QUICK HITTERS

- No. 19/23 West Virginia (4-0) opened the Savannah Invitational with an 80-64 win over North Carolina A&T on Tuesday.
- Sophomore Tynice Martin netted a career-high 28 points and made 9-of-9 from the free throw line. Teana Muldrow added 15 points and led the team with nine rebounds.
- West Virginia has held all of its opponents this season to shooting less than 40 percent from the field: Charleston Southern (17.7%), Howard (32.0%), Coppin State (22.65) and North Carolina A&T (32.2%).
- Opponents are shooting 25.8 percent (60-of-233) from the field.
- WVU and East Carolina (4-1) meet for the fifth time on Tuesday and for the first time since 2004. While the series is even at 2-2, WVU has won the last two meetings.
- West Virginia leads the Big 12 in field goal percentage defense (25.8%) and steals per game (11.0).

SCOUTING ECU

- East Carolina (4-1) has wins over Greensboro College (107-40), Detroit-Mercy (83-81, OT), UNC Wilmington (75-65) and Marist (70-68). The Pirates' lone blemish was a 61-52 setback to Auburn on Nov. 20.
- ECU is second nationally with a 43.6 (34-of-78) 3-point field goal percentage. The Pirates are 11th 20.5 assists per game and 16th with 14.3 steals per contest.
- Offensively, ECU is averaging 77.4 points and shooting 47.6 percent (149-of-313) from the field. Opponents are averaging 63.0 ppg and shooting 35.8 percent (106-of-296).
- Kristen Gaffney leads the Pirates with 20.6 ppg and is 12th nationally with 45 made field goals. Former WVU player Bre McDonald is averaging 14.2 points per contest and shooting 83.3 percent from three-point range. Antoninette Bannister is averaging 10.2 points per contest and leads ECU with 14 three-pointers.

LAST TIME OUT

- West Virginia picked up an 80-64 win over North Carolina A&T on Tuesday in the first day of the Savannah Invitational.
- Tynice Martin registered a career-high 28
 points against the Aggies in her return
 home state of Georgia. Martin matched
 a career-high nine field goals and made
 9-of-9 from the free throw line. The Atlanta
 native has made 28 consecutive free
 throws dating back to the Princeton game
 on March 18, 2016.
- Teana Muldrow eclipsed double-figures with 15 points and led WVU with nine rebounds. Chania Ray paced the Mountaineers with six assists.

WVU CLIMBS TWO SPOTS IN POLLS

- West Virginia climbed two spots in the Associated Press poll to No. 19 on Monday and moved up two to No. 23 in the USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll on Tuesday.
- The Mountaineers were in both preseason polls for the fourth time. Other years include: 2014-15 (17 AP/17 Coaches), 2010-11 (11 AP/11 Coaches) and 2007-08 (18 AP/20 Coaches).
- WVU was tabbed to finish fourth in the Big 12 coaches preseason poll.
- Other Big 12 Top 25 teams include: Baylor (5/6), Oklahoma (13/12), Texas (14/14) and West Virginia (19/23).

PHYSICAL FOR 40 DEFENSE

- West Virginia has limited its first three opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. Through four games, opponents are shooting just 25.8 percent (60-of-233) from the field.
- The Mountaineers held Charleston Southern to 17.7 percent shooting (11-of-62), Howard to 32.0 percent (16-of-50), Coppin State to 22.6 percent (14-of-62) and North Carolina A&T to 32.2 percent (19-of-59).
- WVU has converted 70 opponent turnovers to 109 points this season. The Mountaineers have 44 steals (11.0 spg) on the season and reached double-digit steals against Charleston Southern (11), Howard (15) and Coppin State (10).
- The 11 field goals for Charleston Southern marked the 17th time in program history that WVU has held an opponent to 11 or fewer field goals in a game since 2004.
- In the win over Coppin State, WVU's 14 blocks were the 10th-most in program history and the highest since deflecting 14 against Temple on April 1, 2015.
- The most points allowed in a quarter this season was 24 against NC A&T on Nov. 22.

