## QUICK HITTERS

- West Virginia (19-9, 7-9) and Oklahoma State (15-12, 5-11) meet for the second time in two weeks. The Mountaineers knocked down a school-record 17 three-pointers in the win over the Cowgirls on Feb. 15. The Mountaineers own a 7-4 edge in the all-time series and a 3-2 mark in Stillwater. WVU is seeking its first win at OSU since knocking off the No. 21 Cowgirls, 61-49, on Jan. 17, 2015.
- Tynice Martin and Teana Muldrow combined for 50 of West Virginia's 77 points in a 7773 win over TCU on Wednesday. Martin tallied 25 points and grabbed eight rebounds.
- Muldrow scored a career-high 25 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds, while becoming the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point milestone.
- Martin is second in the Big 12 with 17.8 points per game, while Lanay Montgomery continues to lead the conference with a 68.7 field goal percentage. Chania Ray, who dished out eight assists against TCU, leads the league with 6.0 assists per game.

## SCOUTING OSU

- Oklahoma State (15-12, 5-11) has won two of three since losing five consecutive games and most recently picked up a 75-62 win over Texas Tech on Wednesday.
- The Cowgirls are averaging 67.0 points per game, while giving up 64.7 ppg to opponents. OSU is shooting 41.6 percent (655-of-175) from the field and limiting opponents to 38.5 (640-of-1661) percent.
- Three Cowgirls are averaging doublefigures with Kaylee Jensen leading the way with 18.6 points. Mandy Coleman and Karlie Wheeler follow with 12.8 points and 12.0 points, respectively.
- Jensen leads the Big 12 in points per game and with 10.7 rebounds per game. She is ninth nationally with 19 double-doubles and is 19th in the NCAA with 7.0 defensive rebounds per contest.
- Katelyn Loecker leads the Cowgirls with 81
assists, while averaging 3.9 points per game.

## LAST TIME OUT

- Tynice Martin and Teana Muldrow combined for 50 of West Virginia's 77 points, as the Mountaineers held on for a 77-73 win over TCU on Wednesday.
- Martin scored 25 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Muldrow netted a careerhigh 25 points and grabbed 14 boards in the win. Muldrow became the 33rd Mountaineer in program history to reach the 1,000 -point milestone with a made free throw at the 5:10 mark of the second quarter.
- Wednesday's victory marked the 14 th home win for West Virginia this season, which is tied for the third-most home wins in program history.


## FEBRUARY FACTS

- West Virginia is 69-50 (.580) in the month of February under Mike Carey.
- Under Carey, when West Virginia wins five or more games in the month of February, the Mountaineers have reached the NCAA Tournament (seven times). Only twice has WVU reached the tournament winning five or fewer games (3 in 2011 and 4 in 2004).
- WVU has won five or more games in February in four of the last five seasons: 6 in 2016, 7 in 2014, 5 in 2013 and 6 in 2012.
- WVU has three wins this month with wins over Oklahoma State, K-State and TCU.


## AIMING FOR 20 WINS

- West Virginia is one victory away from securing its 11 th 20 -win season under the direction of 16-year coach Mike Carey.
- Overall, the program has produced 14 20win seasons with 10 of those coming in 15 seasons under Mike Carey.
- A WVU victory would set a school-record fourth consecutive year of reaching 20 or more wins.


## MULDROW REACHES 1,000 POINTS

- Teana Muldrow became just the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point milestone with a free throw make at the 5:10 mark of the second quarter vs. TCU (Feb. 22).
- In the victory over TCU, the junior from East Orange, New Jersey, scored a career-best 25 points and grabbed 14 rebounds for her seventh double-double of the season.
- Muldrow is fourth in the Big 12 with 8.4 rebounds per game and is eighth with 14.6 points per game.
- The junior is second in the Big 12 with 5.9 defensive rebounds per game.
- Muldrow is 12 th all-time at WVU with 113 career made treys, 13th with 79 blocks and 15th with 588 rebounds.
- Muldrow is the active team leader with 51 games scored in double-figures.
- She earned all-tournament honors earlier this season at the Savannah Invitational.

## SINGLE-SEASON NOTABLES

- Tynice Martin (497) is seventh all-time on WVU's sophomore scoring list and is six away from passing Donna Abbott for sixth. Martin is three points away from becoming the 16th Mountaineer to score 500 or more points in a season.
- Martin's 57 3-pointers are sixth for a Mountaineer sophomore.
- Lanay Montgomery's 80 blocked shots are second all-time by a West Virginia senior and sixth overall.
- If the season concluded today, Montgomery's 68.7 field goal percentage would break her own WVU single-season record (58.9\%).
- Chania Ray's 167 assists are fourth all-time by a Mountaineer junior and 11th all-time.
- Ray’s 82.9 free throw percentage (58-of-70) is currently the second-best ever by a WVU junior and 11th all-time.
- WVU's 191 three-point makes this season are seventh all-time, while the team's 164 blocks are eighth all-time.


## NEARING SEASON'S END

- As of Friday, WVU holds a team RPI of 57 with four top 100 RPI victories
- WVU holds top 50 RPI victories over No. 15 Oklahoma, No. 17 Kansas State and No. 43 Auburn.
- If the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship was played today, West Virginia would be the No. 6 -seed and face No. 3-seed Oklahoma.


## MONTGOMERY MAGIC

- $\quad$ Senior center Lanay Montgomery leads the Big 12 with a 68.7 field goal percentage (136 of-198) through 28 games.
- Montgomery has shot 41 percent or better in 24 of 28 games this season.
- WVU is 11-2 this season when Montgomery makes six or more field goals in a contest.
- Montgomery's 59.9 career field goal percentage is on pace to set a WVU career record.
- Montgomery's 10 double-doubles this season are a career-best and the most since Liz Repella's 12 in 2009.
- Montgomery is the first Mountaineer since Maria Tchobanova in 1999 to reach 19 or more career double-doubles. Her 19 doubledoubles are seventh all-time at WVU.
- Montgomery's 311 career blocks are second all-time at WVU and fourth all-time in the Big 12 Conference


## KEY NUMBERS TO A WIN

- WVU is 19-1 when ahead at halftime.
- WVU is $18-0$ when shooting higher than its opponent and 7-0 when shooting better than 50 percent from the field.
- West Virginia is $19-1$ when it wins the rebound battle.

## CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Gold Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

## GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level ( 22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Gold Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLE MANIA

- The Mountaineers have surpassed their double-double total of nine from last season with 20 in 2016-17.
- This year, five different players have recorded double-doubles including a career-best 10 from senior center Lanay Montgomery.
- Montgomery and Teana Muldrow have combined for 17 double-doubles this season.
- Muldrow recorded double-doubles in back-to-back games against Oklahoma (22p/13r) and Oklahoma State (14p/13r).


## RAY GRASPING THE POINT

- Junior guard Chania Ray has excelled at the point guard position this season. She leads the Big 12 Conference and ranks 22nd nationally with 6.0 assists per game.
- Ray's 167 assists are fourth-most by a Mountaineer junior and her 223 handouts are 21st all-time in Mountaineer history.
- Ray has distributed multiple assists in 30 consecutive games since March 2016.
- $\quad$ She has eclipsed the double-digit assists plateau three times this with 11 vs. Charleston Southern (Nov. 12), 10 against Oklahoma (Jan. 8) and 10 vs. K-State (Feb. 15).
- Ray inked her first double-double with 14 ponits and 10 assists in the win over No. 24 Kansas State (Feb. 15).
- She was named the Big 12 Conference Co-Player of the Week on Jan. 2, along with Oklahoma's Peyton Little.


