No. 15/16 West Virginia Meets VMI For The 50th Time In History

- Bob Huggins looks for career win No. 799 as WVU takes on VMI at the Coliseum on Saturday.
- Bob Huggins is in ninth place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. His record now stands at 798-322 in his 35th season as a head coach. Huggins needs eight wins to tie Eddie Sutton for eighth place all-time.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- Bob Huggins has 27 20-win seasons and 16 25-win seasons in 34 seasons as a head coach.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 35 ranked teams at WVU, including 12 wins over Top 10 teams.
- West Virginia has won 57 of its last 61 games at home in the month of December.
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia was its first over a Top 10 team in a true non-conference road game since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU leads the country in turnover margin (15.5), turnovers forced (26.5) and steals (14.1).
- Jevon Carter leads the Big 12 Conference in steals, while Nathan Adrian ranks second in offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers forced a school record 40 turnovers against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- All but one Mountaineer opponent has had at least 19 miscues this year, including three with more than 30. WVU has
 had 15 or more steals five times in 2016-17.
- This season, WVU has forced 212 turnovers and has grabbed 126 offensive rebounds.
- WVU has taken 126 more shots than its opponents this season -- 543 to 417.
- WVU's bench has scored 30 or more in 27 of the last 35 games. This year's team is averaging 43.2 points from the bench.
- The Mountaineers' bench scored 62 points against Manhattan on Nov. 28.
- WVU led the country last year with its bench averaging 33.3 ppg.
- WVU scored 60 points in the first half against Manhattan. WVU scored 64 points in the first half against Mississippi Valley
 State, marking the first time in school history WVU scored 60 or more points in the first half in two games in a season.
- Esa Ahmad finished with 19 points for the second consecutive game against Manhattan. He has shot 50 percent or better in four of the last six outings, including 75 percent in two of the last four contests.
- WVU has shot 43 percent or higher in every game this season. WVU shot 40 percent or better in 25 games last season, including eight games of 50 percent or higher.
- West Virginia is 97-26 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 52-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 86-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 14 years, including 67 of its last 71.
- West Virginia is 128-32 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 13 seasons.
- WVU has won 113 of its last 142 non-conference games and 118 of its last 148 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- West Virginia made its 27th appearance in the NCAA Championship last season, dating back to 1955.
- \bullet $\,$ WVU finished in second place in the Big 12 Conference regular season and postseason tournament.
- Last season, WVU made its seventh NCAA apperance in the last nine years and ninth appearance in the last 12 seasons.
- WVU has made 12 postseason appearances in the last 13 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 65 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history. Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked for 60 weeks during his career.
- Dating back to last year, WVU has been ranked for 21 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 38 of the last 41 weeks in the AP rankings.
- The Mountaineers have won 48 of their last 49 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 566 consecutive games.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 54 times under Bob Huggins (319 games).
- WVU is 169-30 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 58 of its last 60 and 114 of
 its last 125 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 56-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 161-27 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 169-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- · West Virginia is 143-10 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 152-27 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 153-36 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 11-7 all-time on Dec. 10 and 383-159 all-time in the month of December.

- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 798 games in 35 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks ninth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 30 of 34 seasons, including 22 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 34 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 64 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.

Scouting VMI

- VMI is 1-6 overall following an 86-68 loss at home to Gardner-Webb last Saturday.
- The Keydets have lost five in a row. Their win this season was at home to Southern Virginia (78-47) on Nov. 15.
- Dan Earl, a 1997 graduate of Penn State, is 10-27 in his second year at VMI.

Series Record Against VMI

- Saturday's game will be the 50th meeting between West Virginia and VMI. WVU leads the all-time series, 44-5.
- West Virginia was a member of the Southern Conference from 1950-68. The series began on Jan. 15, 1916.
- WVU has won three in a row in the series. The last meeting was a 103-72 WVU win on Nov. 26, 2014, at the Charleston
- VMI's last visit to Morgantown was on Nov. 28, 2012 (a 94-69 WVU win). WVU is 20-1 against VMI in Morgantown.
- Bob Huggins is 3-0 all-time against VMI. All three of those meetings happened since Huggins has been at WVU.
- West Virginia is 87-11 against current members of the Southern Conference: The Citadel (8-2), East Tennessee State (2-0), Furman (24-4), UNC Greensboro (3-0), VMI (44-5), Western Carolina (2-0) and Wofford (4-0).

