QUICK HITTERS

- Sixth-seeded West Virginia (24-10) and No. 3-seed Maryland (31-2) meet for the first time in 36 years on Sunday. The two teams last met on Nov. 22, 1981, with the Terrapins prevailing 81-62 in College Park. If the Mountaineers win on Sunday, it would give WVU its highest-seeded victory in the program's NCAA Tournament history.
- The Mountaineers knocked off No. 11-seed Elon, 75-62, to advance to their third consecutive NCAA Championship Second Round and the 10th in program history. WVU has reached the second round eight times under coach Mike Carey.
- Tynice Martin became the third-quickest Mountaineer to reach 1,000-points with her game-high 26 points in the win over Elon on Friday.
- Lanay Montgomery etched her 20th career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds on Friday. Montgomery leads the team with 8.9 rebounds, while averaging 10.8 points per game.

• No. 3-seed Maryland (31-2) has won five consecutive games, including a 103-61 win over No. 14-seed Bucknell on Friday. The Terrapins won the Big Ten Tournament with a 74-64 win over Purdue.

 UMD leads the nation in scoring offense (89.9 ppg), second in field goal percentage (50.9%), second in rebounding margin

(+14.9) and third in scoring margin (25.4). All-Americans Brionna Jones and Shatori Walker-Kimbrough pace the Terrapins. Jones leads the nation in field goal percentage (69.8%), while averaging 20.0 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. Walker-Kimbrough is second with 18.8 ppg and paces UMD with 70 triples. Destiny Slocum leads Maryland with 193 assists. Slocum is averaging 11.3 ppg and Kaila Charles follows with 10.0 ppg.

• WVU and UMD meet for the third time. Maryland won the previous two meetings.

LAST TIME OUT

- Sixth-seeded West Virginia (24-10) utilized a 10-0 run in the fourth quarter to take a 75-62 victory over No. 11-seed Elon on Friday in the NCAA Championship First Round in College Park.
- Tynice Martin netted 26 points for her 13th of the season. The sophomore became the third-quickest Mountaineer only behind J.D. Drummonds and Cathy Parson to reach the 1,000-point plateau with a free throw make late in the fourth quarter.
- Katrina Pardee knocked down four triples, tying WVU's NCAA Tournament record, and finished with 14 points. Lanay Montgomery netted her 11th double-double this season and 20th in her career with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Meanwhile, Teana Muldrow also pulled down 10 boards and scored six points. Alexis Brewer dished out a careerhigh six assists, as WVU advanced to its eighth NCAA Second Round out of the last nine tries.

WVU RETURNS TO THE POLLS

- WVU returned to the Associated Press and USA TODAY Sports Coaches Top 25 polls.
- The Mountaineers finished No. 22 in the AP poll for the seventh time in school history.
- WVU is No. 21 in the coaches poll. The final poll will be announced after the conclusion of the NCAA Championship in April.

NCAA TOURNAMENT TIDBITS

West Virginia is making its 12th NCAA Championship appearance overall and 10th under coach Mike Carey. WVU has reached the postseason for a schoolrecord 11 consecutive years and the NCAA Tournament 10 of the last 13 years.

- The Mountaineers are the No. 6-seed for a second consecutive year.
- Last season, the sixth-seeded Mountaineers toppled 11-seed Princeton, 74-65, in the NCAA First Round in Columbus, Ohio, and fell, 88-81, to No. 3-seed Ohio State in the Second Round.
- With a 75-62 win over Elon, WVU has reached the Second Round three consecutive times.
- WVU has made the NCAA Second Round 10 times overall, eight under Carey.
- The Mountaineers are seeking their second Sweet 16 appearance and the first since the field expanded to 64 teams.
- WVU's lone visit to the Sweet 16 came in 1992 when the fourth-seeded Mountaineers knocked off No. 5-seed Clemson, 73-72, in Morgantown.
- West Virginia and Maryland meet for the first time in 36 years. The two squads have previously met in 1981 (61-82) and 1980 (67-79) with UMD taking victories in both contests.
- WVU is 10-11 overall in the NCAA Tournament and 8-9 under Carey.

WVU WINS BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP

- West Virginia won its first Big 12 Championship title since joining the league and its second conference tournament title in program history.
- The sixth-seeded Mountaineers toppled No. 3-seed Oklahoma (82-58) in the quarterfinal, No. 2-seed Texas (62-59) in the semifinal and No. 1-seed Baylor (77-66) in the final. The Sooners were ranked No. 19, Texas No. 12/14 and Baylor No. 2 - marking the first time WVU knocked off three consecutive ranked opponents in three days.
- WUU snapped Baylor's 20-game win streak in the Big 12 Conference tournament. The Mountaineers are the only team in the Big 12 the last seven years to win at least a share of the regular-season title and win a conference tournament crown. Since the Big 12 was founded in 1997, WVU joins the 2004 Oklahoma team as the only six seeds to win the Big 12 Tournament.
- The conference title is the second for WVU and the first since beating Temple, 63-54, for the Atlantic 10 crown in 1989.
- Tynice Martin scored 82 points and tallied 12 rebounds in WVU's three victories, earning the Big 12 Championship's Most Outstanding Player and Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team honors. Martin scored a game-record 32 points in the title game, surpassing Brittney Griner's 31 points, while her 82 points were third-most in a Big 12 title game.
- Teana Muldrow averaged 14.6 points and 8.3 rebounds en route to Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team accolades.

BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS

- Sophomore Tynice Martin was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship Most Outstanding Player after scoring 82 points and grabbing 12 rebounds in WVU's victories over No. 3-seed Oklahoma, No. 2-seed Texas and No. 1-seed Baylor.
- The Atlanta native scored a game-record 32 points in the title game, surpassing 31 set by Brittney Griner. Martin's 82 points were the third-most in a Big 12 Championship.
- Teana Muldrow garnered Big 12 Championship All-Tournament recognition, averaging 14.6 points and 8.3 rebounds in three games. Muldrow scored 15 points and corralled nine rebounds in WVU's title game victory over Baylor.

THREE GRAB BIG 12 HONORS

- Three Mountaineers grabbed Big 12 honors, as announced by the league.
- Tynice Martin was a unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 First Team.
- Lanay Montgomery earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Defensive Team for a second year, while garnering All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.
- Junior Teana Muldrow earned her first conference recognition with All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.

CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

MARTIN CLIMBS TO 1,000 POINTS

Sophomore Tynice Martin became the thirdquickest Mountaineer and the 34th overall to reach the 1,000-point milestone with her 26 points in the win over Elon (March 17). Martin is the first WVU player since Meg

- Bulger in 2005 to score 20 or more points in four consecutive games (March 4-present). Martin has been on fire since Feb. 13, 2016.
- The sophomore has reached double figures in 40 of the last 44 contests. She reached double-digits in 23 consecutive games from March 18, 2016, to Jan. 25, 2017. She joined Bria Holmes, as the only WVU
- sophomores to garner unanimous All-Big 12 First Team honors.
- She leads the Big 12 Conference with 18.9 points per game.
 - Martin has 13 20-point games this season and joins Lisa Szymczak (14), Meg Bulger (15) and Cathy Parson (20) as the only Mountaineer sophomores to reach 20 or more points in 13+ games.
- West Virginia is 14-1 overall and 12-1 this season when Martin scores 20+ points.
- Martin's 32 points vs. Baylor in the Big 12 Tournament Championship was the most ever in a title game.
- Martin earned Most Outstanding Player honors for the Big 12 Championship after scoring 82 points and grabbing 12 rebounds. Her 82 points were third-most in a Big 12 Tournament.
- She made a career-high 35 points at OU (Feb. 7), ranking as the second-best game performance by a WVU sophomore.
- She followed up with 30 points vs. Oklahoma State (Feb. 11), becoming the first Mountaineer since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 30+ points in back-to-back games.
- Martin was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on Feb. 13 after averaging 32.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game last week.
- In the win over No. 20 Oklahoma (Jan. 8), Martin inked her first double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds.
- Martin made 30 consecutive free throws from March 18, 2016 to Nov. 24, 2016 - the second longest streak in program history.

MULDROW REACHES 1,000 POINTS

- Teana Muldrow became just the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point club with a made free throw at the 5:10 mark of the second quarter vs. TCU (Feb. 22).
- In the victory over TCU, the junior from East Orange, New Jersey, scored a career-best 25 points and grabbed 14 rebounds for her seventh double-double of the season.
- Currently, she has reached double-digit scoring in 11 consecutive games.
- Muldrow was named to the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament team after averaging 14.6 points and 8.3 rebounds in WVU's three wins in the Big 12 title run.
- The All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection is third in the Big 12 with 5.7 defensive rebounds per game, third with 8.6 rpg and is seventh with 14.5 points per game.
- Muldrow is 11th all-time at WVU with 87 blocks, 12th with 118 career treys, and 13th with 644 rebounds.
 - Muldrow is the active team leader in doublefigure scoring games with 57.

- Tynice Martin (641) is third all-time on WVU's sophomore scoring list. She is 23 away from passing Meg Bulger (663) for second.
- Martin is the 16th Mountaineer to score 500 or more points in a season.

Lanay Montgomery has 928 total rebounds, which rank fourth all-time at WVU.

- Additionally, Montgomery has corralled 320 career offensive rebounds, which are fourth.
- Montgomery leads the Big 12 with a 68.0 field goal percentage (155-of-228).





Montgomery Achieves Historic Feat in Opener Senior Lanay Montgomery's recorded a historic

performance of 17 points and 18 rebounds to pace the No. 22/25 ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a season-opening, 88-38, victory over Charleston Southern on Saturday.

