QUICK HITTERS

- Teana Muldrow's double-double of 21 points and 10 rebounds led No. 19/23 West Virginia (5-0) to a, 79-47, victory over East Carolina on Wednesday at the Savannah Invitational. Newcomer Kristina King tallied season-highs with 16 points and eight rebounds. Tynice Martin (16) and Katrina Pardee (10) rounded out the double-digit scoring. Martin leads WVU with 21.4 ppg followed by Muldrow's 15.0 ppg.
- West Virginia is off to its best start since opening the 2010-11 season 13-0. Under Mike Carey, the Mountaineers have started off the season with five or more wins four times (5-0 in 2016-17, 16-0 in 2010-11, 9-0 in 2004-05 and 10-0 in 2002-03).
- With ECU shooting just 35.8 percent on Wednesday, the Mountaineers have held their last six opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field.
- WVU and Auburn (5-0) meet for the first time on the hardwood on Thursday in the Savannah Invitational Championship.

TIDBITS:

- West Virginia and Auburn have never met on the hardwood.
- The Mountaineers are 5-22 all-time against SEC competition with the most recent victory coming on Nov. 15, 2013, against Ole Miss (86-56) in Honolulu, Hawaii.

SCOUTING AU

- Auburn (5-0) has wins over Troy (61-52), NC A&T (68-36), ECU (61-52), Ball State (54-40) and Marist (52-51).
- Preseason All-SEC Second Team selection Brandy Montgomery leads the Tigers with 16.2 points and 3.2 rebounds.
- Katie Frerking paces Auburn with 9.0 rebounds and 19 assists.
- Janiah McKay is nearly in double-figure scoring with 9.2 points per game.
- Jessica Jones is second on the team with 6.2 rebounds per game and has six blocks.
- Auburn is second nationally with a 46.2 scoring defense, second in turnovers forced (30.4) and sixth with 16.4 steals per game.
- The Tigers shoot just 35.9 percent (110-of-306) from the field and average 59.2 points per game.
- Auburn, under fifth-year head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, was predicted to finish sixth in the SEC.

LAST TIME OUT

- WVU used three extensive runs in the first (10-2), second (16-2) and fourth quarters (12-1) to pick up a 79-47 win over East Carolina on Wednesday.
- Junior Teana Muldrow recorded her second career double-double with a season-high 21 points and 10 rebounds in the victory.
- Tynice Martin eclipsed double-digit scoring for a seventh consecutive game with her 16 points. Kristina King tallied season-highs with 16 points and eight rebounds. Katrina Pardee also added 10 points for WVU.
- The Pirates shot just 35.8 percent (19of-53) from the field, becoming the sixth consecutive Mountaineer opponent since March 20, 2016 to shoot less than 40 percent from the field.
- ECU was limited to four points in the fourth quarter, tying the fewest points for a WVU opponent in a quarter.

MARTIN NEARING HISTORY

- Tynice Martin has made 30 consecutive free throws, which is second in program history behind Talisha Hargis' 32 consecutive makes during the 1998 season.
- In one-plus season, Martin has made 81-of-94 attempts for 86.2 percent shooting from the charity stripe.

PHYSICAL FOR 40 DEFENSE

- West Virginia has limited its first five opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. Through five games, opponents are shooting just 27.6 percent (79-of-286) from the field.
- The Mountaineers held Charleston Southern to 17.7 percent shooting (11-of-62), Howard to 32.0 percent (16-of-50), Coppin State to 22.6 percent (14-of-62, NC A&T to 32.2 percent (19-of-59) and East Carolina to 35.8 percent (19-of-53).
- WVU has converted 91 opponent turnovers into 137 points this season. The Mountaineers have 55 steals (11.0 spg) on the season and reached double-digit steals in 4-of-5 games: Charleston Southern (11), Howard (15), Coppin St. (10) and ECU (11).
- The 11 field goals for Charleston Southern marked the 17th time in program history that WVU has held an opponent to 11 or fewer field goals in a game since 2004.
- In the win over Coppin State, WVU's 14 blocks were the 10th-most in program history and the highest since deflecting 14 against Temple on April 1, 2015.
- The most points allowed in a quarter this season was 24 against NC A&T on Nov. 22.
- ECU was limited to four points in the fourth quarter, tying a record-low for points scored in a quarter by a WVU opponents.

A BLAZING START

- West Virginia, 5-0, is off to its best start since the 2010-11 season, when the Mountaineers finished the nonconference slate undefeated
- Other best season-opening starts under Mike Carey include a 9-0 start in 2004-05 and a 10-0 start in 2002-03.

