QUICK HITTERS

- No. 17/16 West Virginia's 13-game win streak was snapped on Sunday with an 86-71 loss at Kansas State. Despite making 14 three-pointers, the second-most in program history, WVU allowed the Wildcats to shoot 54.7 percent from the field.
- Chania Ray tallied 23 points and dished out seven assists in the win. Ray was named Big 12 Co-Player of the Week after averaging 20.0 points, 8.0 assists and 5.0 rebounds against TCU and K-State. Ray is second in the Big 12 with 6.1 assists per game.
- West Virginia (13-1, 1-1) defends its 14-game home winning streak against No. 2/4 Baylor (13-1, 2-0) on Wednesday. WVU's last home loss at the WVU Coliseum came to the Lady Bears on Jan. 30, 2016.
- WVU is looking for its first win against a top-10 team since knocking off No. 6 Baylor, 71-69, on March 2, 2014. WVU's lone win against a No. 2 ranked team was a 65-63 victory at No. 2 Notre Dame on Feb. 12, 2012.

SCOUTING BAYLOR

• No. 2/2 Baylor (13-1, 2-0) has won 11 consecutive games since falling, 72-61, at UConn on Nov. 17. The Lady Bears lead the nation in 12 different statistical categories. Among those include the nation's No. 1 scoring offense (94.3 ppg) and the top FG% defense (28.7 percent). BU is also in the top-10 in seven other categories.

• In Baylor's 11 wins, the average margin of victory is 57.6 points per game. The closest margin of victory was a 14-point win (84-70) over No. 9 UCLA on Nov. 14.

• Four Lady Bears are averaging doublefigures with Alexis Jones averaging 15.6 points per game. Kalani Brown is scoring 13.9 points per contest and is the team's best rebounder, pulling down 8.6 boards per game. Nina Davis, a preseason All-American selection, is averaging 12.3 points per game. Alexis Prince (11.3 ppg) and Beatrice Mompremier (10.2) are also in double-figures.

LAST TIME OUT

- West Virginia's 13-game winning streak was snapped with an 86-71 loss at Kansas State on Sunday. The Wildcats shot 54.7 percent from the field, halting the Mountaineers' streak of 14 consecutive games of holding their opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field.
- Chania Ray registered a career-high 23 points in the setback, including six threepointers. Teana Muldrow followed with five made treys and 15 points. Tynice Martin's 14 and Kristina King's 11 points rounded out WVU's double-figure scorers.
- The Mountaineers' 14 made three-pointers were the most in the Mike Carey era and the second-most in a single game, two shy of a school-record 16 at Princeton on Jan. 21, 1998.

WHAT A START

- West Virginia's 13-1 start is the secondbest in program history.
- WVU started the season 13-0, tying for the fifth-longest win streak in school history.
- West Virginia started the 2010-11 campaign with a 16-0 mark for the best opening in program history. WVU's top four starts are under coach Mike Carey.
- Until the loss at Kansas State, West Virginia was one of seven remaining unbeaten NCAA Division I teams.

AGAINST RANKED COMPETITION

- West Virginia has won 42 games over AP Poll ranked competition since 1980 and 32 contests under coach Mike Carey.
- WVU is 1-10 all-time against teams ranked No. 2 in the poll. The lone victory was a 65-63 win at No. 2 Notre Dame on Feb. 12, 2012. Baylor is the highest ranked opponent WVU has faced since playing No. 2 Stanford on March 19, 2012.
- WVU last knocked off a top-10 team on March 2, 2014, with a 71-69 win at Baylor.
- WVU's last top-25 victory was on Feb. 27, 2016, an 82-48 win over Oklahoma State in Morgantown.

RAY GRABS BIG 12 HONORS

- Junior guard Chania Ray was named the Big 12 Conference Co-Player of the Week on Jan. 2, along with Oklahoma's Peyton Little.
- Ray led West Virginia with 20.0 points, 8.0 assists and 5.0 rebounds as the Mountaineers split the opening weekend of Big 12 action.
- The Alexandria, Virginia, native scored 17 points, which included eight from the charity stripe in an 83-61 win at TCU.
- She registered a career-high 23 points and six three-pointers in WVU's setback at Kansas State.
- The weekly honor is the first in Ray's career.

ALMOST HEAVEN, WEST VIRGINIA

- West Virginia's current 14-game win streak at the WVU Coliseum is the sixth-longest in school history and the 11th longest active home win streak in the NCAA.
- WVU's last loss at the Coliseum came to Baylor (71-61) on Jan. 30, 2016.
- WVU has won a school-record 32 consecutive nonconference games inside the Coliseum dating back to Nov. 24, 2013.
- The Mountaineers' last loss against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum came to Ohio State on Nov. 8, 2013, with WVU falling 70-61.
- The previous record of 19 lasted from Dec. 30, 2008 to Jan. 2, 2011.
- West Virginia is 105-7 (.938) at home against nonconference opponents since 2002.
- WVU is 191-46 (.806) all-time at home under Mike Carey, including 17-0 in 2010.
- With a 9-0 mark, WVU recorded its 10th undefeated season at home against nonconference competition in 16 years under Mike Carey.
- WVU has reached 10+ home wins in 11 of 15 seasons under Mike Carey.
- WVU has won 80 percent or more of its home games in seven of the last eight years.
- WVU is 396-165 (.706) at the Coliseum alltime.

