No. 7 West Virginia Looks For Season Sweep Against Oklahoma State

- Bob Huggins became the 10th NCAA Division I head coach to win 800 games on Dec. 17 against UMKC.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 809-325 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins trails Rollie Massimino by one win and Jim Phelan by 21 wins.
 - Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 151-35 in its last 186 games against unranked teams, including 79 of its last 89 at the WVU Coliseum.
- Last season, WVU won 13 Big 12 games and 11 two years ago. WVU is 30-15 in the Big 12 in the last two-plus seasons.
- West Virginia is 99-72 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 55-42 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 45-36 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- The Mountaineers have won 72 of their last 102 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 115-31 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 59-27 mark in league games.
- WVU is 524-151 (.781) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 156-37 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 13 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins at the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 81.0 ppg while holding its opponents to 62.4 ppg.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 37 ranked teams at WVU, including 14 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by least 15 points each in a single season.
- WVU's 21-point win over No. 1 Baylor was the eighth-largest margin victory ever against a No. 1-ranked AP team.
- WVU is 6-1 in its last seven games vs. AP Top 25 teams, with two wins over No. 1, one vs. No. 2 and two wins over No. 6.
 WVU leads the country in turnover margin (10.6), turnovers forced (22.4) and steals (11.6). WVU ranks second in scoring
- WVU leads the country in turnover margin (10.6), turnovers forced (22.4) and steals (11.6). WVU ranks second in scoring margin (21.9), third in offensive rebounds (15.4), sixth in assists (17.8) and seventh in scoring offense (87.6).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 in steals (fifth nationally), while Nathan Adrian ranks third in offensive rebounds.
- WVU's plus/minus leaders are Tarik Phillip (+337), Jevon Carter (+331) and Nathan Adrian (+318).
- WVU is averaging 44.2 deflections per game, while averaging 36.5 deflections in Big 12 Conference games.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but six Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU
 has had 15 or more steals eight times in 2016-17.
- Baylor's 29 turnovers were the most forced by WVU in a league game in 24 years (30 vs. St. Bonaventure in 1992).
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 29.6 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.86 points per possession, ranking fourth in the country.
- WVU has nearly forced more turnovers (493) than its opponents have made field goals (498).
- WVU has attempted 253 more shots than its opponents this season -- 1,431 to 1,178.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 36 of the last 49 games. This year's team is averaging 36.5 points from the bench.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season, including four games of 50 percent or higher.
- WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament last season.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 73 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 29 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 29 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 46 of the last 49 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked 49 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers have won 54 of their last 55 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 175-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 64 of its last 66 and 120 of its last 131 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 580 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 56 times under Bob Huggins (333 games).
- West Virginia is 59-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 172-29 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
 West Virginia is 179-18 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or mo
 - West Virginia is 179-18 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 151-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 163-30 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 160-39 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 19-17 all-time on Feb. 4 and 514-395 all-time in the month of February.

- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of • West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 809 games in 35 seasons as a head . coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active . Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks ninth among the NCAA's all time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season. .
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings . nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first . round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Oklahoma State

- Oklahoma State is 14-8 overall and 3-6 in the Big 12 following a 68-66 win at Oklahoma on Monday.
- The Cowboys have won four in a row, including the SEC/Big 12 Challenge over Arkansas.
- Oklahoma State is 4-4 on the road this season, including a 2-3 record in Big 12 road games.
- Brad Underwood, Bob Huggins' Director of Basketball Operations at K-State in 2006-07, is in his first season at Oklahoma State. Previously the head coach at Stephen F. Austin, Underwood holds a 103-22 career record.

Series Record Against Oklahoma State

- This will be the 11th meeting between West Virginia and Oklahoma State.
- The first meeting in the series took place at the Kentucky Invitational on Dec. 19, 1958, with the No. 7-ranked Mountaineers coming away with a 67-59 victory.
- The Mountaineers have won five in a row in the series: 92-70 in Stillwater to open Big 12 play on Dec. 30, 70-56 in Stillwater and 77-60 in Morgantown last season, and 73-63 in Stillwater and 81-72 in Morgantown in 2014-15
- West Virginia is 2-2 against Oklahoma State at the WVU Coliseum. .
- Bob Huggins is 6-6 all-time against Oklahoma State. He was 1-1 while he was the head coach at Cincinnati and 0-1 against the Cowboys while he was the head coach at Kansas State. He is 5-4 against Oklahoma State at West Virginia.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,720-1,063 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.

When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

West Virginia is 3-0 to begin Big Conference 12 play for the first time since joining the league back in 2012.

Score tied - 0 times.

The 17th-ranked Mountaineers defeated Oklahoma State, 77-60, at the WVU Coliseum in front of an announced crowd of 11.219.

West Virginia (14-1, 3-0) overcame poor shooting (39 percent) and lots of fouls in an otherwise very businesslike 17-point victory over the Cowboys

"It's hard to play when there is a stoppage every seven seconds, I think," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, who with the victory moves into a tie with Lou Henson for 11th on the NCAA all-time victories list with 779. "It seemed like we'd get going and it would get stopped, then we'd get going again and it got stopped again."

West Virginia never trailed, led by 12 at halftime and had its biggest lead of 23, 69-46, with 5:31 remaining.

Sophomore guard Jevon Carter led four double-digit scorers with 16 points, senior forward Jonathan Holton contributed 15 points, nine rebounds, three assists and a pair of steals, and Devin Williams added 12 points and nine boards.

Jaysean Paige scored nine in a starting role in place of regular guard Daxter Miles Jr., who has been slowed with an ankle injury sustained in practice. Miles was dressed and sitting on the bench but did not get on the floor.

"We're resilient," said Huggins. "Dax sprained his ankle and didn't practice for two days and my policy has always been if you don't practice I can't play you in the game. It's not fair to the other guys. I thought Tevyon (Myers) gave us good minutes: I'd wish he'd start shooting it the way I think he's capable of shooting it, and we got good minutes for a lot of guys.

Eleven different players saw action today and 10 got into the scoring column.

WVU had a 40-33 advantage on the glass, forced 16 turnovers and were much better handling the basketball with only 10 miscues. Jawun Evans led Oklahoma State (9-6, 1-2) with 13 points.

West Virginia (22-7 11-5) used a 26-7 run between halves to turn an eight-point deficit into 44-31 lead with 15 minutes remaining in the game.

