No. 11 West Virginia Begins Big 12 Play at Oklahoma State

- This is the fourth year in a row WVU has opened league play with two straight road games. WVU has started with at least a 2-0 league record the last three years, including a 4-0 start to league play last season.
- WVU has started 11-1 for the third consecutive year. Last year's team started 15-1 and the 2015 team started 14-1.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 Conference games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 24-12 in Big 12 play the last two years.
- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in 10th place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 802-322 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino by two wins and Eddie Sutton by four wins.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- Bob Huggins has 27 20-win seasons and 16 25-win seasons in 34 seasons as a head coach.
- West Virginia is 146-32 in its last 178 games against unranked teams, including 77 of its last 86 at the Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins has posted 38 conference road victories in nine seasons at WVU, including six Big 12 road wins last season and four Big 12 road wins two years ago.
- West Virginia is 93-69 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 49-39 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 39-33 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Bob Huggins has won 101 out of his 212 games at WVU away from home.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia was its first over a Top 10 team in a true non-conference road game since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU leads the country in scoring margin (33.6), turnover margin (15.8), turnovers forced (26.3) and steals (13.9). WVU ranks second in the country in offensive rebounds (16.3)
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 Conference in steals, while Nathan Adrian ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but one Mountaineer opponent has had at least 19 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has had 15 or more steals seven times in 2016-17.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 34.0 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.754 points per possession, tops in the country.
- WVU has forced more turnovers (315) than its opponents have made field goals (239).
- WVU has taken 189 more shots than its opponents this season -- 808 to 619.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 31 of the last 39 games. This year's team is averaging 43.6 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season, including three games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA appearance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU has made 12 postseason appearances in the last 13 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 68 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history. Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked for 60 weeks during his career.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 24 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 41 of the last 44 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 44 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 52 of their last 53 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 570 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 54 times under Bob Huggins (323 games).
- WVU is 173-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 62 of its last 64 and 118 of its last 129 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 58-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 165-27 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 173-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 147-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 156-27 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 155-36 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 21-13 all-time on Dec. 30 and 387-159 all-time in the month of December.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 802 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 10th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Oklahoma State

- Oklahoma State is 10-2 on the season following a 92-70 win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 22.
- The Cowboys have won their last four games and have a 6-0 record at Gallagher-Iba Arena.
- Brad Underwood, Bob Huggins' Director of Basketball Operations at K-State in 2006-07, is in his first season at Oklahoma State. Previously the head coach at Stephen F. Austin, Underwood holds a 99-16 career record.

Series Record Against Oklahoma State

- This will be the 10th meeting between West Virginia and Oklahoma State.
- The first meeting in the series took place at the Kentucky Invitational on Dec. 19, 1958, with the No. 7-ranked Mountaineers coming away with a 67-59 victory.
- The Mountaineers have won four in a row in the series: 70-56 in Stillwater and 77-60 in Morgantown last season, and 73-63 in Stillwater and 81-72 in Morgantown in 2014-15
- West Virginia is 2-2 against Oklahoma State at Gallagher-Iba Arena.
- Bob Huggins is 5-6 all-time against Oklahoma State. He was 1-1 while he was the head coach at Cincinnati and 0-1 against the Cowboys while he was the head coach at Kansas State. He is 4-4 against Oklahoma State at West Virginia.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,713-1,060 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015. Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). Recap

Jaysean Paige scored 17 points and Devin Williams had a 13-point, 15-rebound double-double to lead 14th ranked West Virginia to a 70-56 victory over Oklahoma State at Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

West Virginia (22-7, 11-5) used a 26-7 run between halves to turn an eight-point deficit into 44-31 lead with 15 minutes remaining in the game.

Torrid outside shooting gave the Cowboys a 24-16 lead with 6:16 remaining in the first half when Joe Burton got Oklahoma State's sixth 3 to go down, but West Virginia answered with a 17-5 run to end the first half with a 33-29 lead. Jevon Carter punctuated the run with a step-back 3 just ahead of the horn.

Then, the Mountaineers scored nine of the first 11 points of the second half to push their advantage out to 13, 44-31, immediately following the first media timeout of the second half.