- West Virginia sits in the top 20 nationally in eight statistical categories.
- Through games on Jan. 1, WVU is second in FG% defense (31.0%), second in blocked shots per game (7.4 bpg), fourth in scoring margin (+29.4), eighth in scoring defense (51.9 ppg), ninth in rebounding margin (+12.1), 13th in field goal percentage (48.0%), 15th in 3-point defense (25.6%) and 16th in scoring offense (81.3 ppg).
- Chania Ray is 24th nationally and second in the Big 12 with 6.1 assists per game.
- Tynice Martin is second in the Big 12 and 49th nationally with 18.4 points per game.
- Lanay Montgomery's 3.4 blocked shots per game are first in the league and fifth nationally.

CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the athletic communications staff.

MOUNTAINEER QUARTET

West Virginia's three Ms (Tynice Martin, Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow) along with newcomer Kristina King provide the bulk of the Mountaineers' offense with an average of 55.8 points scored per game.

- Martin is second in the Big 12 with 18.4 points per game. She has reached doublefigures in 16 consecutive games dating back to March 18, 2016. Martin has made a field goal in 24 consecutive games.
- Muldrow is second on the squad with 14.4 points per contest and 7.7 rebounds per game. Muldrow has made a field goal in 23 consecutive games.
- Montgomery is second in the Big 12 with 9.9 rebounds. She leads the league with 3.4 blocked shots per game and 3.8 offensive rebounds per game.
- Montgomery's 74.2 field goal percentage is second in the Big 12.
- Montgomery and Muldrow have combined for eight double-doubles this season, including back-to-back double-double games vs. High Point and Morehead State.
- Kristina King is fourth on the team with 11.2 points per game and third with 6.2 rebounds per contest.
- King has reached double-figure scoring in the last seven contests.

PHYSICAL FOR 40

- West Virginia has limited 13 of 14 opponents this season to less than 40 percent shooting and seven of those less than 30 percent.
- Through 14 games, opponents are shooting just 31.0 percent (253-of-816), which ranks second in field goal percentage defense.
- WVU has converted 262 opponent turnovers (18.7 TOPG) into 290 points (20.7 ppg) this season.
- WVU has reached 10+ blocks in three games this season: 14 vs. Coppin State, 15 vs. Morehead State and 10 at TCU.
- The Mountaineers have 145 steals and are averaging 10.4 steals per game. WVU has reached double-figure steals in 8-of-14 games this season.
- The 11 field goals for Charleston Southern marked the 17th time in program history that WVU has held an opponent to 11 or fewer field goals in a game since 2004.
- USC Upstate's 33 points were the lowest scored for a Mountaineer opponent since Georgetown was limited to 32 points on March 4, 2012.

STREAKS OF NOTE

- Lanay Montgomery has blocked at least one shot in 49 of the last 52 contests and in the last nine games.
- WVU's 14-game home winning streak is the 11th longest nationally and sixth-longest in program history.

### **MOUNTAINEERS IN THE POLLS**

- West Virginia fell five spots to No. 17 in the AP Top 25 Poll and four spots to No. 16 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll.
- WVU was tabbed to finish fourth in the Big 12 coaches preseason poll.
- Other Big 12 teams include: Baylor (2/2). Texas (15/17), Oklahoma (20/24) and Kansas State (25/RV).

#### HARD TIME TO FIND A DIME

- West Virginia has limited 12 of its first 14 opponents to scoring less than 10 points in at least one quarter.
- WVU has held opponents under double figures in 18 guarters this season.
- ECU was limited to four points in the fourth quarter on Nov. 23, tying a record-low for points scored in a quarter by a WVU opponent.

#### NONCONFERENCE SUCCESS

West Virginia finished its nonconference slate undefeated with a win over Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21. The Mountaineers finished nonleague play unbeaten for a third time with a 12-0 record in program history joining an 11-0 mark in 2002-03 and a 14-0 record in 2010-11.