SAVANNAH INVITATIONAL

- WVU is participating in a regular-season tournament for the 18th consecutive year.
- The Mountaineers have finished unbeaten in 14 tournaments with the most recent occuring last season at the Florida Sunshine Classic in Winter Park, Florida.
- WVU picked up a pair of wins over James Madison and Indiana in the tournament.
- West Virginia makes only its second appearance in the Peach State after playing in the Georgia Southern Hampton Inn Classic
- The Mountaineers went 1-1 in the tournament, collecting an 80-69 win over Liberty and falling, 78-63, to Drexel.
- Atlanta native Tynice Martin returns to her home state after a decorated high school career at Southwest Atlanta Christian Academy and Southwest DeKalb. In addition to multiple All-State honors, Martin was tabbed the 2015 Class A Player of the Year by the Atlanta Journal Constitution.
- Martin scored a career-high 28 points to lead the Mountaineers in an 80-64 win over North Carolina A&T on Tuesday.
- Teana Muldrow scored 21 points and pulled down 10 rebounds in WVU's 79-47 win over East Carolina on Wednesday.
- WVU and Auburn meet for the first time on Thursday.

MARTIN ON A ROLL

- Sophomore Tynice Martin has been on fire since Feb. 13, 2016. The sophomore has reached double-figures in 13 of the last 15 contests, including seven consecutive.
- During that stretch, Martin is averaging 16.0 points per game (240 points in 15 games).
- Martin has made at least seven or more field goals in six consecutive games.
- This season, she is averaging 21.4 points per game, which is second in the Big 12.
- West Virginia is 4-0 when Martin scores 20 or more points in a game.
- She netted a career-high 28 points and matched a career-best nine field goals in the win over North Carolina A&T on Nov. 22. Martin added another 27 points against Howard on Nov. 15.
- Martin has made 30 consecutive free throws since March 2016, which is the secondlongest streak at WVU.
- For her career, Martin is shooting 86.2 percent (81-of-94) from the free throw line.
- The Atlanta native is just the third WVU sophomore to finish perfect from the line in double figures after she went 10-of-10 from the charity stripe against Howard (Nov. 15).

CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the sports communications staff.

NATION'S BEST

- It's still early, but West Virginia sits in the top 10 nationally in multiple statistical categories.
- Through games on Tuesday, Nov. 22, WVU is No. 1 in field goal percentage defense (27.6%), No. 5 in scoring margin (+34.8) and ninth in scoring defense (47.4 ppg).
- Chania Ray is 13 nationally and leads the Big 12 with 6.8 assists per game.
- Tynice Martin is one of 29 players nationally to have yet to miss a free throw.

STREAKS OF NOTE

- Lanay Montogmery has blocked at least one shot in 40 out of the last 42.
- West Virginia's Tynice Martin has reached double-figure scoring in 13 of her last 15 games, including the last seven contests.
- Martin has made a field goal in 15 consecutive games, while Teana Muldrow has connected on at least one bucket in the last 14 games.
- Martin has connected on 30 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016.
- West Virginia has held its last six opponents below 40 percent shooting: Ohio State (37.1%), Charleston Southern (17.7%), Howard (32.0%), Coppin State (22.6%), North Carolina A&T (32.2%) and East Carolina (35.8%).

WVU UP TWO SPOTS IN POLLS

- West Virginia climbed two spots in the Associated Press poll to No. 19 on Monday and moved up two to No. 23 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll on Tuesday.
- The Mountaineers were in both preseason polls for the fourth time. Other years include: 2014-15 (17 AP/17 Coaches), 2010-11 (11 AP/11 Coaches) and 2007-08 (18 AP/20 Coaches).
- WVU was tabbed to finish fourth in the Big 12 coaches preseason poll.
- Other Big 12 Top 25 teams include: Baylor (5/6), Oklahoma (13/12), Texas (14/14) and West Virginia (19/23).

ALMOST HEAVEN, WEST VIRGINIA

- West Virginia has won a school-record 27 consecutive nonconference games inside the WVU Coliseum dating back to Nov. 24, 2013.
- The Mountaineers last loss against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum came to Ohio State on Nov. 8, 2013, with WVU falling 70-61.
- The previous record of 19 lasted from Dec. 30, 2008 to Jan. 2, 2011.

Montgomery Achieves Historic Feat in Opener

Senior Lanay Montgomery's recorded a historic performance of 17 points and 18 rebounds to pace the No. 22/25 ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a season-opening, 88-38, victory over Charleston Southern on Saturday.

