BIG 12 TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

West Virginia won its second conference tournament title and the first in the Big 12 with a 77-66 win over No. 2 Baylor on March 6, 2017, at the Chesapeake Energy Arena in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

QUICK HITTERS

- No. 22/20-ranked West Virginia (24-11, 8-10 Big 12) completed the 2016-17 season by winning the 2017 Big 12 Tournament title and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the 12th time in program history.
- The Mountaineers finished ranked in the AP (22) and WBCA Coaches Poll (20) for the sixth time in program history and for the first time in back-to-back seasons.
- West Virginia won its first Big 12 Championship title since joining the league and its second conference tournament title in program history.
- The sixth-seeded Mountaineers toppled No. 3-seed Oklahoma (82-58) in the quarterfinal, No. 2-seed Texas (62-59) in the semifinal and No. 1-seed Baylor (77-66) in the final. The Sooners were ranked No. 19, Texas No. 12/14 and Baylor No. 2 - marking the first time WVU knocked off three consecutive ranked opponents in three days.
- West Virginia made its 12th NCAA Championship appearance overall and 10th under coach Mike Carey. WVU has reached the postseason for a school-record 11 consecutive years and the NCAA Tournament 10 of the last 13 years.
- With a 75-62 win over Elon on March 17, No. 6-seed WVU reached the NCAA Second Round. WVU's season ended with an 83-56 loss to No. 3-seeded Maryland.
- West Virginia senior center Lanay Montgomery was selected 30th overall in the third round by the Seattle Storm in the 2017 WNBA Draft.
- Tynice Martin became the first WVU sophomore to earn All-America Honorable Mention by both the Associated Press and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

MONTGOMERY DRAFTED BY STORM

- West Virginia senior center Lanay Montgomery was selected 30th overall in the third round by the Seattle Storm in the 2017 WNBA Draft.
- Montgomery is the sixth Mountaineer to be picked in the draft, all during the tenure of coach Mike Carey.
- With Montgomery's selection, the Mountaineers had back-to-back draft picks for the second time in program history and three selections in the last four seasons.
- Asya Bussie was a 15th overall pick in the second round in 2014 by the Minnesota Lynx and Bria Holmes was an 11th overall, first round pick by the Atlanta Dream last season.

WVU RANKED IN FINAL POLLS

- WVU finished ranked in the Associated Press and USA TODAY Sports Coaches Top 25 polls.
- The Mountaineers finished No. 22 in the AP poll for the seventh time in school history and No. 20 in the coaches poll.
- WVU finished ranked in both polls for the sixth time in program history and the first time in back-to-back seasons (1992, 2008, 2010, 2014, 2016 and 2017).

WVU MAKES 12TH NCAA TOURNEY

- West Virginia made its 12th NCAA Championship appearance overall and 10th under coach Mike Carey. WVU has reached the postseason for a school-record 11 consecutive years and the NCAA Tournament 10 of the last 13 years.
- The Mountaineers were the No. 6-seed for a second consecutive year.
- With a 75-62 win over Elon on March 17, WVU reached the Second Round for the third consecutive time.
- WVU has made the NCAA Second Round 10 times overall, eight under Carey.
- West Virginia and Maryland met for the first time in 36 years on March 19. The Mountaineers fell, 83-56, to the No. 3-seeded Terrapins in the second round.
- WVU is 10-12 overall in the NCAA Tournament and 8-10 under Carey.

WVU WINS BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP

- West Virginia won its first Big 12 Championship title since joining the league and its second conference tournament title in program history.
- The sixth-seeded Mountaineers toppled No. 3-seed Oklahoma (82-58) in the quarterfinal, No. 2-seed Texas (62-59) in the semifinal and No. 1-seed Baylor (77-66) in the final. The Sooners were ranked No. 19, Texas No. 12/14 and Baylor No. 2 - marking the first time WVU knocked off three consecutive ranked opponents in three days.
- WVU snapped Baylor's 20-game win streak in the Big 12 Conference tournament. The Mountaineers are the only team in the Big 12 the last seven years to win at least a share of the regular-season title and win a conference tournament crown. Since the Big 12 was founded in 1997, WVU joins the 2004 Oklahoma team as the only six seeds to win the Big 12 Tournament.
- The conference title was the second for WVU and the first since beating Temple, 63-54, for the Atlantic 10 crown in 1989.
- Tynice Martin scored 82 points and tallied 12 rebounds in WVU's three victories, earning the Big 12 Championship's Most Outstanding Player and Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team honors. Martin scored a game-record 32 points in the title game, surpassing Brittney Griner's 31 points, while her 82 points were third-most in a Big 12 title game.
- Teana Muldrow averaged 14.6 points and 8.3 rebounds en route to Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team accolades.

BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS

- Sophomore Tynice Martin was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship Most Outstanding Player after scoring 82 points and grabbing 12 rebounds in WVU's victories over No. 3-seed Oklahoma, No. 2-seed Texas and No. 1-seed Baylor.
- The Atlanta native scored a game-record 32 points in the title game, surpassing 31 set by Brittney Griner. Martin's 82 points were the third-most in a Big 12 Championship.
- Teana Muldrow garnered Big 12 Championship All-Tournament recognition, averaging 14.6 points and 8.3 rebounds in three games. Muldrow scored 15 points and corralled nine rebounds in WVU's title game victory over Baylor.

THREE GRAB BIG 12 HONORS

- Three Mountaineers grabbed Big 12 honors, as announced by the league.
- Tynice Martin was a unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 First Team.
- Laney Montgomery earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Defensive Team for a second year, while garnering All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.
- Junior Teana Muldrow earned her first conference recognition with All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.

CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the athletic communications staff.

MARTIN CLIMBS TO 1,000 POINTS

- Sophomore Tynice Martin became the third-quickest Mountaineer and the 34th overall to reach the 1,000-point milestone with her 26 points in the win over Elon (March 17).
- Martin was the first WVU player since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 20 or more points in four consecutive games (March 4-March 19).
- Martin has been on fire since Feb. 13, 2016. The sophomore has reached double figures in 40 of the last 45 contests. She reached double-digits in 23 consecutive games from March 18, 2016, to Jan. 25, 2017.
- She joined Bria Holmes, as the only WVU sophomores to garner unanimous All-Big 12 First Team honors.
- She ranked second in the Big 12 Conference with 18.6 points per game.
- Martin had 13 20-point games this season and joins Lisa Szymczak (14), Meg Bulger (15) and Cathy Parson (20) as the only Mountaineer sophomores to reach 20 or more points in 13+ games.
- West Virginia is 14-1 overall and was 12-1 this season when Martin scores 20+ points.
- Martin's 32 points vs. Baylor in the Big 12 Tournament Championship was the most ever in a title game.
- Martin earned Most Outstanding Player honors for the Big 12 Championship after scoring 82 points and grabbing 12 rebounds. Her 82 points were third-most in a Big 12 Tournament.
- She scored a career-high 35 points at OU (Feb. 7), ranking as the second-best game performance by a WVU sophomore.
- She followed up with 30 points vs. Oklahoma State (Feb. 11), becoming the first Mountaineer since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 30+ points in back-to-back games.
- Martin was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on Feb. 13 after averaging 32.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game last week.
- In the win over No. 20 Oklahoma (Jan. 8), Martin inked her first double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds.
- Martin made 30 consecutive free throws from March 18, 2016 to Nov. 24, 2016 - the second longest streak in program history.

MULDROW REACHES 1,000 POINTS

- Teana Muldrow became just the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point club with a made free throw at the 5:10 mark of the second quarter vs. TCU (Feb. 22).
- In the victory over TCU, the junior from East Orange, New Jersey, scored a career-best 25 points and grabbed 14 rebounds for her seventh double-double of the season.
- She has reached double-digit scoring in 12 of the last 13 games.
- Muldrow was named to the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament team after averaging 14.6 points and 8.3 rebounds in WVU's three wins in the Big 12 title run.
- The All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection is third in the Big 12 with 5.7 defensive rebounds per game, third with 8.6 rpg and is seventh with 14.5 points per game.
- Muldrow is 11th all-time at WVU with 90 blocks, 12th with 118 career treys, and 12th with 652 rebounds.
- Muldrow is the active team leader in double-figure scoring games with 57.

- The Atlanta native is the first sophomore in program history to earn AP and WBCA All-America Honorable Mention.