#### LANAY NO. 2 IN CAREER BLOCKS

- With her five blocks against Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21, Lanay Montgomery moved past Asya Bussie (270) for No. 2 on WVU's all-time career blocks list.
- Montgomery's 279 blocks are sixth all-time in the Big 12. She is fifth in the NCAA among active career leaders.
- She has 763 total rebounds, which ranks ninth all-time at WVU. She is eight away from passing Dionne Morris (770) for eighth.
- Additionally, Montgomery has corralled 265 career offensive rebounds, which is fifth. She is nine away from reaching fourth.
- If trends continue, Montgomery can become the Mountaineers' best shooter in program history surpassing Olayinka Sanni (55.7%). Her career field goal percentage of 58.9% currently ranks first at WVU.
- Montgomery's 17/18 performance against Charleston Southern is the best for a Mountaineer since Donna Abbott inked 22 points and grabbed 19 rebounds against Rutgers Feb. 1991.
- Montgomery tallied a career-high 23 points, grabbed 18 rebounds and blocked six shots against Morehead State on Nov. 30.
- She joined Georgeann Wells (1984) as the only Mountaineers to score 20+, rebound 18+ and block 5+ in a game.
- On Dec. 7, Montgomery garnered NCAA Weekly Starting Five honors for her performance against Morehead State.
- Montgomery was named a nominee for the Allstate Good Works Team on Nov. 30.

- Kristina King, the Preseason Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, has reached doublefigure scoring in eight games this season, including the last seven contests.
- She registered 16 points in wins over East Carolina. Ole Miss and USC Upstate.
- King has grabbed five or more rebounds in 12 of 14 games this season
- She recorded her first double-double as a Mountaineer with 14 points and 10 rebounds vs. Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21.

#### MARTIN ON A ROLL

- Sophomore Tynice Martin has been on fire since Feb. 13, 2016. The sophomore has reached double figures in 22 of the last 24 contests, including 16 consecutive.

#### Montgomery Achieves Historic Feat in Opener Senior Lanay Montgomery's recorded a historic

performance of 17 points and 18 rebounds to pace the No. 22/25 ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a season-opening, 88-38, victory over Charleston Southern on Saturday.

West Virginia (1-0) sprinted out to an 11-5 lead before Charleston Southern (0-1) cut the game to 11-9 midway through the first quarter. WVU utilized a 12-2 run and held CSU scoreless for a seven minute stretch that lasted late in the second quarter and the first three minutes of the third quarter. The Mountaineers are now 13-3 all-time in season openers under Mike Carey and 29-15 all-time.

Montgomery was one of three WVU players to score 17 points in the contest and did something a Mountaineer had not accomplished in 25 years. The senior from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, connected a perfect 7-of-7 from the field and added 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in 21 minutes. Montgomery's impressive 17 point and 18 rebound performance was the best for a WVU women's basketball player since Donna Abbott posted 22 points and 19 rebounds against Rutgers on Feb. 28, 1991. The double-double marked the 10th in Montgomery's career and she has now pulled down double-digit boards in back-to-back games.

Overall, West Virginia connected on 50.8 percent (32of-63) from the field and 39.1 percent from behind the arc (9-of-23). The Mountaineers held CSU to just 17.7 percent (11-of-62) shooting, as the Buccaneers became the 17th opponent in WVU program history to only make 11 or less field goals.

West Virginia outmanned Charleston Southern, 60-31, on the boards and outscored CSU 38-2 in the paint. WVU capitalized with 21 second chance points and 24 points off 16 Buccaneers turnovers.

Junior Teana Muldrow scored 17 points, collected seven rebounds, dished out three assists and snatched a pair of steals. Tynice Martin also eclipsed double figures with 17 points, making 7-of-13 from the field and 3-of-7 from the 3-point line.

Chania Ray distributed a career-high 11 assists – the most for a Mountaineer point guard since Linda Stepney recorded 12 against Saint Francis in Dec. 2014. Ray also registered four rebounds and two steals.

A couple of other Mountaineers reach career highs: Anja Martin tallied a personal-best eight points and Desiree Rhodes corralled a new career-high in 12 boards. Kristina King, the Big 12 Conference Preseason Newcomer of the Year, scored eight points in her WVU debut.

#### Martin's Career-High 27 Paces WVU Past Howard

Sophomore Tynice Martin netted a career-high 27 points to lead the No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 95-49 victory over Howard on Tuesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

Howard senior Te'Shya Heslip's layup cut the WVU lead to 16-11 with 1:41 remaining in the first quarter. However, West Virginia answered with a 21-0 run that lasted six minutes into the second quarter.

The Mountaineers (2-0) tallied 54 of their 95 points in the second half to cruise to their 26th consecutive victory against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum.

Martin bested her previous career-high of 20 points and became the ninth WVU player to finish perfect from the free throw line with 10 or more points. The sophomore from Atlanta finished the evening 7-of-14 from the field, 3-of-9 from behind the arc and 10-of-10 from the free throw line. She grabbed four rebounds, collected three steals, dished out two assists and blocked two shots in 29 minutes.

In addition to Martin, four other Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures. Junior Chania Ray netted a career-best 17 points, going 7-of-14 from the field, while dishing out five assists and snatching a career-high five steals.

Alexis Brewer connected on a career-best three triples and finished 5-of-9 with 13 points. Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Kristina King tallied 12 points and corralled six rebounds. Teana Muldrow finished with 11 points, eight rebounds four assists and three steals. Lanay Montgomery blocked a shot for a 26th straight game and registered her third consecutive double-figure rebounding game with a game-high 13 boards. The senior scored seven points, just three shy of a doubledouble.