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 108th season and 114th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,709-1,060 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 27 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 19 times, including an
 amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 12 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America
 first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in
 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former
 Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former
 Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15). The Ark (1916-27). Stansbury Hall
 (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during
 the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

- West Virginia is ranked No. 15 in the Associated Press poll and No. 16 in the latest USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers began the season No. 20 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- The Mountaineers were ranked as high as No. 6 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the USA Today poll on Jan. 18 last season and finished No. 8 in the Associated Press poll.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 65 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 25 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- West Virginia has been ranked 85 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 198 weeks total in school history.
- WVU has been ranked in 41 consecutive USA Today polls and for 21 straight weeks in the AP poll.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

- The Virginia game marked the 292nd time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Bob Huggins has 35 wins over ranked teams at WVU: No. 6 Virginia (2016-17), No. 1 Kansas, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 13 Iowa State, No. 15 Baylor, No. 17 Iowa State and No. 19 Baylor (2015-16), No. 8 Kansas, No. 12 Maryland, No. 17 UConn, No. 18 Oklahoma and No. 22 Oklahoma State (2014-15), No. 8 Kansas, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 11 Iowa State (2013-14), No. 9 Georgetown (2011-12), No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 8 Purdue, No. 11 Louisville, No. 13 Georgetown and No. 16 UConn (2010-11), No. 2 Kentucky, No. 9 Villanova, No. 15 Ole Miss, No. 19 Georgetown, No. 21 Ohio St., No. 22 Georgetown and No. 22 Pitt (2009-10), No. 2 Pitt, No. 12 Georgetown, No. 13 Villanova and No. 15 Ohio St. (2008-09) and No. 9 Duke, No. 10 Marquette and No. 15 UConn (2007-08).
- WVU's win at No. 6 Virginia this season was its first non-conference road win over a Top 10 team since winning at No. 5 Kentucky on Dec. 20, 1957.
- WVU owns 91 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 179 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 292 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 60 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 23 seasons.
- WVU has played 130 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 49 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 83 ranked teams during the regular season in nine years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.













Preseason Bits

- West Virginia was predicted to finish second in the Big 12 Conference preseason coaches' poll.
- Last year, the Mountaineers were predicted to finish sixth and finished second in the Big 12 regular season and conference tournament.
- In 11 of the last 14 seasons, the Mountaineers have finished higher than or equal to their preseason prediction.
- Junior guards Daxter Miles Jr. and Jevon Carter were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention Team.

Academic Success

- Thirty-four of the last 35 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- This year, Jevon Carter is a nominee for the Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- In 2016, Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball First Team. Nathan Adrian was named to the second team. Adrian earned first-team honors in 2015. Elijah Macon and Brandon Watkins were second-team honorees in 2015.
- Three members of the 2010-11 team earned their bachelor's and master's degrees while playing at WVU under Huggins: Joe Mazzulla, Cam Thoroughman and Jonnie West.
- Nathan Adrian and James Long are currently pursuing master's degrees at WVU.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010, 2011 and 2016, WVU men's basketball was also recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- In May 2016, WVU was recognized by the NCAA for a perfect four-year APR score of 1,000.





Recap

West Virginia forced 21 turnovers that turned into 26 points and that powered the 20th-ranked Mountaineers to a season-opening 87-59 victory over Mount St. Mary's at the WVU Coliseum.

A curious crowd of 10,510 got their first look at the newly renovated concourse area to the 46-year-old arena, and then watched the same old Bob Huggins' Mountaineers run away with another non-conference home victory.

"Generally when you miss free throws the way we missed free throws, and you are as careless with the ball the way we were today, you're not really ready to play," said Huggins. "We just weren't very good."

Nathan Adrian led a balanced stat sheet with 13 points on fourof-six shooting, freshman Sagaba Knonate came off the bench to contribute 11 points and six rebounds and Jevon Carter added 10.

"I was really encouraged with Sags. I thought Sags played really well; protects the basket, he rebounds the ball, he catches the ball so I was happy with him," said Huggins.

Eleven different players had double-digit minutes, no starter played more than Carter's 27 and eight different guys scored seven points or

West Virginia (1-0) shot 47.8 percent from the floor, hit 17 of 29 from the free throw line, made six of 18 from 3 and never trailed in the game, leading by 19 at halftime and reaching its biggest margin of 29 at the end of the game.

The Mountaineers grabbed 19 offensive rebounds, blocked seven shots \cdot three coming from junior forward Elijah Macon \cdot and made six steals.

Mount St. Mary's (0-1) got 15 points from Greg Alexander, 14 from Elijah Long and 11 from Miles Wilson.