West Virginia (1-0) sprinted out to an 11-5 lead before Charleston Southern (0-1) cut the game to 11-9 midway through the first quarter. WVU utilized a 12-2 run and held CSU scoreless for a seven minute stretch that lasted late in the second quarter and the first three minutes of the third quarter. The Mountaineers are now 13-3 all-time in season openers under Mike Carey and 29-15 all-time.

Montgomery was one of three WVU players to score 17 points in the contest and did something a Mountaineer had not accomplished in 25 years. The senior from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, connected a perfect 7-of-7 from the field and added 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in 21 minutes. Montgomery's impressive 17 point and 18 rebound performance was the best for a WVU women's basketball player since Donna Abbott posted 22 points and 19 rebounds against Rutgers on Feb. 28, 1991. The double-double marked the 10th in Montgomery's career and she has now pulled down double-digit boards in back-to-back games.

Overall, West Virginia connected on 50.8 percent (32of-63) from the field and 39.1 percent from behind the arc (9-of-23). The Mountaineers held CSU to just 17.7 percent (11-of-62) shooting, as the Buccaneers became the 17th opponent in WVU program history to only make 11 or less field goals.

West Virginia outmanned Charleston Southern, 60-31, on the boards and outscored CSU 38-2 in the paint. WVU capitalized with 21 second chance points and 24 points off 16 Buccaneers turnovers.

Junior Teana Muldrow scored 17 points, collected seven rebounds, dished out three assists and snatched a pair of steals. Tynice Martin also eclipsed double figures with 17 points, making 7-of-13 from the field and 3-of-7 from the 3-point line.

Chania Ray distributed a career-high 11 assists – the most for a Mountaineer point guard since Linda Stepney recorded 12 against Saint Francis in Dec. 2014. Ray also registered four rebounds and two steals.

A couple of other Mountaineers reach career highs: Anja Martin tallied a personal-best eight points and Desiree Rhodes corralled a new career-high in 12 boards. Kristina King, the Big 12 Conference Preseason Newcomer of the Year, scored eight points in her WVU debut.

Martin's Career-High 27 Paces WVU Past Howard

Sophomore Tynice Martin netted a career-high 27 points to lead the No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 95-49 victory over Howard on Tuesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

Howard senior Te'Shya Heslip's layup cut the WVU lead to 16-11 with 1:41 remaining in the first quarter. However, West Virginia answered with a 21-0 run that lasted six minutes into the second quarter.

The Mountaineers (2-0) tallied 54 of their 95 points in the second half to cruise to their 26th consecutive victory against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum.

Martin bested her previous career-high of 20 points and became the ninth WVU player to finish perfect from the free throw line with 10 or more points. The sophomore from Atlanta finished the evening 7-of-14 from the field, 3-of-9 from behind the arc and 10-of-10 from the free throw line. She grabbed four rebounds, collected three steals, dished out two assists and blocked two shots in 29 minutes.

In addition to Martin, four other Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures. Junior Chania Ray netted a career-best 17 points, going 7-of-14 from the field, while dishing out five assists and snatching a career-high five steals.

Alexis Brewer connected on a career-best three triples and finished 5-of-9 with 13 points. Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Kristina King tallied 12 points and corralled six rebounds. Teana Muldrow finished with 11 points, eight rebounds four assists and three steals. Lanay Montgomery blocked a shot for a 26th straight game and registered her third consecutive double-figure rebounding game with a game-high 13 boards. The senior scored seven points, just three shy of a doubledouble.

Overall, WVU shot 46.3 percent (31-of-67) from the field and 43.5 percent (10-of-23) from behind the arc. From the charity stripe, WVU knocked down 23-of-29 free throw attempts for 79.3 percent. Howard was limited to 32.0 percent shooting (16-of-15) from the field and 3-of-15 (20.0 percent) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 48-28 and outscored Howard 32-18 in the paint. WVU forced 27 Howard turnovers and converted those into 34 points.

WVU Clips Eagles to Complete Homestand

Three players reached double-figures in the West Virginia University women's basketball team's 69-39 victory over Coppin State on Saturday.

No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia (3-0) opened the game on a 10-0 run, but shot just 33.3 percent (11-of-33) in the opening half. For a third consecutive game, the Mountaineers bounced back and shot over 60 percent (8-of-13) in the third quarter and took command of the contest for the team's 27th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum against nonconference opponents. With the loss, Coppin State fell to 0-4 on the year.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led all scorers with 19 points. Martin connected on six field goals and connected on a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line. The Atlanta native has now made 19 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016, last season.

Katrina Pardee finished with a season-high 17 points and registered a career-high six rebounds in 29 minutes. Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points and pulled down seven rebounds for fourth consecutive double-figure scoring game. The junior made 5-of-8 from the field, snatched three steals and blocked two shots.

Lanay Montgomery had her best blocking performance since April 2015, leading the way with seven of WVU's 14 blocks on the evening. Montgomery also tallied seven points and grabbed seven rebounds. Chania Ray led WVU with eight assists, while grabbing seven rebounds and collecting three steals.

Overall, West Virginia shot 40.0 percent (24-of-60) from the field and 21.7 percent (5-of-23) from behind the three-point line. Coppin State became the fourth consecutive WVU opponent to shoot below 40 percent, connecting on just 22.6 percent (14-of-62) from the field and 9.1 percent (1-of-11) from behind the arc.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-0 run. However, Coppin State answered with a 7-4 run to close Mountaineer lead to 14-7 at the end of one.

Despite shooting just 25 percent (4-of-16) in the first quarter, the Mountaineers answered in the second quarter by connecting on of 7-of-17 for 41.2 percent. WVU used a 13-0 run over a four minute span to push its lead to 24 points with four minutes remaining in the opening half. Pardee paced WVU with 10 points followed by eight from Martin.

Muldrow connected on nine of WVU's first 11 points to open the third quarter. West Virginia outscored CSU, 22-14, and held a 55-27 advantage after three periods. The Mountaineers added 14 more points in the fourth quarter to secure their ninth win over Coppin State.

Martin Nets Career-Best 28 in Return Home

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a 22-2 run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squash the North Carolina A&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak

to 28 makes since March 18, 2016. Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points. Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. North Carolina A&T was the fifth straight Mountaineer opponent to shoot less than 40 percent, connecting on 19-of-59 for 32.2 percent. The Aggies made 6-of-13 from behind the arc for 46.2 percent. The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held

a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.


The second half was much closer as the Aggies became the first WVU opponent to reach 20 points in a quarter this season. Montgomery and Muldrow were limited in the quarter with two fouls each. The Mountaineers led 52-28 at the break. WVU shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the field compared to NC A&T's 23.5 percent (8-of-34).

It was a continuation of the second half for North Carolina A&T, as the Aggies jumped out on a 14-3 run to trim the game to 55-42 with 6:30 remaining. Dana Brown's jumper with 49.5 seconds left in the quarter cut the Mountaineer advantage to 65-52.

A 9-1 fourth quarter start extended the Mountaineer lead back to 21 points with 6:44 remaining. Montgomery and Ray made back-to-back layups followed by a Martin jumper. The exclamation point to the run was a Muldrow slicing layup that drew the and-one opportunity which she connected on to put WVU up 74-53.

Mountaineers Roll Past East Carolina

Teana Muldrow's double-double paced the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 79-47 victory over East Carolina on Wednesday in the Savannah Invitational held at the Savannah Civic Center.

Three extended runs propelled the Mountaineers (5-0) to their fifth victory of the season. WVU used a 10-2 spurt in the first quarter, a 16-2 second quarter run and a 12-1 fourth quarter run to thwart the Pirates. East Carolina fell to 4-2 after being held to a season-low 47 points.

Muldrow, a junior from East Orange, New Jersey, recorded her second career double-double by scoring season-highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Wednesday marked a breakout performance for Kristina King. The junior made 6-of-8 from the field and added four free throws for 16 points. King finished second in rebounds with eight.

Tynice Martin etched her seventh consecutive double-figure scoring game with 16 points. She grabbed six rebounds and collected two steals in 34 minutes. Chania Ray dished out four assists to lead WVU. Lanay Montgomery was limited for a second straight game due to foul trouble, scoring four points and pulling down three boards.

West Virginia made 29-of-60 from the field for 48.3 percent shooting and connected on 5-of-16 from 3-point range for 31.3 percent. ECU was held to 35.8 percent shooting (19-of-53) from the field, becoming the fifth WVU opponent this season to shoot less than 40 percent.

In the rebounds column, WVU outmanned ECU, 41-32, and outscored the Pirates 34-22 inside the paint. For a fourth game this season, West Virginia recorded double-figure steals with 11. West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2

run. ECU would use a 7-3 run to trim the Mountaineer advantage to 13-9. Teana Muldrow added back-to-back buckets to put WVU up 21-16 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, West Virginia utilized a 16-2 run and held the Pirates for nearly a five minute stretch Martin's layup with 1:08 on the clock gave WVU a 39-25 edge to end the half.

East Carolina trimmed the game to 12 points on multiple occasions in the third period. King snapped a three-plus minute scoring drought with five consecutive points. She picked up a steal and used the fast break to score the layup and connect on the and-one. King then hit another layup to extend the Mountaineer lead to 21 points

WVU Edges Auburn for Savannah Invite Title Lanay Montgomery's layup with 12 seconds

remaining gave the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team a 56-52 victory over Auburn to claim the Savannah Invitational Championship on Thursday evening at the Savannah Civic Center.

The Mountaineers (6-0) led by as many as 14 points in the first half before Auburn (5-1) closed the period on a 15-4 run to cut the halftime lead to 31-28. WVU pushed its advantage to 10, 38-28, with a Montgomery layup at 7:06 left in the third. The Tigers held a brief one-point lead for 1:35 in the fourth quarter, but the Mountaineers maintained a slim lead down the stretch.