Overall, WVU shot 46.3 percent (31-of-67) from the field and 43.5 percent (10-of-23) from behind the arc. From the charity stripe, WVU knocked down 23-of-29 free throw attempts for 79.3 percent. Howard was limited to 32.0 percent shooting (16-of-15) from the field and 3-of-15 (20.0 percent) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 48-28 and outscored Howard 32-18 in the paint. WVU forced 27 Howard turnovers and converted those into 34 points.

#### WVU Clips Eagles to Complete Homestand

Three players reached double-figures in the West Virginia University women's basketball team's 69-39 victory over Coppin State on Saturday.

No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia (3-0) opened the game on a 10-0 run, but shot just 33.3 percent (11-of-33) in the opening half. For a third consecutive game, the Mountaineers bounced back and shot over 60 percent (8-of-13) in the third quarter and took command of the contest for the team's 27th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum against nonconference opponents. With the loss, Coppin State fell to 0-4 on the year.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led all scorers with 19 points. Martin connected on six field goals and connected on a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line. The Atlanta native has now made 19 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016, last season.

Katrina Pardee finished with a season-high 17 points and registered a career-high six rebounds in 29 minutes. Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points and pulled down seven rebounds for fourth consecutive double-figure scoring game. The junior made 5-of-8 from the field, snatched three steals and blocked two shots.

Lanay Montgomery had her best blocking performance since April 2015, leading the way with seven of WVU's 14 blocks on the evening. Montgomery also tallied seven points and grabbed seven rebounds. Chania Ray led WVU with eight assists, while grabbing seven rebounds and collecting three steals.

Overall, West Virginia shot 40.0 percent (24-of-60) from the field and 21.7 percent (5-of-23) from behind the three-point line. Coppin State became the fourth consecutive WVU opponent to shoot below 40 percent, connecting on just 22.6 percent (14-of-62) from the field and 9.1 percent (1-of-11) from behind the arc.


West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-0 run. However, Coppin State answered with a 7-4 run to close Mountaineer lead to 14-7 at the end of one.

Despite shooting just 25 percent (4-of-16) in the first quarter, the Mountaineers answered in the second quarter by connecting on of 7-of-17 for 41.2 percent. WVU used a 13-0 run over a four minute span to push its lead to 24 points with four minutes remaining in the opening half. Pardee paced WVU with 10 points followed by eight from Martin.

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a 22-2 run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squash the North Carolina A&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak to 28 makes since March 18, 2016. Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a

Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points. Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.



Teana Muldrow's double-double paced the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 79-47 victory over East Carolina on Wednesday in the Savannah Invitational held at the Savannah Civic Center.

Three extended runs propelled the Mountaineers (5-0) to their fifth victory of the season. WVU used a 10-2 spurt in the first quarter, a 16-2 second quarter run and a 12-1 fourth quarter run to thwart the Pirates. East Carolina fell to 4-2 after being held to a season-low 47 points.

Muldrow, a junior from East Orange, New Jersey, recorded her second career double-double by scoring season-highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Wednesday marked a breakout performance for Kristina King. The junior made 6-of-8 from the field and added four free throws for 16 points. King finished second in rebounds with eight.

Tynice Martin etched her seventh consecutive double-figure scoring game with 16 points. She grabbed six rebounds and collected two steals in 34 minutes. Chania Ray dished out four assists to lead WVU. Lanay Montgomery was limited for a second straight game due to foul trouble, scoring four points and pulling down three boards.

West Virginia made 29-of-60 from the field for 48.3 percent shooting and connected on 5-of-16 from 3-point range for 31.3 percent. ECU was held to 35.8 percent shooting (19-of-53) from the field, becoming the fifth WVU opponent this season to shoot less than 40 percent.

In the rebounds column, WVU outmanned ECU, 41-32, and outscored the Pirates 34-22 inside the paint. For a fourth game this season, West Virginia recorded double-figure steals with 11.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2 run. ECU would use a 7-3 run to trim the Mountaineer advantage to 13-9. Teana Muldrow added back-to-back buckets to put WVU up 21-16 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, West Virginia utilized a 16-2 run and held the Pirates for nearly a five minute stretch. Martin's layup with 1:08 on the clock gave WVU a 39-25 edge to end the half.

The Mountaineers (6-0) led by as many as 14 points in the first half before Auburn (5-1) closed the period on a 15-4 run to cut the halftime lead to 31-28. WVU pushed its advantage to 10, 38-28, with a Montgomery layup at 7:06 left in the third. The Tigers held a brief one-point lead for 1:35 in the fourth quarter, but the Mountaineers maintained a slim lead down the stretch.

Auburn's Jessica Jones made a layup with 1:19 left to tie the game at 52-52. With 12 seconds remaining, Teana Muldrow grabbed an offensive rebound and Montgomery converted the layup for the game-winning basket. Tynice Martin closed out the game with two free throws to give West Virginia its best start since the 2010-11 season.