Torrid outside shooting gave the Cowboys a 24-16 lead with 6:16 remaining in the first half when Joe Burton got Oklahoma State's sixth 3 to go down, but West Virginia answered with a 17-5 run to end the first half with a 33-29 lead. Jevon Carter punctuated the run with a step-back 3 just ahead of the horn.

Then, the Mountaineers scored nine of the first 11 points of the second half to push their advantage out to 13, 44-31, immediately following the first media timeout of the second half.

West Virginia led by as many as 15 with 7:11 remaining and kept its margin in the 10-point range for most of the second half.

Oklahoma State committed 19 turnovers and failed to score at least 60 points for the fifth time in its last seven games. The Cowboys are playing with a depleted roster that includes two of their best backcourt players, Phil Forte III and Jawun Evans, out for the season with injuries.

"They're low on numbers," said Huggins, "They don't have subs and we made them work really hard. When your power forward (Leyton Hammonds) has to come down and help break pressure that's not what he normally does - and that's the whole philosophy of what we're trying to do.'

Neither team shot well from the floor: West Virginia made just 35.7 percent of its field goal attempts while Oklahoma State converted just 41.5 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers had a 42-25 advantage on the glass and made 27 of 37 from the free throw line.

"For the most part, we shot it pretty well from the free throw line, Devin did a great job rebounding the ball on the defensive end for us today, and he and Jon (Holton), Nate (Adrian) and a host of others kept balls alive for us," said Huggins. "That's what we've got to do. That's what this team has to do.

A sellout crowd of 13,714 watched an entertaining game with both teams shooting better than 60 percent for a good portion of the first half. Oklahoma State (18-12, 8-10) finished the game shooting 54.2 percent overall, including 52.4 percent from 3.

Jeff Newberry led everyone with 23 points on 8-of-11 shooting, while Phil Hickey contributed 17 for the Cowboys.

Oklahoma State had a 12-10 advantage on the glass at halftime but West Virginia flipped that around in the second half by outrebounding Oklahoma 23-10 to finish the game plus-11 on the glass.

West Virginia's biggest lead of the game was 15 with 6:43 remaining.

The Mountaineers had sizable advantages over the Cowboys in second-chance points (22-4), bunch points (28-3) and points off of turnovers (19-10),

Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia finished with a winning non-conference mark for the 25th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 133-32 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 13 seasons.
 - The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
 - WVU is 102-26 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
 - WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in eight different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1 and in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn, N.Y.
 - WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

In The Rankings

- West Virginia is ranked No. 7 in the Associated Press poll and No. 12 in the latest USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers began the season No. 20 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- West Virginia has been ranked as high as No. 7 (three times in the AP poll) in both polls this season.
- The Mountaineers were ranked as high as No. 6 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today poll on Jan. 18 last season and finished No. 8 in the Associated Press poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 73 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 29 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- West Virginia has been ranked 93 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 207 weeks total in school history.
- WVU has been ranked in 49 consecutive USA Today polls and for 29 straight weeks in the AP poll.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

- The Kansas game marked the 294th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Bob Huggins has 37 wins over ranked teams at WVU: No. 1 Baylor, No. 2 Kansas (No. 1 in USA Today Coaches Poll), No. 6 Virginia (2016-17), No. 1 Kansas, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 13 Iowa State, No. 15 Baylor, No. 17 Iowa State and No. 19 Baylor (2015-16), No. 8 Kansas, No. 12 Maryland, No. 17 UConn, No. 18 Oklahoma and No. 22 Oklahoma State (2014-15), No. 8 Kansas, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 11 Iowa State (2013-14), No. 9 Georgetown (2011-12), No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 8 Purdue, No. 11 Louisville, No. 13 Georgetown and No. 16 UConn (2010-11), No. 2 Kentucky, No. 9 Villanova, No. 15 Ole Miss, No. 19 Georgetown, No. 21 Ohio St., No. 22 Georgetown and No. 22 Pitt (2009-10), No. 2 Pitt, No. 12 Georgetown, No. 13 Villanova and No. 15 Olio St. (2008-09) and No. 9 Duke, No. 10 Marquette and No. 15 UConn (2007-08).
- WVU's 21 point win over No. 1 Baylor was the largest loss in AP poll history by a team in its first-ever game as No. 1.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia this season was its first non-conference road win over a Top 10 team since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU became the fourth team in the AP poll to beat an AP No. 1 and No. 2 team by at least 15 points each in a season.
- This season, West Virginia becamse the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- This season marks the first time WVU has defeated three AP Top 10 teams in the same season, and the first time WVU has ever beaten three AP Top 6 teams in the same year.
- WVU owns 93 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 181 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 294 total games
 against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 61 percent of the games against the best teams
 in the country have come during the last 23 seasons.
- WVU has played 132 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 51 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 85 ranked teams during the regular season in 10 years, the most in school history. Gale
 Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during
 regular season play in five years.

- Bob Huggins has posted 41 conference road victories in 10 seasons at WVU, including wins at Iowa State, Oklahoma State and Texas this season, six Big 12 road wins last season and four Big 12 road wins two years ago.
- Bob Huggins has won 104 out of his 219 games at WVU away from home.
- West Virginia is 102-26 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 57-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 91-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 14 years, including 72 of its last 76.
- West Virginia is 133-32 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 14 seasons.
- WVU has won 118 of its last 147 non-conference games and 123 of its last 153 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- Bob Huggins has made 22 Division I NCAA Tournament appearances.
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship in 2015-16.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA apperance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 years.
- WVU has made 12 postseason appearances in the last 13 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in six of its last 11 NCAA appearances: (2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005 and 1998).
- West Virginia's basketball staff has 65 years of Division I head coaching experience.

Carter, Miles Jr. Earn All-Big 12 Honors

- Junior guards Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention team. The two Mountaineers were two of the 10 Big 12 Conference players earning preseason recognition.
- Carter started all 35 games a year ago and finished fourth in the Big 12 in steals and 11th in assists.
- Carter earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Defensive Team as a freshman and as a sophomore.
- Miles Jr. averaged 9.4 points per game, with 40 made 3-point field goals.
- He finished 11th in the Big 12 in steals per game a year ago.