Auburn's Jessica Jones made a layup with 1:19 left to tie the game at 52-52. With 12 seconds remaining, Teana Muldrow grabbed an offensive rebound and Montgomery converted the layup for the game-winning basket. Tynice Martin closed out the game with two free throws to give West Virginia its best start since the 2010-11 season.

Montgomery finished with 13 points, five rebounds and three blocks in 22 minutes. Martin led the team with 16 points, which nine of those points were from behind the arc. Muldrow matched her career-high with 14 rebounds and finished with eight points and three assists. Kristina King made 3-of-4 from the field and added two free throws to finish with eight points.

Martin, a native of Atlanta, earned Savannah Invitational MVP honors and Muldrow was named to the All-Tournament Team.

West Virginia shot 38.5 percent (20-of-52) from the field and made 37.5 percent (6-of-16) of its three point attempts. Auburn shot 27.6 percent (16-of-58) from the field and 25.0 percent (5-of-20) behind the arc. Auburn became the seventh consecutive WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field. The Mountaineers withstood the Auburn defensive attack, turning the ball over just 22 times. The Tigers came into



The game went back-and-forth, including a Jones layup with 1:19 on the clock to tie the game at 52-52. From there, WVU used its fourpoint spurt to secure the sixth win of the season.

WVU Downs High Point for 7-0 Start

Four Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures with Tynice Martin's 21 points leading the way in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 82-59 victory over High Point on Sunday at the WVU Coliseum.

A high-scoring first quarter saw the Mountaineers hold a slight 28-22 edge. The team built its halftime advantage to 45-31. West Virginia led the entire game and stretched its lead to 25 points in the fourth quarter. WVU improved to 7-0, the program's best start since the 2010-11 season, and extended its program-record nonconference win streak at the WVU Coliseum to 28.

Martin made 10-of-20 from the field to finish with 21 points, four assists and four steals. The performance was Martin's third 20-point game of the season and her ninth consecutive game in double-figure scoring.

Lanay Montgomery had a standout performance, registering her second double-double this season and the 11th of her career, with 15 points and 14 rebounds. Montgomery blocked five shots, dished out three assists and snatched two steals in 31 minutes. Teana Muldrow also recorded a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Overall, West Virginia made 33-of-66 from the field for 50 percent shooting and held its eighth consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as High Point shot at a 35.6 percent (21-of-59) clip. From three-point range, WVU connected on 5-of-17 for 29.4 percent compared to HPU's 5-of-14 for 35.7 percent. The Mountaineers matched a season-high with 20 assists.

Defensively, West Virginia netted a season-high 16 steals and blocked eight shots. The Mountaineers converted 24 High Point turnovers into 27 points.

West Virginia opened the game to a 9-3 advantage, capitalizing on four early High Point miscues. The Panthers battled back to trim the game to an 11-9 WVU edge after a 6-2 spurt. A Kristina King layup pushed WVU's lead to 23-10 with 2:11 remaining in the period. HPU closed the period on a 12-5 run to narrow the gap to 28-22.

Ray's three-pointer at 6:30 extended the Mountaineer lead to 14, capping a 9-1 WVU run to open the second quarter. Just a minute later, High Point narrowed the lead to 10 points. However, West Virginia maintained a 14-point cushion with a 45-31 halftime advantage.

Martin and Muldrow combined for 12 of West Virginia's first 14 points in the third quarter. A jumper by Martin with 5:53 remaining pushed the Mountaineer lead to 23. Katrina Pardee's jumper gave WVU a 63-43 edge at the end of three. Pardee would finish with nine points.

WVU scored its first eight points from the free throw line the fourth quarter until a Martin jumper at 5:06. The Mountaineers outpaced HPU 19-16 in the frame.

Montgomery Moves WVU Past Morehead State

A stellar performance from senior center Lanay Montgomery propelled the No. 16/17-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 94-53 victory over Morehead State on Wednesday at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia held an early eight-point advantage, but MSU's Katelyn Byrd made a triple with 3:09 remaining in the first quarter to give Morehead State a 15-14 lead. Montgomery's layup 35 seconds later sparked a 13-0 Mountaineer run. Later in the second quarter, WVU used a Montgomery layup and a Katrina Pardee three-pointer to jump start a 17-0 spurt. West Virginia (8-0) scored its second-most points of the season and rolled to a 29th consecutive win against nonconference competition at the WVU Coliseum. Morehead State's two-game win streak was snapped, as the Eagles fell to 5-3 on the season.

Montgomery's historic performance included a careerhigh 23 points, matching a season-high 18 rebounds and blocking six shots in 25 minutes. She made 10-of-11 field goal attempts for 90.9 percent shooting from the field. The Pittsburgh native was just the second WVU player in history to score at least 20-plus points, grab at least 18-plus rebounds and block five or more shots. Only WVU Hall of Famer Georgeann Wells had a better performance against Marshall in 1984, scoring 35 points, pulling down 19 rebounds and blocking eight shots. The double-double was the third for Montgomery this year and the 12th of her career.

Teana Muldrow also netted her third double-double this season with 18 points and 13 rebounds. The junior matched a career-high four assists, blocked three shots and collected three steals. Montgomery and Muldrow are the first WVU duo to tally double-doubles in back-to-back games since Liz Repella and Takisha Granberry accomplished the feat versus FIU and NJIT in November 2008.

Tynice Martin reached double-figure scoring for a 10th consecutive game with 17 points. Also in double-figures, Kristina King posted 14 and grabbed seven rebounds.

West Virginia shot 47.4 percent (36-of-76) from the field and 41.2 percent (7-of-17) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers held their ninth consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting and their fourth opponent this season to less than 30 percent shooting, as Morehead State was limited to 29.4 percent (20-of-68) from the field.

In the rebound column, WVU grabbed 59 boards compared to MSU's 43. The Mountaineers blocked a seasonbest 15 shots, the most since deflecting 15 against Kansas State on Jan. 21, 2015. Bench Scoring Lifts WVU Past Ole Miss

The No. 16/17-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team used a season-high 34 points from its bench to knock off Ole Miss, 66-61, in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge on Sunday afternoon at the WVU Coliseum.

An 8-2 run to start the third quarter gave Ole Miss (6-2) a lead for a minute and 21 seconds. However, West Virginia used two free throws from Alexis Brewer and layups from Tynice Martin and Kristina King to regain the lead, 34-30, with three minutes remaining. With 4:20 remaining in the game, the Rebels trimmed the

With 4:20 remaining in the game, the Rebels trimmed the contest to 54-52 after Erika Sisk made a layup and converted the and-one. However, WVU's Brewer and Lanay Montgomery quickly responded with back-to-back buckets to extend the lead back to four.

West Virginia (9-0) utilized a King layup and nine free throws in the final 1:13 to secure its 30th consecutive win over a nonconference opponent and 11th straight victory at the WVU Coliseum. The Mountaineers are off to their best start since opening the year 16-0 in the 2010-11 season.

King narrowly missed a double-double with a game-high 16 points, season-high nine rebounds and season-best four blocks in 28 minutes. Brewer finished with 12 points, seven of which came from the charity stripe.

Martin reached double-figure scoring for an 11th consecutive game with 10 points. Montgomery and Teana Muldrow contributed with eight points and five rebounds each in limited minutes. Desiree Rhodes filled in the post with six points and five rebounds.

The Mountaineers shot 53.5 percent (23-of-43) from the field in just 43 field goal attempts, the lowest since shooting 43 at Georgetown on Jan. 25, 2011. Ole Miss was limited to 32.2 percent (19-of-59) shooting from the field, marking the 10th consecutive game that West Virginia has held its opponents to shooting less than 40 percent. West Virginia shot well in the second quarter, but

West Virginia shot well in the second quarter, but committed nine more turnovers for a total of 18 at the half. WVU converted on 6-of-13 attempts in the second quarter. Rhodes' layup in the final seconds stretched the Mountaineer advantage to 26-20. Muldrow led WVU with eight points, while Ole Miss' Torri Lewis had eight. The Rebels only made one two-point basket in the first half, which came with 1:38 remaining in the second stanza.

Ole Miss opened the third quarter on a 10-2 run to tie the game with a Taylor Manuel layup at the 6:31 mark. Shandricka Sessom's bucket with 5:26 left in the third quarter gave the Rebels their first lead of the game at 30-28. However, West Virginia responded with a 6-0 run including layups from King and Martin. After starting the game 2-of-10 from the charity stripe, WVU concluded the quarter with four consecutive free throw makes. Manuel would finish with a team-high 13 points for Mississippi.

Despite Ole Miss' Sisk scoring the layup and converting the and-one, WVU outscored Ole Miss 13-to-10 down the final stretch to secure the Big 12 Conference's fourth victory in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

WVU Women's Hoops Improve to 10-0

The No. 13/14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team shot a season-high 59.7 percent from the field and improved to 10-0 in a 91-33 victory over USC Upstate on Saturday.

West Virginia opened the contest on an 11-2 run and never trailed. The Mountaineers used a 21-0 scoring spurt in the third and fourth quarters to pick up their 31st consecutive win over a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum. WVU's 12th straight win at the Coliseum ranks seventh all-time, while the 10-game win streak is tied for the 10th longest in program history. Saturday's win also tied the Mountaineers second-best start in program history, matching the 10-0 start in 2002-03. USC Upstate's 33 points were the lowest for a Mountaineer opponent since Georgetown was limited to 32 in 2012. The Spartans fell to 4-6 on the season.

32 in 2012. The Spartans fell to 4-6 on the season. Senior center Lanay Montgomery recorded her fourth double-double of the year with 16 points and 10 rebounds. She blocked four shots and made 8-of-9 from the field for an 88.9 shooting percentage. For a second consecutive game, Kristina King matched season-highs with 16 points and nine rebounds in 19 minutes. Teana Muldrow finished with 15 points, six rebounds and five assists. Additionally, Tynice Martin eclipsed doublefigures for a 12th consecutive game with 14 points.