West Virginia had a 45-32 edge on the glass in a game that featured a foul a minute - a combined 46 in 40 minutes of action.

"I was extremely disappointed in the second half with the pressure when they just kept driving down and shooting layups," said Huggins. "That hasn't happened in two years and now all of a sudden with this group it's happening."

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead 19th-ranked West Virginia to a 107-66 victory over Mississippi Valley State at the WVU Coliseum.

The Delta Devils led briefly, 3·2, on an Isaac Williams 3, but the Mountaineers had this one in hand by the 15-minute mark of the first half, leading 2l-7.

"I thought we came out and played with a lot of energy and played pretty well early and in the second half we decided we were done for the day," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

At halftime, the margin swelled to 64:28 and for a while it looked like West Virginia might challenge the Coliseum record for points scored, that coming against Alaska-Fairbanks on November 25, 1994 when the Mountaineers put 132 on the Nanocks, but WVU hit a lull at the six-minute mark and remained stuck on 96 points for more than three

"I understand it's hard to play when you're up by 40 at halftime or whatever it was, but all we talked about at halftime was get better," said Huggins. "And we talked about was where they were entering the ball, how they were entering the ball, how we can do a better job, can we work on this in the second half? But we didn't."

Teyvon Myers eventually scored the team's 100th point with 2:22 eft.

Huggins once again substituted liberally, particularly in the second half and usually following mistakes, with all 13 players dressed getting significant minutes

In the season-opening blowout win against Mount St. Mary's, 11 different players got into the scoring column. This time, it was 12, with WVU also getting double-digit efforts from Myers and Lamont West (12 each) and 10 from Esa Ahmad and Jevon Carter.

"I know I'm playing a lot of people and I'm playing a lot of combinations and our deal was we are going to play more people than anybody else and be fresher than everybody else and we gave up nine layups and a tip-in in the second half," noted Huggins. 'That's uncalled for and it didn't happen in the first half when we were chasing them

Mississippi Valley State committed 26 turnovers which translated into 34 points for the Mountaineers.

An announced crowd of 7,807 attended the game.

Bob Huggins said after the first two games that he wanted a full 40 minutes from his 19th-ranked WVU men's basketball team.

He got it against New Hampshire.

West Virginia smothered the Wildcats with a suffocating full-court press and some accurate 3-point shooting to roll to a 100-41 victory at the WVU Coliseum in the opening game of the NIT Season Tip-Off in front of 8.842.

"I thought our rotations were really good, it's a hard matchup for them - they're a half-court team that likes to run a lot of sets and Bill (Herrion) does a great job of coaching them," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, now six wins shy of becoming just the ninth coach in NCAA Division I history to achieve 800 career victories. "That pressure keeps mounting and mounting and mounting and I like what we did today."

West Virginia (3·0) used a 24·4 run early in the first half to build an insurmountable 46·20 halftime lead. In the second half, the Mountaineers kept their foot on the pedal as Huggins used every player he had available

Six different players reached double figures, led by sophomore forward Esa Ahmad's career-high-tying 14 points.

"We've been on him pretty good kind of revving the motor up a little more and I thought he played a lot harder today," said Huggins. "When he's running the floor and getting a full head of steam he's probably going to finish it over most people."

Freshman forward Lamont West contributed 13, Jevon Carter and Nathan Adrian 12 each, 11 by Teyvon Myers and 10 from Tarik Phillip.

The backups even got into the act, freshman guard Chase Harler scoring nine, backup guards James Long and Beetle Bolden contributing six each and freshman center Logan Routt recording a late tip-in basket for his first career points as a Mountaineer.

Overall, WVU's bench outscored UNH's 50-10.

The only unresolved matter was if West Virginia was going to set a school record for forced turnovers established in 2014 with 36 against VMI.

New Hampshire finished two shy of that with 34. West Virginia shot 54.4 percent overall, and 46.8 percent from 3, making 15 of 32.

It was a "Press Virginia" infomercial for West Virginia during the NIT Season Tip-Off at the Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The 19th-ranked Mountaineers smothered Illinois with their suffocating full-court pressure defense to run away with an 89-57 victory.

"It feels good to win any time," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins of the victory, WVU's first at Barclays Center following two losses here.

Nathan Adrian hit his season average with 13 points and Jevon Carter contributed 10 in a well-balanced WVU attack that saw nine different players score at least six points.

All 11 players who got into the game for West Virginia in the first half scored as it built a 19-point halftime lead. After a Mayerick Morgan follow-up basket gave Illinois a 9-7 lead, West Virginia scored the next eight points and the used an 18-2 run to build a 25-11 lead.

