MOUNTAINEERS AT NCAAs

West Virginia qualified a pair of wrestlers to this year's NCAA Championships, though Dylan Cottrell will be the only Mountaineer to compete. Jacob A. Smith also qualified as the Big 12 runner-up at 197 pounds, but was forced to withdraw due to injury. WVU has qualified 10 wrestlers to NCAAs in the Sammie Henson era.

COTTRELL ROLLS

Continuing on a 10-match win streak, Cottrell went 3-0 at 165 pounds at the 2017 Big 12 Championship in Tulsa, Oklahoma, on March 4-5 to become West Virginia's first-ever Big 12 Champion. The Spencer, West Virginia, native defeated lowa State's Logan Brietenbach in an 8-1 decision in the quarterfinals before topping North Dakota State's Andrew Fogarty, 11-4, in the semifinals to advance to the championship finals. Cottrell won a 5-4 decision over Oklahoma State's Chandler Rogers to win the title. It's his second career league title as he previously won the 149-pound Southern Conference title while a redshirt freshman at Appalachian State in 2014.

THIRD TIME'S A CHARM

Both Cottrell and Smith qualified for their third straight NCAA Championships this season. Cottrell earned an automatic bid from the SoCon while at App. State in 2014, entering the tournament as the No. 12 seed. After transferring to WVU in 2015, he earned an automatic bid at 157 after taking third place at Big 12s in 2016. Smith earned at-large bids at 197 in both 2015 and 2016, and earned an automatic big this year.

COTTRELL EARNS NO. 8 SEED

Cottrell enters the tournament as the No. 8 seed at 165 pounds. He is the first Mountaineer to earn a top-10 seed since Kurt Brenner in 2009. Brenner received the No. 10 seed at 174 that season. He is WVU's highest-seeded wrestling since Brandon Rader in 2007. Rader entered the championship as the No. 7 seed at 141 pounds and earned All-America honors with a sixth-place finish. He is the third Mountaineer since 2009 to earn a seed as a top-16 wrestler at the event.

vs. BROOKS MARTINO

Cottrell will face Penn's Brooks Martino in the first round of action on Thursday. It is the first meeting of the two in 2017 and at 165 pounds, though they wrestled in 2016 at 157 pounds. Cottrell posted a 4-1 decision against Martino at the 2016 Southern Scuffle in January.

COMMON OPPONENTS

Cottrell and Martino share a pair of common opponents in Binghamton's Jake Einbinder, and Harvard's Peter Bearse. Both scored bonus points against Einbinder, as Cottrell won a 19-2 tech. fall in 4:19 at the Pitt Duals, while Martino pinned Einbinder in 4:56. Cottrell pinned Bearse in 4:00, also at the Pitt Duals, while Martino scored an 18-3 tech. fall over Bearse in 5:07.

LAST TIME IN ST. LOUIS...

The Scottrade Center has been a lucky place for the Mountaineers. In 2015, then-true freshman Zeke Moisey defeated four ranked opponents on his way to the NCAA finals. He defeated No. 2 seed Nahshon Garrett of Cornell and pinned No. 6 Thomas Gilman of Iowa in the semis before dropping the 125-pound national championship match to Nathan Tomasello of Ohio State. Moisey became the first Mountaineer to earn All-America honors since Brandon Rader in 2007 and was the first WVU wrestler to earn a trip to the finals since Greg Jones in 2005.

CONFERENCE ALLOCATIONS ANNOUNCED

Conference allocations for the 2017 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships, as well as the third edition of the NCAA Coaches' Rankings Panel and RPI Rankings were announced by the NCAA on Thursday. The Big 12 was awarded 38 automatic qualifying spots, third most behind the Big Ten (77) and Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association (42). The 165-pound weight class will qualify the top six finishers at the 2017 Big 12 Championship - the most of any weight class. A weight-by-weight breakdown is listed below. Each qualifying tournament received spots based on each athlete's Division I winning percentage, the coaches' rankings and the ratings percentage index (RPI). Leagues were awarded one qualifying spot for each wrestler who reached threshold in two of three categories. Qualifying spots will be awarded to wrestlers based on qualifying tournament finish, regardless of whether or not they met the threshold. Following the completion of qualifying events, the NCAA Division I Wrestling Committee will select the remaining 49 at-large qualifiers. Selections will be made based on the following criteria: head-to-head competition, quality wins, coaches' ranking, results against common opponents, RPI, qualifying event placement and winning percentage. At-large selections will be announced on March 7.