Press Virginia

- Press Virginia is back in full swing for the Mountaineers for the third season in a row.
- West Virginia forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan.
- All but six Mountaineer opponents have had at least 18 miscues this year, including three with more than 30.
- WVU has 15 or more steals eight times this season.
- The Mountaineers are forcing their opponents to turn it over on 29.5 percent of their possessions, tops in the country.
- In 2014-15, the Mountaineers led the country in forced turnovers, steals and offensive rebounds. Last season, West Virginia led the country in forced turnovers.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 in 2014-15 and 558 to 306 last season.
- WVU forced 30 or more turnovers in three games last season. WVU had at least seven steals in all but six games and forced 14 or more turnovers in all but five games.

WVU To Open 2017-18 Season in Germany

- West Virginia will open its 2017-18 basketball season in Germany against Texas A&M at Ramstein Air Base.
 - The event is part of the Armed Forces Classic a series of Division I men's basketball college games that are televised from United States military bases around Veteran's Day as a morale event for service members.
- WVU and Texas A&M will meet on Nov. 10, 2017, and it will be televised by ESPN.

WVU Coliseum Renovations

- The 46-year-old WVU Coliseum received a \$23-million facelift in 2016.
- The concession stands doubled from 21 points of sale in the past to 40 points of sale.
- The concourse level is adorned with new graphics, more color and easily recognizable signage to help fans to get to their seating locations more rapidly.
- Twelve new Daktronics LED boards have been added inside the inner bowl to add more color to the arena.
- Forty-three high definition television monitors have been added throughout the concourse.
- There have been 140 more toilets and three restrooms added in the concouse.
 - As part of a private gift of \$1.3 million, WVU's locker room and hallway received a signifant makover.
- Phase two of the Coliseum project will involve seating improvements to the arena's interior and will start at the conclusion of the 2016-17 basketball season.

Huggins Announces Recruiting Class

- Coach Bob Huggins inked five student-athletes to letters of intent during the November signing period.
- Teddy Allen, a 6-foot-5 wing from Mesa, Arizona, currently attends Boys Town High in Omaha, Nebraska.
- Derek Culver, a 6-foot-10 forward from Boardman, Ohio, currenty attends Warren G. Harding High.
- Wesley Harris, a 6-foot-8 forward from Jackson, Mississippi, currently attends Lawson State Community College in Birmingham, Alabama. He attended high school at Callaway High.
- D'Angelo Hunter, a 6-foot-7 wing from Louisville, Kentucky, currently attends Navarro College in Corsicana, Texas. He attended high school at Pleasure Ridge Park High.
- Brandon Knapper, a 6-foot-1 guard from South Charleston, West Virginia, currently attends Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Virginia. He attended high school at South Charleston High.







West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good.'

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on fourof six shooting, freshman Sagaba Knonate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or more

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots - three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon - and made six steals

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."



Nathan Adrian scored 15 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead 19th-ranked West Virginia to a 107-66 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the WVU Coliseum.

The Delta Devils led briefly 3-2 on an Isaac Williams 3 but the Mountaineers had this one in hand by the 15-minute mark of the first half, leading 21-7.

"I thought we came out and played with a lot of energy and played pretty well early and in the second half we decided we were done for the day." said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

At halftime, the margin swelled to 64-28 and for a while it looked like West Virginia might challenge the Coliseum record for points scored, that coming against Alaska Fairbanks on November 25, 1994 when the Mountaineers put 132 on the Nanocks, but WVU hit a lull at the six-minute mark and remained stuck on 96 points for more than three minutes.

"I understand it's hard to play when you're up by 40 at halftime or whatever it was, but all we talked about at halftime was get better," said Huggins. "And we talked about was where they were entering the ball, how they were entering the ball, how we can do a better job, can we work on this in the second half? But we didn't."

Tevvon Mvers eventually scored the team's 100th point with 2:22 left

Huggins once again substituted liberally, particularly in the second half and usually following mistakes, with all 13 players dressed getting significant minutes.

In the season opening blowout win against Mount St. Mary's, 11 different players got into the scoring column. This time, it was 12, with WVU also getting double digit efforts from Myers and Lamont West (12 each) and 10 from Esa Ahmad and Jevon Carter.

"I know I'm playing a lot of people and I'm playing a lot of combinations and our deal was we are going to play more people than anybody else and be fresher than everybody else and we gave up nine layups and a tip in in the second half," noted Huggins. 'That's uncalled for and it didn't happen in the first half when we were chasing them down.

Mississippi Valley State committed 26 turnovers which translated into 34 points for the Mountaineers

Bob Huggins said after the first two games that he wanted a full 40 minutes from his 19th-ranked WVU men's basketball team.

He got it against New Hampshire.

West Virginia smothered the Wildcats with a suffocating full-court press and some accurate 3-point shooting to roll to a 100-41 victory at the WVU Coliseum in the opening game of the NIT Season Tip Off in front of 8.842.

"I thought our rotations were really good, it's a hard matchup for them - they're a half-court team that likes to run a lot of sets and Bill (Herrion) does a great job of coaching them," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, now six wins shy of becoming just the ninth coach in NCAA Division I history to achieve 800 career victories. "That pressure keeps mounting and mounting and mounting and I like what we did today.

West Virginia (3-0) used a 24-4 run early in the first half to build an insurmountable 46-20 halftime lead. In the second half, the Mountaineers kept their foot on the pedal as Huggins used every player he had available

Six different players reached double figures, led by sophomore forward Esa Ahmad's career-high-tying 14 points.

"We've been on him pretty good kind of revving the motor up a little more and I thought he played a lot harder today," said Huggins. "When he's running the floor and getting a full head of steam he's probably going to finish it over most people."

Freshman forward Lamont West contributed 13, Jevon Carter and Nathan Adrian 12 each, 11 by Teyvon Myers and 10 from Tarik Phillip.

The backups even got into the act, freshman guard Chase Harler scoring nine, backup guards James Long and Beetle Bolden contributing six each and freshman center Logan Routt recording a late tip in basket for his first career points as a Mountaineer

Overall, WVU's bench outscored UNH's 50-10.

The only unresolved matter was if West Virginia was going to set a school record for forced turnovers established in 2014 with 36 against VMI.

New Hampshire finished two shy of that with 34. West Virginia shot 54.4 percent overall, and 46.8 percent from 3, making 15 of 32.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Maverick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists.