Chania Ray finished with nine points and led WVU with seven assists and four steals. Sophomore Katrina Pardee also tallied nine points in the contest. West Virginia limited its 11th consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as USC Upstate made just 14-of-59 for 23.7 percent. WVU dished out 24 assists and collected 14 steals in the victory.


Pardee scored West Virginia's first seven points as the Mountaineers opened the contest to an 11-2 lead. Montgomery also added eight points and blocked two shots in seven minutes in the opening quarter.

Six of the first eight points were scored by the USC Upstate to start the second quarter. Montgomery, King and Pardee sparked a 10-3 Mountaineer run. West Virginia closed the half with a 42-19 lead and shot a season-best 63.3 percent from the field in the opening half.

Muldrow made four of West Virginia's first six points in the second half, all of which came from the charity stripe. The Mountaineers closed the third quarter on a 14-point run to extend the margin to 45 points.

WVU added seven more consecutive points to stretch the lead to 79-26 with 7:40 remaining. A layup from Vanessa Agrusa snapped the 21-0 run, but WVU added 13 more points in the quarter for its largest margin of victory win of the season. Brittney Delva led the Spartans with 12 points.

WVU Dishes Out 32 Assists in Win over Longwood

The No. 14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team tied a school-record 32 assists in a 107-40 victory over Longwood on Saturday afternoon at the Charleston Civic Center.

A 16-4 run and another 16-0 spurt in the first quarter set the tone for the Mountaineers. West Virginia shot 71.4 percent (25-of-35) in the first half. Although WVU (11-0) cooled down in the second half, the Mountaineers finished the game shooting 56.8 percent (42-of-74) from the field. WVU's 32 assists on 42 field goals matched 32 assists dished out against Indiana State (Nov. 23, 1984) and Duquesne (Nov. 7, 1984). Longwood fell to 1-7 on the season.


Tynice Martin led the Mountaineers with 21 points for her sixth career 20-point performance. Martin dished out a career-high seven assists and matched a season-high six rebounds. Lanay Montgomery made 9-of-9 from the field and finished with 19 points, eight rebounds and three blocks. Junior guard Teana Muldrow also went a perfect 7-of-7 from the field to finishing the day with 17 points, while dishing out five assists and grabbing four rebounds.

Alexis Brewer eclipsed double figures with a careerhigh 16 points in 28 minutes. Kristina King rounded out WVU's double-digit scoring with 11 points, and sophomore Katrina Pardee led the team with a careerhigh 10 assists and zero turnovers in 21 minutes. Desiree Rhodes paced the team with nine rebounds.

Saturday's victory gave West Virginia its 11th straight win, tying for the seventh-longest win streak and second-best start to a season in program history. Longwood became the Mountaineers' 12th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field, knocking down just 23.5 percent (12-of-51). West Virginia won the rebound battle, 49-28, and outscored the Lancers, 40-12, in the paint. WVU converted 24 Longwood turnovers into 29 points. WVU's 107-point performance was the most since tallying 109 against Delaware State on Dec. 18, 2013.

West Virginia opened the game with four different Mountaineers making three-pointers to put WVU up 16-4 with 6:31 left in the first quarter. The team capped a 16-0 run in the first quarter and led 31-8, marking the 15th time this season WVU has limited its opponents to under double-figure scoring in a quarter.

WVU Caps Nonconference Play Unbeaten

The No. 13/12 West Virginia University women's basketball team completed the nonconference slate perfect for the third time in program history with a 77-45 win over Mount St. Mary's on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (12-0) sprinted out to a 19-3 run in the first quarter and never relinquished the lead in the team's 32nd straight win against nonconference opponents at the WVU Coliseum. The Mount (2-9) trimmed the WVU lead to 10 points early in the second quarter, but the Mountaineers responded with 11 consecutive points to seal the team's 14th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia joins the 2010-11 squad (14-0) and the 2002-03 team (11-0) in finishing the nonconference schedule undefeated.

Lanay Montgomery paced the Mountaineers with 16 points and 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. Montgomery finished with five blocks on Wednesday pushing her career total to 273 and passing former teammate Aysa Bussie (270) for second on WVU's all-time career blocks list. The senior made her first five shots to extend her consecutive field goals made streak to 14, before it ended in the first half. She finished 7-of-9 from the field for 77.8 percent shooting.



No. 12 WVU Downs TCU in Big 12 Opener

Strong defensive play and a 32-point third quarter performance propelled the No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to an 83-61 win over TCU on Thursday evening in the Big 12 Conference opener at the Ed and Rae Schollmaier Arena.

WVU (13-0, 1-0) used a series of runs, including a 10-3 spurt in the first quarter to maintain the lead. In the third quarter, West Virginia outscored TCU, 32-20, to stretch its lead to as much as 36. The Horned Frogs (8-4, 0-1) committed 20 turnovers, resulting in 19 Mountaineer points. West Virginia's 17 steals were the most in a Big 12 game for the Mountaineers since joining the league in 2012-13.

Tynice Martin led West Virginia With 21 points, while matching a team high with six steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 19 points and nine rebounds. Guard Chania Ray matched a career-high with 17 points, dished out nine assists, grabbed six boards and collected career-best six steals. Kristina King reached double-digit scoring for a sixth consecutive game with 14 points. Lanay Montgomery led WVU with 11 rebounds, while corralling eight rebounds.

West Virginia's 13-0 start is the second-best in program history. WVU's 13-game win streak is tied for fifth all-time.

Offensively, West Virginia made 26-of-60 from the field for 43.3 percent shooting. WVU connected on 26-of-32 from the field for an 81.3 free throw percentage. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 42-32.

For a 14th straight game, West Virginia held its opponent to less than 40 percent shooting. The Frogs made 37.7 percent (20-of-53) from the field and shot 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from three-point range. TCU entered the game leading the country in three-point field goal percentage. WVU's 10 blocks were the most since deflecting 15 against Morehead State on Nov. 30.


West Virginia sprinted out to a 9-4 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Montgomery scored on a putback with 11 seconds remaining and Muldrow hit a jumper to cap a 10-3 run and give the Mountaineers a 19-7.

TCU was limited to just one three-point make in the first quarter. The Frogs connected on three more, but WVU utilized an 8-0 run midway through the quarter to stretch its lead to as much as 23 points.

The Mountaineers outscored TCU 32-20 in the third quarter despite the Frogs shooting 5-of-9 from three-point range. West Virginia utilized another nine-point spurt and held a 73-39 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Toree Thompson made back-to-back buckets to spark a 12-2 run in the fourth quarter. Amy Oknonkwo's threepointer with 6:23 remaining trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 75-51. However, WVU added eight more points to seal its 13th straight win. Okonkwo led the Frogs with 17 points and eight rebounds.

Ray's 23 Paces WVU in Loss at K-State

The No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team could not overcome Kansas State's strong offensive play, as the Mountaineers fell 86-71 to the Wildcats on Sunday at Bramlage Coliseum.

Kansas State (11-3, 1-1) dominated inside during the first half, scoring 34 of its 51 first half points inside the paint to hold a 51-39 advantage at halftime. The Mountaineers (13-1, 1-1) trimmed the contest to six points with eight minutes left in the third quarter, but K-State proceeded on an 11-2 run to push the lead back to 15 points. WVU trimmed the deficit to 14 late in the fourth quarter, but Kansas State held on to snap the Mountaineers' 13-game winning streak.

Chania Ray scored a career-high 23 points, which included a personal-best six three-point makes. The junior from Alexandria, Virginia, dished out seven assists, grabbed four rebounds and collected two steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 15 points, including 5-of-7 from beyond the arc. WVU's other double-figure scorers included Tynice Martin (14) and Kristina King (11). Lanay Montgomery paced WVU with nine rebounds.

WVU's 14 three-point makes were second all-time in a single-game. The Mountaineers shot 42.4 percent (25-of-59) from the field and 48.3 percent (14-of-29) from behind the arc. Kansas State finished shooting 54.7 percent (35-of-64) from the field – snapping WVU's 14-game streak of holding opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. The Wildcats outscored WVU, 54-22, in the paint and won the rebound battle 35-28. Breanna Lewis paced K-State with 23 points.

The Mountaineers held a 9-6 lead midway through the first quarter. K-State outscored WVU 10-6 in final 3:39, which included back-to-back layups from Lewis to end the quarter.


Kansas State opened the second quarter on an 8-3 run and extended its lead to 10 points with 7:25 remaining. Karyla Middlebrook's layup with 38 seconds on the clock pushed the lead to 14. No. 17 Mountaineers Topple No. 20 Oklahoma The No. 17/16-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team withstood a fourth quarter Oklahoma comeback attempt and prevailed 83-73 over the No. 20/24 Sooners on Sunday at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (14-2, 2-2) led by 17, 42-25, at halftime. However, the Sooners (12-4, 3-1) outscored WVU, 21-13, in the third to trim the lead. With 8:32 remaining in regulation, OU trailed by five, 55-50, with the ball. Teana Muldrow collected a steal and scored a layup to draw the and-one. She followed up with another layup, thanks to a steal from Lanay Montgomery to push the Mountaineer advantage back to 10. West Virginia maintained an eight-point cushion from that point forward to collect its 43rd victory and first this season over an Associated Press Top 25 team.

Five Mountaineers reached double-figures as Tynice Martin netted her first career double-double with 18 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Lanay Montgomery tallied 16 points, grabbed 14 rebounds, blocked four shots and collected four steals in the victory, becoming just the fourth Mountaineer to record that stat line. Muldrow added 11 points and five rebounds in limited minutes due to foul trouble.