Daxter Miles Jr., making his first appearance of the season, knocked down back-to-back 3s, and Brandon Watkins came off the bench to score a couple of close ones to key the run.

Miles played 17 minutes coming off the bench and finished with 8 points and two assists.

West Virginia's lead swelled to 18 on two Lamont West free throws, but a six-minute dry spell allowed the Illini to make it a single-digit game with 4:50 left in the half when Michael Finke got his 3 to go down

Miles ended the drought with a driving layup, and then WVU turned up its defensive pressure to get another quick basket on a breakaway dunk by freshman Maciej Bender.

Watkins hit a short jumper, Ahmad got another basket on a follow and West finished a strong first half by following Myers' miss just ahead of the buzzer.

It took Illinois four minutes to score to begin the second half and by that time West Virginia's lead was 31.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 39 points following a Bender follow-up basket with 4:42.

The Mountaineers finished the game shooting 45.8 percent and if not for missed free throws, the margin could have been far worse. WVU was just 17 of 30 from the charity stripe.

Illinois committed 24 turnovers and handled the basketball today like it was on fire, the Mountaineers scoring 34 points off those turnovers

Temple got late free throws free throws from Alani Moore III and Obi Enechionya to hold off 19th-ranked WVU 81-77 to win the NIT Season Tip-Off played at Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

It looked like the Owls might run away and hide with this one, Enechionya scoring 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half as Temple built a 45-25 halftime lead. Tarik Phillip gave West Virginia its first lead of the second half, 65-64, hitting the first of two free throws and Ahmad gave West Virginia a brief three-point advantage with a basket in close.

After Enechionya answered with a 3 - his first field goal of the second half - the Mountaineers turned the ball over on back-to-back possessions leading to four straight Temple free throws.

Quinton Rose and Myers traded field goals and then Daniel Dingle's layup gave Temple a four-point lead with 3:09 to go. Ahmad scored inside and was fouled on the play but he couldn't complete the traditional three-point play.

After Dingle got one of two to go down, Myers scored again to make it a one-point game. Here, Temple called timeout and Enenchionya got a good look from the left elbow, but his shot came up

Ahmad was unable to grab the rebound, Miles Jr. fouled Moore near midcourt and he knocked down both free throws with 14.1 seconds left.

Huggins used his final timeout between Moore's free throw attempts to draw up a last-second play, but the best West Virginia could get to try and tie the game was a heavily contested step-in shot by Myers that was blocked from the wing.

Enenchionya was fouled on the rebound and made the game's final point with 0.7 seconds remaining.

Temple won the game at the free throw line (21 of 24) and from behind the 3-point arc (10 of 19).

Esa Ahmad made all seven of his field goal attempts to lead 25th-ranked West Virginia with 19 points as the Mountaineers cruised to a 108-61 victory over Manhattan at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 8,190 got to see coach Bob Huggins' entire roster for a good portion of the second half after West Virginia built a 60-27 halftime lead.

"I thought we played pretty hard and we took better care of the ball for the most part," said Huggins.

The Mountaineer defense forced Manhattan into committing a record 40 turnovers, the Jaspers spreading their miscues across the

Nathan Adrian scored 15 points, Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 11 and James Long came off the bench to score 10 in just eight minutes of

"James Long he's given so much to our program," said Huggins. "He gets other guys in the gym and he's got such a great work ethic so it was great to be able to get him in a little bit in the first half and play as much as he did in the second half"

All 15 players who got into the game scored and 62 of the team's 108 points came from the bench.

Ahmad, coming off a 19-point performance to Temple, continued his strong play. He has made 15 of his last 20 field goal attempts in career-high-duplicating performances.

"He gets better all the time, we've just got pushing up those expectations and try to keep that motor running that way all the time," said Huggins. "We all know he's a talented guy and I really think he's got a great advantage in this league being a 6-foot-7 three-man because there aren't very many of them."

WVU shot 47.3 percent for the game and also hit 30 of 43 from the free throw line for 69.8 percent, an improvement over the 60.5 percent the team was shooting coming into tonight's game.

Manhattan got 11 points from Xavier Peart.

- WVU's 40 forced turnovers were the most by any Division I team since 2007.
- The previous school record for turnovers in a game was set by VMI with 36 in 2014.
- WVU had 60 or more points in the first half for the 12th time in school history. It is the first time WVU has scored 60 or more points in the first half in two games in the same season.
- Manhattan is now 0-3 in the WVU Coliseum.