West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers

West Virginia nearly overcame a 20-point first half deficit, but the Mountaineers couldn't make the critical plays down the stretch to pull out the victory.

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. But West Virginia (4-1) came out with much more energy at the start of the second half, trimmed Temple's lead to eight, 60-52 with 11:51 to go, and then to three, 60-57, on an Esa Ahmad 3

Another 3, this one by Daxter Miles Jr. from NBA range, pulled WVU to within two, 62-60, and Teyvon Myers tied the game at 62 on a driving lavup

Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in close.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enenchionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up short

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound. Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 14.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Esa Ahmad made all seven of his field goal attempts to lead 25th-ranked West Virginia with 19 points as the Mountaineers cruised to a 108-61 victory over Manhattan at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 8,190 got to see coach Bob Huggins' entire roster for a good portion of the second half after West Virginia built a 60-27 halftime lead.

"I thought we played pretty hard and we took better care of the ball for the most part," said Huggins.

The Mountaineer defense forced Manhattan into committing a record 40 turnovers, the Jaspers spreading their miscues across the board

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points, Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 11 and James Long came off the bench to score 10 in just eight minutes of action

"James Long he's given so much to our program," said Huggins. "He gets other guys in the gym and he's got such a great work ethic so it was great to be able to get him in a little bit in the first half and play as much as he did in the second half"

All 15 players who got into the game scored and 62 of the team's 108 points came from the bench.

Ahmad, coming off a 19-point performance to Temple, continued his strong play. He has made 15 of his last 20 field goal attempts in career-high-duplicating performances.

"He gets better all the time, we've just got pushing up those expectations and try to keep that motor running that way all the time," said Huggins. "We all know he's a talented guy and I really think he's got a great advantage in this league being a 6-foot-7 three-man because there aren't very many of them."

WVU shot 47.3 percent for the game and also hit 30 of 43 from the free throw line for 69.8 percent, an improvement over the 60.5 percent the team was shooting coming into tonight's game

Manhattan got 11 points from Xavier Peart.

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14.

WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Notebook

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008.
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesvile for the first time since 1975.

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers.

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Daxter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Knonate) gets 13. We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready.

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins. "We make people play. (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when you're constantly throwing the ball backwards."

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense eventually wore down VMI and the 15th-ranked Mountaineers cruised to their eighth victory of the season, 90-55, at the WVU Coliseum.

The win against 1-7 VMI was never in doubt, but the Keydets did hang around longer than most people expected.

VMI trailed by just five, 22-17 with 7:36 remaining in the first half and then by six with 4:34 left. Then, early in the second half the Keydets got a conventional three-point play from Will Miller to pull within 12.

The Mountaineers (8-1) were slow dosing out on defense, allowing VMI to convert eight 3s, permitted the much smaller Keydets to grab 13 offensive rebounds, missed several layups and was just 26 of 42 from the free throw line.

But eventually, the constant pressure got to VMI as West Virginia's lead swelled to 20 at the 10-minute mark, and then to 30 with 6:34 to go.

WVU's biggest lead was 38 with 3:16 remaining.

Guard Daxter Miles Jr. made 5 of 6 from 3 and finished with a game-high 20 points. The junior became the first Mountaineer player to edipse the 20-point barrier in 2016-17.

Esa Ahmad recovered from a poor first half to finish with12, and senior forward Brandon Watkins came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 11 points and 10 rebounds in just 17 minutes of action. That was his second career double-double.

Those three players combined to score 21 points, grab 18 rebounds and block four shots.

Freshman guard James "Beetle" Bolden finished with 9 points on three 3s, getting some extended work with the ones, including a second half start.

West Virginia once again dominated all of the specialty statistics, including a 27-3 advantage in points off of turnovers, a 34-9 edge in

- second chance points and a 44-28 advantage in points off the bench. Twelve different Mountaineer players got into the scoring column. Q.J. Peterson led VMI with 17 points.

Recap

West Virginia's Bob Huggins became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I history to win his 800th career win against UMKC, 112-67.

Score tied - 2 times.

Huggins now joins a college basketball who's who of coaches that includes Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan, Eddie Sutton and Rollie Massimino.

Now he is one of them and he got there by winning at places such as Walsh College, Akron, Cincinnati, Kansas State and now West Virginia - not exactly the blue bloods of college basketball.

Afterward, West Virginia University conducted an on-court celebration of Huggins' 35-year coaching career involving WVU director of athletics Shane Lyons, Huggins' family and his current and former players

Also, special video messages from former players, assistant coaches, rival coaches, celebrities, national media members and his family played on the video board during the ceremony.

As for the game, the Mountaineers used a 24-0 run early in the first half to take control of the contest. The lead was 32 at halftime and eventually swelled to 43 points at the conclusion of the game with mostly third-stringers on the floor.

The way the players Huggins had in the game then consisting mostly of freshmen demonstrates why he has won so many games in what will one day lead to his induction into the Naismith Hall of Fame.

With the Mountaineers leading by 40 points, freshman guard Beetle Bolden hustled for a loose basketball that was rolling toward midcourt, dove for it and deflected the ball in Chase Harler's direction.

Harler grabbed the basketball and set sail to the rim for a breakaway dunk. Those among the 8,800 that were left in the arena stood up and applauded the fantastic hustle play.

Seven different players reached double figures, led by Nathan Adrian's 13 points.

The Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the floor (41 of 77) and forced UMKC into committing 27 turnovers.

UMKC guard LaVell Boyd led all scorers with 14 points.

- UMKC was the 171st different team to play a game against WVU in the Coliseum (non-exhibition).
- WVU is now 135-36 against teams making their first appearance in the Coliseum
- WVU is now 2-0 against teams from the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The other WAC team WVU faced was New Mexico State in 2007 in Newark, New Jersey.

Recap

Esa Ahmad scored 17 points in 24 minutes of action to power 11th-ranked West Virginia to an 84-57 victory over Radford at the WVU Coliseum

West Virginia (10-1) used a 23-0 run to build a 32 point first-half lead the Highlanders nearly having more turnovers than points scored (22 points to 21 turnovers) at the break.

WVU shot 58.8 percent from the floor, including 60 percent from 3 in the first half, but those numbers fell off considerably in the second half as Huggins continued to use different players.

"The guys that we started, I thought they went out and were walking around so I took them out and put some other guys in and they weren't a whole lot better," said Huggins. "The game has a way of getting even with you when you approach it the wrong way. We went on that big run and we thought the game was over and kind of quit playing.