SAVANNAH INVITATIONAL

- WVU is participating in a regular-season tournament for the 18th consecutive year.
- The Mountaineers have finished unbeaten in 14 tournaments with the most recent occuring last season at the Florida Sunshine Classic in Winter Park, Florida.
- WVU picked up a pair of wins over James Madison and Indiana in the tournament.
- West Virginia makes only its second appearance in the Peach State after playing in the Georgia Southern Hampton Inn Classic in 1995.
- The Mountaineers went 1-1 in the tournament, collecting an 80-69 win over Liberty and falling, 78-63, to Drexel.
- Atlanta native Tynice Martin returns to her home state after a decorated high school career at Southwest Atlanta Christian Academy and Southwest DeKalb. In addition to multiple All-State honors, Martin was tabbed the 2015 Class A Player of the Year by the Atlanta Journal Constitution.
- Martins scored a career-high 28 points to lead the Mountaineers in an 80-64 win over North Carolina A&T on Tuesday.
- WVU and East Carolina meet for the fifth time on Wednesday. The series is even at 2-2. WVU won the last contest 76-54 at Minges Coliseum in Greenville.
- WVU and Auburn have never met on the hardwood.

MARTIN ON A ROLL

- Sophomore Tynice Martin has been on fire since Feb. 13, 2016. The sophomore has reached double-figures in 12 of the last 14 contests, including six consecutive.
- During that stretch, Martin is averaging 16.0 points per game (224 points in 14 games).
- Martin has made at least six or more field goals in six consecutive games.
- This season, she is averaging 22.8 points per game, which is second in the Big 12.
- West Virginia is 4-0 when Martin scores 20 or more points in a game.
- She netted a career-high 28 points and matched a career-best nine field goals in the win over North Carolina A&T on Nov. 22. Martin added another 27 points against Howard on Nov. 15.
- Martin has made 28 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton NCAA Tournament game on March 18, 2016.
- For her career, Martin is shooting 85.9 percent (79-of-92) from the free throw line.
- The Atlanta native is just the third WVU sophomore to finish perfect from the line in double figures after she went 10-of-10 from the charity stripe against Howard (Nov. 15).

CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the sports communications staff.

STREAKS OF NOTE

- Lanay Montogmery has blocked at least one shot in 28 consecutive games and 40 out of the last 40.
- West Virginia's Tynice Martin has reached double-figure scoring in 12 of her last 14 games, including the last six contests.
- Martin has made a field goal in 14 consecutive games, while Teana Muldrow has connected on at least one bucket in the last 13 games.
- Martin has connected on 28 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016, in Columbus, Ohio.
- West Virginia has held its last five opponents below 40 percent shooting: Ohio State (37.1%), Charleston Southern (17.7%), Howard (32.0%), Coppin State (22.6%) and North Carolina A&T (32.2%).

ALMOST HEAVEN, WEST VIRGINIA

- West Virginia has won a school-record 27 consecutive nonconference games inside the WVU Coliseum dating back to Nov. 24, 2013.
- The Mountaineers last loss against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum came to Ohio State on Nov. 8, 2013, with WVU falling 70-61.
- The previous record of 19 lasted from Dec. 30, 2008 to Jan. 2, 2011.
- West Virginia is 99-7 (.934) at home against nonconference opponents since 2002.
- WVU has registered nine undefeated seasons at home against nonconference competition in 15 years under Mike Carey.

CAREY GETS WIN NO. 325 AT WVU

- Coach Mike Carey is in his 16th season at the helm of the Mountaineer women's basketball program.
- Carey collected his 325 win at West Virginia with a 69-39 victory over Coppin State.
- He produced 288 wins at Salem and has 326 victories at West Virginia.
- His .656 winning percentage in 16 seasons at WVU is a program-best.
- Mike Carey (614) recorded his 600th career win at the collegiate level with WVU's 72-35 victory over Kansas on Jan. 16, 2016.
- With a win over Morehead State on Dec. 2, 2015, Carey surpassed Kittie Blakemore as WVU's all-time wins leader.
- Carey will coach his 500th career game at West Virginia on Nov. 27 against High Point.