## ALMOST HEAVEN, WEST VIRGINIA

- With an 83-73 victory over No. 20 Oklahoma on Jan. 8, WVU has reached 10+ home wins in 12 of 16 seasons under Mike Carey.
- WVU has won 13 or more home games in each of the last four seasons.
- WVU collected its14th home victory, which is tied for the third-most wins at home in school history.

- WVU has won a school-record 32 consecutive nonconference games inside the Coliseum dating back to Nov. 24, 2013.
- The Mountaineers' last loss against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum came to Ohio State on Nov. 8, 2013, with WVU falling 70-61
- The previous record of 19 lasted from Dec. 30, 2008 to Jan. 2, 2011.
- West Virginia is 105-7 (.938) at home against nonconference opponents since 2002.
- WVU is 196-49 (.800) all-time at home under Mike Carey, including 17-0 in 2010.
- With a 9-0 mark, WVU recorded its 10th undefeated season at home against nonconference competition in 16 years under Mike Carey.
- WVU has won 80 percent or more of its home games in seven of the last eight years.

## LANAY 8 REBOUNDS FROM FOURTH

- Lanay Montgomery has 883 total rebounds, which rank fifth all-time at WVU. She needs eight more to pass Mary Hennen (890) for fourth.
- Additionally, Montgomery has corralled 307 career offensive rebounds, which are fourth.
- With her five blocks against Mount St. Mary's on Dec. 21, Montgomery moved past Asya Bussie (270) for No. 2 on WVU's alltime career blocks list.
- Montgomery's 311 blocks are fourth all-time in the Big 12. She is fourth in the NCAA among active career leaders.
- Montgomery's 10 double-doubles this season are a career-best and 14th all-time.
- Her 19 career double-doubles are seventh all-time.
- Montgomery is the first Mountaineer since Maria Tchobanova in 1999 to record 19 or more double-doubles in a career.
- If the trend continues, Montgomery can become the Mountaineers' best shooter in program history surpassing Olayinka Sanni ( $55.7 \%$ ). Her career field goal percentage of 59.9\% currently ranks first at WVU.
- Montgomery's 17/18 performance against Charleston Southern is the best for a Mountaineer since Donna Abbott inked 22 points and grabbed 19 rebounds against Rutgers Feb. 1991.
- Montgomery tallied a career-high 23 points, grabbed 18 rebounds and blocked six shots against Morehead State on Nov. 30.
- $\quad$ She joined Georgeann Wells (1984) as the only Mountaineers to score 20+, rebound 18+ and block 5+ in a game.
- On Dec. 7, Montgomery garnered NCAA Weekly Starting Five honors for her performance against Morehead State.
- Montgomery was named one of 30 women's basketball candidates announced for the 2017 Senior CLASS Award earlier in January.

## CAREY COACHES 900TH GAME

- On Nov. 27 against High Point, program all-time wins leader Mike Carey (341-180) coached his 500th game at West Virginia.
- Carey coached his 900th collegiate game on Jan. 11 at Texas Tech.
- Carey is in his 16th season at the helm of the WVU women's basketball program.
- He produced 288 wins at Salem and has 341 victories at West Virginia.
- His .655 winning percentage in 16 seasons at WVU is a program-best.
- Mike Carey (629) recorded his 600th career win at the collegiate level with WVU's 72-35 victory over Kansas on Jan. 16, 2016.
- With a win over Morehead State on Dec. 2, 2015, Carey surpassed Kittie Blakemore as WVU's all-time wins leader.


## MARTIN ON A ROLL

- $\quad$ Sophomore Tynice Martin has been on fire since Feb. 13, 2016. The sophomore has reached double figures in 34 of the last 38 contests. She reached double-digits in 23 consecutive games from March 18, 2016, to Jan. 25, 2017.
- $\quad$ This season, she is averaging 17.8 points per game, which is second in the Big 12.
- West Virginia is $10-1$ when Martin scores 20 or more points in a game.
- $\quad$ She made a career-high 35 points at Oklahoma (Feb. 7), ranking as the secondbest game performance by a WVU sophomore.
- $\quad$ She followed up with 30 points vs. Oklahoma State (Feb. 11), becoming the first Mountaineer since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 30+ points in back-to-back games.
- Martin was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week on Feb. 13 after averaging 32.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game last week.
- In the win over No. 20 Oklahoma, Martin inked her first double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds.
- Martin made 30 consecutive free throws from March 18, 2016 to Nov. 24, 2016 - the second longest streak in program history.

Montgomery Achieves Historic Feat in Opener
Senior Lanay Montgomery's recorded a historic performance of 17 points and 18 rebounds to pace the No. 22/25 ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a season-opening, 88-38, victory over Charleston Southern on Saturday.

West Virginia (1-0) sprinted out to an 11-5 lead before Charleston Southern (0-1) cut the game to 11-9 midway through the first quarter. WVU utilized a 12-2 run and held CSU scoreless for a seven minute stretch that lasted late in the second quarter and the first three minutes of the third quarter. The Mountaineers are now 13-3 all-time in season openers under Mike Carey and 29-15 all-time.

Montgomery was one of three WVU players to score 17 points in the contest and did something a Mountaineer had not accomplished in 25 years. The senior from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, connected a perfect 7 -of-7 from the field and added 3-of-4 from the charity stripe in 21 minutes. Montgomery's impressive 17 point and 18 rebound performance was the best for a WVU women's basketball player since Donna Abbott posted 22 points and 19 rebounds against Rutgers on Feb. 28, 1991. The double-double marked the 10th in Montgomery's career and she has now pulled down double-digit boards in back-to-back games.

Overall, West Virginia connected on 50.8 percent (32-of-63) from the field and 39.1 percent from behind the arc (9-of-23). The Mountaineers held CSU to just 17.7 percent (11-of-62) shooting, as the Buccaneers became the 17th opponent in WVU program history to only make 11 or less field goals.

West Virginia outmanned Charleston Southern, 60-31, on the boards and outscored CSU 38-2 in the paint. WVU capitalized with 21 second chance points and 24 points off 16 Buccaneers turnovers.

Junior Teana Muldrow scored 17 points, collected seven rebounds, dished out three assists and snatched a pair of steals. Tynice Martin also eclipsed double figures with 17 points, making 7 -of- 13 from the field and 3 -of- 7 from the 3-point line.

A couple of other Mountaineers reach career highs: Anja Martin tallied a personal-best eight points and Desiree Rhodes corralled a new career-high in 12 boards. Kristina King, the Big 12 Conference Preseason Newcomer of the Year, scored eight points in her WVU debut.

## Martin's Career-High 27 Paces WVU Past Howard

Sophomore Tynice Martin netted a career-high 27 points to lead the No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 95-49 victory over Howard on Tuesday evening at the WVU Coliseum. Howard senior Te'Shya Heslip's layup cut the WVU lead to 16-11 with 1:41 remaining in the first quarter. However, West Virginia answered with a 21-0 run that lasted six minutes into the second quarter.

The Mountaineers (2-0) tallied 54 of their 95 points in the second half to cruise to their 26th consecutive victory against a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum.

