtime, West Virginia got the lead to four, 85-81, but couldn't hold onto it at the free throw line and also couldn't stop Woodard whenever had the hall

West Virginia simply couldn't convert free throws at crunch time, missing five of seven at one point and finished the overtime period just four out of nine. Overall, West Virginia missed 11 out of 29 for 62.1 percent.

With 2:02 left, Daxter Miles Jr. missed one of two; with 1:14 on the clock and West Virginia leading 86-85, Ahmad missed both attempts and then trailing 87-86. Carter rimmed out the first of two. His second one tied the game eight seconds left, but Woodard easily got to the basket to score the game's deciding bucket.

Oklahoma had little difficulty handling West Virginia's pressure, OU turning the ball over just 12 times - one less than WVU's 13.

The loss spoiled an outstanding offensive night for Carter, who led West Virginia with a season-high 23 points. Adrian contributed 14 and Elijah Macon came off the bench to score a season-high 13.

Recap

All five Kansas State starters scored double figures and the Wildcats overcame a 12-point first half deficit to defeat seventh-ranked West Virginia 79-75 at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan, Kansas.

Sophomore point guard Jamau Stokes matched Barry Brown for team scoring honors with 15 points.

D.J. Johnson added 14 while Wesley Iwandu and Dean Wade contributed 13 apiece.

West Virginia, now 15-4, 4-3, was unable to hold on to a doubledigit lead for the second straight game; WVU led Oklahoma by 15 points in the second half before falling, 89-87, in overtime.

"We haven't had that edge and we need to get that edge back," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

The defense once again struggled to get stops in the second half and West Virginia also turned the ball over a season-high 23 times.

Three different players had four turnovers and six had at least two bobbles.

After missing its first six shots of the game, West Virginia made seven of its next nine and eventually took a 12-point lead, which it enjoyed on three different occasions in the first half, before K-State scored 10 straight over the remaining 1:13 to reduce the Mountaineers' lead to two at halftime, 38:36.

The Wildcats took control of the game midway through the second half when they led by 11. But West Virginia responded by scoring 12 of the next 13 points over a three-minute span to retake the lead on Tarik Phillip's traditional three-point play with 5:07 left.

The two teams exchanged points before layups by Wesley Iwundu, Jamau Stokes and Iwandu put the Wildcats ahead, 73-68, with 2:18 to go.

Brown managed to take the ball away from Jevon Carter and was fouled by Carter, which led to a free throw to give K-State a six-point margin with 1:49 remaining.

Nathan Adrian's 3 seven seconds later cut it to three, 74-71, but two Brown free throws and a layup gave Kansas State enough room to collect its 15th victory of the year.

Kansas State shot a sizzling 54 percent in the second half, had a 25-15 advantage in points off turnovers and outscored the Mountaineers, 40-28, in the paint.

Phillip came off the bench to lead West Virginia with 20 points.

West Virginia shot 41.8 percent for the game, but converted just 44 percent of its field goal attempts inside the 3-point line.

 West Virginia had its five-game winning streak against the Wildcats snapped, induding its two-game winning streak at Bramlage Coliseum.