Radford (4-7) actually outscored West Virginia in the second half, 35-31, grabbed two more rebounds than the much taller Mountaineers, led by Sterling Christy's game high 10 boards, and overall the Highlanders had a 40-37 edge on the glass for the game.

"I don't know if it was effort or a lack of focus," said Huggins. "We boxed out and stood and then went and got it. We made an effort to block out sometimes."

West Virginia's big advantages were in points in the paint (46-8) and points off of turnovers (41-10). Bench scoring, which has been a staple all season for the Mountaineers, was just plus-eight (33-25).

Jevon Carter contributed 15 and Tarik Phillip led the reserves with 13.

Overall, West Virginia shot 49.2 percent from the floor but just 48.4 percent from the free throw line.

"When you miss free throws, when you fumble the ball - which we fumbled countless balls, when you miss layups you're not ready to play, explained Huggins

Radford was worse, hitting just 42.1 percent of its free throw tries. Justin Cousin scored 12 and Caleb Tanner scored 10 for Radford,

which is coached by Mike Jones, who spent one year on John Beilein's WVU coaching staff in 2003.

An announced crowd of 8,311 watched the game.

Tarik Phillip came off the bench to score a team-high 16 points to lead 11th-ranked West Virginia to 92-61 victory over Northern Kentucky at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia trailed by eight early in the game but was able to flip that around by halftime, leading by seven at the break.

"They did a good job of throwing the ball out of traps," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "They probably did a best job distributing the ball out of traps than anybody's done all year. When you've got two against one you're supposed to really bother that guy but we didn't bother him much."

WVU used a 14-4 run to begin the second half to build its lead to 17, 48-31, at the first media stoppage and then got its margin to 20 points at the 10-minute mark.

Northern Kentucky (9-4) made a mini run to reduce West Virginia's lead to 15, 67-52, but senior Brandon Watkins answered with a pair of free throws to begin another 9-1 spurt to make it a 23-point contest.

Teyvon Myers added 13 off the bench and WVU got 12 from starting forward Esa Ahmad and 11 from starting guard Jevon Carter to improve to 11-1.

West Virginia shot 51.6 percent from the field for the game and forced 25 turnovers.

Northern Kentucky got 12 points from Carson Williams and 10 each from Lavone Holland II and Brennan Gillis.

Center Drew McDonald, the team's leading scorer averaging better than 17 points per game, failed to score.

"A hard earned win," said Huggins. "They do a good job. They've done a great job going into places and winning. They've got nine wins." An announced crowd of 10,197 watched the game.

Eleventh ranked West Virginia nearly led wire to wire in depositing Oklahoma State, 92-75, at sold-out Gallagher-Iba Arena in Stillwater, Oklahoma

It was the Big 12 opener for both teams.

With the exception Lucas NGuessan's dunk to begin the game. Oklahoma State spent the rest of the day simply trying to get the ball in bounds and across the midcourt line against "Press Virginia," which made eight steals and forced 19 turnovers that translated into 26 points.

This game's outcome was more a matter of some stellar outside shooting from guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter against Oklahoma State's more highly touted backcourt of Jawun Evans and Phil Forte

Miles' game-high 22 came on nine of 14 shooting, while Carter's 15 was the result of converting five out of 10 from the floor.

Forte led Oklahoma State with 18

Freshman forward Sagaba Konate came off the bench to contribute a season-high 12 points after taking junior Elijah Macon's spot in the rotation. Macon was a late scratch after suffering a knee injury in the win against Northern Kentucky.

Brandon Watkins earned his second straight start and contributed nine points and five rebounds.

Three other players - Nathan Adrian, Esa Ahmad and Lamont West - added nine points each as West Virginia shot a sizzling 55 percent from the floor.

The Mountaineers were also fairly accurate from the free throw line, converting a better-than-usual 76.9 percent from the charity stripe.

Following a Leyton Hammonds basket that reduced West Virginia's lead to 10-7, the Miles took control of the game with three straight layups to make it 16-7. Jevon Carter was fouled by Evans attempting a 3, and his three free throws expanded West Virginia's lead to 12, 19-7.

The margin mushroomed to 16 on a Konate stuff with 2:14 remaining before the Mountaineers settled for a 13-point advantage at the break.

On three occasions, Oklahoma State reduced its deficit to eight but each time West Virginia had answers.

The big response came following two Evans free throws when West Virginia scored seven straight points to push the margin back to 15. Another 3 from West with 12:03 remaining got the margin to 18, 61-43, which is about where it remained until Miles' driving layup with 4:21 left in the game made it 82-61, West Virginia.

Some late 3s from Forte kept the margin under 20.

Texas Tech

Anthony Livingston's 3-point field goal with six seconds left lifted Texas Tech to a 77-76 overtime victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at United Supermarkets Arena in Lubbock. Texas.

West Virginia (12-2, 1-1) had trouble stopping Tech's dribble penetration and was also victimized by fouls, the Mountaineers sending the Red Raiders to the free throw line 30 times where they made 20. Meanwhile, WVU didn't help itself when it got to the foul line, West

Virginia converting just 13 out of 24 for 54.2 percent.

West Virginia's full-court pressure defense turned Tech over just 13 times - one fewer than the Mountaineers' 14 for the game.

The Red Raiders shot 51 percent from the field, including 53.8 percent from 3-point distance.

There were 21 lead changes with the game's biggest lead being seven points - that by West Virginia with 17:13 to go when Daxter Miles Jr. converted a driving layup off a feed from Nathan Adrian. But Texas Tech erased that within a span of five minutes when the Mountaineers went ice cold from the floor.

Texas Tech's scoreless spell came near the end of regulation after Justin Gray's layup with 2:20 left put the Red Raiders ahead by five.

Lamont West's two free throws reduced Tech's lead to three, and then Adrian banged in a 3 with seven seconds left to tie the game at 67.

Shadell Millinghaus tried to win it for Tech in regulation but his 3 was off the mark just ahead of the horn.

In overtime, missed free throws by Tarik Phillip, Miles Jr., Esa Ahmad and Adrian - six in all - kept Tech in position to get the upset.

Two Jevon Carter free throws pushed West Virginia's lead to three. 70-67, but two at the other end by Aaron Ross and then a turnaround jumper by Smith gave the lead back to Texas Tech, 71-70.