Montgomery Achieves Historic Feat in Opener

Senior Lanay Montgomery's recorded a historic performance of 17 points and 18 rebounds to pace the No. 22/25 ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a season-opening, 88-38, victory over Charleston Southern on Saturday.

West Virginia (1-0) sprinted out to an 11-5 lead before Charleston Southern (0-1) cut the game to 11-9 midway through the first quarter. WVU utilized a 12-2 run and held CSU scoreless for a seven minute stretch that lasted late in the second quarter and the first three minutes of the third quarter. The Mountaineers are now 13-3 all-time in season openers under Mike Carey and 29-15 all-time.

Montgomery was one of three WVU players to score 17 points in the contest and did something a Mountaineer had not accomplished in 25 years. The senior from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, connected a perfect 7-of-7 from the field and added 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in 21 minutes. Montgomery's impressive 17 point and 18 rebound performance was the best for a WVU women's basketball player since Donna Abbott posted 22 points and 19 rebounds against Rutgers on Feb. 28, 1991. The double-double marked the 10th in Montgomery's career and she has now pulled down double-digit boards in back-to-back games.

Overall, West Virginia connected on 50.8 percent (32of-63) from the field and 39.1 percent from behind the arc (9-of-23). The Mountaineers held CSU to just 17.7 percent (11-of-62) shooting, as the Buccaneers became the 17th opponent in WVU program history to only make 11 or less field goals.

West Virginia outmanned Charleston Southern, 60-31, on the boards and outscored CSU 38-2 in the paint. WVU capitalized with 21 second chance points and 24 points off 16 Buccaneers turnovers.

Junior Teana Muldrow scored 17 points, collected seven rebounds, dished out three assists and snatched a pair of steals. Tynice Martin also eclipsed double figures with 17 points, making 7-of-13 from the field and 3-of-7 from the 3-point line.

Chania Ray distributed a career-high 11 assists - the most for a Mountaineer point guard since Linda Stepney recorded 12 against Saint Francis in Dec. 2014. Ray also registered four rebounds and two steals.

A couple of other Mountaineers reach career highs: Anja Martin tallied a personal-best eight points and Desiree Rhodes corralled a new career-high in 12 boards. Kristina King, the Big 12 Conference Preseason Newcomer of the Year, scored eight points in her WVU debut.

Martin's Career-High 27 Paces WVU Past Howard

Sophomore Tynice Martin netted a career-high 27 points to lead the No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 95-49 victory over Howard on Tuesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

Howard senior Te'Shya Heslip's layup cut the WVU lead to 16-11 with 1:41 remaining in the first quarter. However, West Virginia answered with a 21-0 run that lasted six minutes into the second quarter.

The Mountaineers (2-0) tallied 54 of their 95 points in the second half to cruise to their 26th consecutive victory against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum.

Martin bested her previous career-high of 20 points and became the ninth WVU player to finish perfect from the free throw line with 10 or more points. The sophomore from Atlanta finished the evening 7-of-14 from the field, 3-of-9 from behind the arc and 10-of-10 from the free throw line. She grabbed four rebounds, collected three steals, dished out two assists and blocked two shots in 29 minutes.

In addition to Martin, four other Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures. Junior Chania Ray netted a career-best 17 points, going 7-of-14 from the field, while dishing out five assists and snatching a career-high five steals.

Alexis Brewer connected on a career-best three triples and finished 5-of-9 with 13 points. Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Kristina King tallied 12 points and corralled six rebounds. Teana Muldrow finished with 11 points, eight rebounds four assists and three steals. Lanay Montgomery blocked a shot for a 26th straight game and registered her third consecutive double-figure rebounding game with a game-high 13 boards. The senior scored seven points, just three shy of a doubledouble.