Returning for action for the first time since Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21, Alexis Brewer made 6-of-10 from the field for 15 points. Katrina Pardee finished in doublefigures with 10 points.

West Virginia shot 52.5 percent (32-of-61) from the field and held Oklahoma to 40.3 percent (27-of-67) shooting. The Mountaineers were 10-of-21 (47.6 percent) from three-point range. WVU won the rebound battle, 41-33, and dished out 20 assists. WVU won the battle of the paint, outscoring OU, 38-32.

West Virginia pushed its lead to 10-6 with 3:50 left in the first quarter, but a Gioya Carter layup a minute later trimmed the game to one. WVU closed the quarter on a 7-1 run to take a 17-10 advantage.


Oklahoma tied the game, 17-17, after scoring seven consecutive points including a Peyton Little threepointer. From there, WVU utilized a 22-6 run.

The Sooners started the third quarter making 4-of-7 from the field. Little's jumper with 1:11 remaining in the quarter trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 55-46. Oklahoma outscored West Virginia, 21-13, in the frame.

Buckets from Vionise Pierre-Louis and T'ona Edwards trimmed the game to 55-50 with 8:53 left. However, Muldrow converted a steal into a layup along with the and-one opportunity to push the edge back to eight. WVU stretched the lead to as many as 15 late in the game before back-to-back treys from OU. Little led the Sooners with 17 points.

Comeback Effort Falls Short at Texas Tech

A valiant fourth quarter comeback effort fell short, as No. 18/19-ranked West Virginia fell, 75-66, to Texas Tech on Wednesday evening at the United Supermarkets Arena.

WVU (14-3, 2-3) trailed by 14 at the end of the third quarter. The Mountaineers utilized a 21-4 run over six minutes in the fourth quarter, eventually tying the game at 3:02 with a Lanay Montgomery jumper. Ivonne CookTaylor hit a two to put TTU up 62-60. WVU responded with two free throws from Teana Muldrow to tie the game once again. However, Recee' Caldwell responded with a three to give the Lady Raiders the go-ahead bucket. TTU (11-5, 3-2) scored eight consecutive points down the stretch to remain undefeated in Lubbock with a 10-0 record.

Montgomery paced WVU with 18 points, while collecting seven rebounds. Tynice Martin finished with 17 points after finishing the first half scoreless and Katrina Pardee added 10 points. Muldrow led the Mountaineers with 10 rebounds and Chania Ray dished out eight assists.

WVU shot 43.5 percent (27-of-62) from the field and gave up 43.8 percent shooting (28-of-64) to Texas Tech. The Lady Raiders won the rebound column, 40-32, and scored 18 points off 11 WVU turnovers.

Pardee and Montgomery combined for WVU's 10-0 run to start the contest. Pardee hit two treys and Montgomery connected on two buckets in the first two and a half minutes. WVU maintained a 19-11 lead at the end of one. Pardee had 10 of WVU's first 19 points.



Another fourth quarter comeback attempt fell short, as the No. 18/19-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team dropped a 73-63 decision to No. 16/17 Texas on Saturday in front of 4,118 fans at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (14-4, 2-4) were outscored 43-24 in the second and third quarters, as the Longhorns (12-4, 6-0) built up their lead to 22 points. WVU used a 15-1 run over a four-minute span in the fourth quarter to trim the deficit to eight points, 68-60, with 2:13 remaining. However, Texas scored five points in the final two minutes to secure the victory.

Teana Muldrow led West Virginia with a seasonhigh 22 points, one short of her career-best 23, while grabbing seven rebounds. Senior Lanay Montgomery registered her seventh double-double of the year with 14 points and 12 rebounds. Other double-figure scorers included 14 points from Tynice Martin and 12 from Chania Ray.

Overall, West Virginia shot 45.1 percent (23-of-51) from the field and surrendered 50 percent (32-of-64) shooting from Texas. WVU made 6-of-13 (46.2%) from behind the arc and held UT to no three-point makes. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, but were outscored, 48-24, in the paint.



Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow each recorded a double-double in the No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 62-51 victory over Kansas on Wednesday evening at Allen Fieldhouse. West Virginia (15-4, 3-4) led by 12 points in the second

quarter. However, Kansas (6-12, 0-7) fought back with a 13-3 run to open the third quarter and take a 35-34 lead with 4:06 left in the period. A Tynice Martin trey with 48 seconds remaining in the third, gave WVU the 39-37 go-ahead lead. The Jayhawks trimmed the game to three early in the fourth, but the Mountaineers made 12 free throws in the final 45 seconds to secure the win; giving Kansas its 25th consecutive Big 12 loss.

The Jayhawks were the 14th WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field this season. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 52-32, and outscored the Jayhawks, 28-20, inside the paint. WVU outscored KU, 18-6, in secondchance point opportunities. Kansas forced 25 Mountaineer turnovers, but only converted 13 into points.



No. 24 WVU Battles, Falls at No. 2 Bavlor

No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia battled No. 2/2 Baylor, but fell, 79-73, in a hard-fought contest on Saturday afternoon in front of 6,462 fans at the Ferrell Center.

West Virginia (15-5, 3-5) held brief leads in the first and second quarters and for a total of 3:21 in the game. Baylor (19-1, 8-0) held a 40-34 advantage at the half, marking the closest halftime margin for the Lady Bears in Big 12 play.

Katrina Pardee made a layup and hit a three-pointer to trim the game to four, 65-61, with 5:51 left in the game. However, BU made six free throws in the final minute to collect the win.

BU came into Saturday's game with a +35.1 scoring margin in Big 12 games and had its closest game, a 23-point victory over TCU. WVU's 73 points were the most scored against the Lady Bears this season.

Teana Muldrow led WVU with a game-high 20 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Tynice Martin tallied 18 points, while dishing out four assists. Pardee finished with 13 points, followed by 11 points and five assists from Chania Ray.

Baylor finished shooting 45.2 percent (28-of-62) from the field compared to WVU's 41.7 percent (30-of-72). The Lady Bears won the rebound battle, 42-38, and edged WVU, 44-42, inside the paint. Baylor made 20-of-26 from the charity stripe for 76.9 percent compared to West Virginia's 9-of-13 for 69.2 percent.

Pardee, Muldrow and Ray combined for West Virginia's six-point run to take a 12-6 lead with 6:42 left in the first. However, Baylor proceeded on a 13-1 to push its lead to seven. The Mountaineers fought back and Muldrow's trey capped the period, trimming the contest to 25-24.

Martin's layup at the 8:10 mark gave West Virginia its first lead, 28-27. The two teams traded buckets throughout the game, but BU eventually stretched out to a 40-34 lead at halftime after outscoring the Mountaineers, 15-10, in the quarter.

WVU shot 35.9 percent from the field (14-of-39) compared to Baylor's 43.8 percent (14-of-32) at the half.

An Alexis Jones layup pushed Baylor's lead to 11 points at the 5:21 mark in the third. Alexis Brewer followed up with a layup plus connected on the and-one, while Martin added a jumper to trim the contest back to six. BU made six of its next eight to extend its lead to 59-47 with 1:25 left in the third. At the end of three, Baylor maintained a 63-52 advantage.

Pardee's bucket with 6:39 left in the fourth trimmed the game to 65-58. She followed up the next possession with a three to narrow the game to four. However, Baylor responded with back-to-back jumpers to extend the lead to eight.

Muldrow made a bucket and converted the and-one to trim the game to 73-68 with less than two minutes remaining. However, Baylor kept its distance down the stretch to improve to 8-0 in the Big 12.

No. 22 West Virginia Downs Texas Tech

Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow combined for 43 points, as the No. 22-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team collected an 89-79 win over Texas Tech on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (16-5, 4-5) opened up to a 22-point lead late in the second quarter, before the Lady Raiders (11-8. 3-5) stormed back nailing five three-pointers and outscoring WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter. Texas Tech cut the game to within seven in the final guarter, but West Virginia outscored TTU, 27-24, in the period to collect their 16th victory of the season.

Muldrow matched a season-high with 22 points, grabbed nine rebounds and dished out a career-high seven assists. Montgomery followed with 21 points, nine rebounds and three blocks. Chania Ray reached double-figure scoring with 12 points and six rebounds. Tynice Martin finished with 11 points and five rebounds. Katrina Pardee and Alexis Brewer added nine and eight points, respectively.

Statistically, the Mountaineers shot 53.2 percent from the field (33-of-62) compared to Texas Tech's 47.6 percent (30-of-63). The Lady Raiders made 13 three-pointers for 54.2 percent shooting, while WVU made 7-of-14 for 50 percent from behind the arc. The Mountaineers connected on 16-of-19 free throws for 84.2 percent. WVU dished out 20 assists, collected eight steals and blocked five shots.

West Virginia came out on fire with a 16-2 run to open the game in the first five minutes. Texas Tech made just 3-of-14 in the quarter, as the Mountaineers maintained a 24-8 lead at the end of the period.

Texas Tech used three-pointers from Larryn Brooks and Recce' Caldwell to trim the deficit to 14 points. WVU stretched its lead to 22 with a Montgomery layup at the 1:45 mark, but WVU held a 43-24 advantage at break.


To open the third quarter, the Lady Raiders opened by making seven three-pointers in the first six minutes to trim the deficit to 50-43. TTU would outscore WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter and trim the deficit to five points after a pair of Brooks free throws at the 1:43 mark.

Montgomery made a layup early in the fourth quarter and converted on the and-one to extend WVU's lead back to 10. TTU would trim the game to within seven on three occasions, but WVU responded each time to collect the victory. Ivonne CookTaylor led TTU with 19 points in the contest.