Ahmad followed with his two misses at the line before Phillip was able to get two to go down with 2:15 left, putting WVU back ahead, 72-71.

Stevenson answered with a 3 - his second - to make it 74-72. Then, Adrian could only get one of two to go down from the line before Phillip followed a Devon Thomas miss with a 3 to put West Virginia ahead, 76-74, with 33 seconds remaining

The Red Raiders came down and worked to get into position for a late shot, with Livingston taking it off a feed from Stevenson.

Carter had a chance to win the game for West Virginia at the other end but he couldn't get his 3 to go down with one second left.

Notebook

It is the first regular season win for the Red Raiders over the Mountaineers since they joined the Big 12 in 2012. Tech's only victory against West Virginia since then came in the first round of the 2013 Big 12 tournament when WVU finished 13-19.

Recap

Daxter Miles Jr. scored 22 points and Jevon Carter banged in three critical 3s during a key stretch late in the second half to lead seventhranked West Virginia to an 82-70 victory over TCU inside the WVU Coliseum

In a battle of two 12-2 teams both looking to go 2-1 in Big 12 play. the game boiled down to the final 9:47 when West Virginia outscored the Horned Frogs 25-13.

TCU, which trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half, and then again by 11 with 13:12 remaining, used a 15-4 run to tie the game at 57 following a Desmond Bane layup with 9:47 to go.

But Miles answered with a layup and Sagaba Konate followed with a traditional three-point play when he was fouled by Vlad Brodziansky while scoring near the basket. Konate's free throw pushed West Virginia's advantage to 62-57.

Then three minutes later, Carter took control of the game with the Mountaineers leading by just four.

Following a missed jumper by TCU's Alex Robinson, Carter came down on the other end and drilled a 3 from the top of the key. The next time down the floor, following a basket by Bane, Carter drained another. This one put WVU ahead by eight, 71-63.

His third came with 2:52 left to put the Mountaineers ahead by nine, 74-65. Konate followed with another lay in and then a steal by Nathan Adrian led to Miles' 3 from the corner to make it a 15-point game with two minutes to go.

West Virginia (13-2, 2-1) used an 18-9 run over the remaining six minutes by holding the Horned Frogs to just three field goals during that stretch of time.

Overall, TCU committed 18 miscues leading to 28 West Virginia points - a deciding factor in the game.

Esa Ahmad added 16 points on seven of 11 shooting, while Carter and Konate contributed 13 points each. For Konate, who also grabbed eight rebounds coming off the bench, it was a season high in scoring for him.

Adrian, despite scoring just four points, was also a big contributor in the victory by grabbing a game-high nine rebounds, handing out five assists and making two steals. He played a team high 34 minutes.

Robinson led TCU with 17 points on three of nine shooting. Brodziansky added 14 on five-of-six shooting.

Overall, the Horned Frogs made 46.2 percent from the floor and were 17-of-21 from the free throw line - attempting seven more free throws and making eight more than the Mountaineers (nine of 14). An announced crowd of 12.568 watched the game.

WVU improved to 10-0 all-time against TCU, including a 5-0 record against the Horned Frogs in Morgantown.

Recap

Baylor, which reached No. 1 in both major polls a day earlier for the first time in school history, ran into "Press" Virginia in Morgantown and the 10th-ranked Mountaineers ran away with a surprisingly easy 89-68 victory over the Bears.

It was the second consecutive year West Virginia has knocked off No. 1 at home in January. In 2015-16, it was top-ranked Kansas which succumbed to the Mountaineers, 74-63.

Nathan Adrian scored a career-high 22 points, grabbed six rebounds, made three steals and handed out two assists in a terrific allaround performance. The Morgantown High graduate made seven-of-10 from the field, knocked down a pair of 3s and also hit six-of-nine from the free throw line in one of the best all-around efforts.

Carter, too, stepped up and played wonderfully by scoring 17, handing out seven assists and producing a game-high five steals. Carter hounded Baylor's guards the entire night and was a major reason why the Bears turned the ball over a staggering 29 times.

Eight of the 11 players who got into the game for Baylor had multiple turnovers, including six by forward Ishmail Wainright.

West Virginia (14-2, 3-1) led Baylor (15-1, 3-1) throughout, and the Mountaineers had plenty of chances to extend their lead in the first half, but the Bears stuck around by beating West Virginia on the glass. The rebounding disparity was 12 in the Baylor's favor, and that minimized to some extent the 16 turnovers they committed in the first 20 minutes of play.

The Mountaineers began the game strong and took an early 11-point lead before Baylor began chipping away, gradually reducing its deficit to four with 2:31 remaining.

In the second half, Baylor scored first on a Wainright layup but Watkins answered with a jumper. Another Watkins jumper pushed the lead to nine and soon it was 13 on a quick 7-0 spurt, capped by a pair of Esa Ahmad layups.

A Watkins dunk made it 57·43, and then a Tarik Phillip jumper with 9:36 remaining gave West Virginia a 15-point advantage. A Miles Jr. follow-up dunk pushed the margin to 21, but he was called for a technical foul for hanging on the rim, giving Baylor free throws at the other end.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 26 points, twice, before Huggins began emptying his bench.

A sellout crowd of 14,632 watched the game.



Teyvon Myers scored a career-high 16 points and Jevon Carter added 17 to lead 10th-ranked West Virginia to a 74-72 victory at the Erwin Center in Austin, Texas.

Texas, with leading scorer Tevin Mack, had a six-point lead with 10:40 remaining in the game when Andrew Jones made one of his four 3-point baskets.

Two Myers free throws, and a Tarik Phillip traditional three-point play sliced the Texas lead to one in a matter 35 seconds. Another Phillip basket after he stole the ball from Kerwin Roach Jr. gave West Virginia a 54-53 lead.

Another Jones 3 tied the game at 60 with 6:55 to go but that's when Carter took over. A Carter free throw and then a steal in the open court led to a short jumper and a three-point lead.

Two more Carter free throws, coming after a terrific Sagaba Konate block on Shaquille Cleare's turnaround jumper put West Virginia up by five, 65-60, with 3:52 left.

Another Carter jumper with 2:28 remaining answered Allen's jumper to make it 68:65. Carter scored again with 1:42 left after two Roach Jr. free throws.