Martin bested her previous career-high of 20 points and became the ninth WVU player to finish perfect from the free throw line with 10 or more points. The sophomore from Atlanta finished the evening 7-of-14 from the field, 3 -of-9 from behind the arc and 10-of-10 from the free throw line. She grabbed four rebounds, collected three steals, dished out two assists and blocked two shots in 29 minutes.

In addition to Martin, four other Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures. Junior Chania Ray netted a career-best 17 points, going 7 -of-14 from the field, while dishing out five assists and snatching a career-high five steals.

Alexis Brewer connected on a career-best three triples and finished 5-of-9 with 13 points. Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Kristina King tallied 12 points and corralled six rebounds. Teana Muldrow finished with 11 points, eight rebounds four assists and three steals. Lanay Montgomery blocked a shot for a 26th straight game and registered her third consecutive double-figure rebounding game with a game-high 13 boards. The senior scored seven points, just three shy of a doubledouble.

Overall, WVU shot 46.3 percent (31-of-67) from the field and 43.5 percent ( 10 -of-23) from behind the arc. From the charity stripe, WVU knocked down 23-of29 free throw attempts for 79.3 percent. Howard was limited to 32.0 percent shooting (16-of-15) from the field and 3-of-15 (20.0 percent) from behind the arc. WVU Clips Eagles to Complete Homestand
Three players reached double-figures in the West Virginia University women's basketball team's 69-39 victory over Coppin State on Saturday.

No. 21/25-ranked West Virginia (3-0) opened the game on a 10-0 run, but shot just 33.3 percent (11-of-33) in the opening half. For a third consecutive game, the Mountaineers bounced back and shot over 60 percent (8-of-13) in the third quarter and took command of the contest for the team's 27th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum against nonconference opponents. With the loss, Coppin State fell to 0-4 on the year.

Sophomore Tynice Martin led all scorers with 19 points. Martin connected on six field goals and connected on a perfect 6 -of- 6 from the free throw line. The Atlanta native has now made 19 consecutive free throws dating back to the Princeton game on March 18, 2016, last season.

Katrina Pardee finished with a season-high 17 points and registered a career-high six rebounds in 29 minutes. Teana Muldrow tallied 11 points and pulled down seven rebounds for fourth consecutive double-figure scoring game. The junior made 5-of-8 from the field, snatched three steals and blocked two shots.

Lanay Montgomery had her best blocking performance since April 2015, leading the way with seven of WVU's 14 blocks on the evening. Montgomery also tallied seven points and grabbed seven rebounds. Chania Ray led WVU with eight assists, while grabbing seven rebounds and collecting three steals.
Overall, West Virginia shot 40.0 percent (24-of-60) from the field and 21.7 percent ( 5 -of- 23 ) from behind the three-point line. Coppin State became the fourth consecutive WVU opponent to shoot below 40 percent, connecting on just 22.6 percent (14-of-62) from the field and 9.1 percent (1-of-11) from behind the arc.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-0 run. However, Coppin State answered with a 7-4 run to close Mountaineer lead to 14-7 at the end of one.

Despite shooting just 25 percent (4-of-16) in the first quarter, the Mountaineers answered in the second quarter by connecting on of 7 -of-17 for 41.2 percent. WVU used a 13-0 run over a four minute span to push its lead to 24 points with four minutes remaining in the opening half. Pardee paced WVU with 10 points followed by eight from Martin.

## Martin Nets Career-Best 28 in Return Home

Atlanta native Tynice Martin excelled in her return home to Georgia, scoring a career-high 28 points in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's, 80-64, win over North Carolina A\&T on day one of the Savannah Invitational.

West Virginia (4-0) came out on fire with a $22-2$ run in the first quarter. The Aggies (1-3) outscored WVU, 24-13, in the third quarter to trim the Mountaineer lead to 13. However, a 9-1 West Virginia run in the fourth quarter helped the Mountaineers squash the North Carolina A\&T comeback attempt.

Martin made 9-of-15 from the field and finished with a career-best 28 points, while dishing out three assists and collecting two steals. She connected on 9-of-9 from the charity stripe, pushing her consecutive free throw streak to 28 makes since March 18, 2016.

Teana Muldrow added 15 points and corralled a season-high nine rebounds. Chania Ray added nine points and dished out six assists in the victory. Katrina Pardee and Kristina King each added eight points. Center Lanay Montgomery, largely limited due to foul trouble, finished with seven rebounds, four points and three blocks.

West Virginia shot 44.6 percent (25-of-56) from the field and 32.2 percent (19-of-59) from behind the three-point line. North Carolina A\&T was the fifth straight Mountaineer opponent to shoot less than 40 percent, connecting on 19 -of-59 for 32.2 percent. The Aggies made 6-of-13 from behind the arc for 46.2 percent.

The Mountaineers sprinted out to a 22-2 and held a 28-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter. In a stretch halfway through the quarter, Martin made four consecutive free throws and hit two jumpers as Pardee netted a triple to push the Mountaineers lead to 20.

The second half was much closer as the Aggies became the first WVU opponent to reach 20 points in a quarter this season. Montgomery and Muldrow were limited in the quarter with two fouls each. The Mountaineers led 52-28 at the break. WVU shot 51.5 percent (17-of-33) from the field compared to NC A\&T's 23.5 percent (8-of-34).

It was a continuation of the second half for North Carolina A\&T, as the Aggies jumped out on a 14-3 run to trim the game to 55-42 with 6:30 remaining. Dana Brown's jumper with 49.5 seconds left in the quarter cut the Mountaineer advantage to 65-52.

A 9-1 fourth quarter start extended the Mountaineer lead back to 21 points with 6:44 remaining. Montgomery and Ray made back-to-back layups followed by a Martin jumper. The exclamation point to the run was a Muldrow slicing layup that drew the and-one opportunity which she connected on to put WVU up 74-53.

## Mountaineers Roll Past East Carolina

Teana Muldrow's double-double paced the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 79-47 victory over East Carolina on Wednesday in the Savannah Invitational held at the Savannah Civic Center.

Three extended runs propelled the Mountaineers $(5-0)$ to their fifth victory of the season. WVU used a 10-2 spurt in the first quarter, a 16-2 second quarter run and a 12-1 fourth quarter run to thwart the Pirates. East Carolina fell to 4-2 after being held to a season-low 47 points.

Muldrow, a junior from East Orange, New Jersey, recorded her second career double-double by scoring season-highs with 21 points and 10 rebounds. Wednesday marked a breakout performance for Kristina King. The junior made 6-of-8 from the field and added four free throws for 16 points. King finished second in rebounds with eight.

Tynice Martin etched her seventh consecutive double-figure scoring game with 16 points. She grabbed six rebounds and collected two steals in 34 minutes. Chania Ray dished out four assists to lead WVU. Lanay Montgomery was limited for a second straight game due to foul trouble, scoring four points and pulling down three boards.

West Virginia made 29-of-60 from the field for 48.3 percent shooting and connected on 5 -of-16 from 3 -point range for 31.3 percent. ECU was held to 35.8 percent shooting (19-of-53) from the field, becoming the fifth WVU opponent this season to shoot less than 40 percent.

In the rebounds column, WVU outmanned ECU, 41-32, and outscored the Pirates 34-22 inside the paint. For a fourth game this season, West Virginia recorded double-figure steals with 11.

West Virginia opened the first quarter on a 10-2 run. ECU would use a $7-3$ run to trim the Mountaineer advantage to 13-9. Teana Muldrow added back-to-back buckets to put WVU up 21-16 at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, West Virginia utilized a 16-2 run and held the Pirates for nearly a five minute stretch. Martin's layup with 1:08 on the clock gave WVU a 39-25 edge to end the half.