West Virginia (1-0) sprinted out to an 11-5 lead before Charleston Southern (0-1) cut the game to 11-9 midway through the first quarter. WVU utilized a 12-2 run and held CSU scoreless for a seven minute stretch that lasted late in the second quarter and the first three minutes of the third quarter. The Mountaineers are now 13-3 all-time in season openers under Mike Carey and 29-15 all-time.

Montgomery was one of three WVU players to score 17 points in the contest and did something a Mountaineer had not accomplished in 25 years. The senior from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, connected a perfect 7-of-7 from the field and added 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in 21 minutes. Montgomery's impressive 17 point and 18 rebound performance was the best for a WVU women's basketball player since Donna Abbott posted 22 points and 19 rebounds against Rutgers on Feb. 28, 1991. The double-double marked the 10th in Montgomery's career and she has now pulled down double-digit boards in back-to-back games.

Overall, West Virginia connected on 50.8 percent (32of-63) from the field and 39.1 percent from behind the arc (9-of-23). The Mountaineers held CSU to just 17.7 percent (11-of-62) shooting, as the Buccaneers became the 17th opponent in WVU program history to only make 11 or less field goals.

West Virginia outmanned Charleston Southern, 60-31, on the boards and outscored CSU 38-2 in the paint. WVU capitalized with 21 second chance points and 24 points off 16 Buccaneers turnovers.

Junior Teana Muldrow scored 17 points, collected seven rebounds, dished out three assists and snatched a pair of steals. Tynice Martin also eclipsed double figures with 17 points, making 7-of-13 from the field and 3-of-7 from the 3-point line.

Chania Ray distributed a career-high 11 assists - the most for a Mountaineer point guard since Linda Stepney recorded 12 against Saint Francis in Dec. 2014. Ray also registered four rebounds and two steals.

A couple of other Mountaineers reach career highs: Anja Martin tallied a personal-best eight points and Desiree Rhodes corralled a new career-high in 12 boards. Kristina King, the Big 12 Conference Preseason Newcomer of the Year, scored eight points in her WVU debut.

Martin's Career-High 27 Paces WVU Past Howard

Sophomore Tynice Martin netted a career-high 27 points to lead the No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 95-49 victory over Howard on Tuesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

Howard senior Te'Shya Heslip's layup cut the WVU lead to 16-11 with 1:41 remaining in the first quarter. However, West Virginia answered with a 21-0 run that lasted six minutes into the second quarter.

The Mountaineers (2-0) tallied 54 of their 95 points in the second half to cruise to their 26th consecutive victory against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum

Martin bested her previous career-high of 20 points and became the ninth WVU player to finish perfect from the free throw line with 10 or more points. The sophomore from Atlanta finished the evening 7-of-14 from the field, 3-of-9 from behind the arc and 10-of-10 from the free throw line. She grabbed four rebounds, collected three steals, dished out two assists and blocked two shots in 29 minutes.

In addition to Martin, four other Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures. Junior Chania Ray netted a career-best 17 points, going 7-of-14 from the field, while dishing out five assists and snatching a career-high five steals.

Alexis Brewer connected on a career-best three triples and finished 5-of-9 with 13 points. Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Kristina King tallied 12 points and corralled six rebounds. Teana Muldrow finished with 11 points, eight rebounds four assists and three steals. Lanay Montgomery blocked a shot for a 26th straight game and registered her third consecutive double-figure rebounding game with a game-high 13 boards. The senior scored seven points, just three shy of a doubledouble.

Overall, WVU shot 46.3 percent (31-of-67) from the field and 43.5 percent (10-of-23) from behind the arc. From the charity stripe, WVU knocked down 23-of-29 free throw attempts for 79.3 percent. Howard was limited to 32.0 percent shooting (16-of-15) from the field and 3-of-15 (20.0 percent) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 48-28 and outscored Howard 32-18 in the paint. WVU forced 27 Howard turnovers and converted those into 34 points.

WVU Clips Eagles to Complete Homestand

Three players reached double-figures in the West Virginia University women's basketball team's 69-39 victory over Coppin State on Saturday.

No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia (3-0) opened the game on a 10-0 run, but shot just 33.3 percent (11-of-33) in the opening half. For a third consecutive game, the Mountaineers bounced back and shot over 60 percent (8-of-13) in the third quarter and took command of the contest for the team's 27th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum against nonconference opponents. With the loss, Coppin State fell to 0-4 on the year.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led all scorers with 19 points. Martin connected on six field goals and connected on a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line. The Atlanta native has now made 19 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016, last season.