Montgomery finished with 13 points, five rebounds and three blocks in 22 minutes. Martin led the team with 16 points, which nine of those points were from behind the arc. Muldrow matched her career-high with 14 rebounds and finished with eight points and three assists. Kristina King made 3-of-4 from the field and added two free throws to finish with eight points.

Martin, a native of Atlanta, earned Savannah Invitational MVP honors and Muldrow was named to the All-Tournament Team.

West Virginia shot 38.5 percent (20-of-52) from the field and made 37.5 percent (6-of-16) of its three point attempts. #### WVU Downs High Point for 7-0 Start

Four Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures with Tynice Martin's 21 points leading the way in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 82-59 victory over High Point on Sunday at the WVU Coliseum.

A high-scoring first quarter saw the Mountaineers hold a slight 28-22 edge. The team built its halftime advantage to 45-31. West Virginia led the entire game and stretched its lead to 25 points in the fourth quarter. WVU improved to 7-0, the program's best start since the 2010-11 season, and extended its program-record nonconference win streak at the WVU Coliseum to 28.

Martin made 10-of-20 from the field to finish with 21 points, four assists and four steals. The performance was Martin's third 20-point game of the season and her ninth consecutive game in double-figure scoring.

Lanay Montgomery had a standout performance, registering her second double-double this season and the 11th of her career, with 15 points and 14 rebounds. Montgomery blocked five shots, dished out three assists and snatched two steals in 31 minutes. Teana Muldrow also recorded a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Overall, West Virginia made 33-of-66 from the field for 50 percent shooting and held its eighth consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as High Point shot at a 35.6 percent (21-of-59) clip. From three-point range, WVU connected on 5-of-17 for 29.4 percent compared to HPU's 5-of-14 for 35.7 percent. The Mountaineers matched a season-high with 20 assists.

Defensively, West Virginia netted a season-high 16 steals and blocked eight shots. The Mountaineers converted 24 High Point turnovers into 27 points.

West Virginia opened the game to a 9-3 advantage, capitalizing on four early High Point miscues. The Panthers battled back to trim the game to an 11-9 WVU edge after a 6-2 spurt. A Kristina King layup pushed WVU's lead to 23-10 with 2:11 remaining in the period. HPU closed the period on a 12-5 run to narrow the gap to 28-22.

Ray's three-pointer at 6:30 extended the Mountaineer lead to 14, capping a 9-1 WVU run to open the second quarter. Just a minute later, High Point narrowed the lead to 10 points. However, West Virginia maintained a 14-point cushion with a 45-31 halftime advantage.

Martin and Muldrow combined for 12 of West Virginia's first 14 points in the third quarter. A jumper by Martin with 5:53 remaining pushed the Mountaineer lead to 23. Katrina Pardee's jumper gave WVU a 63-43 edge at the end of three. Pardee would finish with nine points.

WVU scored its first eight points from the free throw line the fourth quarter until a Martin jumper at 5:06. The Mountaineers outpaced HPU 19-16 in the frame.

#### Montgomery Moves WVU Past Morehead State

A stellar performance from senior center Lanay Montgomery propelled the No. 16/17-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 94-53 victory over Morehead State on Wednesday at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia held an early eight-point advantage, but MSU's Katelyn Byrd made a triple with 3:09 remaining in the first quarter to give Morehead State a 15-14 lead. Montgomery's layup 35 seconds later sparked a 13-0 Mountaineer run. Later in the second quarter, WVU used a Montgomery layup and a Katrina Pardee three-pointer to jump start a 17-0 spurt. West Virginia (8-0) scored its second-most points of the season and rolled to a 29th consecutive win against nonconference competition at the WVU Coliseum. Morehead State's two-game win streak was snapped, as the Eagles fell to 5-3 on the season.

Montgomery's historic performance included a careerhigh 23 points, matching a season-high 18 rebounds and blocking six shots in 25 minutes. She made 10-of-11 field goal attempts for 90.9 percent shooting from the field. The Pittsburgh native was just the second WVU player in history to score at least 20-plus points, grab at least 18-plus rebounds and block five or more shots. Only WVU Hall of Famer Georgeann Wells had a better performance against Marshall in 1984, scoring 35 points, pulling down 19 rebounds and blocking eight shots. The double-double was the third for Montgomery this year and the 12th of her career.

Teana Muldrow also netted her third double-double this season with 18 points and 13 rebounds. The junior matched a career-high four assists, blocked three shots and collected three steals. Montgomery and Muldrow are the first WVU duo to tally double-doubles in back-to-back games since Liz Repella and Takisha Granberry accomplished the feat versus FIU and NJIT in November 2008.

Tynice Martin reached double-figure scoring for a 10th consecutive game with 17 points. Also in double-figures, Kristina King posted 14 and grabbed seven rebounds.

West Virginia shot 47.4 percent (36-of-76) from the field and 41.2 percent (7-of-17) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers held their ninth consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting and their fourth opponent this season to less than 30 percent shooting, as Morehead State was limited to 29.4 percent (20-of-68) from the field.