- Tynice Martin (651) finished third all-time on WVU's sophomore scoring list.
- Her 651 points are sixth-best in a single-season at WVU. She is the sixth Mountaineer to score 600 or more points in a season.

- West Virginia secured its 11th 20-win season under Carey with a win over KU (Feb. 27).
- Overall, the program has produced 15 20-win seasons with 11 of those under Carey.
- WVU's victory set a school-record as the fourth consecutive year of reaching 20 or more wins.

MONTGOMERY WRAS UP CAREER

- Senior Lanay Montgomery capped an illustrious four-year career at West Virginia. She was selected 30th overall in the third round of the 2017 WNBA Draft by the Seattle Storm.
- Montgomery's 937 total rebounds rank fourth all-time at WVU.
- Additionally, her 325 career offensive rebounds rank fourth.
- Montgomery ranked second in the Big 12 with a 66.5 field goal percentage (157-of-236).
- Montgomery is the best shooter in program history, surpassing Olayinka Sanni (55.7%). Her career field goal percentage of 59.6% is first at WVU.
- She shot 41 percent or better in 29-of-35 games.
- She earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and was selected to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team for a second consecutive year.
- WVU was 13-2 this season when Montgomery makes six or more field goals in a contest.
- Montgomery's 11 double-doubles this year are a career-best and are 14th all-time.
- Montgomery is the first Mountaineer since Maria Tchobanova in 1999 to reach 19 or more career double-doubles. Her 20 double-doubles are seventh all-time at WVU.
- Montgomery's 330 career blocks are second all-time at WVU and fourth all-time in the Big 12 Conference.
- With her five blocks against Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21, Montgomery moved past Asya Bussie (270) for No. 2 on WVU's all-time career blocks list.
- Montgomery's 17/18 performance against Charleston Southern is the best for a Mountaineer since Donna Abbott inked 22 points and grabbed 19 rebounds against Rutgers in Feb. 1991.
- Montgomery tallied a career-high 23 points, grabbed 18 rebounds and blocked six shots against Morehead State on Nov. 30.
- She joined Georgeann Wells (1984) as the only Mountaineers to score 20+, rebound 18+ and block 5+ in a game.
- On Dec. 7, Montgomery garnered NCAA Weekly Starting Five honors for her performance against Morehead State.

- Ray inked her first double-double with 14 points and 10 assists in the win over No. 24 Kansas State (Feb. 15).

No. 24/23 WVU Outlasts Kansas

Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow each recorded a double-double in the No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 62-51 victory over Kansas on Wednesday evening at Allen Fieldhouse. West Virginia (15-4, 3-4) led by 12 points in the second quarter. However, Kansas (6-12, 0-7) fought back with a 13-3 run to open the third quarter and take a 35-34 lead with 4:06 left in the period. A Tynice Martin trey with 48 seconds remaining in the third, gave WVU the 39-37 go-ahead lead. The Jayhawks trimmed the game to three early in the fourth, but the Mountaineers made 12 free throws in the final 45 seconds to secure the win; giving Kansas its 25th consecutive Big 12 loss. Montgomery etched her eighth double-double this season with 15 points and 13 rebounds, while blocking six shots. Muldrow inked her fourth double-double this season with 12 points and a career-high 15 rebounds, while dishing out a team-leading six assists. Martin netted a team-high 21 points, including 9-of-12 from the charity stripe. West Virginia shot 36.8 percent (21-of-57) from the field and held Kansas to 27.6 percent shooting (16-of-58). The Jayhawks were the 14th WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field this season. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 52-32, and outscored the Jayhawks, 28-20, inside the paint. WVU outscored KU, 8-6, in second-chance point opportunities. Kansas forced 25 Mountaineer turnovers, but only converted 13 into points. Montgomery and Martin combined for West Virginia's first 10 points to open the game in the first five minutes. WVU added 10 more points to finish the period and led 20-10 at the end of one. Kansas opened the second quarter on a 7-2 run. KU's Jessica Washington hit a three-pointer and made two free throws to trim the deficit to 28-24. Chania Ray drained a trey as time expired in the half, putting the Mountaineers up 31-24. WVU shot 44.8 percent (13-of-29) from the field and held KU to 30.0 percent shooting (9-of-30). No. 24 WVU Battles, Falls at No. 2 Baylor