West Virginia led by as many as 15 with 7:11 remaining and kept its margin in the 10-point range for most of the second half.

Oklahoma State committed 19 turnovers and failed to score at least 60 points for the fifth time in its last seven games. The Cowboys are playing with a depleted roster that includes two of their best backcourt players, Phil Forte III and Jawun Evans, out for the season with injuries.

"They're low on numbers," said Huggins. "They don't have subs and we made them work really hard. When your power forward (Leyton Hammonds) has to come down and help break pressure that's not what he normally does - and that's the whole philosophy of what we're trying to do."

Neither team shot well from the floor: West Virginia made just 35.7 percent of its field goal attempts while Oklahoma State converted just 41.5 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers had a 42-25 advantage on the glass and made 27 of 37 from the free throw line.

"For the most part, we shot it pretty well from the free throw line. Devin did a great job rebounding the ball on the defensive end for us today, and he and Jon (Holton), Nate (Adrian) and a host of others kept balls alive for us," said Huggins. "That's what we've got to do. That's what this team has to do."

Notebook

- The 11 conference victories match the Mountaineers' Big 12 win total from a year ago, and the road win was their fifth in league play in 2016 - now the most by West Virginia since joining the Big 12 in 2012.
Huggins surpassed Lefty Driesell to reach 10th place in all-time wins in NCAA history with 787.

Recap

West Virginia is 3-0 to begin Big Conference 12 play for the first time since joining the league back in 2012.

The 17th-ranked Mountaineers defeated Oklahoma State, 77-60, at the WVU Coliseum in front of an announced crowd of 11,219.

West Virginia (14-1, 3-0) overcame poor shooting (39 percent) and lots of fouls in an otherwise very businesslike 17-point victory over the Cowboys.

"It's hard to play when there is a stoppage every seven seconds. I think," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, who with the victory moves into a tie with Lou Henson for 11th on the NCAA all-time victories list with 779. "It seemed like we'd get going and it would get stopped, then we'd get going again and it got stopped again."

West Virginia never trailed, led by 12 at halftime and had its biggest lead of 23, 69-46, with 5:31 remaining.

Sophomore guard Jevon Carter led four double-digit scorers with 16 points, senior forward Jonathan Holton contributed 15 points, nine rebounds, three assists and a pair of steals, and Devin Williams added 12 points and nine boards.

Jaysean Paige scored nine in a starting role in place of regular guard Daxter Miles Jr., who has been slowed with an ankle injury sustained in practice. Miles was dressed and sitting on the bench but did not get on the floor.

"We're resilient," said Huggins. "Dax sprained his ankle and didn't practice for two days and my policy has always been if you don't practice I can't play you in the game. It's not fair to the other guys. I thought Teyvon (Myers) gave us good minutes; I'd wish he'd start shooting it the way I think he's capable of shooting it, and we got good minutes for a lot of guys.

Eleven different players saw action today and 10 got into the scoring column.

WVU had a 40-33 advantage on the glass, forced 16 turnovers and were much better handling the basketball with only 10 miscues.

Jawun Evans led Oklahoma State (9-6, 1-2) with 13 points.

Recap

No. 23 West Virginia got 40 points from its senior backcourt tandem of Juwan Staten and Gary Browne to knock off 22nd-ranked Oklahoma State 73-63 at Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma. Staten, coming off a 20-point game in the Mountaineers' 62-61 upset victory over eighth-rated Kansas earlier in the week, continued his outstanding play, the senior making 6-of-11 from the floor, going 9-of-10 from the free throw line and handing out a game-high seven assists.

Browne was equally impressive, hitting 3-of-7 from 3, making 9-of-12 from the free throw line and pulling down eight rebounds while scoring a career-high 18 points.

West Virginia (21-6, 9-5) destroyed Oklahoma State (17-10, 7-8) on the glass, the much more physical Mountaineers out-rebounding the Cowboys by a 37-20 margin. West Virginia almost had as many offense rebounds (18) as Oklahoma State (20) pulled down for the entire game. At the outset it looked like the Cowboys were going to run West Virginia right out of the gym, Oklahoma State taking a nine-point lead just eight minutes into the game. But WVU settled down, got a pair of jumpers from Staten to do down and then got a 3 from Jaysean Paige to reduce its deficit to two, 13-11.