Overall, WVU shot 46.3 percent (31-of-67) from the field and 43.5 percent (10-of-23) from behind the arc. From the charity stripe, WVU knocked down 23-of-29 free throw attempts for 79.3 percent. Howard was limited to 32.0 percent shooting (16-of-15) from the field and 3-of-15 (20.0 percent) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 48-28 and outscored Howard 32-18 in the paint. WVU forced 27 Howard turnovers and converted those into 34 points. WVU Clips Eagles to Complete Homestand

Three players reached double-figures in the West Virginia University women's basketball team's 69-39 victory over Coppin State on Saturday.

No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia (3-0) opened the game on a 10-0 run, but shot just 33.3 percent (11-of-33) in the opening half. For a third consecutive game, the Mountaineers bounced back and shot over 60 percent (8-of-13) in the third quarter and took command of the contest for the team's 27th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum against nonconference opponents. With the loss, Coppin State fell to 0-4 on the year.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led all scorers with 19 points. Martin connected on six field goals and connected on a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line. The Atlanta native has now made 19 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016, last season.

Katrina Pardee finished with a season-high 17 points and registered a career-high six rebounds in 29 minutes. Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points and pulled down seven rebounds for fourth consecutive double-figure scoring game. The junior made 5-of-8 from the field, snatched three steals and blocked two shots.

Lanay Montgomery had her best blocking performance since April 2015, leading the way with seven of WVU's 14 blocks on the evening. Montgomery also tallied seven points and grabbed seven rebounds. Chania Ray led WVU with eight assists, while grabbing seven rebounds and collecting three steals.

Overall, West Virginia shot 40.0 percent (24-of-60) from the field and 21.7 percent (5-of-23) from behind the three-point line. Coppin State became the fourth consecutive WVU opponent to shoot below 40 percent, connecting on just 22.6 percent (14-of-62) from the field and 9.1 percent (1-of-11) from behind the arc.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-0 run. However, Coppin State answered with a 7-4 run to close Mountaineer lead to 14-7 at the end of one.

Despite shooting just 25 percent (4-of-16) in the first guarter, the Mountaineers answered in the second quarter by connecting on of 7-of-17 for 41.2 percent. WVU used a 13-0 run over a four minute span to push its lead to 24 points with four minutes remaining in the opening half. Pardee paced WVU with 10 points followed by eight from Martin.

Muldrow connected on nine of WVU's first 11 points to open the third quarter. West Virginia outscored CSU, 22-14, and held a 55-27 advantage after three periods. The Mountaineers added 14 more points in the fourth quarter to secure their ninth win over Coppin State.

Martin Nets Career-Best 28 in Return Home

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a 22-2 run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squash the North Carolina A&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak

to 28 makes since March 18, 2016. Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points. Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. North Carolina A&T was the fifth straight Mountaineer opponent to shoot less than 40 percent, connecting on 19-of-59 for 32.2 percent. The Aggies made 6-of-13 from behind the arc for 46.2 percent. The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held

a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.

The second half was much closer as the Aggies became the first WVU opponent to reach 20 points in a quarter this season. Montgomery and Muldrow were limited in the quarter with two fouls each. The Mountaineers led 52-28 at the break. WVU shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the field compared to NC A&T's 23.5 percent (8-of-34).

It was a continuation of the second half for North Carolina A&T, as the Aggies jumped out on a 14-3 run to trim the game to 55-42 with 6:30 remaining. Dana Brown's jumper with 49.5 seconds left in the quarter cut the Mountaineer advantage to 65-52.

A 9-1 fourth quarter start extended the Mountaineer lead back to 21 points with 6:44 remaining. Montgomery and Ray made back-to-back layups followed by a Martin jumper. The exclamation point to the run was a Muldrow slicing layup that drew the and-one opportunity which she connected on to put WVU up 74-53.