East Carolina trimmed the game to 12 points on multiple occasions in the third period. King snapped a three-plus minute scoring drought with five consecutive points. She picked up a steal and used the fast break to score the layup and connect on the and-one. King then hit another layup to extend the Mountaineer lead to 21 points.

WVU used a 12-1 in the fourth quarter capped by a Muldrow three-pointer to push the edge to 30 points.

## WVU Edges Auburn for Savannah Invite Title

Lanay Montgomery's layup with 12 seconds remaining gave the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team a 56-52 victory over Auburn to claim the Savannah Invitational Championship on Thursday evening at the Savannah Civic Center. The Mountaineers (6-0) led by as many as 14 points in the first half before Auburn (5-1) closed the period on a $15-4$ run to cut the halftime lead to 31-28. WVU pushed its advantage to 10, 38-28, with a Montgomery layup at 7:06 left in the third. The Tigers held a brief one-point lead for 1:35 in the fourth quarter, but the Mountaineers maintained a slim lead down the stretch.

Auburn's Jessica Jones made a layup with 1:19 left to tie the game at 52-52. With 12 seconds remaining, Teana Muldrow grabbed an offensive rebound and Montgomery converted the layup for the game-winning basket. Tynice Martin closed out the game with two free throws to give West Virginia its best start since the 2010-11 season. Montgomery finished with 13 points, five rebounds and three blocks in 22 minutes. Martin led the team with 16 points, which nine of those points were from behind the arc. Muldrow matched her career-high with 14 rebounds and finished with eight points and three assists. Kristina King made 3-of-4 from the field and added two free throws to finish with eight points.

Martin, a native of Atlanta, earned Savannah Invitational MVP honors and Muldrow was named to the All-Tournament Team.

West Virginia shot 38.5 percent (20-of-52) from the field and made 37.5 percent (6-of-16) of its three point attempts. Auburn shot 27.6 percent (16-of-58) from the field and 25.0 percent ( 5 -of- 20 ) behind the arc. Auburn became the seventh consecutive WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field. The Mountaineers withstood the Auburn defensive attack, turning the ball over just 22 times. The Tigers came into the game forcing an average of 30-plus turnovers.

Montgomery scored the Mountaineers first three points and WVU eventually pushed out to a 14-3 lead. A King layup make on the fast break drew the and-one to push the WVU advantage to 22-13 at the end of one WVU lead 31-28 at halftime.

West Virginia opened the third quarter on a 10-0 run, but Auburn fired back. And trimmed the game to one on multiple occasions. King's layup gave WVU a 44-43 edge at the end of three.

Auburn took its only lead in the game with Frerking layup with 8:04 left in the contest. WVU answered immediately with a King jumper. The game went back-and-forth, including a Jones layup with 1:19 on the clock to tie the game at 52-52. From there, WVU used its fourpoint spurt to secure the sixth win of the season.

## WVU Downs High Point for 7-0 Start

Four Mountaineers eclipsed double-figures with Tynice Martin's 21 points leading the way in the No. 19/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 82-59 victory over High Point on Sunday at the WVU Coliseum.

A high-scoring first quarter saw the Mountaineers hold a slight $28-22$ edge. The team built its halftime advantage to 45-31. West Virginia led the entire game and stretched its lead to 25 points in the fourth quarter. WVU improved to 7-0, the program's best start since the 2010-11 season, and extended its program-record nonconference win streak at the WVU Coliseum to 28.

Martin made 10-of-20 from the field to finish with 21 points, four assists and four steals. The performance was Martin's third 20-point game of the season and her ninth consecutive game in double-figure scoring.

Lanay Montgomery had a standout performance, registering her second double-double this season and the 11 th of her career, with 15 points and 14 rebounds. Montgomery blocked five shots, dished out three assists and snatched two steals in 31 minutes. Teana Muldrow also recorded a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Overall, West Virginia made 33-of-66 from the field for 50 percent shooting and held its eighth consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as High Point shot at a 35.6 percent (21-of-59) clip. From three-point range, WVU connected on 5 -of-17 for 29.4 percent compared to HPU's 5 -of-14 for 35.7 percent. The Mountaineers matched a season-high with 20 assists.

Defensively, West Virginia netted a season-high 16 steals and blocked eight shots. The Mountaineers converted 24 High Point turnovers into 27 points.

West Virginia opened the game to a 9-3 advantage, capitalizing on four early High Point miscues. The Panthers battled back to trim the game to an 11-9 WVU edge after a $6-2$ spurt. A Kristina King layup pushed WVU's lead to 23-10 with 2:11 remaining in the period. HPU closed the period on a 12-5 run to narrow the gap to 28-22.

Ray's three-pointer at 6:30 extended the Mountaineer lead to 14 , capping a 9-1 WVU run to open the second quarter. Just a minute later, High Point narrowed the lead to 10 points. However, West Virginia maintained a 14-point cushion with a 45-31 halftime advantage.

Martin and Muldrow combined for 12 of West Virginia's first 14 points in the third quarter. A jumper by Martin with 5:53 remaining pushed the Mountaineer lead to 23. Katrina Pardee's jumper gave WVU a 63-43 edge at the end of three. Pardee would finish with nine points.

WVU scored its first eight points from the free throw line the fourth quarter until a Martin jumper at 5:06. The Mountaineers outpaced HPU 19-16 in the frame.

## Montgomery Moves WVU Past Morehead State

A stellar performance from senior center Lanay Montgomery propelled the No. 16/17-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a $94-53$ victory over Morehead State on Wednesday at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia held an early eight-point advantage, but MSU's Katelyn Byrd made a triple with 3:09 remaining in the first quarter to give Morehead State a 15-14 lead. Montgomery's layup 35 seconds later sparked a 13-0 Mountaineer run. Later in the second quarter, WVU used a Montgomery layup and a Katrina Pardee three-pointer to jump start a $17-0$ spurt. West Virginia ( $8-0$ ) scored its second-most points of the season and rolled to a 29th consecutive win against nonconference competition at the WVU Coliseum. Morehead State's two-game win streak was snapped, as the Eagles fell to 5-3 on the season.

Montgomery's historic performance included a careerhigh 23 points, matching a season-high 18 rebounds and blocking six shots in 25 minutes. She made 10-of-11 field goal attempts for 90.9 percent shooting from the field. The Pittsburgh native was just the second WVU player in history to score at least 20-plus points, grab at least 18 -plus rebounds and block five or more shots. Only WVU Hall of Famer Georgeann Wells had a better performance against Marshall in 1984, scoring 35 points, pulling down 19 rebounds and blocking eight shots. The double-double was the third for Montgomery this year and the 12th of her career.

Teana Muldrow also netted her third double-double this season with 18 points and 13 rebounds. The junior matched a career-high four assists, blocked three shots and collected three steals. Montgomery and Muldrow are the first WVU duo to tally double-doubles in back-to-back games since Liz Repella and Takisha Granberry accomplished the feat versus FIU and NIIT in November 2008.

Tynice Martin reached double-figure scoring for a 10th consecutive game with 17 points. Also in double-figures, Kristina King posted 14 and grabbed seven rebounds.