No. 22 West Virginia Falls at No. 12 Texas

The No. 22-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team couldn't overcome a 12-point fourth quarter run by No. 12 Texas, as the Mountaineers fell, 69-54, on Sunday afternoon in front of 4,123 fans at the Frank Erwin Center.

There were four lead changes and West Virginia (16-6, 4-6) led by as many as four in the first quarter. WVU had trimmed the deficit to three, 48-45, at the end of the third quarter. However, UT (16-4, 10-0) used a 12-point spurt to push its lead to 15 points. The victory gave Texas its 14th consecutive victory and 10th in Big 12 play.

Lanay Montgomery led the team with 11 points and five rebounds after making 4-of-5 from the field. Teana Muldrow also reached double-figures with 10 points in just 12 minutes because of foul trouble. Kristina King paced the team with seven points.

WVU shot 39.1 percent (18-of-46) from the field compared to Texas' 47.3 percent (26-of-55). The Longhorns won the rebound battle, 35-28, and outscored WVU inside the paint, 28-22. The Mountaineers dished out nine assists and collected seven steals, but UT converted 23 WVU turnovers into 22 points.



Brooke McCarty's back-to-back three-pointers and two buckets from Joyner Holmes sparked a 12-0 fourth quarter run to give Texas a comfortable 15-point lead. McCarty finished with a team-leading 15 points for the Longhorns.

The No. 22/23 West Virginia University women's basketball team suffered an 80-55 loss to lowa State on Saturday afternoon at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (16-7, 4-7 Big 12 Conference) suffered their first loss to the Cyclones (13-10, 4-8) in the last four games and fell to 7-3 all-time in the series. After the two teams traded the lead four times in the opening two minutes, ISU took a 7-5 lead and never looked back.

Sophomore guard Katrina Pardee led the Mountaineers with 16 points, including a career-high-tying 12 from threepoint range, and added five rebounds. Sophomore guard Tynice Martin also reached double figures, with 13 points, all in the second half, and a team-high five assists. On the glass, senior center Lanay Montgomery and junior forward Teana Muldrow each had nine rebounds.

The Mountaineers shot 29.7 percent (19-64) and 24.1 percent from three-point range (7-29). WVU's bench outscored lowa State's, 9-7.

outscored lowa State's, 9-7. The Mountaineers trailed early, as the Cyclones opened the game shooting 6-8 from the field to take a 14-8 lead. After a timeout on the floor, ISU extended the advantage to 16-8 before West Virginia chipped away at the deficit. A Muldrow jumper and a Brewer three made it a 16-13 game before lowa State scored the final points of the quarter to take an 18-13 lead after 10 minutes of play. The WVU defense held lowa State to 2-8 from the field and

The WVU defense held lowa State to 2-8 from the field an 0-3 from beyond the arc in the final 4:22 of the first quarter. Pardee opened the second guarter with a three, her

Pardee opened the second quarter with a three, her third of the game, to cut the lowa State lead to just two at 18-16. The Cyclones responded with a 12-3 run, holding the Mountaineers scoreless for nearly three minutes. A jumper by junior guard Chania Ray halted the scoring drought, and Brewer followed with a three to make it 32-24. Ray then converted on a four-point play, where she was fouled while making a three and made the ensuing free throw.

With 1:27 left, the Cyclone lead had been cut to 32-28. The visitors responded with a 5-0 run to end the half, taking a 37-28 lead into the locker room.

West Virginia was 10-33 from the field and 6-16 from 3-point range in the first half, while Iowa State was 16-31 and 5-15 from beyond the arc. ISU held a 14-6 advantage in points in the paint and a 9-2 edge in second-chance points. The Cyclones had 23 rebounds to the Mountaineers' 16.

Múldrow opened the scoring in the third quarter with a jumper, but the Cyclones answered with a three to make it a 10-point game, 40-30. Iowa State extended its advantage to 13, its largest of the game, at 46-33. Out of a WVU timeout, Martin hit a jumper, but ISU

Out of a WVU timeout, Martin hit a jumper, but ISU answered right back with a three. The lowa State lead reached 17 at 54-37, the largest lead of the game, before a Martin jumper made it 54-39. Jowa State closed the quarter on a 6-2 run to take a 60-41 lead into the fourth quarter.

A pair of free throws in the opening minute of the final quarter extended lowa State's lead to 21, at 62-41. Martin quickly answered with a jumper to cut the deficit to 19 points, but that was as close as the Mountaineers could get. lowa State outscored West Virginia 20-14 in the final 10 minutes to seal the victory.

Mountaineers Fall to No. 19 Sooners in Double OT The West Virginia University women's basketball team was unable to hold a 15-point lead and eventually fell, 90-87, in a double overtime loss to No. 19 Oklahoma on Tuesday, at the Lloyd Noble Center.

The Mountaineers (16-8, 4-8) opened the game with a 9-0 run and held a 15-point lead midway through the third quarter. However, Oklahoma (19-6, 10-3) used a 23-11 fourth quarter period to take force of the game to overtime. Both teams traded 11 points in the first overtime, but eventually OU scored four consecutive points late in the second OT to take the victory. Overall, there were 11 ties and 15 lead changes in the contest.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led the Mountaineers with a career-high 35 points, just one shy of tying the sophomore program record of 36 scored by Meg Bulger. Teana Muldrow contributed with her fifth double-double of the season with 22 points and 13 rebounds. Lanay Montgomery finished with 10 points and nine rebounds. Chania Ray and Muldrow each dished out five assists in the setback.

Offensively, WVU shot just 36.6 percent (26-of-71) from the field compared to Oklahoma's 44.8 percent (30-of-67). Both teams corralled 44 rebounds each. WVU's 21 turnovers resulted in 29 Oklahoma points, while 17 OU miscues resulted in 17 points for the Mountaineers. West Virginia knocked down 11 three-pointers in the loss.

West Virginia sprinted out to a nine-point lead in the first three and a half minutes, which included six points from Martin and buckets from Katrina Pardee and Montgomery. The Sooners were held scoreless for the first six minutes, but fought back to trim the game to 11-8. However, WVU used an 8-3 run to close the period and take a 19-11 advantage at the end of the period.

Montgomery's putback and Pardee's two free throws stretched the Mountaineer lead to 12, 25-13, with 5:25 remaining. The Sooners cut the game to eight on a couple of occasions and trimmed the contest to 33-25 at halftime after a Gioya Carter jumper.

Martin opened the third quarter with back-to-back three-pointers to push the WVU advantage to 39-25. Vionise Pierre-Louis' two consecutive layups sparked a 6-2 Sooner run to trim the game to 10. WVU responded with a Ray three-pointer, while Martin made a jumper and converted the and-one to push the Mountaineer lead to 15 points. West Virginia held a 12-point lead, 56-44, at the end of three.

Oklahoma used a 14-2 run in the fourth quarter and trim the West Virginia lead to 60-53 with 6:39 remaining. The Mountaineers made only one field goal in the fourth quarter and were outscored 23-11 as the game was tied 67-67 at the end of regulation.


Both teams swapped buckets in the overtime period as the Mountaineers and Sooners swapped leads and finished tied at 78-78 at the end of the first OT.

WVU Nails Record 17 Treys in Rout of Cowgirls The West Virginia University women's basketball team knocked down a school-record 17 three-pointers in a 79-53 win over Oklahoma State on Saturday evening in front of

4,024 fans at the WVU Coliseum for the Play4Kay pink game. After one period of play, it remained a two-point margin as WVU held a 14-12 advantage. However, WVU responded with seven three-pointers in the second quarter and held a 39-24 halftime edge. The three-point hot streak continued in the second half, as WVU responded with eight more makes from behind the arc. The Mountaineers (17-8, 5-8) maintained a comfortable lead in the second half and never trailed the Cowgirls (13-11, 3-10).

Coming off a 35-point performance at Oklahoma, sophomore Tynice Martin once again had a stellar game by scoring a game-high 30 points and grabbing eight rebounds in 35 minutes. The sophomore became the first Mountaineer since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 30 or more points in back-to-back games. The Atlanta native knocked down a career-best 7-of-10 from three-point range, tying for the second-most three-pointers made by a West Virginia sophomore in a game.

Teana Muldrow registered her sixth double-double of the season and second consecutive with 14 points and 13 rebounds. She also blocked two shots in 34 minutes. Katrina Pardee made 4-of-5 from three-point range and finished with 12 points.


Offensively, WVU shot 46.0 percent (29-of-63) from the field and 58.6 percent (17-of-29) from behind the arc. Oklahoma State was limited to 37.3 percent shooting (19-of-51) and 16.7 percent (2-of-12) from3-point range. WVU won the rebound battle, 37-32.

A pair of Martin jumpers and a Muldrow three-pointer put the Mountaineers up 7-2 in the first three and a half minutes of Saturday's contest. However, Oklahoma State fought back to trim the game to one, 7-6. The game remained close for the rest of the period, but a Brewer driving layup gave WVU a 14-12 edge at the end of the guarter.

Strong perimeter play in the second quarter propelled the Mountaineers to a 39-24 halftime advantage. Seven of West Virginia's nine field goals were from behind the arc, setting a new school quarter record. Pardee banked three treys, while Muldrow followed with two. Martin and Brewer also knocked down triples. WVU outscore OSU, 25-12, in the period.

In the third quarter, WVU added three more treys in contest and Martin led WVU with nine points in the period. A Martin jumper and the connection on the and-one stretched WVU's lead to 23. The Mountaineers added 21 points in the fourth quarter. Martin's three-point make at the 3:08 mark tied the previous school record of 16 treys against Providence in 1998. Less than a minute later, Brewer broke the school record with her second three-pointer of the game.