In the rebound column, WVU grabbed 59 boards compared to MSU's 43. The Mountaineers blocked a seasonbest 15 shots, the most since deflecting 15 against Kansas State on Jan. 21, 2015. WVU also matched a season-high with 20 assists.

The No. 16/17-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team used a season-high 34 points from its bench to knock off Ole Miss, 66-61, in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge on Sunday afternoon at the WVU Coliseum.

An 8-2 run to start the third quarter gave Ole Miss (6-2) a lead for a minute and 21 seconds. However, West Virginia used two free throws from Alexis Brewer and layups from Tynice Martin and Kristina King to regain the lead, 34-30, with three minutes remaining. With 4:20 remaining in the game, the Rebels trimmed the

With 4:20 remaining in the game, the Rebels trimmed the contest to 54-52 after Erika Sisk made a layup and converted the and-one. However, WVU's Brewer and Lanay Montgomery quickly responded with back-to-back buckets to extend the lead back to four.

West Virginia (9-0) utilized a King layup and nine free throws in the final 1:13 to secure its 30th consecutive win over a nonconference opponent and 11th straight victory at the WVU Coliseum. The Mountaineers are off to their best start since opening the year 16-0 in the 2010-11 season.

King narrowly missed a double-double with a game-high 16 points, season-high nine rebounds and season-best four blocks in 28 minutes. Brewer finished with 12 points, seven of which came from the charity stripe.

Martin reached double-figure scoring for an 11th consecutive game with 10 points. Montgomery and Teana Muldrow contributed with eight points and five rebounds each in limited minutes. Desiree Rhodes filled in the post with six points and five rebounds.

The Mountaineers shot 53.5 percent (23-of-43) from the field in just 43 field goal attempts, the lowest since shooting 43 at Georgetown on Jan. 25, 2011. Ole Miss was limited to 32.2 percent (19-of-59) shooting from the field, marking the 10th consecutive game that West Virginia has held its opponents to shooting less than 40 percent. West Virginia shot well in the second quarter, but

West Virginia shot well in the second quarter, but committed nine more turnovers for a total of 18 at the half. WVU converted on 6-of-13 attempts in the second quarter. Rhodes' layup in the final seconds stretched the Mountaineer advantage to 26-20. Muldrow led WVU with eight points, while Ole Miss' Torri Lewis had eight. The Rebels only made one two-point basket in the first half, which came with 1:38 remaining in the second stanza.

Ole Miss opened the third quarter on a 10-2 run to tie the game with a Taylor Manuel layup at the 6:31 mark. Shandricka Sessom's bucket with 5:26 left in the third quarter gave the Rebels their first lead of the game at 30-28. However, West Virginia responded with a 6-0 run including layups from King and Martin. After starting the game 2-of-10 from the charity stripe, WVU concluded the quarter with four consecutive free throw makes. Manuel would finish with a team-high 13 points for Mississippi.

Despite Ole Miss' Sisk scoring the layup and converting the and-one, WVU outscored Ole Miss 13-to-10 down the final stretch to secure the Big 12 Conference's fourth victory in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

#### WVU Women's Hoops Improve to 10-0

The No. 13/14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team shot a season-high 59.7 percent from the field and improved to 10-0 in a 91-33 victory over USC Upstate on Saturday.

West Virginia opened the contest on an 11-2 run and never trailed. The Mountaineers used a 21-0 scoring spurt in the third and fourth quarters to pick up their 31st consecutive win over a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum. WVU's 12th straight win at the Coliseum ranks seventh all-time, while the 10-game win streak is tied for the 10th longest in program history. Saturday's win also tied the Mountaineers second-best start in program history, matching the 10-0 start in 2002-03. USC Upstate's 33 points were the lowest for a Mountaineer opponent since Georgetown was limited to 32 in 2012. The Spartans fell to 4-6 on the season.

She blocked four shots and made 8-of-9 from the field for an 88.9 shooting percentage. For a second consecutive game, Kristina King matched season-highs with 16 points and nine rebounds in 19 minutes. Teana Muldrow finished with 15 points, six rebounds and five assists. Additionally, Tynice Martin eclipsed doublefigures for a 12th consecutive game with 14 points.

Chania Ray finished with nine points and led WVU with seven assists and four steals. Sophomore Katrina Pardee also tallied nine points in the contest. West Virginia limited its 11th consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as USC Upstate made just 14-of-59 for 23.7 percent. WVU dished out 24 assists and collected 14 steals in the victory.


Pardee scored West Virginia's first seven points as the Mountaineers opened the contest to an 11-2 lead. Montgomery also added eight points and blocked two shots in seven minutes in the opening quarter.

Six of the first eight points were scored by the USC Upstate to start the second quarter. Montgomery, King and Pardee sparked a 10-3 Mountaineer run. West Virginia closed the half with a 42-19 lead and shot a season-best 63.3 percent from the field in the opening half.

Muldrow made four of West Virginia's first six points in the second half, all of which came from the charity stripe. The Mountaineers closed the third quarter on a 14-point run to extend the margin to 45 points.