Recap

West Virginia used a 7-0 run late in the game to upset sixth-ranked Virginia, 66-57, at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Virginia.

The win snapped Virginia's 24-game home winning streak, the sixth-longest home winning streak in the country.

WVU turned the ball over just eight times to Virginia's 14.

WVU used the 3-ball to beat Virginia - a big one coming from Esa Ahmad with 1:30 remaining to give West Virginia a 58-55 lead. Prior to that, freshman forward Lamont West hit two big 3s, the second coming with 4:36 left to give the Mountaineers a 52-49 lead.

Following Ahmad's 3 from the corner, Tarik Phillip made a driving layup to put West Virginia ahead by five, 60-55.

Jevon Carter then blocked London Perrantes' 3-point try at the other end, Nathan Adrian grabbed the rebound and he was fouled by Devon Hall with 27 seconds left and Adrian made both free throws. On the next trip down the floor, Perrantes couldn't get another 3 to go down, Ahmad grabbed the rebound, was fouled by Hall, and hit two more free throws to make it a three-possession game with 15 seconds left.

Virginia (7-1) had an 11-point lead midway through the first half, 17-6, before West Virginia began finding some openings in Virginia's Pack Line defense.

A traditional three-point play from Carter reduced Virginia's lead to six, and then three straight baskets from Brandon Watkins, Daxter Miles Jr. and Ahmad pulled WVU to within one, 23-22.

A flagrant foul 2 called on Miles, causing him to be ejected from the game with 2:42 left in the first half, momentarily slowed the Mountaineers' momentum, but Teyvon Myers came in and responded with a short jumper to give WVU its first lead of the game, 24-23, with 27 seconds left in the half.

West Virginia shot 45.1 percent from the floor and made 16 of 19 from the free throw line in the victory. Virginia came into the game ranked No. 1 in the country in scoring defense giving up an average of just 44.1 points per game.

Notebook

- It was West Virginia's first victory over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating No. 8 Maryland, 69-59, in a 2015 NCAA Tournament game played in Columbus, Ohio, and the first regular-season non-conference road victory against a ranked team since beating 15th-ranked Ohio State, 76-48, in Columbus on December 27, 2008
- It was also the first true non-conference road win over a top 10-ranked team since the Mountaineers defeated fifth-ranked Kentucky, 77-70, on December 20, 1957 - 59 years ago.
- WVU played in Charlottesvile for the first time since 1975.

Recap

Western Carolina, without starting point guard Devin Peterson, was swarmed by 15th-ranked West Virginia in Charleston, the Mountaineers cruising to a 90-37 victory.

Esa Ahmad led four double-figure scorers with 14 points. Jevon Carter contributed 13, Elijah Macon had a season-high 11 and Teyvon Myers scored 10 for the Mountaineers

A crowd of 8,384 watched West Virginia score the first seven points and limit the Catamounts to only two field goals during the game's first 10 minutes to build a 25-point lead.

The margin swelled to 28, then 31, and finally 34 at halftime on two 3s by Teyvon Myers and another 3 by Daxter Miles Jr. ahead of the horn.

Eleven different players got into the game and the Mountaineers made half their 3-point field goal attempts (7 of 14) in the first half. Thirteen different players scored.

The West Virginia reserves played a good portion of the second half.

"I think the biggest thing that came out of the second half is we played a lot of guys a lot of minutes," said Huggins. "You get a guy like Magic (Maciej Bender). He plays nine minutes and we needed to play him some minutes. Sags (Sagaba Knonate) gets 13. We have six freshmen so if we're planning on playing those guys then we need to try and get them ready and that's the only way we can get them ready.

"It's just hard when you have five of them out there because you can't run anything," added Huggins.

Western Carolina shot just 26 percent from the field, turned the ball over 34 times and didn't have a player score more than six points.

"It's hard for them just because we don't let people run offense," said Huggins. "We make people play. (Western Carolina coach) Larry Hunter is a good coach and he runs really good sets, we just let people get into it. I think everybody gets to the point where they see other people turn it and you want to take care of the ball. The best thing to do is throw it backwards and it's hard to run offense when you're constantly throwing the ball backwards."

- The last time the leading scorer from an opposing team had six points or less was by Maryland on Dec. 14, 1946.
- The last WVU opponent to score 37 or less points in a game was The Citadel on Dec. 20, 2006. WVU won that game 63:36.
- WVU finished with a 37-0 advantage on points off turnovers.
- The Mountaineers are now 66-20 in the Charleston Civic Center and 74-22 all-time in games played in Charleston.