No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia battled No. 2/2 Baylor, but fell, 79-73, in a hard-fought contest on Saturday afternoon in front of 6,462 fans at the Ferrell Center. West Virginia (15-5, 3-5) held brief leads in the first and second quarters and for a total of 3:21 in the game. Baylor (19-1, 8-0) held a 40-34 advantage at the half, marking the closest halftime margin for the Lady Bears in Big 12 play. Katrina Pardee made a layup and hit a three-pointer to trim the game to four, 65-61, with 5:51 left in the game. However, BU made six free throws in the final minute to collect the win. BU came into Saturday's game with a +35.1 scoring margin in Big 12 games and had its closest game, a 23-point victory over TCU. WVU's 73 points were the most scored against the Lady Bears this season. Teana Muldrow led WVU with a game-high 20 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Tynice Martin tallied 18 points, while dishing out four assists. Pardee finished with 13 points, followed by 11 points and five assists from Chania Ray. Baylor finished shooting 45.2 percent (28-of-62) from the field compared to WVU's 41.7 percent (30-of-72). The Lady Bears won the rebound battle, 42-38, and edged WVU, 44-42, inside the paint. Baylor made 20-of-26 from the charity stripe for 76.9 percent compared to West Virginia's 9-of-13 for 69.2 percent. Pardee, Muldrow and Ray combined for West Virginia's six-point run to take a 12-6 lead with 6:42 left in the first. However, Baylor proceeded on a 13-1 to push its lead to seven. The Mountaineers fought back and Muldrow's trey capped the period, trimming the contest to 25-24. Martin's layup at the 8:10 mark gave West Virginia its first lead, 28-27. The two teams traded buckets throughout the game, but BU eventually stretched out to a 40-34 lead at halftime after outscoring the Mountaineers, 15-10, in the quarter. WVU shot 35.9 percent from the field (14-of-39) compared to Baylor's 43.8 percent (14-of-32) at the half. An Alexis Jones layup pushed Baylor's lead to 11 points at the 5:21 mark in the third. Alexis Brewer followed up with a layup plus connected on the and-one, while Martin added a jumper to trim the contest back to six. BU made six of its next eight to extend its lead to 59-47 with 1:25 left in the third. At the end of three, Baylor maintained a 63-52 advantage. Pardee's bucket with 6:39 left in the fourth trimmed the game to 65-58. She followed up the next possession with a three to narrow the game to four. Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow combined for 43 points, as the No. 22-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team collected an 89-79 win over Texas Tech on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum. The Mountaineers (16-5, 4-5) opened up to a 22-point lead late in the second quarter, before the Lady Raiders (11-8, 3-5) stormed back nailing five three-pointers and outscoring WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter. Texas Tech cut the game to within seven in the final quarter, but West Virginia outscored TTU, 27-24, in the period to collect their 16th victory of the season. Muldrow matched a season-high with 22 points, grabbed nine rebounds and dished out a career-high seven assists. Montgomery followed with 21 points, nine rebounds and three blocks. Chania Ray reached double-figure scoring with 12 points and six rebounds. Tynice Martin finished with 11 points and five rebounds. Katrina Pardee and Alexis Brewer added nine and eight points, respectively. The Lady Raiders made 13 three-pointers for 54.2 percent shooting, while WVU made 7-of-14 for 50 percent from behind the arc. The Mountaineers connected on 16-of-19 free throws for 84.2 percent. WVU dished out 20 assists, collected eight steals and blocked five shots. West Virginia came out on fire with a 16-2 run to open the game in the first five minutes. Texas Tech made just 3-of-14 in the quarter, as the Mountaineers maintained a 24-8 lead at the end of the period. Texas Tech used three-pointers from Larryn Brooks and Recce Caldwell to trim the deficit to 14 points. WVU stretched its lead to 22 with a Montgomery layup at the 1:45 mark, but WVU held a 43-24 advantage at break. To open the third quarter, the Lady Raiders opened by making seven three-pointers in the first six minutes to trim the deficit to 50-43. TTU would outscore WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter and trim the deficit to five points after a pair of Brooks free throws at the 1:43 mark.