West Virginia Knocks Off No. 24 K-State

The West Virginia University women's basketball team staved off a Kansas State fourth quarter rally to knock off the 24th-ranked Wildcats, 66-59, on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers (18-8, 6-8) had built up a 19-point lead in the first half, but K-State (18-8, 8-6) slowly chipped away in the second half. The Wildcats trimmed the game to two points on two occasions in the fourth quarter, which included a Kaylee Page triple at the 4:34 mark to make it a 52-50 contest. Teana Muldrow's layup followed by a bucket from Kristina King sparked a nine-point Mountaineer run over the next two minutes to push the West Virginia lead back to 11.

KSU could only trim the game to seven in the final 2:22, giving West Virginia its second top 25 win of the season. Earlier on Jan. 8, WVU picked up an 83-73 victory over No. 20/24 Oklahoma. The Mountaineers have won at least two games over ranked opponents in the last eight years and in 11 of the last 12 seasons.

Junior guard Chania Ray registered her first career doubledouble with 14 points and dishing out a game-high 10 assists. Katrina Pardee again had a strong performance from the perimeter, banking four three-pointers and finishing with 14 points. Despite being limited due to foul trouble, Lanay Montgomery etched her ninth double-double of the season and 18th of her career with 12 points and 12 rebounds. The Pittsburgh native made 6-of-8 from the field for a 75 shooting percentage.

Muldrow also eclipsed double-figures with 10 points, while grabbing six rebounds. The junior is just 16 points away from becoming the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point plateau.


Offensively, West Virginia shot 45.5 percent (25-of-55) from the field and made 36.4 percent (8-of-22) from behind the arc. A 13-point Iowa State run in the third quarter hampered the West Virginia University women's basketball team in a 68-53 loss to the Cyclones at the Hilton Coliseum on Saturday afternoon.

lowa State (15-11, 6-9) closed out the first quarter with a 17-7 lead. However, West Virginia (18-9, 6-9) fought back and took a brief 26-25 lead with two minutes remaining in the first half. ISU used a four-point spurt to lead, 29-26, at the break. In the third quarter, the Mountaineers trimmed the game to 29-28, but lowa State used a 13-point run to stretch its lead to double-figures. In the fourth quarter, WVU trimmed the game to 10, but a 9-3 run to open the period pushed the Cyclone lead to 18 points.

Lanay Montgomery paced West Virginia with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while blocking three shots. The doubledouble was Montgomery's 10th of the season. The senior center became the first Mountaineer since Maria Tchobanova in 1999 to record 19 or more double-doubles in her career. Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points, just five shy of 1,000

Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points, just five shy of 1,000 career points, and grabbed nine rebounds in 33 minutes. Tynice Martin scored 15 points followed by seven from Alexis Brewer. Chania Ray led the way with a team-leading seven assists and grabbed six rebounds.

Offensively, WVU was limited to 31.7 percent shooting (19-of-60) from the field compared to lowa State's 38.5 percent (25-of-65). The Mountaineers made just 3-of-17 (17.6 percent) from behind the arc, while lowa State connected on 7-of-21 (33.3%). ISU scored 22 points off 16 WVU turnovers and won the rebound battle, 44-38.

Ray opened the contest with a three-pointer, but Iowa State responded with six consecutive points to take a 6-3 edge in the first five minutes. The Cyclones closed the final period on an 11-4 run to take a 17-7 lead at the end of one.

West Virginia used a five-point turnaround thanks to a Muldrow bucket plus and-one and a Martin fast break score trim the game to 21-17 with 5:13 left in the half. WVU capped a 9-2 run and tied the game, 21-21, with 3:14 left. WVU took a brief 26-25 lead after a Brewer three. However, the Cyclones closed the half on a four-point run to hold a 29-26 advantage. The Mountaineers shot 34.5 percent (10-of-29) from the filed compared to ISU's 36.1 percent (13-of-36).

A Muldrow layup trimmed the contest to one, 29-28. However, Iowa State responded with Bridget Carleton and Jadda Buckley three-pointers coupled with a Seanna Johnson layup that began the front-end of a 13-0 Cyclone run. WVU trimmed the ISU 14-point lead to 10, but the Cyclones maintained a 48-36 edge at the end of three.

The fourth quarter started off slowly for West Virginia, as the Mountaineers started 0-of-8 from the field and ISU used a 9-3 run to push its lead to 57-39 with 5:42 remaining. Iowa State held on to pick up the regular-season series sweep over WVU. Buckley led the Cyclones with 20 points in the win.

Teana Muldrow and Tynice Martin combined for 50 points, as West Virginia held on for a 77-73 win over TCU on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia (19-9, 7-9) led by 14 points at the end of three quarters, but TCU (12-15, 4-12) opened the fourth

West Virginia (19-9, 7-9) led by 14 points at the end of three quarters, but TCU (12-15, 4-12) opened the fourth quarter on an 11-1 run to trim the game to two points. Martin banked a trey on the next possession, followed by free throw makes from Muldrow and Katrina Pardee to push the Mountaineer lead back to nine. The relentless Horned Frogs fought back and trimmed the game to three, 76-73, with 26 seconds remaining after an AJ Alix three-point make. Again, Muldrow and Martin answered with three combined free throws to seal West Virginia's 14th home victory, tying for the third-most home wins in program history.

Muldrow had a banner evening, scoring a career-high 25 points and corralling 14 rebounds for her seventh doubledouble of the season. She connected on 9-of-10 from the charity stripe, while making 7-of-11 from the field. With a free throw make at the 5:10 mark in the second quarter, the junior from East Orange, New Jersey, became the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point milestone.

Martin netted her ninth 20-point performance of the year, scoring 25 points and grabbing eight rebounds. The Atlanta sophomore made 10 field goals and two triples. The Mountaineers shot 41.9 percent (26-of-62) from the

The Mountaineers shot 41.9 percent (26-of-62) from the field, while the Horned Frogs connected on 42.9 percent (27-of-63). WVU made 19-of-22 for an 86.4 free throw percentage. The rebound battle was handily won by the Mountaineers, as WVU edged TCU, 49-36. West Virginia dished out 21 assists, but committed 22 turnovers in the contest.



The West Virginia Úniversity women's basketball team fought back from an 11-point fourth quarter deficit, but fell short in a 67-63 loss at Oklahoma State on Saturday evening at the Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Mountaineers (19-10, 7-10) held a six-point lead in the first quarter, but Oklahoma State (16-12, 6-11) used an 8-0 run to open the second quarter and held a 33-27 halftime lead. WVU fought back to take a 44-42 lead with 1:19 left in the third, but OSU would answer with a three to regain the advantage and extended its advantage to seven after opening the fourth quarter on an 11-5 run.

The Cowgirls would push their lead to 11, but the Mountaineers fought back to cut the game to six, 60-54, with 2:23 left. 

WVU Rolls Past Kansas on Senior Night

Four Mountaineers reached double-figure scoring, as the West Virginia University women's basketball team closed out the regular season with a 73-54 win over Kansas on Senior Night at the WVU Coliseum.

A free throw early in the first quarter gave Kansas (8-21, 2-16) a lead for 12 seconds, but the Mountaineers would use a 15-3 run from there to take a double-figure lead for the remainder of the contest. WVU extended its lead to 29 in the third quarter, but KU outscored the Mountaineers, 16-11, in the final period.

Tynice Martin finished with a team-high 17 points, while grabbing six rebounds. Teana Muldrow became the first Mountaineer since Korinne Campbell in 2010 to record a double-double in three consecutive games after scoring 15 points and grabbing a game-high 11 rebounds. Junior Kristina King knocked down 6-of-7 from the field and finished with 13 points and five rebounds. Chania Ray eclipsed double-figures with 11 points, while grabbing five boards and distributing a game-best five assists.

Prior to Monday evening's game, the Mountaineers honored seniors Lanay Montgomery and Desiree Rhodes. Montgomery, a Pittsburgh native, finished with nine rebounds and seven points. Her nine rebounds moved her fourth all-time with 898 career rebounds. Rhodes, a native of Aurora, Illinois, made her first career start at WVU and completed the night with two rebounds and an assist.

Offensively, West Virginia shot 48.3 percent from the field (28-of-58) and made 70.0 percent (14-of-20) from the free throw line. WVU won the rebound battle, 44-33, and dished out 11 assists and blocked six shots. KU was limited to 29.5 percent (18-of-61) from the field and 18.8 percent (3-of-16) from three-point range. The Mountaineers opened up the contest with a 15-4

The Mountaineers opened up the contest with a 15-4 lead, which included an 11-point run over a stretch of three minutes. King added five consecutive points in a minute to push the West Virginia edge to 20-6 at the 1:37 mark. Muldrow's two layups to end the quarter gave WVU a 24-10 lead.

King added two more buckets to open the second quarter and West Virginia used an 11-2 run to take a 26 point lead. The Mountaineers held a 41-18 lead at the half, their largest in Big 12 play this season. Muldrow paced the team with 17 points and seven rebounds.

After remaining scoreless in the first half due to foul trouble, Montgomery responded with five of WVU's first 12 points. A six-point run stretched the Mountaineer lead to 27 after a three-pointer from Martin at the 5:55 mark. Kansas closed the half with 12 points in the final four minutes of the third quarter to trim the deficit to 24. In the fourth quarter, six points from KU's Jayde

In the fourth quarter, six points from KU's Jayde Christopher and Chayla Cheadle trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 22. KU would outscored WVU by five in the stanza. The Jayhawks' Jessica Washington led all scorers with 18 points.