West Virginia shot 47.4 percent (36-of-76) from the field and 41.2 percent ( 7 -of-17) from behind the arc. The Mountaineers held their ninth consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting and their fourth opponent this season to less than 30 percent shooting, as Morehead State was limited to 29.4 percent (20-of-68) from the field.

In the rebound column, WVU grabbed 59 boards compared to MSU's 43. The Mountaineers blocked a seasonbest 15 shots, the most since deflecting 15 against Kansas State on Jan. 21, 2015. WVU also matched a season-high with 20 assists.

The No. 16/17-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team used a season-high 34 points from its bench to knock off Ole Miss, 66-61, in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge on Sunday afternoon at the WVU Coliseum.

An 8-2 run to start the third quarter gave Ole Miss (6-2) a lead for a minute and 21 seconds. However, West Virginia used two free throws from Alexis Brewer and layups from Tynice Martin and Kristina King to regain the lead, 34-30, with three minutes remaining.

With 4:20 remaining in the game, the Rebels trimmed the contest to 54-52 after Erika Sisk made a layup and converted the and-one. However, WVU's Brewer and Lanay Montgomery quickly responded with back-to-back buckets to extend the lead back to four.

West Virginia (9-0) utilized a King layup and nine free throws in the final 1:13 to secure its 30th consecutive win over a nonconference opponent and 11th straight victory at the WVU Coliseum. The Mountaineers are off to their best start since opening the year 16-0 in the 2010-11 season.

King narrowly missed a double-double with a game-high 16 points, season-high nine rebounds and season-best four blocks in 28 minutes. Brewer finished with 12 points, seven of which came from the charity stripe.

Martin reached double-figure scoring for an 11th consecutive game with 10 points. Montgomery and Teana Muldrow contributed with eight points and five rebounds each in limited minutes. Desiree Rhodes filled in the post with six points and five rebounds.

The Mountaineers shot 53.5 percent ( 23 -of-43) from the field in just 43 field goal attempts, the lowest since shooting 43 at Georgetown on Jan. 25, 2011. Ole Miss was limited to 32.2 percent (19-of-59) shooting from the field, marking the 10th consecutive game that West Virginia has held its opponents to shooting less than 40 percent.

West Virginia shot well in the second quarter, but committed nine more turnovers for a total of 18 at the half. WVU converted on 6-of-13 attempts in the second quarter. Rhodes'layup in the final seconds stretched the Mountaineer advantage to 26-20. Muldrow led WVU with eight points, while Ole Miss' Torri Lewis had eight. The Rebels only made one two-point basket in the first half, which came with 1:38 remaining in the second stanza.

Ole Miss opened the third quarter on a 10-2 run to tie the game with a Taylor Manuel layup at the 6:31 mark. Shandricka Sessom's bucket with 5:26 left in the third quarter gave the Rebels their first lead of the game at 30-28. However, West Virginia responded with a 6-0 run including layups from King and Martin. After starting the game 2-of-10 from the charity stripe, WVU concluded the quarter with four consecutive free throw makes. Manuel would finish with a team-high 13 points for Mississippi.

Despite Ole Miss' Sisk scoring the layup and converting the and-one, WVU outscored Ole Miss 13-to-10 down the final stretch to secure the Big 12 Conference's fourth victory in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

WVU Women's Hoops Improve to 10-0
The No. 13/14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team shot a season-high 59.7 percent from the field and improved to 10-0 in a 91-33 victory over USC Upstate on Saturday.

West Virginia opened the contest on an 11-2 run and never trailed. The Mountaineers used a 21-0 scoring spurt in the third and fourth quarters to pick up their 31st consecutive win over a nonconference opponent at the WVU Coliseum. WVU's 12th straight win at the Coliseum ranks seventh all-time, while the 10-game win streak is tied for the 10th longest in program history Saturday's win also tied the Mountaineers second-best start in program history, matching the 10-0 start in 2002-03. USC Upstate's 33 points were the lowest for a Mountaineer opponent since Georgetown was limited to 32 in 2012. The Spartans fell to 4-6 on the season.

Senior center Lanay Montgomery recorded her fourth double-double of the year with 16 points and 10 rebounds. She blocked four shots and made 8-of-9 from the field for an 88.9 shooting percentage. For a second consecutive game, Kristina King matched season-highs with 16 points and nine rebounds in 19 minutes. Teana Muldrow finished with 15 points, six rebounds and five assists. Additionally, Tynice Martin eclipsed doublefigures for a 12th consecutive game with 14 points.

Chania Ray finished with nine points and led WVU with seven assists and four steals. Sophomore Katrina Pardee also tallied nine points in the contest.
West Virginia limited its 11th consecutive opponent to less than 40 percent shooting as USC Upstate made just 14-of-59 for 23.7 percent. WVU dished out 24 assists and collected 14 steals in the victory.

Pardee scored West Virginia's first seven points as the Mountaineers opened the contest to an 11-2 lead. Montgomery also added eight points and blocked two shots in seven minutes in the opening quarter.

Six of the first eight points were scored by the USC Upstate to start the second quarter. Montgomery, King and Pardee sparked a 10-3 Mountaineer run. West Virginia closed the half with a 42-19 lead and shot a season-best 63.3 percent from the field in the opening half.

Muldrow made four of West Virginia's first six points in the second half, all of which came from the charity stripe. The Mountaineers closed the third quarter on a 14 -point run to extend the margin to 45 points.

WVU added seven more consecutive points to stretch the lead to 79-26 with 7:40 remaining. A layup from Vanessa Agrusa snapped the 21-0 run, but WVU added 13 more points in the quarter for its largest margin of victory win of the season. Brittney Delva led the Spartans with 12 points.

WVU Dishes Out 32 Assists in Win over Longwood
The No. 14-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team tied a school-record 32 assists in a 10740 victory over Longwood on Saturday afternoon at the Charleston Civic Center.

A 16-4 run and another 16-0 spurt in the first quarter set the tone for the Mountaineers. West Virginia shot 71.4 percent (25-of-35) in the first half. Although WVU (11-0) cooled down in the second half, the Mountaineers finished the game shooting 56.8 percent (42-of-74) from the field. WVU's 32 assists on 42 field goals matched 32 assists dished out against Indiana State (Nov. 23, 1984) and Duquesne (Nov. 7, 1984). Longwood fell to 1-7 on the season.

Tynice Martin led the Mountaineers with 21 points for her sixth career 20-point performance. Martin dished out a career-high seven assists and matched a season-high six rebounds. Lanay Montgomery made 9-of-9 from the field and finished with 19 points, eight rebounds and three blocks. Junior guard Teana Muldrow also went a perfect 7-of-7 from the field to finishing the day with 17 points, while dishing out five assists and grabbing four rebounds.

Alexis Brewer eclipsed double figures with a careerhigh 16 points in 28 minutes. Kristina King rounded out WVU's double-digit scoring with 11 points, and sophomore Katrina Pardee led the team with a careerhigh 10 assists and zero turnovers in 21 minutes. Desiree Rhodes paced the team with nine rebounds.

Saturday's victory gave West Virginia its 11th straight win, tying for the seventh-longest win streak and second-best start to a season in program history. Longwood became the Mountaineers' 12th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field, knocking down just 23.5 percent (12-of-51). West Virginia won the rebound battle, 49-28, and outscored the Lancers, 40-12, in the paint. WVU converted 24 Longwood turnovers into 29 points. WVU's 107-point performance was the most since tallying 109 against Delaware State on Dec. 18, 2013.