The two teams played even basketball for the remainder of the half. Huggins said his team settled down when they got the ball into Staten's hands.

In the second half, West Virginia got a pair of big 3s from freshman guard Daxter Miles to build a five-point lead, 34-29, got another 3 from Browne and then added a short jumper from Elijah Macon to build its lead to eight, 39-31.

Two Browne free throws with 13:07 remaining gave the Mountaineers a double-digit advantage and the margin swelled to as many as 14 with 8:18 to go on Browne's third 3.

After Oklahoma State reduced West Virginia's lead to eight, 61-53, with 3:43 left, Browne hit two more from the line and then a pair of Staten baskets kept the lead in double digits as the clock wound down inside of two minutes to go.

All of West Virginia's remaining six points from that point on came at the free throw line. West Virginia shot just 40.4 percent overall, but hit 10-of-20 from 3 and also made 25 of its 37 free throw attempts.

Sophomore forward Devin Williams led everyone with 12 rebounds.

Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on four-of-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or more.

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six steals.

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

Notebook

- The Mountaineers now own a 93-15 all-time record in season openers, including a 99-9 record in home openers.
- The crowd of 10,510 was the fifth time in Coliseum history that WVU had a crowd of 10,000 or more in the month of November.
- Tarik Phillip made his first career start as a Mountaineer.

Recap

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead 19th-ranked West Virginia to a 107-66 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the WVU Coliseum.

The Delta Devils led briefly, 3-2, on an Isaac Williams 3, but the Mountaineers had this one in hand by the 15-minute mark of the first half, leading 21-7.

"I thought we came out and played with a lot of energy and played pretty well early and in the second half we decided we were done for the day," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

At halftime, the margin swelled to 64-28 and for a while it looked like West Virginia might challenge the Coliseum record for points scored, that coming against Alaska-Fairbanks on November 25, 1994 when the Mountaineers put 132 on the Nanocks, but WVU hit a lull at the six-minute mark and remained stuck on 96 points for more than three minutes.

"I understand it's hard to play when you're up by 40 at halftime or whatever it was, but all we talked about at halftime was get better," said Huggins. "And we talked about was where they were entering the ball, how they were entering the ball, how we can do a better job, can we work on this in the second half? But we didn't."

Teyvon Myers eventually scored the team's 100th point with 2:22 left.

Huggins once again substituted liberally, particularly in the second half and usually following mistakes, with all 13 players dressed getting significant minutes.

In the season-opening blowout win against Mount St. Mary's, 11 different players got into the scoring column. This time, it was 12, with WVU also getting double-digit efforts from Myers and Lamont West (12 each) and 10 from Esa Ahmad and Jevon Carter.

"I know I'm playing a lot of people and I'm playing a lot of combinations and our deal was we are going to play more people than anybody else and be fresher than everybody else and we gave up nine layups and a tip-in in the second half," noted Huggins. "That's uncalled for and it didn't happen in the first half when we were chasing them down."

Mississippi Valley State committed 26 turnovers which translated into 34 points for the Mountaineers.

An announced crowd of 7,807 attended the game.

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

"It feels good to win any first," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Maverick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists.

West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down.

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers.

Recap

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory.

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa Ahmad 3.

Another 3, this one by Dexter Miles Jr. from NBA range, pulled WVU to within two, 62-60, and Teyvon Myers tied the game at 62 on a driving layup.

Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in close.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enechionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up short.

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 1.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Enechionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining.

Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3-point arc (10 of 19).

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14. WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tank Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Dexter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Recap

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers.

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Dexter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Konate) gets 13. We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready."

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins. "We make people play. (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when

Recap

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67. Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino. Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball. Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players. Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches, rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony.

As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor. The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame. With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction. Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakthrough dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic display. Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points. The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers. UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

- UMKC was the 171st different team to play a game against WVU in the Coliseum (non-exhibition).
- WVU is now 135-36 against teams making their first appearance in the Coliseum.
- WVU is now 2-0 against teams from the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The other WAC team WVU faced was New Mexico State in 2007 in Newark, New Jersey.