A key play came with 43 seconds left when Nathan Adrian, battling a virus, managed to grab Phillip's missed 3 and was fouled by Allen. Adrian hit both free throws to put West Virginia ahead by four.

Two Carter free throws with 22 seconds left gave West Virginia enough room to hold on for a two-point road win.

After trailing for most of the first half, WVU used a 22-13 run over the remaining 7:09 of the half to take a five-point lead at halftime.

Phillip contributed 14. giving West Virginia 30 points from its two guards coming off the bench.

That made up for Daxter Miles Jr.'s struggles from the floor. The junior missed all six of his 3-point field goal tries and finished with seven.

Adrian finished with eight points and six rebounds, but spent a good portion of the first half on the bench with foul trouble.

Allen led everyone with 19 points on six of seven shooting. Jones finished with 17 before fouling out with 3:23 remaining.

Texas (7-10, 1-4) made eight 3s and shot 47.9 percent from the floor. The Longhorns committed 19 turnovers, but West Virginia was only able to score 21 points off those turnovers.

The Mountaineers were a frigid four of 18 from 3 against primarily a zone defense.

Recap

Jordan Woodard's driving layup with 2.5 seconds left in overtime gave Oklahoma an 89-87 come-from behind victory over seventh-ranked West Virginia at the WVU Coliseum.

Woodard, who led the Sooners with 20 points, missed a free throw with three seconds left that could have won it in regulation. But he sure made up for it in overtime.

With nine minutes remaining it looked like WVU was well on its way to a double digit victory when Jevon Carter's driving layup gave it a 66-51 lead.

But then Oklahoma scored nine straight before Carter's basket ended the dry spell with seven minutes to go. A Woodard traditional three-point play a minute later got the OU deficit to three, and eventually Rashard Odomes tied it at 69 with 4:25 left.

But West Virginia rebuilt it to four twice, 73-69 and 75-71, before Woodard took over the game by going right at and then past the Mountaineer defense. His driving basket with 2:10 to go pulled the Sooners to within two, and he tied it with 45 seconds remaining on another dribble-drive to the hoop.

Carter answered at the other end with 21 seconds left to give WVU a 77-75 lead, but once more, Oklahoma got the ball into Woodard's hands and he got close enough to the rim to get his short baseline jumper to go down. He was fouled by Esa Ahmad while doing so.

Woodard's free throw to win the game bounced off the rim and Adrian's desperation heave sailed out of bounds at the end regulation after Huggins had called timeout to draw up a play in case Woodard made his foul shot.

In overtime, West Virginia got the lead to four, 85-81, but couldn't hold onto it at the free throw line and also couldn't stop Woodard whenever had the ball.

West Virginia simply couldn't convert free throws at crunch time, missing five of seven at one point and finished the overtime period just four out of nine. Overall, West Virginia missed 11 out of 29 for 62.1 percent.

With 2:02 left, Daxter Miles Jr. missed one of two; with 1:14 on the clock and West Virginia leading 86-85, Ahmad missed both attempts and then trailing 87-86, Carter rimmed out the first of two. His second one tied the game eight seconds left, but Woodard easily got to the basket to score the game's deciding bucket.

Oklahoma had little difficulty handling West Virginia's pressure, OU turning the ball over just 12 times $^\circ$ one less than WVU's 13.

Notebook

The loss spoiled an outstanding offensive night for Carter, who led West Virginia with a season-high 23 points. Adrian contributed 14 and Elijah Macon came off the bench to score a season-high 13.

Recap

All five Kansas State starters scored double figures and the Wildcats overcame a 12-point first half deficit to defeat seventh-ranked West Virginia 79-75 at Bramlage Coliseum in Manhattan, Kansas.

Sophomore point guard Jamau Stokes matched Barry Brown for team scoring honors with 15 points.

D.J. Johnson added 14 while Wesley Iwandu and Dean Wade contributed 13 apiece.

West Virginia, now 15-4, 4-3, was unable to hold on to a doubledigit lead for the second straight game; WVU led Oklahoma by 15 points in the second half before falling, 89-87, in overtime.

"We haven't had that edge and we need to get that edge back," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

- The defense once again struggled to get stops in the second half and West Virginia also turned the ball over a season-high 23 times.
- Three different players had four turnovers and six had at least two bobbles

After missing its first six shots of the game, West Virginia made seven of its next nine and eventually took a 12-point lead, which it enjoyed on three different occasions in the first half, before K-State scored 10 straight over the remaining 1:13 to reduce the Mountaineers' lead to two at halftime, 38-36.

The Wildcats took control of the game midway through the second half when they led by 11. But West Virginia responded by scoring 12 of the next 13 points over a three-minute span to retake the lead on Tarik Phillip's traditional three-point play with 5:07 left.

The two teams exchanged points before layups by Wesley Iwundu, Jamau Stokes and Iwandu put the Wildcats ahead, 73-68, with 2:18 to go.

Brown managed to take the ball away from Jevon Carter and was fouled by Carter, which led to a free throw to give K-State a six-point margin with 1:49 remaining.

Nathan Adrian's 3 seven seconds later cut it to three, 74-71, but two Brown free throws and a layup gave Kansas State enough room to collect its 15th victory of the year.

Kansas State shot a sizzling 54 percent in the second half, had a 25-15 advantage in points off turnovers and outscored the Mountaineers, 40-28, in the paint.

Phillip came off the bench to lead West Virginia with 20 points. West Virginia shot 41.8 percent for the game, but converted just 44 percent of its field goal attempts inside the 3-point line.

West Virginia had its five game winning streak against the Wildcats snapped, including its two game winning streak at Bramlage Coliseum.

Recap

Esa Ahmad started the night off with an emphatic baseline tomahawk dunk and then continued to throw down dunks in leading the 18th-ranked Mountaineers to a resounding 85-69 victory over Kansas, ranked No. 1 in the Coaches' poll and No. 2 in the .AP poll.

From the outset, Ahmad and his teammates brought the crowd to their feet, particularly the final nine minutes of the game after Kansas briefly retook the lead, 59-58, on a Svi Mykhailiuk 3.

Ahmad came right back with that little curl play around the basket that was so successful all night, scoring once again against Jackson.

Following Ahmad's basket to put West Virginia back ahead, 60-59, Macon contributed one of two from the free throw line and then another freshman, West Virginia's Lamont West, banged in a big 3 from the corner to make it a five-point game with 7:56 remaining.