West Virginia opened the game with four different Mountaineers making three-pointers to put WVU up 16-4 with 6:31 left in the first quarter. The team capped a 16-0 run in the first quarter and led 31-8, marking the 15th time this season WVU has limited its opponents to under double-figure scoring in a quarter.

WVU Caps Nonconference Play Unbeaten
The No. 13/12 West Virginia University women's basketball team completed the nonconference slate perfect for the third time in program history with a 77-45 win over Mount St. Mary's on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (12-0) sprinted out to a 19-3 run in the first quarter and never relinquished the lead in the team's 32nd straight win against nonconference opponents at the WVU Coliseum. The Mount (2-9) trimmed the WVU lead to 10 points early in the second quarter, but the Mountaineers responded with 11 consecutive points to seal the team's 14th consecutive win at the WVU Coliseum. West Virginia joins the 2010-11 squad (14-0) and the 2002-03 team (11-0) in finishing the nonconference schedule undefeated.

Lanay Montgomery paced the Mountaineers with 16 points and 10 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the season. Montgomery finished with five blocks on Wednesday pushing her career total to 273 and passing former teammate Aysa Bussie (270) for second on WVU's all-time career blocks list. The senior made her first five shots to extend her consecutive field goals made streak to 14, before it ended in the first half. She finished 7 -of- 9 from the field for 77.8 percent shooting.

Kristina King, the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year, registered her first double-double at West Virginia with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Tynice Martin added 16 points followed by 14 from junior Teana Muldrow. Chania Ray led the Mountaineers with six assists, while scoring eight points and grabbing six rebounds in 34 minutes.

Offensively, West Virginia ended the evening with a 47.8 shooting percentage from the field (32-of-67) and scored a season-high 56 points inside the paint. The Mountaineers outrebounded Mount St. Mary's, 51-31. WVU limited the Mount to 28.8 percent (17-of-59) from the field, marking the 13th consecutive opponent to shoot less than 40 percent. Also, Mount St. Mary's is the seventh opponent this season to shoot less than 30 percent.

Montgomery made eight of WVU's first 15 points, as the Mountaineers opened the contest on a 19-3 run in the first five minutes. Mount St. Mary's finished the period with an 8-4 run of its own, including four points from Katrice Dickson to cut the WVU lead to 23-11.

Mount St. Mary's Caroline Hummell scored the first bucket in the second quarter. WVU answered with 11 consecutive points. Montgomery tallied six of her 14 first half points and led the team with seven rebounds at the break.

WVU outscored the Mount 22-15 in the third quarter to stretch its lead to 62-32 at the end of the period. The fourth quarter was much closer as the Mountaineers edged Mount St. Mary's, 15-13. Hummell finished with a team-high 13 points for the Mount.

No. 12 WVU Downs TCU in Big 12 Opener
Strong defensive play and a 32 -point third quarter performance propelled the No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to an 83-61 win over TCU on Thursday evening in the Big 12 Conference opener at the Ed and Rae Schollmaier Arena.

WVU (13-0, 1-0) used a series of runs, including a 10-3 spurt in the first quarter to maintain the lead. In the third quarter, West Virginia outscored TCU, 32-20, to stretch its lead to as much as 36 . The Horned Frogs ( $8-4,0-1$ ) committed 20 turnovers, resulting in 19 Mountaineer points. West Virginia's 17 steals were the most in a Big 12 game for the Mountaineers since joining the league in 2012-13.

Tynice Martin led West Virginia with 21 points, while matching a team high with six steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 19 points and nine rebounds. Guard Chania Ray matched a career-high with 17 points, dished out nine assists, grabbed six boards and collected career-best six steals. Kristina King reached double-digit scoring for a sixth consecutive game with 14 points. Lanay Montgomery led WVU with 11 rebounds, while corralling eight rebounds.

West Virginia's 13-0 start is the second-best in program history. WVU's 13 -game win streak is tied for fifth all-time.

Offensively, West Virginia made 26-of-60 from the field for 43.3 percent shooting. WVU connected on 26 -of- 32 from the field for an 81.3 free throw percentage. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 42-32.

For a 14th straight game, West Virginia held its opponent to less than 40 percent shooting. The Frogs made 37.7 percent ( 20 -of-53) from the field and shot 47.1 percent ( 8 -of17) from three-point range. TCU entered the game leading the country in three-point field goal percentage. WVU's 10 blocks were the most since deflecting 15 against Morehead State on Nov. 30.

West Virginia sprinted out to a 9-4 lead in the first five minutes of the game. Montgomery scored on a putback with 11 seconds remaining and Muldrow hit a jumper to cap a 10-3 run and give the Mountaineers a 19-7.

TCU was limited to just one three-point make in the first quarter. The Frogs connected on three more, but WVU utilized an 8-0 run midway through the quarter to stretch its lead to as much as 23 points.

The Mountaineers outscored TCU 32-20 in the third quarter despite the Frogs shooting 5-of-9 from three-point range. West Virginia utilized another nine-point spurt and held a 73-39 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Toree Thompson made back-to-back buckets to spark a 12-2 run in the fourth quarter. Amy Oknonkwo's threepointer with 6:23 remaining trimmed the Mountaineer lead to 75-51. However, WVU added eight more points to seal its 13th straight win. Okonkwo led the Frogs with 17 points and eight rebounds.

The No. 12-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team could not overcome Kansas State's strong offensive play, as the Mountaineers fell 86-71 to the Wildcats on Sunday at Bramlage Coliseum.

Kansas State (11-3, 1-1) dominated inside during the first half, scoring 34 of its 51 first half points inside the paint to hold a 51-39 advantage at halftime. The Mountaineers (13-1, 1-1) trimmed the contest to six points with eight minutes left in the third quarter, but K-State proceeded on an 11-2 run to push the lead back to 15 points. WVU trimmed the deficit to 14 late in the fourth quarter, but Kansas State held on to snap the Mountaineers' 13 -game winning streak.

Chania Ray scored a career-high 23 points, which included a personal-best six three-point makes. The junior from Alexandria, Virginia, dished out seven assists, grabbed four rebounds and collected two steals. Teana Muldrow followed with 15 points, including 5 -of-7 from beyond the arc. WVU's other double-figure scorers included Tynice Martin (14) and Kristina King (11). Lanay Montgomery paced WVU with nine rebounds.

WVU's 14 three-point makes were second all-time in a single-game. The Mountaineers shot 42.4 percent (25-of-59) from the field and 48.3 percent ( 14 -of-29) from behind the arc. Kansas State finished shooting 54.7 percent (35-of-64) from the field - snapping WVU's 14-game streak of holding opponents to less than 40 percent shooting. The Wildcats outscored WVU, 54-22, in the paint and won the rebound battle 35-28. Breanna Lewis paced K-State with 23 points.

The Mountaineers held a 9-6 lead midway through the first quarter. K-State outscored WVU 10-6 in final 3:39, which included back-to-back layups from Lewis to end the quarter.

Kansas State opened the second quarter on an 8-3 run and extended its lead to 10 points with 7:25 remaining. Karyla Middlebrook's layup with 38 seconds on the clock pushed the lead to 14. Muldrow answered with a triple to trim the advantage to 11, but Willock made a free throw to push the edge to 51-39 at halftime.

The paint advantage was dominated by Kansas State as WVU was outscored $34-8$, as K-State shot 61.1 percent (22-of36) from the field. Ray led WVU with 15 points.

