## Bob Huggins Begins 35th Season as a Head Coach in 2016-17

- West Virginia returns four starters and eight letterwinners from last year's 26 -win team.
- WVU's returning players who started games in 2015-16: Jevon Carter (35 starts), Esa Ahmad (34 starts), Daxter Miles Jr. (30 starts), Nathan Adrian ( 16 starts), Teyvon Myers (four starts) and Elijah Macon (one start).
- Freshmen Maciej Bender, Chase Harler and Sagaba Konate join the Mountaineers in 2016-17. James "Beetle" Bolden, Logan Routt and Lamont West will join the lineup after redshirting last season as freshmen.
- The Mountaineers own a 92-15 all-time record in season openers, including a 98-9 record in home openers.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA apperance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU has made II NCAA postseason appearances in the last 12 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- WVU's 26 wins tied for the fifth-most victories in a single season.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 791-321 entering his 35 th season as a head coach. Huggins needs 15 wins to tie Eddie Sutton for eighth place all-time.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- Bob Huggins has 2720 -win seasons and 1625 -win seasons in 34 seasons as a head coach.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 34 ranked teams at WVU, including 12 wins over Top 10 teams.
- West Virginia is 103-30 in the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 55-26 mark in league games.
- WVU is $512-150(.775)$ all-time at the WVU Coliseum and $144-36$ at the WVU Coliseum in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU's average margin of victory at home last year was +22.4 . WVU averaged 83.3 points per game at home last year.
- Under Bob Huggins in the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 77.9 ppg while holding its opponents to 62.4 ppg
- West Virginia is $90-25$ in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a $48-4$ mark at home.
- West Virginia is 82-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 13 years, including 63 of its last 67 .
- West Virginia is $121-31$ against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU has won 106 of its last 134 non-conference games and 111 of its last 140 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- West Virginia has won 136 of its last 167 games against unranked teams, including 69 of its last 78 at the Coliseum.
- WVU led the country last year with its bench averaging 33.3 ppg . WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 21 of the last 27 games.
- WVU shot 40 percent or better in 25 games last season, including eight games of 50 percent or higher.
- WVU forced 30 or more turnovers in three games last season. WVU had at least seven steals in all but six games and forced 14 or more turnovers in all but five games.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 61 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history. Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked for 60 weeks during his career.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 17 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 34 of the last 37 weeks in the AP rankings.
- West Virginia has been ranked 81 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 194 weeks total in school history.
- The Mountaineers have won 41 of their last 42 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 in 2014-15 and 558 to 306 last season.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 558 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 54 times under Bob Huggins ( 311 games).
- WVU is 162-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 51 of its last 53 and 107 of its last 118 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 55-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 155-27 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 163-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is $137-10$ under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 146-26 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 150-35 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 1-O all-time on Nov. 11 and 96-26 all-time in the month of November.


## Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21 st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 791 games in 34 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks ninth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

## Scouting Mount St. Mary's

- Mount St. Mary's was 14-19 overall and 10-8 in the Northeast Conference in 2015-16.
- The Mountaineers reached the NEC Tournament semifinals where they lost to Fairleigh Dickinson, 80-75.
- Mount St. Mary's defeated Hood College, 89-65, in exhibition action earlier this month. Senior Will Miller came off the bench to hit seven 3-pointers to lead the Mountaineers.
- Jamion Christian (Mount St. Mary's, 2004) in his in fifth season as head coach at MSM. He is $63-65$ overall and 0-l against West Virginia.


## Series Record Against Mount St. Mary's

- This will be the fifth meeting between WVU and Mount St. Mary's with WVU holding a 4.0 series record.
- All four games have been in Morgantown and since 1988. The two teams last met in the season opener of the 2013-14 season on Nov. 8, 2013. Nathan Adrian had 11 points and Brandon Watkins had 10 points to lead WVU to a $77-62$ win.
- Bob Huggins is $1-0$ against Mount St. Mary's.
- WVU is $34-5$ all-time against current members of the Northeast Conference: Fairleigh Dickinson (1-0), LIU Brooklyn (4-1), Mount St. Mary's (4-0), Robert Morris (19-2), St. Francis N.Y. (3-0) and St. Francis Pa. (3-2).


## WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,702-1,059 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 2519 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold \& Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

## For Openers

- WVU owns a 92-15 all-time record in season openers, including a 98-9 record in home openers.
- The last time WVU dropped a season-opening home game was against Robert Morris to start the 1989-90 season.


## Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia has posted a winning non-conference mark for 24 consecutive seasons.
- West Virginia is $121-31$ against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 12 seasons
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference play.
- WVU is 90-25 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in seven different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went $11-1$ out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went $10-1$ outside the Big East,
2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was $11-1$ with its only loss at Purdue and 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing $12-1$.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.



## In The Rankings

- West Virginia is ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press poll and No. 18 in the latest USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers were ranked as high as No. 6 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today poll on Jan. 18 last season and finished No. 8 in the Associated Press poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 61 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10 .
- West Virginia has been ranked 81 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 194 weeks total in school history.
- WVU was ranked in every USA Today poll last season and cracked the AP rankings on Nov. 30 at No. 20. WVU has been ranked in 38 consecutive USA Today polls and 17 straight weeks in the AP poll.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60, and finished No. 22 in 2011.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks - the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.


## Against Ranked Teams

- The Kansas game marked the 291st time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Bob Huggins has 34 wins over ranked teams at WVU: No. 1 Kansas, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 13 lowa State, No. 15 Baylor, No. 17 lowa State and No. 19 Baylor (2015-16), No. 8 Kansas, No. 12 Maryland, No. 17 UConn, No. 18 Oklahoma and No. 22 Oklahoma State (2014-15), No. 8 Kansas, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. Il lowa State (2013-14), No. 9 Georgetown (2011-12), No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 8 Purdue, No. 11 Louisville, No. 13 Georgetown and No. 16 UConn (2010-11), No. 2 Kentucky, No. 9 Villanova, No. 15 Ole Miss, No. 19 Georgetown, No. 21 Ohio St., No. 22 Georgetown and No. 22 Pitt (2009-10), No. 2 Pitt, No. 12 Georgetown, No. 13 Villanova and No. 15 Ohio St. (2008-09) and No. 9 Duke, No. 10 Marquette and No. 15 UConn (200708).
- WVU owns 90 wins over APranked teams.
- Since 1995 , the Mountaineers have played 178 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 291 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 60 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 22 seasons.
- WVU has played 129 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 48 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 82 ranked teams during the regular season in nine years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.


## Preseason Bits

- West Virginia was predicted to finish second in the Big 12 Conference preseason coaches' poll.
- Last year, the Mountaineers were predicted to finish sixth and finished second in the Big 12 regular season and conference tournament.
- In 11 of the last 14 seasons, the Mountaineers have finished higher than or equal to their preseason prediction.
- Junior guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention Team.


## Academic Success

- Thirty-four of the last 35 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- This year, Jevon Carter is a nominee for the Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- In 2016, Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball First Team. Nathan Adrian was named to the second team. Adrian earned first-team honors in 2015. Elijah Macon and Brandon Watkins were second-team honorees in 2015.
- Three members of the 2010-11 team earned their bachelor's and master's degrees while playing at WVU under Huggins: Joe Mazzulla, Cam Thoroughman and Jonnie West.
- Nathan Adrian and James Long are currently pursuing master's degrees at WVU.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010, 2011 and 2016, WVU men's basketball was also recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- In May 2016, WVU was recognized by the NCAA for a perfect four-year APR score of 1,000.


## More Team Assists

- Bob Huggins has posted 38 conference road victories in nine seasons at WVU, including six Big 12 road wins last season and four Big 12 road wins two years ago.
- West Virginia is 93-69 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 48-39 in Big 12 Conference games. He is $38-33$ at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Bob Huggins has made 22 Division I NCAA Tournament appearances.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship in 2015-16.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in six of its last II NCAA appearances: (2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005 and 1998).
- West Virginia's basketball staff has 65 years of Division I head coaching experience.