A Josh Jackson flying tomahawk reduced the lead to three, 64-61, with 7:11 to go before Ahmad answered once more with a pair of free throws.

Two more Macon free throws extended West Virginia's lead to seven, 68-61, and vet another Ahmad close one pushed the lead to nine

A Landen Lucus dunk - his only two points of the game - stopped the West Virginia spurt momentarily.

But Daxter Miles Jr., with the shot dock winding down to three, got a nifty shot from the baseline to go down, freshman Sagaba Konate followed with a thunderous dunk in transition and then Miles hit the dagger from the corner with 1:57 left.

That put WVU ahead by 12, and everyone in the building could sense the Kansas players waiving the white flag. Free throws by Tarik Phillip and Miles preceded a Jevon Carter 3 with 28 seconds remaining to give West Virginia its biggest lead of the game at 19, 85 66.

Nathan Adrian contributed 11 points, five rebounds, two assists, a block and a steal in 29 minutes of action, while Miles Jr. and Phillip added 10 each

Devonte' Graham, who burned West Virginia for 27 points in the 2016 Big 12 Championship game, scored 17 on six of 10 shooting.

Frank Mason III, averaging 20.1 points per game heading into the game, scored 15 but managed just six of 16 shooting.

Overall, Kansas shot 42.4 percent from the floor and just 40 percent from the free throw line (6 of 15).

Notebook

- WVU became the first team since Indiana in 2011-12 to beat No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.
- WVU is the fourth team in AP history to beat an AP No. 1 and AP No. 2 by least 15 points each in a single season.
- It is also the first time Kansas has lost four consecutive games in the same arena since it joined the Big 12 in 1996.

Recap

The issues West Virginia had in recent losses against Oklahoma and Kansas State showed up once again against Texas A&M, but the 18th-ranked Mountaineers were able to overcome them to defeat the Aggies, 81-77, in the opening game of the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

Poor decision making, defensive lapses and an inability to throw the basketball into the ocean from the free throw line in the second half almost caused a 13-point meltdown in the game's remaining 2:36, but Esa Ahmad finally managed to make two free throws with five seconds left and the Mountaineers leading by just two.

There were many moments when the 12.836 who showed to watch this one thought win No. 17 was in the bag:

* When the lead was 20 with 19:32 to go in the second half

* When Jevon Carter's 3 ended the team's long scoreless drought with 8:04 left to put the Mountaineers back up by 11

* When Carter hit another 3 with 2:36 remaining to make it a 13-point game

* When Ahmad got his free throw to go in with 1:09 left to once again get the lead to double digits

* And, finally, when Elijah Macon dunked the ball with 23 seconds left to make it a two-possession game.

But after Macon's breakaway dunk, Hampton's 3 nine seconds later reduced West Virginia's lead to 79-77 with 14 seconds left.

Ahmad was fouled by Tonny Morelos-Trocha with five seconds

showing on the clock and he was able to get both free throws to go in - avoiding West Virginia's sixth and seventh misses from the line in the second half.

Overall, the Mountaineers hit 12 of their 23 free throw attempts, but missed seven after the break

WVU's poor free throw shooting almost canceled out the 23 turnovers it caused - most of those coming in the first half, including five from sophomore guard Chris Collins.

Gilder led everyone with 24. Davis finished with 19 points and 18 rebounds while Hampton came off the bench to score 21 - 16 of those coming in the second half.

Carter hit two critical second-half 3s for West Virginia and finished with 19. He also grabbed a team best nine boards.

Ahmad contributed 14 points - 10 of those coming in the first half while Daxter Miles Jr. added 10.

West Virginia (17-4) tried 26 3-point field goal attempts, hitting 11, while Texas A&M finished the afternoon 10 of 21 from behind the arc.

Notebook

The win gives West Virginia a 12-1 record outside of Big 12 play, and snaps the Mountaineers' six-game losing streak to SEC teams dating back to a victory over Vanderbilt in Puerto Rico in 2011.

Recap

Nathan Adrian was West Virginia's perfect antidote for "Hilton Magic." The senior scored a career-high 23 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to lead the seventh-ranked Mountaineers to an 85-72 victory over lowa State at Hilton Coliseum.

Score tied - 4 times.

Adrian made seven of his 10 field goal attempts, including two of three from 3, knocked down seven of eight from the free throw line and his basket right before the first-half buzzer really gave the team a big boost going into the locker room leading by four, 44-40.

In the second half, West Virginia (18·4, 6·3) never trailed as the Mountaineers began taking control of the game at the halfway point. Adrian grabbed Esa Ahmad's miss and was fouled by Nazareth

Mitrou-Long while trying to follow. He made two free throws to put the Mountaineers up six, 56-50, and then his 3-pointer from the corner off a pretty feed from Ahmad got the lead to seven with 10:26 remaining.

Daxter Miles Jr. answered a Morris jumper with a 3 from the corner to expand the lead to nine, 64-55, and a Teyvon Myers steal led to two free throws and an II-point advantage.

A Sagaba Konate put back basket and Jevon Carter's driving layup pushed the lead to 15 with 5:42 to go. The widest margin was 16 points with 49 seconds remaining.

West Virginia knocked down its free throws, hitting 17 of 20, including 15 of 17 in the second half.

Tarik Phillip came off the bench to give the Mountaineers a big boost with 15, Ahmad contributed 14 and seldom-used freshman guard Beetle Bolden, who has scored just six points in eight prior Big 12 games, came off the bench and scored eight, including a pair of bankshot 3s. He also made a pretty drive to the basket for two.

Preseason Big 12 player of the year Monte Morris had a tough night with Carter mostly guarding him. Morris made just four of 14 from the floor, missing both 3-point attempts, never got to the free throw line and finished with just eight - eight below his season average.

Matt Thomas led lowa State (13.8, 5.4) with 19, but 13 of those came in the first half. The Cyclones shot just 29 percent from the field in the second half.

The loss was lowa State's second-worst loss of the season. lowa beat the Cyclones by 14 back on December 8.

A crowd of 14,384 watched the game.

- West Virginia won for the second year in a row at lowa State. The Mountaineers are now 2-3 in Ames.
- West Virginia's 13-point win at Iowa State was Iowa State's first double-figure loss in regulation at home since 2010.