West Virginia opened the third period on an 8-2 run, which included back-to-back threes from Ray and Martin. However, K-State made back-to-back treys that sparked an 11-2 run to stretch its lead to 15 with 4:57 left in the quarter. With 27 seconds left in the third, K-State stretched its lead to 21 points.

In the fourth quarter, West Virginia trimmed the game to 17 points and Kansas State scoreless for four-plus minutes. Muldrow's three-pointer cut the game to 14 points with three minutes remaining, but K -State held on to collect its second win against WVU.

The Mountaineers (14-4, 2-4) were outscored 43-24 in the second and third quarters, as the Longhorns (12-4, $6-0$ ) built up their lead to 22 points. WVU used a 15-1 run over a four-minute span in the fourth quarter to trim the deficit to eight points, 68-60, with 2:13 remaining. However, Texas scored five points in the final two minutes to secure the victory.

Teana Muldrow led West Virginia with a seasonhigh 22 points, one short of her career-best 23, while grabbing seven rebounds. Senior Lanay Montgomery registered her seventh double-double of the year with 14 points and 12 rebounds. Other double-figure scorers included 14 points from Tynice Martin and 12 from Chania Ray.

Overall, West Virginia shot 45.1 percent (23-of-51) from the field and surrendered 50 percent ( 32 -of-64) shooting from Texas. WVU made 6-of-13 (46.2\%) from behind the arc and held UT to no three-point makes. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, but were outscored, 48-24, in the paint.

Muldrow scored eight of West Virginia's first 10 points in a five-minute span. The Longhorns stormed back on an $8-2$ run to tie the game at 10 with 3:08 remaining. The contest went back-and-forth with WVU holding a 17-16 edge at the end of the period.

Texas utilized an 18-1 run at the end of the first quarter and the first in seven minutes of the second quarter. Muldrow's free throw at 3:08 snapped the scoring drought. Lanay Montgomery and Teana Muldrow each recorded a double-double in the No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team's 62-51 victory over Kansas on Wednesday evening at Allen Fieldhouse.

West Virginia (15-4, 3-4) led by 12 points in the second quarter. However, Kansas ( $6-12,0-7$ ) fought back with a 13-3 run to open the third quarter and take a $35-34$ lead with 4:06 left in the period. A Tynice Martin trey with 48 seconds remaining in the third, gave WVU the 39-37 go-ahead lead. The Jayhawks trimmed the game to three early in the fourth but the Mountaineers made 12 free throws in the final 45 seconds to secure the win; giving Kansas its 25 th consecutive Big 12 loss.

Montgomery etched her eighth double-double this season with 15 points and 13 rebounds, while blocking six shots. Muldrow inked her fourth double-double this season with 12 points and a career-high 15 rebounds, while dishing out out a team-leading six assists. Martin netted a team-high 21 points, including 9 -of-12 from the charity stripe.

West Virginia shot 36.8 percent (21-of-57) from the field and held Kansas to 27.6 percent shooting ( $16-\mathrm{of-} 58$ ). The Jayhawks were the 14th WVU opponent to shoot less than 40 percent from the field this season. The Mountaineers won the rebound battle, 52-32, and outscored the Jayhawks, $28-20$, inside the paint. WVU outscored KU, 18-6, in secondchance point opportunities. Kansas forced 25 Mountaineer turnovers, but only converted 13 into points.

Montgomery and Martin combined for West Virginia's first 10 points to open the game in the first five minutes. WVU added 10 more points to finish the period and led 20-10 at the end of one.

Kansas opened the second quarter on a 7-2 run. KU's Jessica Washington hit a three-pointer and made two free throws to trim the deficit to 28-24. Chania Ray drained a trey as time expired in the half, putting the Mountaineers up 3124. WVU shot 44.8 percent ( 13 -of-29) from the field and held KU to 30.0 percent shooting ( 9 -of-30).

In the third quarter, the Jayhawks started a 13-3 run and took a 35-34 lead with a McKenzie Calvert 3-pointer with four minutes remaining. However, Martin responded with a trey with 39 seconds left to give WVU a 39-37 edge at the end of three.

Muldrow's back-to-back layups stretched the Mountaineer lead to 47-40 with 6:10 remaining in the contest. The Mountaineers connected on 12 free throws down the stretch to secure their third Big 12 win this season. Washington finished with a game-high 24 points for the Jayhawks.

No. 24/23-ranked West Virginia battled No. 2/2 Baylor, but fell, 79-73, in a hard-fought contest on Saturday afternoon in front of 6,462 fans at the Ferrell Center.

West Virginia (15-5, 3-5) held brief leads in the first and second quarters and for a total of 3:21 in the game. Baylor (19-1, 8-0) held a 40-34 advantage at the half, marking the closest halftime margin for the Lady Bears in Big 12 play.

Katrina Pardee made a layup and hit a three-pointer to trim the game to four, 65-61, with 5:51 left in the game. However, BU made six free throws in the final minute to collect the win.

BU came into Saturday's game with a +35.1 scoring margin in Big 12 games and had its closest game, a 23 -point victory over TCU. WVU's 73 points were the most scored against the Lady Bears this season.

Teana Muldrow led WVU with a game-high 20 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Tynice Martin tallied 18 points, while dishing out four assists. Pardee finished with 13 points, followed by 11 points and five assists from Chania Ray.

Baylor finished shooting 45.2 percent (28-of-62) from the field compared to WVU's 41.7 percent ( $30-\mathrm{of-} 72$ ). The Lady Bears won the rebound battle, 42-38, and edged WVU, 44-42, inside the paint. Baylor made 20 -of- 26 from the charity stripe for 76.9 percent compared to West Virginia's 9-of-13 for 69.2 percent.

Pardee, Muldrow and Ray combined for West Virginia's six-point run to take a 12-6 lead with 6:42 left in the first. However, Baylor proceeded on a 13-1 to push its lead to seven. The Mountaineers fought back and Muldrow's trey capped the period, trimming the contest to 25-24.

Martin's layup at the 8:10 mark gave West Virginia its first lead, 28-27. The two teams traded buckets throughout the game, but BU eventually stretched out to a $40-34$ lead at halftime after outscoring the Mountaineers, 15-10, in the quarter.

WVU shot 35.9 percent from the field (14-of-39) compared to Baylor's 43.8 percent (14-of-32) at the half.

An Alexis Jones layup pushed Baylor's lead to 11 points at the 5:21 mark in the third. Alexis Brewer followed up with a layup plus connected on the and-one, while Martin added a jumper to trim the contest back to six. BU made six of its next eight to extend its lead to $59-47$ with 1:25 left in the third. At the end of three, Baylor maintained a 63-52 advantage.

Pardee's bucket with 6:39 left in the fourth trimmed the game to 65-58. She followed up the next possession with a three to narrow the game to four. However, Baylor responded with back-to-back jumpers to extend the lead to eight.

Muldrow made a bucket and converted the and-one to trim the game to 73-68 with less than two minutes remaining. However, Baylor kept its distance down the stretch to improve to 8-0 in the Big 12.

The Mountaineers (16-5, 4-5) opened up to a 22-point lead late in the second quarter, before the Lady Raiders (11-8, $3-5$ ) stormed back nailing five three-pointers and outscoring WVU, 31-19, in the third quarter. Texas Tech cut the game to within seven in the final quarter, but West Virginia outscored TTU, 27-24, in the period to collect their 16th victory of the season.