WVU added seven more consecutive points to stretch the lead to 79-26 with 7:40 remaining. A layup from Vanessa Agrusa snapped the 21-0 run, but WVU added 13 more points in the quarter for its largest margin of victory win of the season. Brittney Delva led the Spartans with 12 points.

#### WVU Dishes Out 32 Assists in Win over Longwood

The No. 14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team tied a school-record 32 assists in a 107-40 victory over Longwood on Saturday afternoon at the Charleston Civic Center.

A 16-4 run and another 16-0 spurt in the first quarter set the tone for the Mountaineers. West Virginia shot 71.4 percent (25-of-35) in the first half. Although WVU (11-0) cooled down in the second half, the Mountaineers finished the game shooting 56.8 percent (42-of-74) from the field. WVU's 32 assists on 42 field goals matched 32 assists dished out against Indiana State (Nov. 23, 1984) and Duquesne (Nov. 7, 1984). Longwood fell to 1-7 on the season.

Tynice Martin led the Mountaineers with 21 points for her sixth career 20-point performance. Martin dished out a career-high seven assists and matched a season-high six rebounds. Lanay Montgomery made 9-of-9 from the field and finished with 19 points, eight rebounds and three blocks. Junior guard Teana Muldrow also went a perfect 7-of-7 from the field to finishing the day with 17 points, while dishing out five assists and grabbing four rebounds.

Alexis Brewer eclipsed double figures with a careerhigh 16 points in 28 minutes. Kristina King rounded out WVU's double-digit scoring with 11 points, and sophomore Katrina Pardee led the team with a careerhigh 10 assists and zero turnovers in 21 minutes. Desiree Rhodes paced the team with nine rebounds.

Saturday's victory gave West Virginia its 11th straight win, tying for the seventh-longest win streak and second-best start to a season in program history. Longwood became the Mountaineers' 12th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field, knocking down just 23.5 percent (12-of-51). West Virginia won the rebound battle, 49-28, and outscored the Lancers, 40-12, in the paint. WVU converted 24 Longwood turnovers into 29 points. WVU's 107-point performance was the most since tallying 109 against Delaware State on Dec. 18, 2013.

West Virginia opened the game with four different Mountaineers making three-pointers to put WVU up 16-4 with 6:31 left in the first quarter. WVU Caps Nonconference Play Unbeaten

The No. 13/12 West Virginia University women's basketball team completed the nonconference slate perfect for the third time in program history with a 77-45 win over Mount St. Mary's on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (12-0) sprinted out to a 19-3 run in the first quarter and never relinquished the lead in the team's 32nd straight win against nonconference opponents at the WVU Coliseum. The Mount (2-9) trimmed the WVU lead to 10 points early in the second quarter, but the Mountaineers responded with 11 consecutive points to seal the team's 14th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia joins the 2010-11 squad (14-0) and the 2002-03 team (11-0) in finishing the nonconference schedule undefeated.

Lanay Montgomery paced the Mountaineers with 16 points and 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. Montgomery finished with five blocks on Wednesday pushing her career total to 273 and passing former teammate Aysa Bussie (270) for second on WVU's all-time career blocks list. The senior made her first five shots to extend her consecutive field goals made streak to 14, before it ended in the first half. She finished 7-of-9 from the field for 77.8 percent shooting. Kristina King, the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the

Kristina King, the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year, registered her first double-double at West Virginia with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Tynice Martin added 16 points followed by 14 from junior Teana Muldrow. Chania Ray led the Mountaineers with six assists, while scoring eight points and grabbing six rebounds in 34 minutes.

eight points and grabbing six rebounds in 34 minutes. Offensively, West Virginia ended the evening with a 47.8 shooting percentage from the field (32-of-67) and scored a season-high 56 points inside the paint. The Mountaineers outrebounded Mount St. Mary's, 51-31. WVU limited the Mount to 28.8 percent (17-of-59) from the field, marking the 13th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent. Also, Mount St. Mary's is the seventh opponent this season to shoot less than 30 percent.

Montgomery made eight of WVU's first 15 points, as the Mountaineers opened the contest on a 19-3 run in the first five minutes. Mount St. Mary's finished the period with an 8-4 run of its own, including four points from Katrice Dickson to cut the WVU lead to 23-11.

Mount St. Mary's Caroline Hummell scored the first bucket in the second quarter. WVU answered with 11 consecutive points. Montgomery tallied six of her 14 first half points and led the team with seven rebounds at the break.

WVU outscored the Mount 22-15 in the third quarter to stretch its lead to 62-32 at the end of the period. The fourth quarter was much closer as the Mountaineers edged Mount St. Mary's, 15-13. Hummell finished with a team-high 13 points for the Mount.

#### No. 12 WVU Downs TCU in Big 12 Opener

Strong defensive play and a 32-point third quarter performance propelled the No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to an 83-61 win over TCU on Thursday evening in the Big 12 Conference opener at the Ed and Rae Schollmaier Arena.