MOUNTAINEERS IN PLACE TO QUALIFY

A pair of Mountaineers rank in the top-33 of their respective weights in the coaches' rankings. Jacob A. Smith is No. 5 at 197 pounds, while Dylan Cottrell is No. 11 at 165 pounds. Cory Stainbrook joins Smith and Cottrell in the RPI rankings. Cottrell ranks at No. 7 at 165, with Smith coming in at No. 8 at 197, and Stainbrook at No. 26 in the 133-pound rankings.

MOUNTAINEERS CLAIM FIRST BIG 12 WIN

WVU is coming off an historic 22-20 win over lowa State last weekend in Morgantown. Trailing by 11 team points with three bouts remaining, Parker VonEgidy won in sudden victory at 184 while Jacob A. Smith added a major at 197 as the team found itself down 20-16. Freshman heavyweight Brandon Ngati then pinned Joe Scanlan in the second period for his second win of the season, giving the Mountaineers the win. It marked the first Big 12 dual match win in WVU program history.

SENIOR NIGHT

West Virginia will hold its annual Senior Night recognition against Edinboro on Friday. Seniors will be honored following every other bout. Nine Mountaineers will finish their WVU career at the end of the season: Dylan Cottrell, Cory Stainbrook, Tony DeAngelo, Ty Millward, William Jenkins, James Dekrone, Louis Colonna, Jake S. Smith and Bryson Begley.

SMITH 4-0 IN BIG 12 ACTION

Jacob A. Smith led WVU with a 4-0 mark at 197 in the regular season. Smith claimed a 2-1 win over OSU's Derek White before adding a 3-1 decision over No. 20 Brad Johnson of OU. He later added a win by injury default over SDSU's Nate Rotert before taking a major decision against lowa State's Marcus Harrington. The Charleston, West Virginia, native went undefeated in Big 12 matches last year and entered the 2016 Big 12 Championships as the No. 1 seed. Smith leads the squad with 18 wins on the season, 17 of which have come against Division I wrestlers.

Sammie Henson was named the eighth head coach in WVU program history in May of 2014, and is quickly bringing the program to new heights.

Henson brought with him a 17-year streak of All-Americans, having coached a total of 20 with five NCAA national champions. In Morgantown, he was challenged with the task of extending that streak in a program that hadn't had a wrestler finish in the top eight since 2007. He succeeded.

Pulling freshman Zeke Moisey's redshirt two weeks into the season proved to be one of the most crucial decisions of Henson's career. Entering the 2015 NCAA National Championships unseeded, Moisey put together an historic run, upsetting the No. 15, No. 2 and No. 7 seeds to become WVU's first All-American since Brandon Rader in 2007. He then went on to pin No. 6 Thomas Gilman of Iowa in 52 seconds in the semifinals to become the first unseeded wrestler to advance to the finals since 2003. Moisey dropped a 9-5 decision to No. 4 Nathan Tomasello of Ohio State to cap his season as the NCAA runner-up.

However, the turnaround of the WVU wrestling program started long before the NCAA Championships. The Sammie Henson era opened in Morgantown on November 13, when the Mountaineers hosted former WVU assistant and the Arizona State Sun Devils at the WVU Coliseum. Though the Sun Devils took the match, 19-13, the match in front of 1,200 fans rejuvenated interest in the program. The team went on to place a trio of wrestles on the podium at the Cliff Keen Invitational, with the 16th-place finish marking WVU's best showing since 2007. In dual action, the Mountaineers topped No. 25 Bucknell in early January, briefly entering the NCAA top-25 that month, before ending the regular season with a win at No. 18 Pitt. It was the first time since 2007 WVU had taken the annual Backyard Brawl. In between, the Mountaineers sought revenge on ASU, twice taking victories from the Sun Devils.

West Virginia put together it's best-ever showing at the Big 12 Championship in March, accruing a team-high 35 points with four finalists. A.J. Vizcarrondo became the program's first ever two-time Big 12 finalist and was the runner-up at heavyweight for the second straight year. He was joined on the podium by Moisey (runner-up 125), Roman Perryman (runner-up at 149), Jake A. Smith (runner-up at 197) and Bubba Scheffel (third at 184).

Along with senior Michael Morales (149), Smith, Moisey and Scheffel earned at-large bids to nationals. The four combined to post eight wins, marking WVU's best finish in 10 years. The Mountaineers finished in 20th place with 23.5 points, their first top-25 finish since 2005, helping Henson earn Amatuer Wrestling News Rookie Coach of the Year accolades.