Muldrow matched a season-high with 22 points, grabbed nine rebounds and dished out a career-high seven assists. Montgomery followed with 21 points, nine rebounds and three blocks. Sophomore guard Katrina Pardee led the Mountaineers with 16 points, including a career-high-tying 12 from threepoint range, and added five rebounds. The Mountaineers trailed early, as the Cyclones opened the game shooting 6-8 from the field to take a 14-8 lead. After a timeout on the floor, ISU extended the advantage to 16-8 before West Virginia chipped away at the deficit. A Muldrow jumper and a Brewer three made it a 16-13 game before lowa State scored the final points of the quarter to take an 18-13 lead after 10 minutes of play.

The WVU defense held lowa State to 2-8 from the field and 0-3 from beyond the arc in the final 4:22 of the first quarter.

A pair of free throws in the opening minute of the final quarter extended lowa State's lead to 21, at 62-41. The West Virginia University women's basketball team knocked down a school-record 17 three-pointers in a 79-53 win over Oklahoma State on Saturday evening in front of 4,024 fans at the WVU Coliseum for the Play4Kay pink game.

After one period of play, it remained a two-point margin as WVU held a 14-12 advantage. However, WVU responded with seven three-pointers in the second quarter and held a 39-24 halftime edge. The three-point hot streak continued in the second half, as WVU responded with eight more makes from behind the arc. The Mountaineers (17-8, 5-8) maintained a comfortable lead in the second half and never trailed the Cowgirls (13-11, 3-10).

Coming off a 35-point performance at Oklahoma, sophomore Tynice Martin once again had a stellar game by scoring a game-high 30 points and grabbing eight rebounds in 35 minutes. The sophomore became the first Mountaineer since Meg Bulger in 2005 to score 30 or more points in back-to-back games. The Atlanta native knocked down a career-best 7-of-10 from three-point range, tying for the second-most three-pointers made by a West Virginia sophomore in a game.

Teana Muldrow registered her sixth double-double of the season and second consecutive with 14 points and 13 rebounds. She also blocked two shots in 34 minutes. Katrina Pardee made 4-of-5 from three-point range and finished with 12 points.

However, Oklahoma State fought back to trim the game to one, 7-6. The game remained close for the rest of the period, but a Brewer driving layup gave WVU a 14-12 edge at the end of the quarter.

Teana Muldrow's layup followed by a bucket from Kristina King sparked a nine-point Mountaineer run over the next two minutes to push the West Virginia lead back to 11

KSU could only trim the game to seven in the final 2:22, giving West Virginia its second top 25 win of the season. Earlier on Jan. 8, WVU picked up an 83-73 victory over No. 20/24 Oklahoma. The Mountaineers have won at least two games over ranked opponents in the last eight years and in 11 of the last 12 seasons.

Junior guard Chania Ray registered her first career doubledouble with 14 points and dishing out a game-high 10 assists. Katrina Pardee again had a strong performance from the perimeter, banking four three-pointers and finishing with 14 points. Despite being limited due to foul trouble, Lanay Montgomery etched her ninth double-double of the season and 18 th of her career with 12 points and 12 rebounds. The Pittsburgh native made 6 -of- 8 from the field for a 75 shooting percentage.

WVU won the rebound battle, 38-29, and outscored the Wildcats, $28-22$, in the paint. The Mountaineers dished out 20 assists, collected 10 steals and blocked three shots.

It remained a near-even game in the first five minutes of Wednesday's contest. A Breanna Lewis layup, along with the and-one, put the Wildcats up 10-8 with 5:31 remaining. The Mountaineers fought back with a 15-2 run which started with a Muldrow layup, a Ray three-pointer and a Montgomery bucket to give WVU a 15-10 edge. The Mountaineers led 2312 at the end on of the opening period.

The Mountaineers added seven more points for a 22-2 run and pushed their lead to 19 after Pardee made a layup at the 5:20 mark. KSU used a 9-3 spurt of its own to close the half and trim West Virginia's advantage to 39-25. Pardee led all scorers with 14 points, while Montgomery had 10 rebounds in the first half.

However, lowa State responded with Bridget Carleton and Jadda Buckley three-pointers coupled with a Seanna Johnson layup that began the front-end of a 13-0 Cyclone run. WVU trimmed the ISU 14-point lead to 10, but the Cyclones maintained a 48-36 edge at the end of three.

The fourth quarter started off slowly for West Virginia, as the Mountaineers started 0-of-8 from the field and ISU used a 9-3 run to push its lead to 57-39 with 5:42 remaining. lowa State held on to pick up the regular-season series sweep over WVU. Buckley led the Cyclones with 20 points in the win.

## Muldrow and Martin Power WVU Past TCU

Teana Muldrow and Tynice Martin combined for 50 points, as West Virginia held on for a 77-73 win over TCU on Wednesday evening at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (19-9, 7-9) led by 14 points at the end of three quarters, but TCU (12-15, 4-12) opened the fourth quarter on an 11-1 run to trim the game to two points. Martin banked a trey on the next possession, followed by free throw makes from Muldrow and Katrina Pardee to push the Mountaineer lead back to nine. The relentless Horned Frogs fought back and trimmed the game to three, 76-73, with 26 seconds remaining after an AJ Alix three-point make. Again, Muldrow and Martin answered with three combined free throws to seal West Virginia's 14th home victory, tying for the third-most home wins in program history.

Muldrow had a banner evening, scoring a career-high 25 points and corralling 14 rebounds for her seventh doubledouble of the season. She connected on 9-of-10 from the charity stripe, while making 7-of-11 from the field. With a free throw make at the 5:10 mark in the second quarter, the junior from East Orange, New Jersey, became the 33rd Mountaineer to reach the 1,000-point milestone.

Martin netted her ninth 20-point performance of the year, scoring 25 points and grabbing eight rebounds. The Atlanta sophomore made 10 field goals and two triples.

The Mountaineers shot 41.9 percent (26-of-62) from the field, while the Horned Frogs connected on 42.9 percent (27-of-63). WVU made 19 -of-22 for an 86.4 free throw percentage. The rebound battle was handily won by the Mountaineers, as WVU edged TCU, 49-36. West Virginia dished out 21 assists, but committed 22 turnovers in the contest.

West Virginia opened up to a 10-5 lead in the first five minutes of Wednesday's contest. However, Lanay Montgomery exited early due to foul trouble. TCU used a nine-point run to take a 16-14 lead at the end of one.

The Mountaineers came out firing in the second quarter, knocking down 10-of-14 from the field for a 71.4 shooting percentage. Muldrow and Martin combined for 18 of WVU's 29 points in the period. A Martin layup extended WVU's lead to 43-33 with 21 seconds remaining. TCU's Jada Butts made two free throws to end the half and trim the lead to 43-35. Martin led all scorers with 14 points and Muldrow added 13 in the opening two quarters.

Martin, Montgomery and Muldrow combined for all eight of West Virginia's field goals in the third quarter.

TCU opened the fourth quarter on an 11-1 spurt, which included back-to-back layups from Amy Okonkwo to trim the Mountaineer lead to 60-56 with 7:36 remaining. Moore made a jumper to cut the game to 60-58. However, on the next possession Martin answered with a three to push the lead back to 63-58. Four consecutive free throws from Teana Muldrow and Katrina Pardee pushed the lead back to nine. TCU cut the game to three with six seconds remaining. West Virginia executed the free throw attempts down the stretch to collect the team's 19th win of the season.