Explosive Mountaineers Advance to Big 12 Semis The West Virginia University women's basketball used an explosive 48-point first half en route to an 82-58 win over No. 19-ranked Oklahoma on Saturday evening in the quarterfinal round of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championships held at the

Chesapeake Energy Arena. The sixth-seeded Mountaineers (21-10) sprinted out to a 12-point lead in the first four minutes. No. 3-seed Oklahoma (22-9) trimmed the lead to eight twice in the first quarter, but WVU responded each time with jumpers from Teana Muldrow and Tynice Martin. WVU would go on to score 48 points in the opening half, the most in a Big 12 Tournament game since Texas tallied 52 in 2008. West Virginia held as much as a 37-point lead late in the third quarter. OU outscored WVU, 25-12, in the final quarter, as the Mountaineers picked up their third win this season over an Associated Press Top 25 team.

Martin poured in a game-high 21 points, connecting on seven field goals which included four triples. Muldrow followed with 19 points and grabbed eight rebounds, dished out three assists, blocked three shots and collected two steals. The East Orange, New Jersey, native made 8-of-11 from the field for 72.3 percent shooting.

Katrina Pardee knocked down 5-of-8 (62.5 percent) from the field to finish with 13 points. Lanay Montgomery also reached double-figure scoring with 12 points and seven rebounds. Chania Ray distributed 10 assists and scored six points in 37 minutes.

Offensively, West Virginia shot 55.9 percent (33-of-59) from the field and 45.0 percent (9-of-20) from three-point range. WVU dished out 20 assists, collected 11 steals and blocked eight shots.


The Mountaineers opened up with a 12-0 lead in the first four minutes of the game. Montgomery and Pardee combined for all 12 points as WVU made five of their first eight buckets. WVU would score 26 points in the quarter and hold a 26-10 lead after shooting 61.1 percent (11-of-18) in the first quarter.

Martin and Montgomery continued the Mountaineers' offensive spark as Martin drained two triples and Montgomery made two buckets to extend WVU's lead to 36-13 with 7:20 remaining. The Mountaineers closed the second quarter with 12 more points to hold a 48-24 advantage.

West Virginia continued its shooting barrage, knocking down 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the field and extending its lead to as many as 37 late in the third quarter and finished the period with a 70-33 lead.

OU opened the fourth quarter with back-to-back buckets from Maddie Manning and Peyton Little to trim the game to 32. Manning would pace OU with 14 points. The Sooners finished with 25 points in the quarter, but the Mountaineers held on for their third Big 12 semifinal appearance.

WVU Topples Texas, Advances to Big 12 Title Game

Relentless effort and a 29-point performance from sophomore Tynice Martin propelled the sixth-seeded West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 62-59 upset victory over No. 2-seed Texas to advance to the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship final on Monday.

There were a total of nine lead changes and three ties in Sunday evening's semifinal contest at the Chesapeake Energy Arena. Texas (23-8) built an early 10-point lead in the first four minutes of the game, but the Mountaineers (22-10) charged back in the second quarter outscoring UT, 17-5, and taking a halftime 31-26 lead. An Audrey-Ann Caron-Goudreau jumper at the 5:21 mark of the third quarter gave the Longhorns a lead they would hold for majority of the period and the first four minutes of the fourth quarter.


Martin's jumper at the 4:45 mark gave West Virginia a 52-51 advantage and would prove to be the game winner. WVU's biggest lead of four points in the final four-plus minutes was short-lived as UT kept it a two-point contest and trimmed it to one on two occasions. Martin hit a pair of free throws with 14 seconds remaining to put the Mountaineers up four. However, Texas quickly responded as Big 12 Player of the Year Brooke McCarty banked a three-pointer to make it a 60-59 contest with 10 seconds left. WVU avoided a near turnover and Chania Ray converted the final two free throws to give WVU a 62-59 lead. McCarty again threw up a three-point attempt, which bounced away and into the hands of Teana Muldrow to end the contest.

The Mountaineers will play No. 2-ranked and Big 12 regular-season champion Baylor in a 9 p.m. ET/8 p.m. CT contest on Monday evening.

West Virginia makes its second Big 12 Championship title game appearance, with the other coming in 2014, and its fifth overall conference tournament title game appearance. WVU has now made four of its five title game appearances under coach Carey (2006, 2010, 2014 and 2017).

Martin registered her second 20-point performance with a WVU Big 12 Tournament record of 29 points. The All-Big 12 First Team performer made 10-of-21 from the field (47.6 percent) and 4-of-10 from three-point range (40 percent). Muldrow scored 10 points and grabbed eight rebounds after missing majority of the first half due to foul trouble. Katrina Pardee connected on 4-of-5 from the field and a perfect 3-of-3 beyond the arc for 13 points. Chania Ray also reached double-figures with 10 points. Lanay Montgomery was stout defensively with six rebounds and five blocks in 36 minutes.

Statistically, WVU shot just 35.6 percent (21-of-59) from the field and was outscored 26-12 inside the paint. The Mountaineers knocked down nine triples for 42.9 percent shooting and 11-of-12 (91.7 percent) from the charity stripe. The Mountaineers dished out 12 assists, blocked six shots and collected six steals.



Magical Mountaineers Claim Big 12 Title

The sixth-seeded West Virginia University women's basketball team overcame improbable odds in a three-day span en route to defeating top-seeded and No. 2 nationallyranked Baylor 77-66 to hoist the program's first ever Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship trophy Monday night at Chesapeake Energy Arena.

Monday's win marked the second conference tournament title in school history and the first since winning the 1989 Atlantic 10 Tournament. Sophomore guard Tynice Martin poured in 32 points en route to being name the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

West Virginia (23-10) sprinted out to a 22-14 lead after one quarter, but the No. 2 ranked Lady Bears (30-3) quickly trimmed the game to three with a Nina Davis jumper with 4:45 left in the second quarter. WVU then used a 10-2 run and pushed its lead to 13 before BU cut the game to nine, 39-30, at intermission. BU's Kristy Wallace made the layup with 8:53 in the third to trim the game to 41-34. Martin, a sophomore All-America candidate, banked a three-pointer on the next possession, setting up a 12-4 Mountaineer run to push the WVU lead to 15.

WVU led by 21 at the end of three, but Baylor proceeded to fight back and trim the game to seven with 2:19 remaining. Though tired, the determined Mountaineers made eight free throws down the stretch to clinch the program's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. West Virginia will make its 12th NCAA Tournament appearance and the 10th under 16th-year head coach Mike Carey.

Over the three-day weekend, WVU defeated No. 3-seed/ No. 19-ranked Oklahoma (82-58), No. 2-seed Texas/No. 12/14 Texas (62-59), and top-seeded/No. 2-ranked Baylor on Monday night. The win snapped Baylor's 20-game win streak in Big 12 Championship games, while WVU joined the 2004 Oklahoma team as the only six seeds to win the Big 12 Championship title.

Martin finished with a game-high and Big 12 Tournament title game record 32 points, which included 12-of-15 from the free throw line. Martin banked eight field goals and four triples and dished out four assists, as she was tabbed the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship's Most Outstanding Player. Martin's 32 points were the most in a championship final after surpassing Baylor's Brittney Griner's 31 points in 2011 and 2013.

Teana Muldrow added 15 points and nine rebounds, while blocking two shots. Muldrow also grabbed Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship All-Tournament accolades after averaging 14.7 points and 8.3 rebounds in the three victories.

Additionally, Katrina Pardee added 11 points and hit three triples in the victory. Lanay Montgomery grabbed seven rebounds and scored six points, while Chania Ray dished out game-highs with eight assists and three steals.

Fourth Quarter Run Propels WVU Past Elon

A 10-0 run in the fourth quarter propelled the No. 6-seed West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 75-62 win over No. 11-seed Elon on Friday afternoon in the NCAA Championship First Round at the XFINITY CENTER.

There were six lead changes and two ties in Friday's backand-forth battle. Elon (27-7), who won the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament last week, never trailed by more than six points in the third quarter. Elon's Lauren Brown's three-point shot at the 7:25 mark in the fourth quarter evened the game at 53-53. Senior Lanay Montgomery connected on a jumper to give WVU (24-10) the eventual goahead bucket. WVU sophomores Tynice Martin and Katrina Pardee helped extend the run as Martin made two free throws and Pardee banked back-to-back triples to give No. 22/21-ranked WVU the 10-point cushion with 5:19 remaining. Elon trimmed the game to seven, but West Virginia held on to advance to the NCAA Tournament Second Round for the 10th time in program history.

Martin recorded a game-high 26 points and became the 34th Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point plateau with her free throw make at the 1:03 mark in the fourth quarter. The sophomore from Atlanta is the third-quickest Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point club. She finished with seven field goals and made 9-of-10 from the free throw line.

Montgomery scored 13 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in the in the victory for her 20th career double-double. She connected on 6-of-9 from the field for 66.7 percent. Pardee made four treys, tying WVU's NCAA Tournament record for three-pointers, and finished with 14 points for her fourth consecutive double-figure scoring game. Junior Teana Muldrow grabbed 10 rebounds, scored six points and distributed seven assists. Chania Ray tallied seven points, four assists, four rebounds and three steals in 37 minutes.

Offensively, West Virginia shot 47.4 percent (27-of-57) from the field and 47.1 percent (8-of-17) from three-point range. The Mountaineers limited Elon to 39.3 percent shooting (24-of-61) from the field and 26.7 percent (4-of-15) from three-point range. The Mountaineers outrebounded the Phoenix, 38-28, and dished out 20 assists in the victory.

West Virginia opened the game on a slow start, making just 2-of-10 from the field as the Phoenix opened with an 8-5 lead in the first six minutes after back-to-back layups. Elon built its lead to five at the 2:35 mark, but WVU only trailed 13-10 at the end of the opening quarter.

After Brown tied the game at 53-53 in the fourth quarter, Montgomery's jumper gave WVU the go-ahead lead and sparked the Mountaineers' 10-point run. Burnett led Elon with 19 points and Brown followed with 17.