In 2016, Henson guided a pair of in-state natives to the NCAA Championship. Jacob A. Smihth of Charleston and Dylan Cotrell of Morgantown spent the season inside the nation's top-20 of their respective weights. The duo, along with Bubba Scheffel, qualified for the 2016 NCAA Championships at Madison Square Garden. In addition, the Mountaineers knocked off nationally ranked rival Pitt for the second straight year and picked up a win over Edinboro to cap the regular season.

In addition to his work with the Mountaineers, Henson started the Mountaineer Regional Training Center, drawing a number of national and international-level wrestlers to Morgantown to train. In the summer of 2014, he guided assistant coach Nick Marable to a spot on the U.S. World Team, and continues to coach Marable, former Olympian Clarissa Chun and national team member Jessica Medina through the MRTC.

A native of St. Charles, Mo., Henson came to WVU from Missouri, where he spent two seasons as head assistant coach. In just two seasons at Missouri, he assisted in producing the No. 2-ranked recruiting class in the nation in 2013 in addition to leading the Tigers to two consecutive conference titles and seven All-America finishes, including one national champion this past season.

Prior to Missouri, Henson was the assistant head coach at Oklahoma from 2009-11. While there, he helped secure the No. 2 recruiting class in the country, coached seven wrestlers to All-America status at the NCAA Championships and helped the program become the top academic squad in the Big 12 during his tenure. Before Henson arrived at Oklahoma, the Sooners hadn't had an All-American in two years.

Prior to his stint with Oklahoma, Henson served as the head assistant at Cal Poly (2007-09), volunteer assistant at Nebraska (2006-07), along with stops as an assistant at Army (2002-03) and Penn State (2000-02).

During his time at Penn State, Henson assisted head coach Troy Sunderland in taking the Nittany Lions from 35th in the country to sixth with a pair of top-five recruiting classes in just two years. He has mentored numerous national champions, such as Michael Lightner (Oklahoma), Byron Tucker (Oklahoma), Paul Donahoe (Nebraska) and J'den Cox (Missouri), along with several All-Americans, Big 12 Champions, Big 10 Champions and Pac 12 Champions, including: Shane and Dane Valdez (Oklahoma), Witt Durden (Oklahoma) and Josh and Scott Moore (Penn State), Chad Mendes (Cal Poly), Chase Pami (Cal Poly), Boris Novachkov (Cal Poly), Jarrod Patterson (Oklahoma), Zach Bailey (Oklahoma), Kyle Terry (Oklahoma), Tyler Caldwell (Oklahoma) and Eric Lapotsky (Oklahoma).

Henson has been widely recognized as one of the elite assistant coaches in the country. Tim Foley of Intermat rated him as the best in the nation in an article from 2010, stating that "Henson's intensity is legendary and seemingly always transferred to his grapplers. There is nothing coincidental about his arrival in Norman and the Sooners impressive 2009-2010 turnaround."

Along with collegiate coaching, Henson is also the current head coach for the Sunkist Kids Wrestling Club, which has more current world and Olympic wrestlers than any other wrestling club in the United States. Out of the seven freestyle wrestlers who represented Team USA at the 2012 Olympic Games in London, three came from the Sunkist Kids. Included in that group is Olympic gold medalist Jordan Burroughs at 74 kg/163 lbs. Also representing the United States in the Olympics in 2012 were Sam Hazewenkil (55 kg/121.3 lbs. and Tervel Dlagnev (120 kg/264.6 lbs.).

Henson's resume as a competitor speaks for itself. He went on to become one of the most celebrated wrestlers in the history of the United States, as one of just a few wrestlers in USA history to earn three world medals. In 1998, Henson became a world champion for Team USA at the World Wrestling Championships, in Tehran, Iran, which eventually led to him winning the John Smith Award for USA Wrestler of the Year. He earned a silver medal at the 2000 Olympic Games at 55 kg (121 lbs.) in Sydney, Australia, and won the bronze medal at the 2006 World Wrestling Championships at 35 years of age.

Additionally, Henson was named USOC Athlete of the Month of September 1998, and was a finalist for the Sullivan Award in 1999 for his efforts in the World Championships. In all, Henson has won more than 15 freestyle titles at the international level.

Henson started his collegiate wrestling career at Missouri, where he was a Big Eight Champion and All-American for Missouri in 1991. He then transferred to Clemson, where he became a two-time NCAA Champion, finishing his career with a 71-0 record. He was named as Clemson's Male Athlete of the Year in 1994 and was inducted into the Clemson Athletics Hall of Fame in 2000. Henson returned to Missouri in 1995 to earn a degree in parks, recreation and tourism management.

Henson and his wife, Stephanie, have four children: Jackson, Wyatt, Ruby and Georgia-Kate. They also have two dogs Biggie Smalls and Nelly.