WVU (13-0, 1-0) used a series of runs, including a 10-3 spurt in the first quarter to maintain the lead. In the third quarter, West Virginia outscored TCU, 32-20, to stretch its lead to as much as 36. The Horned Frogs (8-4, 0-1) committed 20 turnovers, resulting in 19 Mountaineer points. West Virginia's 17 steals were the most in a Big 12 game for the Mountaineers since joining the league in 2012-13. Tynice Martin led West Virginia with 21 points, while

Tynice Martin led West Virginia with 21 points, while matching a team high with six steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 19 points and nine rebounds. Guard Chania Ray matched a career-high with 17 points, dished out nine assists, grabbed six boards and collected career-best six steals. Kristina King reached double-digit scoring for a sixth consecutive game with 14 points. Lanay Montgomery led WVU with 11 rebounds, while corralling eight rebounds.

West Virginia's 13-0 start is the second-best in program history. WVU's 13-game win streak is tied for fifth all-time.

Offensively, West Virginia made 26-of-60 from the field for 43.3 percent shooting. WVU connected on 26-of-32 from the field for an 81.3 free throw percentage. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 42-32.

For a 14th straight game, West Virginia held its opponent to less than 40 percent shooting. The Frogs made 37.7 percent (20-of-53) from the field and shot 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from three-point range. TCU entered the game leading the country in three-point field goal percentage. WVU's 10 blocks were the most since deflecting 15 against Morehead State on Nov. 30.


West Virginia sprinted out to a 9-4 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Montgomery scored on a putback with 11 seconds remaining and Muldrow hit a jumper to cap a 10-3 run and give the Mountaineers a 19-7.

TCU was limited to just one three-point make in the first quarter. The Frogs connected on three more, but WVU utilized an 8-0 run midway through the quarter to stretch its lead to as much as 23 points.

The Mountaineers outscored TCU 32-20 in the third quarter despite the Frogs shooting 5-of-9 from three-point range. West Virginia utilized another nine-point spurt and held a 73-39 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Toree Thompson made back-to-back buckets to spark a 12-2 run in the fourth quarter. Amy Oknonkwo's threepointer with 6:23 remaining trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 75-51. However, WVU added eight more points to seal its 13th straight win. Okonkwo led the Frogs with 17 points and eight rebounds.

#### Ray's 23 Paces WVU in Loss at K-State

The No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team could not overcome Kansas State's strong offensive play, as the Mountaineers fell 86-71 to the Wildcats on Sunday at Bramlage Coliseum.

Kansas State (11-3, 1-1) dominated inside during the first half, scoring 34 of its 51 first half points inside the paint to hold a 51-39 advantage at halftime. The Mountaineers (13-1, 1-1) trimmed the contest to six points with eight minutes left in the third quarter, but K-State proceeded on an 11-2 run to push the lead back to 15 points. WVU trimmed the deficit to 14 late in the fourth quarter, but Kansas State held on to snap the Mountaineers' 13-game winning streak.

Chania Ray scored a career-high 23 points, which included a personal-best six three-point makes. The junior from Alexandria, Virginia, dished out seven assists, grabbed four rebounds and collected two steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 15 points, including 5-of-7 from beyond the arc. WVU's other double-figure scorers included Tynice Martin (14) and Kristina King (11). Lanay Montgomery paced WVU with nine rebounds.

WVU's 14 three-point makes were second all-time in a single-game. The Mountaineers shot 42.4 percent (25-of-59) from the field and 48.3 percent (14-of-29) from behind the arc. Kansas State finished shooting 54.7 percent (35-of-64) from the field – snapping WVU's 14-game streak of holding opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. The Wildcats outscored WVU, 54-22, in the paint and won the rebound battle 35-28. Breanna Lewis paced K-State with 23 points.

The Mountaineers held a 9-6 lead midway through the first quarter. K-State outscored WVU 10-6 in final 3:39, which included back-to-back layups from Lewis to end the quarter.

Kansas State opened the second quarter on an 8-3 run and extended its lead to 10 points with 7:25 remaining. Karyla Middlebrook's layup with 38 seconds on the clock pushed the lead to 14. Muldrow answered with a triple to trim the advantage to 11, but Willock made a free throw to push the edge to 51-39 at halftime.

The paint advantage was dominated by Kansas State as WVU was outscored 34-8, as K-State shot 61.1 percent (22-of-36) from the field. Ray led WVU with 15 points.

West Virginia opened the third period on an 8-2 run, which included back-to-back threes from Ray and Martin. However, K-State made back-to-back treys that sparked an 11-2 run to stretch its lead to 15 with 4:57 left in the quarter. With 27 seconds left in the third, K-State stretched its lead to 21 points.

In the fourth quarter, West Virginia trimmed the game to 17 points and Kansas State scoreless for four-plus minutes. Muldrow's three-pointer cut the game to 14 points with three minutes remaining, but K-State held on to collect its second win against WVU.