Katrina Pardee finished with a season-high 17 points and registered a career-high six rebounds in 29 minutes. Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points and pulled down seven rebounds for fourth consecutive double-figure scoring game. The junior made 5-of-8 from the field, snatched three steals and blocked two shots.

Lanay Montgomery had her best blocking performance since April 2015, leading the way with seven of WVU's 14 blocks on the evening. Montgomery also tallied seven points and grabbed seven rebounds. Chania Ray led WVU with eight assists, while grabbing seven rebounds and collecting three steals

Overall, West Virginia shot 40.0 percent (24-of-60) from the field and 21.7 percent (5-of-23) from behind the three-point line. Coppin State became the fourth consecutive WVU opponent to shoot below 40 percent, connecting on just 22.6 percent (14-of-62) from the field and 9.1 percent (1-of-11) from behind the arc.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-0 run. However, Coppin State answered with a 7-4 run to close Mountaineer lead to 14-7 at the end of one.

Despite shooting just 25 percent (4-of-16) in the first quarter, the Mountaineers answered in the second quarter by connecting on of 7-of-17 for 41.2 percent. WVU used a 13-0 run over a four minute span to push its lead to 24 points with four minutes remaining in the opening half. Pardee paced WVU with 10 points followed by eight from Martin.

Muldrow connected on nine of WVU's first 11 points to open the third quarter. West Virginia outscored CSU, 22-14, and held a 55-27 advantage after three periods. The Mountaineers added 14 more points in the fourth quarter to secure their ninth win over Coppin State.

Martin Nets Career-Best 28 in Return Home

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a 22-2 run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squash the North Carolina A&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak to 28 makes since March 18, 2016.

Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points.

Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. North Carolina A&T was the fifth straight Mountaineer opponent to shoot less than 40 percent, connecting on 19-of-59 for 32.2 percent. The Aggies made 6-of-13 from behind the arc for 46.2 percent.

The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.

The second half was much closer as the Aggies became the first WVU opponent to reach 20 points in a quarter this season. Montgomery and Muldrow were limited in the quarter with two fouls each. The Mountaineers led 52-28 at the break. WVU shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the field compared to NC A&T's 23.5 percent (8-of-34).

Mountaineers Roll Past East Carolina

Teana Muldrow's double-double paced the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 79-47 victory over East Carolina on Wednesday in the Savannah Invitational held at the Savannah Civic Center.

Three extended runs propelled the Mountaineers (5-0) to their fifth victory of the season. WVU used a 10-2 spurt in the first quarter, a 16-2 second quarter run and a 12-1 fourth quarter run to thwart the Pirates. East Carolina fell to 4-2 after being held to a season-low 47 points.

Muldrow, a junior from East Orange, New Jersey, recorded her second career double-double by scoring season-highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Wednesday marked a breakout performance for Kristina King. The junior made 6-0-8 from the field and added four free throws for 16 points. King finished second in rebounds with eight.

Tynice Martin etched her seventh consecutive double-figure scoring game with 16 points. She grabbed six rebounds and collected two steals in 34 minutes. Chania Ray dished out four assists to lead WVU. Lanay Montgomery was limited for a second straight game due to foul trouble, scoring four points and pulling down three boards.

West Virginia made 29-of-60 from the field for 48.3 percent shooting and connected on 5-of-16 from 3-point range for 31.3 percent. ECU was held to 35.8 percent shooting (19-of-53) from the field, becoming the fifth WVU opponent this season to shoot less than 40 percent.

In the rebounds column, WVU outmanned ECU, 41-32, and outscored the Pirates 34-22 inside the paint. For a fourth game this season, West Virginia recorded double-figure steals with 11.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2 run. ECU would use a 7-3 run to trim the Mountaineer advantage to 13-9. Teana Muldrow added back-to-back buckets to put WVU up 21-16 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, West Virginia utilized a 16-2 run and held the Pirates for nearly a five minute stretch. Martin's layup with 1:08 on the clock gave WVU a 39-25 edge to end the half.

East Carolina trimmed the game to 12 points on multiple occasions in the third period. King snapped a three-plus minute scoring drought with five consecutive points. She picked up a steal and used the fast break to score the layup and connect on the and-one. King then hit another layup to extend the Mountaineer lead to 21 points.

WVU used a 12-1 in the fourth quarter capped by a Muldrow three-pointer to push the edge to 30 points.
